



VIETNAM VETERANS AGAINST THE WAR (VVAW)

The St. Louis Chapter of the Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW) met on September 16, 1971 at the Peace Information Center (PIC), St. Louis, Missouri, which was the usual meeting place for that organization. Approximately 20 individuals attended the meeting. It was stated that the treasury contained approximately \$200 and during the meeting the first issue of the "First Casualty" was distributed (6)

The VVAW is an anti-war organization organized in 1967, with headquarters in New York City. Its first published objective is "to demand an immediate cessation of fighting and the withdrawal of all American troops from Indo-China."

The PIC is a building which various peace and New Left groups have used in the past for meetings and various other types of gatherings.

The "First Casualty" is the publication of the VVAW, which is issued monthly.

VVAW members from several Chapters including the one from St. Louis, held a "silent vigil and fast" on the steps of the Missouri State Capitol Building in Jefferson City, Missouri, on Thanksgiving Day, November 25, 1971. The demonstrators, numbering approximately 45 persons, called for an end to the Vietnam War. They distributed handbills requesting citizens to write their senators and congressmen to request aid for the East Pakistan people.

November 20, 1972)

An article appeared in "Student Life", the official student newspaper at Washington University, St. Louis, Missouri, on October 25, 1972, which stated that the St. Louis VVAW conducted an anti-war protest at Soldiers Memorial, St. Louis, Missouri, which approximately 65 individuals attended. The veterans demonstrating put various military decorations and awards into a cardboard box which was to be sent to the President of the United States to show their feelings about the war.

The VVAW held a National Steering Committee meeting in Denver, Colorado, which ested from February 18 - 21, 1972, to discuss the structure, aims and objectives of the organization. In attendance was Richard Bangert, Regional Coordinator of the VVAW for area covering Eastern Missouri and Western Illinois. MERIBER OF SUBJECT ORGANIZATION

On March 3, 1972, information was received that the St. Louis VVAW was working in the Soulard area in South St. Louis. The members of the group were working with the local citizens council to help the people and improve the depressed area which is composed mostly of poor white people.

The VVAW members came into conflict with the St. Louis Intercommunal Survival Committee to Combat Fascism, (SL ISCCF) which distributed used clothing in the Soulard area. On several occasions the VVAW members who were sponsoring local activities actually stopped members of the SL ISCCF from selling Black Panther Party newspapers at the functions.

A source advised in May, 1972, that the St. Louis Committee to Combat Fascism was organized in September, 1971. The group consisted of white leftists who sought to support and implement the stated goals of the Black Panther Party. (BPP).

This same source advised that the group changed its name to the St. Louis Intercommunal Survival Committee to Combat Fascism (ISCCF) in January, 1972 in accordance with BPP national instructions. The groups major activities consist of distributing clothing and selling BPP newspapers in the St. Louis area.

The Black Panther Party (BPP) is a black extremist organization started in Oakland, California, in December, 1966. It advocates the use of guns and guerrilla tactics to bring about the overthrow of the United States Government.

At a meeting of the St. Louis VVAW on March 30, 1972, plans were discussed by the membership for a demonstration at the home of James Mc Donnell of Mc Donnell - Douglas Aircraft Corporation. The VVAW demonstration was in connection with and was to cooperate with the Mc Donnell - Douglas Project protest which were to occur during the same time period.

The Mc Donnell - Douglas Project is an ad hoc group of individuals who produced an anti-imperialism "film" focusing on the Mc Donnell - Douglas Corporation in St. Louis, Missouri.

An article with accompanying photograph concerning the VVAW protest march at the home of James Mc Donnell on April 15, 1972, appeared in the April 17, 1972 issue of the St. Louis Globe-Democrat, a morning daily newspaper published in the St. Louis, Missouri, area

The article stated that the demonstration consisted of VVAW members placing a coffin as near as possible to Mc Donnell's house in Ladue, Missouri. The article stated that the protest was to denounce Mc Donnell - Douglas Corporations production of war materials for the Vietnam War.

A St. Louis VVAW newsletter dated March 23, 1972, which was distributed to the general public contained information concerning a demonstration and march at the Crane Ammunition Depot, Crane, Indiana, April 7 - 8, 1972. The letter stated that individuals should contact listed VVAW members for information and/or rides to the demonstration.

The letter also stated that approximately 25 St. Louis VVAW members were to attend a demonstration at the Depot which produced forty per cent of the bombs used in Indo-China.

These Individuals

participated in a march and demonstration at the Crane Ammunition Depot, which was held on April 7 - 8, 1972 to protest the Vietnam War.


At a VVAW meeting conducted March 30, 1972, information was given that the National Office of the VVAW was sending seven members of the organiztion to North Vietnam. One of the seven was already named and he was an individual who had previously gone to North Vietnam. The six additional members were to be chosen from the 28 VVAW regions.

At a VVAW meeting held April 14, 1972, Tichard bangert stated he had been chosen by the National Office as a second alternate for the trip to North Vietnam.



Members of the St. Louis VVAW participated in anti-Vietnam War demonstrations held in St. Louis on April 17, April 24 and May 4, 1972. The VVAW members acted as marshalls in the three demonstrations. The leadership also cold local law enforcement the details of the demonstrations and stated that they wanted them to be non-violent, which they were.

