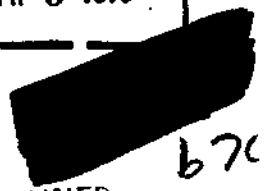

[redacted] was contacted to determine if VVAW members are actively involved in supporting the Irish Republican Army (IRA) within the United States or Northern Ireland.

[redacted] has received no indication that VVAW is, in any way, involved with the IRA. He is remaining alert for any such information and anything ascertained will be expeditiously furnished to the Bureau.

In this connection, in order to afford further coverage of VVAW activities, Chicago desires to establish a mail cover on VVAW National Headquarters, 827 West Newport Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, 60657, for a period of 120 days. None of the National VVAW leaders are known to currently have an attorney or to be under indictments.

It is believed such coverage may furnish desired information regarding VVAW bank accounts, other sources of funds, membership, and possible contacts with influential persons who may, on a national or international level, be able to assist the VVAW or request assistance of the VVAW.

Bureau concurs with observations set forth in referenced airtel regarding the desirability of placing a mail cover on the VVAW National Headquarters in Chicago. You noted that none of the national VVAW leaders are known to be under indictment or known to have an attorney. The current prosecutive action being taken against VVAW leaders and activists in Gainesville, Florida, must be considered in this matter and it is considered prudent to take no action on your request for a mail cover in order not to jeopardize this prosecution. Upon completion of the trial, however, you should resubmit your request fully justifying the use of this technique.

NOTE:

VVAW National Headquarters has recently relocated from New York City to Chicago, Illinois. Chicago has developed a source, [REDACTED] but in order to afford further coverage has requested the establishment of a mail cover. This would be most desirable in ordinary circumstances because of the extensive international contact of VVAW leaders as well as the fact that we have individual Espionage X cases on some of them. The actions of the defense attorneys in the Gainesville case and the unreasonable length they will go to to harass the Government make it undesirable to establish a mail cover at this time. This matter will be followed and after the trial, Chicago's request will be reconsidered.

II. AFFILIATION WITH THE VIETNAM VETERANS AGAINST THE WAR (VVAW)

The VVAW is a National Organization composed primarily of veterans of the war in Vietnam, that has organized and participated in numerous demonstrations against the war in Vietnam during 1970-72, including the seizure of the Statue of Liberty, New York City, and the occupation of the Betsy Ross House, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania in December, 1971. Six members of the VVAW were indicted by a Federal Grand Jury, Tallahassee, Florida in July, 1972 on charges of conspiracy to violate the Federal Anti-Riot Laws.



On October 16, 1972, a source who has provided reliable information in the past advised that [redacted] telephone number [redacted] at that time was a member of the New York Chapter of the VVAW.

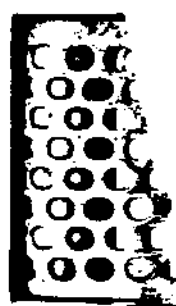

On August 17, 1972, [REDACTED] Hancock County Sheriff's Office, Findlay, Ohio, advised he did not know [REDACTED] and could furnish no information concerning his activities.

On September 14, 1972, [REDACTED] advised that approximately one year ago someone in the plant had brought in a college newspaper from the University of Dayton, and this paper contained an advertisement from the Vietnam Veterans Against the War and furnished an address in Dayton, Ohio for anyone who wished information concerning this organization. He stated that since he was a veteran of the Vietnam War and a former member of the U.S. Marine Corps, he wanted to know more about this organization and consequently sent in his name to the address furnished in the newspaper. He did not recall the name or address of the individual he contacted in Dayton, Ohio. He stated that shortly after his inquiry he received literature from this source and after reading the literature furnished him he decided he wanted nothing to do with the organization and never contacted the individual or organization again. [REDACTED] advised that literature was furnished to him for approximately 2 months subsequent to his initial contact of the organization. He stated that he is not a member of the Vietnam Veterans Against The War and has never been a member of this organization. He volunteered he did not believe in the methods of some of the individuals who belong to the Vietnam Veterans Against The War. [REDACTED] stated that he is presently [REDACTED] and considers himself a family man. He could not furnish the names of any members of the Vietnam Veterans Against The War in Findlay, Ohio, or anywhere else and he volunteered that he did not have any additional information concerning the organization.