Information was received by the St. Louis
Chapter of the VVAW that the National Headquarters
needed \$30,000 to send the seven members to North
Vietnam. The Nationa' Headquarters hoped to receive large
contributions from various people including actress
Jane Fonda.

The VVAW held a National Steering Committee meeting in Houston, Texas on April 7 - 11, 1972. Discussed was policy, organizational guidelines, directions of the organization in the future, plans for the Democratic Convention to be held in Miami Beach, Florida and the trip to North Vietnam by VVAW members. Rich Bangert gave an oral report on his region at the meeting.

On May 12, 1972, members of the St. Louis VVAW paid admission, gained entry and took over the USS Inaugural anchored at the waterfront in downtown St. Louis. The Inaugural is a decommissioned U. S. Navy Minesweeper which is now privately owned and used as a tourist attraction. The demonstrators stated they were going to take the ship to North Vietnam waters to clear mines laid by the United States.

The management of the ship, local law enforcement and the media did not show undue concern about the demonstration which obviously disturbed the demonstrators.

May 9, 1972)

On May 9, 1972, members of the St. Louis VVAW staged a sit-in demonstration at the Jefferson National Expansion Memorial Gateway Arch, St. Louis, Missouri to protest the blockade of North Vietnam harbors. The demonstrators, no bering at most 15, were led by Richard Bangert.


The demonstrators left the top of the Arch for safety reasons as requested by the management and upon reaching the vestibule gave a news conference for the local media. During the conference spokesmen stated that the demonstrators would stay at the Arch until arrested. Demonstrators reconsidered at a later period in the day and left the Arch by closing time, avoiding arrest.

On May 24, 1972, Richard Bangert and other officers of the VVAW throughout the United States met at the organization's National Offices in New York City.

Discussed were actions to be taken at the two upcoming national political conventions in Miami Beach, Florida. Among other items which were discussed was the finances for the members going to North Vietnam. It was mentioned that one-half of the expenses may be paid by the Soviet Union.



On June 3, 1972, approximately 15 members of the St. Louis VVAW met at the PIC. It was stated Richard Bangert had received a "slingshot" delivered in the United States mail from Scott Camil, a VVAW leader from Florida. The slingshot consisted of aluminum tubing with a wrist brace and what appeared to be heavy surgical hose. All VVAW regional coordinators reportedly received a similar slingshot with the implied intention of suggesting slingshots could be brought by VVAW members who planned on demonstrating in Miami at the Republican National Convention

Scott Camil, Florida Regional Coordinator for the VVAW clong with six other individuals was indicted by a Federal Grand Jury on July 13, 1972 at Tallahassee, Florida for conspiracy to violate Federal Anti-Riot Laws and for the proposed use of explosive and incendiary devices related to planned demonstrations at the Republican National Convention, Miami Beach, Florida in August, 1972.

The letter accompanying the slingshot announced the demonstration would be concentrated on the Republican National Convention and not the Democratic National Convention. The letter also reportedly contained some information regarding molotov cocktails and a kind of chlorine gas bomb. The letter implied that these items could be used by the demonstrators. Camil also urged

An interview of Toby Hollander appeared in the July 8 - 9, 1972 issue of the Metro-East Journal, which is a daily newspaper published in East St. Louis, Illinois. Hollander stated he was one of a fifteen member delegation of VVAW members who recently traveled to Paris, France and stayed as guests of the Center for the Denounciation of War Crimes which was an international peace group. The VVAW group was unable to meet with the North Vietnamese and Vietcong veterance

Hollander advised in the article that he had learned while in France that the United States was systematically bombing dikes in North Vietnam and seeding clouds to cause floods.

Richard Bangert stated on June 19, 1972 and June 22, 1972, that he received a total of three letters from Scott Camil concerning the proposed action at the Republican National Convention. One of the letters Bangert stated suggested bringing slingshots, ballooms containing clorox and amonia, gas masks, swimsuits and other items./// u

The National VVAW sponsored four convoys of automobiles to go to the Republican National Convention in August, 1972 for protest reasons. One of the western convoys was tentatively scheduled to go through St. Louis, Missouri. The St. Louis VVAW Chapter made plans to assist the convoy and to give information to people in the area who desired to join.


In August, 1972 the St. Louis VVAW moved its headquarters to 716 Geyer, in the Soulard district of South St. Louis, Missouri. The offices at 716 Geyer were also used by the Soulard Improvement Association. building was owned and the space was given rent free to the VVAW by the adjoining Catholic church.

On November 6, 1972, a small group of St. Louis VVAW members participated in a sit-in demonstration at the Old Court House, Jefferson National Expansion Memorial, St. Louis, Missouri. The demonstration consisted mostly of handing out literature. The state purpose of the group was to "occupy the Dred Scott Court Room during the day lidening the 1857 decision denying Scott citizenship to refusal of the Supreme Court in the 1960s to hear arguments about the constitutionality of the war in Southeast Asia." The demonstration terminated at closing time. No incidents occurred.

Scott Camil gave a speech with Jane Fonda at Washington University in St. Louis, Missouri on October 15, 1972. Camil also gave speeches on October 16, 1972 at St. Louis University and on October 17, 1972, at the University of Missouri at St. Louis, both in St. Louis, Missouri. Camil stated he was making speaking tours throughout the United States to raise money for his defense. He also said he was not guilty of the charges brought against him and planned to sue the United States Government for false arrest, financial loss and mental harrassment.

Cam'il stayed with, met with and was guarded by a team of members from the St. Louis Chapter of the VVAW during the speaking tour in St. Louis.

Information was received that the VVAW was attempting to raise \$175,000 for the defense fund of individuals charged by a Federal Grand Jury in Thilahassee, Florida for violations of Anti-Riot Laws - Conspiracy; Explosive and Incendiary Lavices.

On November 23, 1972, approximately 40 individuals led by several local members of the United Front of Cairo (UFC), marched from a previously held conference to downtown Cairo, Illinois. The march which dispersed on its own accord apparently because of a lack of support, was non-violent. No incidents occurred.

Charles Enlow Koen is the Director of the United Front of Cairo, Illinois, a pre-dominantly black group which is boycotting white business establishments in that city.

Participating in the conference and the march were members of the St. Louis Chapter of the VVAW including Richard Bangert



62 670 On November 1, 1972, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that the Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW) National Steering Committee meeting would be held in Chicago, Illinois. Source later advised that this meeting would be held from January 4-8, 1973.

The VVAW was founded in the spring of 1967 by six voung Vietmam veterans in New York City. At the beginning of 1968, with 600 members, VVAW opened a national office, founded the first GI newspaper, "Vietnam GI", and sent close to 500 veterans into the McCarthy campaign to beat down the red baiters. After getting gassed at the Democratic convention at Chicago and caught in the general "down" of the peace movement, VVAW was nearly inactive until the moratoriums in the fall of 1969. Members of VVAW led student strikes on major campuses across the country and battled Veterans Administration Hospital authorities over threats to throw amoutee Vietnam veterans out for signing anti-war petitions. At present, membership of the VVAW, nationally, consists of 8,500 members.



Appearing on the front page of the St. Touis Post Dispatch (a local daily newspaper), December 24, 1972, was an article with accompanying photograph concerning a demonstration staged by the St. Touis Chapter of the Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW) at the Defense Mapping Agency, Acrospace Center (DMA-AC), St. Touis, Hissouri, on December 23, 1972. The article stated the protest consisted of several VVAW members throwing punctured plastic bags of their own blood at the Center's identification sign at its main gate and bording a peace symbol made of barbed wire on the gate.

The accompanying photograph showed one of the demonstrators throwing an object at the above described sign.

On December 26, 1972, stated that 25 to 30 individuals participated in the demonstration at the DMA-AC. The protestors met across the street from the main gate in a small park at approximately 10:30 AM, December 23, 1972. They milled about in the park until approximately 11:50 AM, at which time they walked across the street and a number of the demonstrators then threw punctured plastic bags containing a red fluid at the main gate sign.

All of the demonstrators then got into various vehicles parked in the area and left. No arrests or violence occurred during the peaceful demonstration. Fourteen empty plastic bags were laying on the ground at the main gate were counted and then picked up for analysis by the Evidence and Technician Unit of the St. Louis Police Department.

photographer for the St. Louis Post Dispatch, stated at the scene of the demonstration that the newspaper had been called in the p.m., of December 22, 1972, and that a person identifying himself as a member of the St. Louis Chapter of the VVAW advised that blood would be spilled at the DMA-AC at 11:00 a.m., December 23, 1972.

On December 26, 1972, stated that the demonstration at the DMA-AC was sponsored by the St. Louis VVAW and its members participated. Source fentified the individual in the photograph, previously mentioned, appearing in the St. Louis Post Dispatch, as of the St. Louis VVAW.

additionally advised that the VVAW members' blood was drawn by St. Louis, Missouri.

On December 26, 1972, U.S. Air Force Security Officer at the DMA-AC, advised a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation that the sign at the main entrance of the facility had been splattered with a red substance at the demonstration on December 23, 1972. The sign was later washed down by units of the St. Louis Fire Department at his request.



What's it all about? Why are they jicking on us? What are they trying to

prove? These are some of the questions we have multed over in our minds since the indictments came down. Here are some of the answers we've come ur with. The first and most obvious conclusion is that this is not an attack on us asindividuals, but rather an attack on the ideas and issues we re-resent. This is another in a series of attempts on the part of the government to intimidate and discredit the anti-war movement and those who choose to dissent in this country. It is a direct attempt to destroy the Vietnam Veterans Against the War as an organization by destroying its credibility and undermining the base of support it has been building among the people. What the government is trying to do is to create a dilemma for Wad by forcing us to waste valuable time, resources, and energy fighting the government's injustice at a time when protest against the war could be most effective, are trying to destrey the credibility of Ward by associating our name with criminal acts cited in the indictment. They don't even need a conviction; all they need do is link the name of VV.W with violence, and they think they can stor people from listening to us. Ultimately, it is an attent to intimidate the entire mevement. The government was totally arbitrary in its chiec of defendants. Hence of us is, by any means, a "movement succretar" or even well known among our contemporaries. This is a government varning that anyone who protests too loudly or too effectively could meet the same fate.