On December 27, 1971, a confidential source in a position to furnish reliable information advised that the subject, [REDACTED] along with twenty-four other individuals belonging to the Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW), occupied the Betsy Ross House, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, on that date, and removed the United States flag from the outside pole, placing it upside down on the flagpole. At approximately 10:40 a.m., Philadelphia Police officers broke the lock on the door and entered the house. All twenty-five individuals, including the subject, were arrested and transported to police headquarters without incident, later to be released on bond.

The VVAW is a national organization composed primarily of veterans of the war in Vietnam, that has organized and participated in numerous demonstrations against the war in Vietnam during 1970-72, including the seizure of the Statue of Liberty, New York City, and the occupation of the Betsy Ross House, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, in December, 1971. Six members of the VVAW were indicted by a Federal Grand Jury, Tallahassee, Florida, in July, 1972, on charge of conspiracy to violate the Federal Antiriot Law.

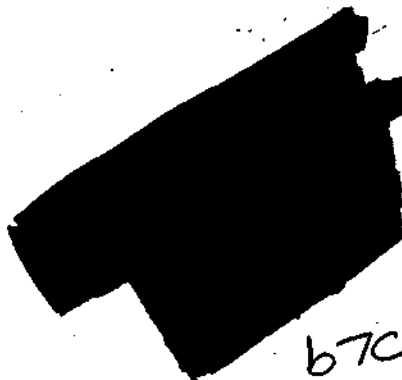

Orange County-The membership has increased several-fold-V.V.A.W. is getting stronger-A newsletter is coming out-Petitioning for Amnesty-Good turn-out for Jan. 20th-Looking forward to a West Point Action-Would like to promote the G.I. movement, Thinking of a lick & stick campaign

New York City-Presented a packet of literature-is selling G.I. movement calendars for \$1.00 apiece, V.V.A.W. buttons for 8¢- Spending a lot of effort fund-raising, some tips-business reply envelopes, thank you notes, direct telephone campaigns, and membership pledges.-Got over 100 people to Washington on Jan. 20-Changing their structure to committee form-Six committees with one person from each comprising the Steering Committee- Sent out questionnaire to members (25% unemployed, 40% students, 50% PVS, 10% have UD's, 99% say the G.I. bill is inadequate)- Trying to establish chapters on area campuses-Are keeping files on vets counselling services-Know a printer that will let Vets print at cost.

Oneonta-Nine active members-Took part in Jan. 20, had a local demonstration Jan. 19th,-Trying to get a campus Vets club going-Working to have people support Medical Aid for Indochina, also Oneonta County Fair-Having Gainesville people come up to speak.

Rochester-Working to revive the chapter-Doing leafletting, contacting newspapers, radio and T.V. stations, speaking.

Buffalo-Have a 4-week training program going for Drug and P.V.S. Counselling-Have been fighting for the rights of over 100 area Vets who are being penalized by the V.A. for S.U.N.Y. administrative errors-Had 50 people in D.C. Jan. 20th-Looking for a storefront.

Cobleskill-Not organized much yet, but there are people interested (Vets and others)-Working to start a campus Vets Club.

2. Regional Report- There are 15 active chapters in the state, varying in size and level of activity. Although there are many important areas that don't have chapters (i.e. Albany-Troy-Schenectady-Rome-Utica), we still have the potential of reaching a great many people. However, we are operating far below our full potential due to lack of cooperation and participation by the existing chapters. The poor attendance at the Regional meetings is evidence enough of this. Fund-raising is a full-time job for the state office. Strength lies in communications, and this takes money. Right now the state account is approximately \$600. in the red. This adversely affects all levels of the organization.

3. Regional Structure:

In order to insure fairness of representation at regional meetings, especially to the smaller chapters, the following proposal for voting was worked out and passed:

3 votes-those chapters with on-going programs for veterans.