So a cerson has two choices - talk and o to jail or den't talk and o to jail. The invasion of protesting citizen's privacy is done primarily through the use of wire tap ing and informers. Anyone who protests everyment clicies is subject to having their phone

Informers generally fall into two catenot redical enough to fit their needs, they are more than herry to proveke you into violent acts or commit the acts themselves and attribute them to you. Then there are the scople who are forced to inform or face presecution themsolves. This is the vilest form of blackmail, because the jovernment gives such a merson the choice of destruying his friends or going to jail. Many times these cople feel it necessary to lie in order to save their who skins. Probably, the biggest question in everyone's mind is whether we are, in fact, juilty of the crimes we have been accused of. WE ARE NOT GUILTY! The whole existence of VVAW is based on the fact that we who were once the pawns in a systematic destruction of the people and lands of indechina feel a much reater while for human life then our congovernment does. New the government is trying to charge us with the very crime of which we have been accusing them for five years - the total disregard of human life to achieve their wan ends. Since we ence warticipates in their leadly games, the government thinks it will be cost to convince people that we are willing to do it again. If we had not protested - if we were not resisting their criminal war policy - we would be considered herees on the basis of our war records. Look at the VVaW record and judge for yourself. The only thing we are guilty of is telling the truth. The only danger is our presence to the government because we expose their hypoeracies, lies, and eriminality cetter than aryone clsc. The government wants to destroy the VVAW with this trial. At the very least, they want to silence us in this crucial time before the election. We will not allow these charges and the threat of jail to halt our activities. Rather than destroying VVad, this trial will make us stronger. Rather than silencing us, it will only make us -rotest louder. We hope this trial will demonstrate to the american people just what their government is doing; that it will be a major step toward achieving the coal for which we all strive: ending the war in





On January 2, 1972, a confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, furnished a mailing of the New York Regional Office of the Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW), 357 Broadway, New York City (NYJ), which was transmitted to VVAW chapters of the Now York Region on December 29, 1972.

The VVAW is a national organization composed primarily of veterans of the war in Vietnam, that has organized and participated in numerous demonstrations against the war in Vietnam during 1970-72, including the seizure of the Statue of Liberty, NYC, and the occupation of the Betsy Ross House, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, in December, 1971. Six members of the VVAW were indicted by a Federal Grand Jury, Tallahassee, Florida, July, 1972, on charge of conspiracy to violate the Federal Anti-Riot Law.

#### Gainesville Conspiracy Information (latest news)


New Developments - On Bec 17, Larry durner, one of the attorneys for the Gainesville 8, was returning to Gainesville from a meeting in New York with members of the defense committee and defendants. Buind in his briefcase all the factual information (interviews, tapes, written statements, etc.) that had been gathered so far by the defense. Prior to the boarding of his plane, the two marshalls of the date made no attempt to search his briefcase. After boarding the plane, however, one of the membelieved to be a federal marshall loarded the plane after him, bypassed several other passagers, and informed Turner that his briefcase was too large, and that it would have to be checked. Turner objected, saying that the stewardess had hold him that he could put the briefcase on an empty seat. The man said that there would be no empty seat.

Reluctantly, Turner numbed in over and got a boggage claim check for it. After departure, Turner noticed that there were empty seats and that other passengers had similar briefcases that they had been allowed to keep. As soon as he got to Gainesville, Tur or demanded his baggage. "Mysteriously" all his baggage was there except for the briefcase, which showed up the following day at 2 PM. The lawyers in the case have filed a motion for dismissed on the grounds of invasion of the defense camp.

On Dec 18, Judge David Hiddlebrooks excused himself from the case after the defense lawyers had filed a motion citing numerous instances of predjudice. It is rumored that Hiddlebrooks read the Chicago Conspiracy opinion and decided he didn't want to ruin his political career with this trial. Hiddlebrooks was a bomber pilot during the Korean War.

In a related event, Alton Foss, one of the defender is, was adjucated in a trial for a drug bust. Alton was busted on a drug charge after he refused to cooperate with two Dade County undercover agents who wanted him to turn state's evidence. Adjudicated means that he was not found guilty, but he was not found not guilty (?). He was given 5 years probation. The conviction came after the judge refused to allow Alton's lawyer, William Kuntsler, to defend him, saying "I will hot allow my courtroom turned into a Communist playground." So he turned it into a Kangaroo Court, with Alton having no lawyer to defend him. The sentence will, of course, be appealed.

The Bombing—The latest reescalation of the bombing of Forth Vietnam is the most savage, criminal act of this or any war in the history of the world. We have all read the accounts of the daily bombings and the massive deaths that nixon's B-52s have once again poured on Vietnam. We all updenshold, now, that "peace is at hand" was a lie to the American people in an attempt to increase the size of his "mandate" so that nixon could carry out his Hitlerian dreams and finally wipe out the people and the land of North Vietnam. We are all aware that this latest bembing is wiping out hospitals, homes and most importantly the people that we support in this war.