2 votes-those chapters visably engaged in activity in support of the goals, objectives, and programs of V.V.A.W.

1 vote-those chapters considered to be in an embryonic stage.

The regional office has one vote.

Functions of the Regional Coordinator:

- a. To coordinate Regional meetings and Regional delegations to National meetings.
- b. To supply literature and organizing materials.
- c. Travel and initiate new chapters throughout the Region.
- d. To promote on-going programs in the Region.
- e. Maintain membership files and coordinate this with the National office.
- f. Set up and operate a fund-raising apparatus.
- g. Coordinate agenda items for regional and national meetings.
- h. Maintain files and records of all V.V.A.W. activities.
- i. Coordinate and issue newsletters.
- j. Issue minutes of meetings.

**Proposal: That one person from each area already established within the N.Y. Region be chosen by the people within that area and the Regional coordinator to implement organization within that area, and that they in turn work closely with the regional coordinator. PASSED.

**Proposal: To investigate the possibility of including Vermont into the Region. This could be started by inviting them to our Regional meetings. PASSED.

**Proposal: That chapters pledge money to the Regional office

on a meeting to meeting basis according to their capabilities (10% of chapter income is the suggested guideline). PASSED.
N.Y.C. \$100. Newburgh \$25. Buffalo \$40.
Oneonta \$20. Rochester \$30.

4. West Point Action:

****Proposal:** That a planning committee be set up immediately for a Regional action at West Point, May 19, 1973 (Armed Forces Day) with the emphasis on:

1. Anti-imperialism
2. Defense spending
3. Amnesty
4. Support of the G.I. movement.

This committee to be made up by Don Abrams, from Orange County, the Southern Sub-regional coordinator, and the Regional Coordinator. Further, that a campsite and workshop facilities be set up to work around these four points.

Further, that we propose at the N.S.C.M. in New Mexico that all other regions implement actions in their regions on Armed Forces Day in cooperation with the G.I. movement. PASSED.

5. Amnesty

****Proposal-** That V.V.A.W. Regionally begin a state-wide activity including petition and leaflet campaigns around implementing the amnesty objective. PASSED.

****Proposed Petition:** We, the undersigned, petition for full and unconditional amnesty for all those, military and civilian, who have refused to serve in a war which was so obviously illegal and immoral. We look forward to their return so that they may help to build lasting peace. PASSED.

Discussion of a Buffalo proposal to have a multi-regional demonstration at major U.S.-Canadian border crossings in coordination with exiles was tabled until the next Regional meeting so that specific information could be gathered and the exiles contacted. Tentatively dated for July.

6. Election of the Regional Coordinator:

Upon the recommendation of former N.Y.R.C. Ed Darato, the name of Ray Winters from the Buffalo Chapter V.V.A.W. was entered in nomination and unanimously approved by those present to become the new Regional Coordinator.

7. National Minutes:

This section refers to discussion of the minutes of the N.S.C.M., Chicago, January, 1973.

A. Proposals:

1. Medical Aid to Indochina: ****Proposal:** That we adopt the MAI proposal from the NSCM, Chicago, supporting MAI and withdrawing support from the Nguyen Van Troi Hospital Project at the national level, changed, however, to allow chapters to continue to work on N.V.T.H. project on a local level. PASSED.

2. Troc Proposal: Overwhelmingly defeated.

****New Proposal for next NSCM:** That VVAW relate in a principled manner with all political groups or parties whose politics and tactics do not conflict with the politics, policies and objectives of VVAW, and whose history shows potential and sincerity in

affecting change. This does not preclude cooperation and participation on specific issues. VVAW members who belong to other political organizations whose politics come in conflict with any of the objectives of VVAW will be excluded from holding any leadership position within VVAW. PASSED.

****New Proposal:** Any time the National Office or any national affiliate raises money in a region, they notify the Regional office and the local chapter and the split (if any) will be worked out with the local chapter, with the Regional office acting as moderator.

B. Workshops:

1. PANWAP (Propaganda Against Nuclear Weapons Attack Plan): Discussed- It was passed at National and we feel that people who want to work on it should. Persons who have questions or information on this should contact Ray Winters at the Regional office.

2. WSI's (Nuclear Weapons and Intelligence Community)

****Proposal:** We support the concept of WSI's (specifically Intelligence Comm.). However, N.S.C. members should insure that their functions are not disrupted through WSI's. People working directly with WSI's should have interim replacements if they are in leadership positions for the duration of their involvement with the W.S.I. PASSED.

3. Operation County Fair: It was decided to go along with the NSCM in supporting this as a VVAW project. As more information becomes available to the Regional office, it will be passed on to the chapters.

4. P.V.S.: There will be a national meeting on PVS this April in St. Louis, Mo., being organized by the National Council of Churches. VVAW will have good representation there, including some people from this region. We will try to make any results of that conference available to interested parties. Contact the Regional office. Item of interest: "The Vietnam Vet in Contemporary Society", Dept. of Medicine and Surgery, Veterans Administration, Washington, D.C. 20420.

5. G.I. Workshop: ****Proposal:** That objective #3 as amended at the R.M. in Oneonta in Dec. 1972, be resubmitted at the next NSCM: PASSED.

6. Objective #2: As found in the Chicago minutes, the N.Y. Region backs Proposal #2.

9. Third World Caucus and Women's Caucus:

A. The work here has been taking place mainly in N.Y.C., but other chapters can learn from them. Dave Bailey has been working to set up integrated workshops on racism and black nationalism. He says that blacks don't think whites are struggling against racism, and suggests trying to unite people around the discharge objective. Dave can be contacted by writing the N.Y.C. Chapter. B. Also in N.Y.C. is a Women's Caucus. This is 20-25 women, mostly wives and friends of Vets who are at this stage, still trying to develop their own group dynamics and a relationship with VVAW.

10. January 20th:

This demo was the largest VVAW has ever had, and it received the least coverage. The National office issued a full and lengthy criticism on the action that was distributed with

the second National 1973 newsletter. Copies can be obtained through this office. Despite many screw-ups, the demo was a great success that conveyed our message to the world (foreign press wasn't stifled) and to Nixon (you can bet that he later received a lot of excellent film footage of that day's activities that the T.V. viewing public never saw: we stretched from one end of the Arlington Bridge to the other, six abreast.)

- **Proposal:** That we urge the NSC to start exploring possibilities for demonstrations, should the bombing start again. PASSED.
11. Next Regional Meeting: First Choice: Syracuse; Second Choice: Rochester; Third Choice: Potsdam.
 12. Direction of VVAW:
Due to lack of time, we didn't go into this. However, we thought that much of our future work is going to be in implementing the objectives.
 13. V.V.A.W.'s Reaction to the Peace Accords:
The National office put out a statement on this that can be obtained on request. It can best be summed up by saying that we are delighted, hopeful and skeptic. We have our work cut out for us. The government has to be watched for moves to sabotage the accords once the POW's are back and the American people have to be kept informed and concerned over developments in S.E. Asia - as elsewhere.

The Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW) is a national organization, composed primarily of veterans of the Vietnam war, which has conducted demonstrations against the war during 1970-1972. Its first published objective is "to demand an immediate cessation of fighting and withdrawal of all American troops from Southeast Asia."

I ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE

The VVAW, with national headquarters located at 827 West Newport Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, is organized as follows:

[REDACTED] advised in February of 1972, that at the VVAW National Steering Committee (NSC) meeting held in Denver, Colorado, in February of 1972, it was voted that policy decisions on national activities and financial decisions would be made by the NSC, which would be composed of the VVAW regional coordinators and members of the National Staff. Also, the NSC will meet quarterly during April, June, September, and January, with provisions for emergency meetings which would supercede the regular meeting.

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A source advised in April of 1972, that at a VVAW NSC meeting held in Houston, Texas, in April of 1972, it was voted to establish six national VVAW officers to be known as National Coordinators. The officers created were: a liaison officer to be in charge of inter-communications in the VVAW; a treasurer; a communications officer, who would be in charge of films, publications and press releases; a projects director; a membership director, and a legislative officer.