And in spite of all this, we have done next to nothing to scream cut in protest to stop the bombing and sign the pence agreement. We have rationalized doing nothing by saying that nothing works. We have gotten drunk and calked and have done nothing. We have forgotten that in 1971, when the up to that point most savage raids of the war were met by mumbers of VVAW taking over the State. of Liberty, the Lincoln memorial, the South Vietnamese consulate in San Francisco, the Betsy Ross home in Philadelphia as well as other targets around the country. We have also forgotten that last Christmas the bembing was calle doff when "only" 30% of the targets had been hit. This year, and it is again at Christmas time, the raids are more savage and the response of angry protest of VVAM has been nil.

A call was received in New York this week from the Victor namese in Paris wondering why the American peace movement has not responded. It seems that we have failed, not just in terms of support for the Victnamese, but also we have failed in voicing our anger to the American people and the American government. It is still not too late to do somewhing and I urge every chapter (no matter how small or how disorganized) to do whatever is within your means to speak out in forceful nocie and demand that the government stup the bombing, sign the treaty and end the war.

It has occured to me that in times of crisis, like that which we are in right now, that we have no contingency class within the chapters to deal with organizing immediate proponse. I suggest that each chapter at their next meeting developed a scenario for initiating action to deal with it, that are "it" may be.

#### A Suggested guideline:

- 1. That each chapter develop ideas for imaginative responses, and that plans for these ideas be kept in a safe place where they can be called upon when needed.
- 2. That after the initial crisis unfolds, certain means bers of the chapter would call for an emergency meaning of the membership for that night or the next.

- 3. That that meeting the plans would be discussed, and put into effect.
- 4. That there be one person in charge of publicizing the action and that others would if necessary, chlist the suppor of other groups or people who could work with the chapter of
- 5. That whatever the action, a phone call be made to the regional effice so that a complete list of the actions come be used for a press release and that this information would also be passed on to the Mational office.
- 5. That thus action be followed up with appropriate actions until such time that the crisis as over.
- 7. That after this crisis period, the chapter would again draw up contingencies for the next time.

This is just a rough outline and I think it could be improved upon. But we must not forget that we have a job to do and that only hard work can help us achieve it. We must draw community support in the meanting so that when we respe in an emergency, we will have the support we need to carry it off. We have strongth in our collective voice and this voice is the power of the people.

During VVAW National Steering Committee meeting in Chicago, 1/4-8/73, Steve Hawkins, National VVAW Coordinator, made the statement that atomic and nuclear weapons were presently stockpiled in Japan and he is conducting a campaign to develop information which will corroborate existence of nuclear weapons in Japan in an effort to dis redit present Administration and an adverse of ect on the war effort. Hawkins also made the statement he hopes to obtain sufficient testimony from individuals having knowledge concerning weapons in Japan to aggravate the Japanese Government and people into aligning themselves with communists. Information was also developed during VVAW meeting that at least 13 VVAW members have experience in phases of military intelligence and had "secret" or higher clearances while in the military. In addition, various VVAW members, as individuals, reportedly have contacts in Congress who may be able to support and assist VVAW activities.

In a separate development, Legat, Tokyo, has developed information that VVAW has established 3 active chapters in the Far East, 2 in Japan and 1 on Okinawa.

#### **OBSERVATION:**

As indicated by developments at VVAW National Steering Committee meeting and by establishing active chapters in Japan, it is apparent that VVAW officers are making concerted efforts to develop intelligence information desired by the state of the conceivable that activities in this regard will border on espionage activity and it is quite possible that the motive in promoting campaign is purely for the purpose of providing intelligence information to a foreign power.

NISO and Legat Tokyo feel that the establishment of three VVAW Chapters in Japan and Okinawa at about the same time is not a coincidence, but is probably an effort to give the G.I. anti-military movement a facelift and make it easier for the G.I's to identify with it. Legat and NISO have received reports that PCS is out of funds and that BEHEIREN leaders feel that BEHEIREN will die when the war in Vietnamends. Therefore, it/most likely that the VVAW activity is calculated to keep the old activity going under a different name.

NISO as well as Legat Tokyo is most anxious to know if there is any indication that the VVAW move onto the PCS foundation in Japan was planned by the leadership of both organizations in the US; and if so, what plans are being made for future activity, financing, etc.

Please furnish Tokyo any information available in this regard.



The information set out in this memorandum is classified confidential unless otherwise indicated. Those paragraphs containing unclassified information will be followed by "U".

### I. ORGANIZATION

Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW) is a national anti-war group primarily composed of Vietnam Veterans with the stated objective of demanding an immediate cease of fighting and withdrawal of all American troops from Southeast Asia.

On December 13, 1972, and advised that the VVAW in Michigan currently has two active chapters. One being the Detroit chapter, which is not affiliated with any university, and the other is the Lansing chapter which is a recognized organization on the campus of Michigan State University (MSU), Lansing, Michigan. Advised that the Detroit chapter holds its weekly meetings at 48 West Parsons, Detroit, Michigan. Source further advised that is the Detroit chapter and lansing, Michigan, chapter of the VVAW. U

On December 14, 1972, advised that 48 West Parsons, Detroit, is the site of the Chapel of the Little Flower and this building is used by the VVAW on Thursday evenings for the purpose of holding their weekly meetings. U

### II. ACTIVITIES

On June 26, 1972, advised that on June 17, 1972, members of the Lansing chapter of the VVAW drove to Grand Rapids, Michigan, in order to attend the convention of the Michigan Veterans of Foreign Wars. The purpose of the VVAW members was to influence the proceedings of the convention, however, they met with no success because they were greatly outnumbered and could not gain an audience among the Veterans of Foreign Wars members.