A second source advised in April of 1972, that at the VVAW NSC meeting held in Houston, Texas, during April of 1972, it was discussed and voted that the 28 regional coordinators should constitute the governing body of the VVAW. They will meet quarterly as the NSC for the purpose of conducting national business and to discuss regional affairs. It will be the duty of the regional coordinators to define policy, activities and the philosophy of the national organization.

A third source, on March 12, 1973, furnished a VVAW "Working Paper" which set forth the following information:

VVAW "Working Paper"

"I. Structure.

A. National - 6 coordinators (elected) and staff (appointed).

"1. Election of coordinators - Nominations for openings will be taken at one NSCM to fill vacancies at the next NSCM. Nominees will return to their regions to make preparations for possible election to the national office. As nominees make decisions on whether or not they can accept the nomination, they will inform the national office of their decision with the national office relaying this to the regions and chapters. Decisions must be sent in one month prior to the next NSCM with elections taking place at that NSCM.

a. Requirements for National officer.

1. Must be a Vietnam Veteran.
2. Must have worked on a local and/or regional level for at least one year prior to nomination.
3. National officers of VVAW cannot be an officer in any other organization.

"2. Functions and Responsibilities:

a. Internal Liaison - responsible for keeping open lines of communication between the national office and the regions and chapters; this to be done by written correspondence, phone calls, and personal visits.

b. External Liaison - responsible for keeping in contact with other, foreign and domestic, anti-war, anti-imperialist, progressive, and revolutionary organizations. Also responsible for gathering literature and information from other organizations and resource centers for analysis and dissemination to the chapters and regions.

c. Finances - responsible for keeping straight all financial records, preparing documents such as balance sheets, statements, budgets, and expected income.

d. Political prisoners - responsible for collecting and disseminating information on as many political prisoners and defense committees as possible, to the regions and chapters.

e. Political analysis - responsible for gathering information on all seemingly unrelated issues and events, both domestic and foreign, to study and analyze, to connect these issues together and show how one affects the other and then disseminate the analyses to the chapters and regions and to other organizations, resource centers and alternate media for further dissemination.

f. 1st Casualty - responsible for collecting articles and pictures for the paper from both within and outside VVAW, laying out the paper, and making sure the emphasis of the paper is political education.

g. Membership - responsible for updating the national"

membership list, adding and deleting names and changes of address, and to send out information packets to new members and to forward their names to their respective regional coordinator.

h. Coordination of actions, projects, and programs - National office is a central gathering point for information from regions, chapters, and other organizations, on actions, projects, and programs for dissemination to the regions, chapters and other interested organizations.

"B. Regional Level.

"1. Elections - Regional coordinators will serve for a fixed period of one year and may be re-elected for a second term. Regional Coordinators may be removed from office at any time by the membership of that region.

- a. Requirements - must be a Vietnam Veteran.
- b. Division of regions requires a 2/3 majority vote by the NSC.

"2. Functions and responsibilities.

- a. Regional Coordinators will be the official representatives of VVAW in their respective geographic areas.
- b. Regional Coordinators will be responsible for and have full authority to make all decisions relative to VVAW operations consistent with VVAW philosophy and policy as determined by the NSC.
- c. Regional Coordinators will be supported in all decisions consistent with VVAW philosophy and policy, by the National Office and NSC.
- d. Regional Coordinators will be responsible for establishing media and political contacts within their respective areas.
- e. Regional Coordinators will be expected to support all national fund raising drives initiated by the Steering Committee.
- f. Regional Coordinators will be responsible for the calling of press conferences and the issuances of press releases and statements at the request of the NSC office.
- g. Regional Coordinators will be responsible for the maintenance of communications between the national office and the chapters in their respective areas.
- h. Regional coordinators, and/or their representatives, with a written proxy, will be required to attend the regular scheduled meetings of the National Steering Committee and those non-scheduled or emergency meetings convened at the request of the National Steering or National Office Committees."

i. Regional Coordinators will convene regional meetings quarterly. Those meetings will be convened for the purpose of elections and/or advising the National Steering Committee and delegations of proxies at its regular scheduled meetings.

j. Regional Coordinators will be responsible for making recommendations to the National Office relative to the granting or terminating of chapter charters in their respective areas.

k. Regional Coordinators will be responsible for having a representative to cover his respective area when he is not available.

NOTE: Election of Regional Coordinators will take place within their respective regions.

" C. National Defense Committee - National Defense Fund.

1. To establish a National Committee to defend VVAW and all political prisoners. PURPOSE: To defend VVAW, its members engaged in VVAW activities and all political prisoners from any and all repressive political attacks by the government against VVAW as an organization and against all other political prisoners with the primary emphasis at this time being directed to the grand jury proceedings in Gainesville. FUNCTION: To coordinate all information and propaganda between local defense committees and the press and the regions of VVAW. To coordinate raising and dissemination of those funds to the local committees under political attack and to raise money for continuing defense efforts. STRUCTURE: To be directed by the VVAW NSC. To be comprised of one member from each local defense committee and one national coordinator. To be responsible for the collection and dispersal at the national level of necessary information and materials. This committee is to meet together, by phone or in person, to fulfill the needs of each local defense committee.

" 2. Membership of LDC on NDC will be decided by a vote of the NSC

" 3. The NDC must secure the approval of the of the LDC's, by phone or in person, for the use of any funds ear-marked for the NDF for other than direct dispersal to the appropriate LDC. Each LDC and the national coordinator will have one vote.

" 4. If the LDC decides to remove its representative from the NDC, that representative is no longer on the NDC. A new representative to NDC must be appointed immediately by the LDC.

"5. Monthly financial reports must be sent from each LDC to the national office to be kept on file. These reports are available to all NSC members and will be presented at NSCM.

"6. Monthly status reports from each LDC must be sent to the National Office.

"7. A monthly newsletter must be sent to all regions by the NDC"

"8. LDC should coordinate with regional offices so we can expand our contacts.

"9. There are three local defense committees which have been recognized by the NSC, these are: 1. Gainseville Conspiracy Committee. 2. Billy Dean Smith Defense Committee. 3. Gary Lawton Defense Committee

National Defense Fund

All money that is sent to the NDF will be dispersed by the NDC as determined by the necessity of meeting the political attacks on VVAW and other political prisoners.

All funds collected for (earmarked for) a specific case will be immediately forwarded to the LDC office concerned.

GUIDELINES FOR FUNDING

- a. Only direct defense expenses - lawyers, bond, expenses for mailings etc.
- b. Priority for funding: cases affecting the continuing function of VVAW.
- c. All checks be made payable to the VVAW National Defense Fund. The VVAW NDF is the name of the bank account of the National Committee to Defend VVAW and all Political Prisoners. Only funds or checks made out to the NDF can be deposited in the account. Funds earmarked for specific defense committees will be forwarded immediately for the appropriate committee.
- d. The NDF bank account will immediately moved to Chicago.

"II. Communications.

A. Regional Communications

1. From the regional office
 - a. A bi-weekly newsletter to chapters to include regional and national news.
 - b. Personal contact by phone at least once a month with chapters.
 - c. Physical presence at chapter meetings at least once every six months.
- "2. From Chapters (this must be approved at regional meetings).
 - a. Bi-weekly letter to regional office outlining problems, needs, etc.
 - b. Monthly phone call to regional office.
 - c. Chapter representative present at regional office at least once every three months.
 - d. Mailings sent to chapter membership and other chapters once a month.

"3. Regional meetings at least once every three months to be held prior to the NSCM.

"B. National Communications:

- " 1. From the National office.
 - a. Bi-weekly newsletter to regional offices and all local chapters.
 - b. Personal contact by phone at least twice a month.
 - c. National coordinators should attend as many regional meetings as possible"

"d. The First Casualty will be mailed to all members once a month or drop shipped to regions at their request.

"2. From the Regional Offices

- a. Bi-weekly newsletter to national office.
- b. Phone calls to national office at least twice a month.
- c. Regional coord. to visit national office for one week each year.
- d. Regions have access to national newsletter and national coordinators.
- e. Bi-monthly newsletter to other regions.