On August 6, 1972, advised that on August 5, 1972, a state-wide meeting of the VVAW was held at Lansing, Michigan, on the second floor of the Union Building, MSU. At this meeting the Detroit chapter of the VVAW was trying to have the VVAW throughout the state endorse the bussing issue. Other members present did not wish to sponsor a state-wide movement endorsing bussing and, therefore, this endorsement was defeated. The outcome of this discussion caused dissention between the group from Detroit and the group from Lansing, Michigan. The only positive action planned for the VVAW throughout the state was to initiate a membership drive in order to build a stronger organization.

On August 18, 1972, a Special Agent of the FBI observed three members of the Detroit chapter of the VVAW participating in an anti-war, anti-Nixon rally being held at Re-elect Nixon Headquarters at Grand River and Washington Boulevard in Detroit, Michigan. U

On August 20, 1972, advised that meeting of the VVAW was held at war and county Community College, Rochester, Michigan, on This meeting was chaired by

of the VVAW. The main topic of discussion concerned improving communication between members within the state and also between the local chapters and the national office. Another issue was discussed concerning the secrecy of the VVAW's activities. The majority agreed that the VVAW was not intended to be a clandestine organization, and the Michigan affiliates should not treat it as such.

On November 11, 1972, advised three members of the VVAW demonstrated during a Veterans Day parade on Woodward Avenue, Detroit, Michigan, on November 11, 1972. These three individuals from the VVAW were arrested for disturbing the peace. Advised that one of the individuals arrested at the time was



Further, a number of VVAW members allegedly have experience in military intelligence and many have had "secret" or higher clearances while in the military.

Legat, Tokyo, has developed information that VVAW has now established three active chapters in the Far East, with two in Japan and one on Okinawa.

All recipients are reminded that attempts by VVAW members to solicit classified defense information could possibly result in engaging in espionage activities. Recipients be extremely alert, through informants and established sources, for any indication that such information is being solicited by VVAW members. Immediately advise Bureau if information in this regard is developed, along with pertinent recommendations for additional investigation, under "ESPIONAGE" character.

Background investigation regarding subject has been conducted, and the results along with a suitable photograph of the subject are contained in the Seattle file. It is not felt that subject poses a realistic, direct and current danger to the national security, and he is not regarded as dangerous at this time. No interview of subject is recommended as it is not felt that subject would have any impormation of value to the FBI, and he would have no potential in the PSI Program.

In view of the above, it is felt subject does not meet current ADEX criteria, and this case is being closed at Seattle to be reopened at such time information is received indicating subject may be involved in any revolutionary activities or pose some immediate danger to the national security.

of information on the NLG or it3 projects, the court approved settlement provides that present or former NLG members may request that their individual files which reflect Guild affiliation or activities be similarly withheld. Pursuant to this provision, the NLG has compiled the attached list of individual NLG members who have requested relief under 8c(iv) of the Settlement. 1

Accordingly, IMD is requested to identify any individual on the attached list who has a file reflecting NLG affiliation or activities which was created prior to 3/1/77. Any identified file should be appropriately labeled to insure non-disclosure as required by the settlement. Please advise Legal Counsel Division as to the results of the indices search, including the number of individual files identifiable with the NLG, individuals for whom no file could be located or are not identical, and the actions taken to comply with the order. In addition, please preserve all search slips in case we are required to respond to the Court regarding our compliance. It is likely that no files will be identified with a substantial number of the individuals on the attached list. Finally, inasmuch as the Settlement applies to all FBI files, the Field should also be requested to conduct indices searches and to appropriately label their files.

We recognize that this is a time-consuming chore that is being imposed on IMD caring a time of limited resources. Nevertheless, we have made this commitment to the court and we are

STIPULATION AND ORDER OF SETTLEMENT

AND DISMISSAL

77 Civ. 999 (PKL)

IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED AND AGREED by and among the parties as follows:

:

- The parties agree to settle and compromise this action on the terms indicated below.
- This action is hereby dismissed with prejudice as to all defendants except the City of New York, i.e., the "federal defendants."
- Plaintiff hereby releases and rorever discharges, and for its administrators, successors and assigns releases and forever discharges, the United States of America, its departments, agencies and past or present officials, officers and employees (and their heirs, executors, administrators, successors and assigns) from all claims whatsoever, in law, admiralty, or equity, which plaintiff and its administrators, successors and assigns hereafter can, shall or may have for, upon or by reason of any surveillance, investigation, disruption, or similar conduct by the Federal Bureau of Investigation ("FBI") directed toward the National Lawyers Guild (the "Guild") at any time prior to the date of this stipulation; provided, however, that

plaintiff is entitled to rely upon the federal defendants' representations set forth in paragraph 7 below, and any claim based upon any conduct of the federal defendants inconsistent with such representations shall not be barred by the above release.

- 4. Each party shall bear the costs and expenses of this litigation as they have been incurred or paid as of the date of this stipulation and no costs or expenses shall be taxed subsequently. Plaintiff and its attorneys waive all claims for attorneys' fees and expenses in connection with the prosecution of this action.
- 5. This stipulation and agreement does not constitute an admission by the plaintiff that any of the conduct of the federal defendants was lawful, or an admission by the federal defendants or any of their present or former officials, officers or employees that any of their conduct was unlawful or legally actionable.
- 6. Without conceding the legality or illegality of any of the federal defendants' actions, the parties agree that the discovery in this case has shown the following:
- a. The FBI engaged in extensive activities with respect to the Guild for the period 1940 through March 1975, and in the course of those activities generated voluminous files on the Guild.
- b. It appears more likely than not that between 1940 and 1951 the FBI surreptitiously entered the Guild's national office approximately 7 times without judicial warrant or

Attorney General authorization and copied the Guild's internal records. Some of the material thus obtained provided the Government in advance with drafts of a report the Guild was planning to release criticizing FBI surveillance practices, and with details of the Guild's related public campaign calling for an investigation of the FBI. The FBI used this material in an effort to counter the Guild's report even before its issuance.

- c. The FBI without judicial warrant maintained a wiretap on the Guild's national office telephone between 1947 and 1911.
- d. Information derived from the surreptitious entries formed a material part of the information placed before the Attorney General for his consideration in deciding whether to initiate proceedings to designate the Guild as a subversive organization under the Federal Employment Loyalty Security Program, Executive Order 10450. Such designation proceedings were begun in 1953.
- e. The FBI received information from an informant on the national ex cutive board of the Guild in 1953 and 1954 who reported on its deliberations and discussions with counsel concerning the Guild's defense of the EO 10450 administrative designation proceedings and its conduct of related litigation against the Government.
- f. In 1958, the Department of Justice determined that on the basis of the evidence then available it was unable to go forward with the designation proceedings, and the Attorney General therefore rescinded the proposal to designate the Guild

as a subversive organization under EO 10450. There were no further proceedings against the Guild under EO 10450.

g. The FBI continued its activities with respect to the Guild after the designation proceedings were discontinued in 1958. A Department of Justice review conducted in 1972 of the FBI's files on the Guild for the preceding five years concluded that there was no basis at that time for an investigation of the Guild under the Internal Security Act of 1950. In 1974-1975 the FBI, with Department of Justice authorization, conducted a preliminary inquiry concerning the Guild's prison work without discovering any basis for a further investigation.

h. Alleged or suspected criminal wrongdoing was not the predicate or reason for FBI activity concerning the Guild. No criminal prosecutions of the Guild were ever authorized or undertaken by the Department of Justice.

- i. From 1940 through the early 1970's, the FBI placed Guild members on its Security Index, Adex and related indices because of their leadership positions in the Guild or, in some cases, because of their membership in the Guild in conjunction with their actual or suspected membership in other organizations.
- j. The FBI engaged in certain COINTELPRO and similar disruptive operations against the Guild and Guild members. The FBI used information it had derived from its other activities with respect to the Guild and Guild members for that purpose.

- k. The FBI over several decades provided information from its files on the Guild affiliation and activities of individuals to the National Conference of Bar Examiners at the request of the NCBE.
- l. Further, at various times in its activities with respect to the Guild, the FBI used numerous informants and confidential sources, including Guild members and staff and third parties in contact with the Guild; "btained Guild bank records from banks with which the Guild had banking relations; obtained information from the National Conference of Bar Examiners and from some character committees; monitored trash covers on the Guild; and obtained information about the Guild from its surveillance of the law offices of some Guild members, which surveillance included use of trash covers, wiretaps, informants on the temporary or permanent staff of the law offices, bank records and surreptitious entries.
- m. The conclusions stated here do not imply that the FBI did or did not engage in other activities.
  - 7. The federal defemients represent as follows:
- a. There is not now, and has not been since March 1977, any FBI investigation or preliminary inquiry of any nature of the Guild or its chapters, or of its projects, activities or enterprises readily identifiable as such or of individuals based upon their Guild affiliation or activities, and the FBI does not presently have information warranting any such investigation or preliminary inquiry.

- b. To the extent, if any, that FBI inquiries or investigation of third parties has resulted in surveillance or acquisition of information about the Guild since March 1, 1977, no information so acquired has been stored in FBI investigative (i.e., non-litigation) main files on the Guild or its projects (as specified in Appendix A hereto) or see-referenced or otherwise indexed to the Guild or its projects, except as may have been disclosed to the plaintiff in this litigation.
- c. There has been no additions to FBI investigative (i.e., non-litigation) main files on the Guild or its projects (as specified in Appendix A) or to see-references on the Guild or its projects, since March 1977, except as may have been disclosed to the plaintiff in this litigation.
- d. The FBI is not now, and has not since March 1977, engaged in any activities intended to disrupt or impede the activities of the Guild or the Guild activities of its members, or the activities of individuals based upon their Guild affiliation.
- e. The FBI coes not now, and has not since March 1977, used Guild members as informants or confidential sources with respect to matters involving the Guild or Guild activities, placed wiretaps or pen registers on Guild telephones, surreptitiously entered Guild premises, obtained access to Guild bank records, maintained mail covers on Guild mail, maintained trash covers on the Guild, obtained access to Guild information at mailhouses used by the Guild, otherwise secured mailing or

membership lists of the Guild or obtained phone records on the Guild's phones.