"III. Finances

- a. 50% of all monies raised by the national office on speaking gigs will go to the region that the speaking took place in.
- b. Any region or VVAW program that receives a contribution of \$200 or more will forward that name and address to the national office. If the contribution comes from a national program the name and address will be forwarded to the appropriate region for a personal thank you only.
- c. The national office will prepare a projected budget for each NSCM.

"IV. National Steering Committee Meeting - Functions and Procedures. The Regional Delegations will comprise the National Steering Committee of VVAW, and, in fact, will be the governing body of this organization.

A. The function of the National Steering Committee will be to define the philosophy, establish the policy, formulate the programs and determine the activities of VVAW on the national level.

B. The National Steering Committee, at its discretion, may audit VVAW books without prior notice of its intentions to the National Executive Committee.

C. Emergency meetings of the National Steering Committee will be convened at the request of the National Executive Committee after canvassing by phone the members of the NSC with two-thirds of the members responding and a simple majority of that number concurring with the request.

D. The National Steering Committee may convene a non-scheduled meeting upon the request of any single member of that body if the request is concurred with by a simple majority of that body as determined by telephone canvass of all members with no less than two-thirds responding.

E. Concerning the use of proxy votes: The first matter to be resolved by the steering committee concerned the use of proxies at National Steering Committee Meetings (NSCM). A motion concerning proxies was made and seconded. The motion was; that proxy votes may only be used for motions which the region issuing a proxy has prior knowledge of. Motion defeated yes-33, no-37. Proxy voting will continue on the basis laid down at Milwaukee. Any region may only have one proxy from an unattending region. This proxy may be used on all votes. A proxy may not be used for a quorum count."

"F. Authorized Quorum for National Steering Committee Meetings - Each region will contact the national office prior to a scheduled steering committee meeting to confirm their attendance at the meeting. 2/3 of the regions planning to attend will constitute a quorum for the first session. Afterwards 2/3 of the regions present will constitute a quorum.

G. Each region can have no more than five working delegates to the NSCM. Each region has five votes on all issues so as to reflect all views of their delegation. The NSC will meet quarterly with provisions for emergency meetings which would supersede regular NSCM. The regional coordinator, in whose region the NSCM is to be held, will be responsible for the logistics of the meeting, preparing the agenda, soliciting and disseminating agenda items which he receives to all the regions."

II OBJECTIVES

On March 12, 1973, the third source furnished the following objectives of the VVAW:

*

" OBJECTIVES OF VIETNAM VETERANS AGAINST THE WAR

- ~~CONFIDENTIAL~~
- " 1. To demand an immediate cessation of fighting and the withdrawal of all American troop plans, and military and economic aid from Southeast Asia. We cannot allow one more human being to be killed in Southeast Asia. We support as a basis for the cessation of these hostilities the various peace proposals of the Peoples of Southeast Asia such as the 7 point peace proposal of the P R G of South Vietnam or such future plans as they develop based upon their right of self-determination and actual control of their own destinies.
 - " 2. To demand the immediate termination of all other operations by the United States government, its agencies, and American business interests that are designed to suppress the rightful struggles for liberation and self-determination of the Peoples of Africa, Asia and Latin America. This includes the maintenance of dictatorial governments, economic domination, and the theft of the natural resources of other countries. The United States should make reparations in a program acceptable to the Indochinese for all of the damage done by the United States.
 - " 3. To demand that all active duty servicemen and women, Reservists and National Guards be afforded the same rights that are guaranteed by the United States Constitution and Bill of Rights that are presently denied by the Uniform Code of Military Justice. We are appalled that our active duty GI's are treated as less than first class citizens. We endorse the efforts of our active duty sisters and brothers in their struggle to democratize the military.
 - " 4. To support all military personnel refusing to serve against their consciences in wars at home and abroad. We demand that Congress enact legislation for the immediate repatriation to those brothers and sisters who are in prison or in self-exile by reason of their refusal to serve in the military. It must also involve an end to all repression and a freeing of all political prisoners.
 - " 5. To demand there be no distinctions as to types of discharges and that a single type of discharge be issued, and that this be retroactive. We also demand all veterans receive all rights and benefits under the VA; and that compensation for disabilities be based solely upon the degree of disability for veterans and their families, without regard to sex, race, rank, or length of service.
 - " 6. To make clear that the United States has never undertaken an extensive open investigation of American war crimes in Indochina. In its war in Indochina, the principles of Nuremberg have been violated. As active duty and former GI's we recognize the responsibility and guilt of the individual soldier to refrain from committing war crimes. We also recognize that the responsibility and guilt of war crimes committed in the name of America lies with our policymakers at all levels."