- f. Since March 1, 1977, and presently, the FBI has not provided information on the Guild affiliation or activities of individuals to the National Conference of Bar Examiners or to bar admission committees.
- 8. The federal defendants agree to the following disposition of their files concerning the plaintiff:
- a. For purposes of this provision, the "FBI files on the Guild" means Headquarters, Field Office and Legat main files on the National Lawyers Guild and its projects (as specified in Appendix A); wiretap logs included in the main file on Robert Silberstein; EBF's to the Guild main files and the wiretap logs in the Silberstein main file; the see-reference cards and any other similar computerized or no: computerized reference capable of locating Guild-related information in files other than main files on the Guild, as well as references to the Guild in the Elsur Index and any indices to the informant files; and copies of the foregoing and any summaries thereof included in the FBI file on this litigation (62-117572). It is limited to documents created prior to the date of this stipulation.
- b. Within 180 days after the date of this stipulation, the FBI shall place all copies of the "FBI files on the Guild" in its possession or custody in secure storage under the supervision of the Deputy Assistant Director, Legal Counsel Division, and shall not dispose of, or permit access to, such

files before the year 2025. At that time the files may be transferred to the National Archives and Records Service.

c. The federal agencies which are parties defendant to this action (specifically, the FBI, the Central Intelligence Agency, the National Security Agency, the Internal Revenue Service, the Office of Personnel Management, the Postal Service, and the Departments of Defense, Justice, State, the Treasury, the Army, the Navy and the Air Force) shall not use, release or disclose, within on outside the Government:

(i) any "FBI files on the Guild" readily identifiable as such, or copies thereof, in their possession or custody;

(ii) any portion of any document or record which is shown on its face to have been generated, prior to the date of this stipulation, in the course of any FBI activities directed in whole or in part toward the Guild, to the extent it concerns the Guild or its activities or the Guild affiliatic or Guild activities of any individual:

(iii) any information contained in(i) and (ii) or reasonably identifiable ashaving been derived from (i) and (ii); or

The Office of Personnel Management is substituted as a party defendant in place of the Civil Service Commission pursuant to Rule 25 of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure.

- (iv) any portion of any document or record created prior to March 1, 1977, or the information contained therein, to the extent that it mentions the Guild affiliation or Guild activities of any individual, provided, however, that because of the federal defendants' representation of the practical impossibility of assuring compliance with such broad restrictions, the following limitations shall apply:
  - records of defendant federal agencies other than the FBI, this subparagraph (iv) shall apply only to such documents or records as are contained in a file the subject of which is either the Guild or a "Requesting Individual" (as defined below).
  - (b) With respect to documents or records of the FBI, this subparagraph (iv) shall apply only to such documents or records as are contained in a main file the subject of which is a "Requesting Individual" (as defined below), or in a volume containing see-references to the Guild, or in serials which are see-referenced to a

Requesting Individual (but only to the extent that such serials are accessed through the name of the Requesting Individual).

- a present or former Guild member who requests, in writing, that this subparagraph (iv) be applied to him or her, and who includes in such riguest his or her full name, any previous names, date and place of birth, and social security number. Such information is required to identify relevant documents and records and will not be used for any other purpose. Requests must be sent to plaintiff's counsel and forwarded by them to counsel for the federal defendants within 180 days of the date of this stipulation.
- d. Nothing herein shall preclude any agency from returning to the FBI any "FBI files on the Guild" or copies thereof in its possession (in which event the FBI shall handle such files as provided in subparagraph (b) above), or from disposing of any files by either destroying them in the ordinary course of business, or transferring them to the National Archives and Records Service in or after the year 2025. The United States Attorney's Office for the Southern District of New York will

return any copies of the "FBI files on the Guild" in its possession to the FBI within 90 days of the date of this Stipulation.

- e. If, upon the application of a third party, subparagraphs (b) or (c) above, or any portion thereof, shall be invalidated by any court, no other provision of this stipulation and order shall thereby be affected.
  - notwithstanding, the Department of Justice may have access to and use of any of the documents and records described in subparagraphs (a', (b) and (c) above to the extent relevant and material to the defense of the United States or any of its departments, agencies, officers or employees in any judicial or administrative proceedings the gravamen of which arises from conduct alleged to have occurred prior to the date of this stipulation. Appropriate records shall be maintained of any such use. Upon completion of the litigation for which the records were necessary, they and any records derived from them shall be restored to the status quo ante except if they were filed as part of the court record in the litigation.
  - g. Nothing in this stipulation shall preclude the Guild from requesting the release to it, under the Freedom of Information Act or any successor statutes, of those portions of the "FBI files on the Guild" not previously released to it, or the FBI from releasing the same to the Guild if appropriate under such statutes; provided, however, that the Guild shall make no such request prior to January 1, 1994.

Nothing in this stipulation shall preclude the federal defendants from releasing or disclosing any document or file at the request or with the authorization of the subject of such document or file.