" 7. Resolved to fight racism, to show Americans that our society is permeated by racism, which manipulates whites into viewing non-whites as inferior or less than human. This racism pushes Third World People through inferior schools to inferior jobs and into combat arms. Thus Third World People are sent off to die in disproportionately high numbers as we kill Asians indiscriminately. We also demand the US military recognize its complicity in America's domestic and international racism.

" 8. Resolved to fight sexism, to show that sexism plays a major part in promoting war. We must show Americans our society is permeated by sexism, which forces an inferior status upon women, reducing them to subservient sexual objects, and which robs both men and women of their natural growth. This institutionalized sexism channels women into unfulfilling lower paying jobs which are servile in nature and purpose; it exploits their bodies for sex and profit; and it degrades and dehumanizes them by a double standard of morality wholly dependent on the myth of male supremacy. This sexism is exploited by the military, officially defining servicewomen as subordinate and thoroughly subjugating them to servile work and the role of a sexual object. We resolve to fight sexism within our society, within our own organization and within ourselves.

" 9. To support the democratic right of Americans to unionize and strike to protect their income and safeguard their employment. We consider all legislation designed to suppress these rights, including mandatory arbitration to be illegal, and not in the interests of American working people. We also demand full employment for all Americans, including free educational and vocational training for all who need or want it. We refuse to participate in the effort being made to separate us from other working people, making veterans enemies by giving us the charade of employment priority. We condemn this as a method of encouraging military enlistment by the false promise of employment after service. We also condemn the use of active-duty GI's, Reservists, and National Guardspeople as strikebreakers.

" 10. To dedicate ourselves to these principles and objectives which directly relate to the imperialist suppression of the People of the World by the United States Government. We understand this war is imperialist in origin and affirm that the membership of VVAW is not only concerned with ending this war, but with changing the domestic, social, political and economic institutions that have caused and perpetuated its continuance."

A fourth source advised on March 20, 1973, that the Socialist Workers Party (SWP) and Young Socialist Alliance (YSA), do not exert any influence on the VVAW.

The Chicago Branch Socialist Workers Party (CBSWP) was one of the founding branches of the SWP and follows the aims and principles of the SWP, which has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

As the youth organization of the Socialist Workers Party (SWP), the Young Socialist Alliance (YSA) serves as the main source of recruitment into that organization. The YSA is described in the masthead of its official publication, "The Young Socialist Organizer," as "A multinational revolutionary socialist youth organization."

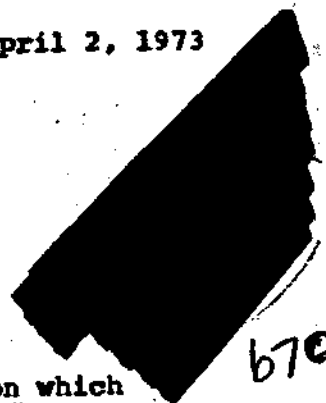

On May 27, 1972, the local daily newspaper published in Binghamton, New York, contained an article concerning the Memorial Day parade scheduled for May 30, 1972, in the city, and stated that a small group of veterans of Vietnam opposed to the Vietnam War had been denied permission to join the Memorial Day parade. This article revealed that this small group of men call themselves the Vietnam Veterans Against the War. The newspaper reported on May 30, 1972, that the parade was held and six individuals appeared at the parade dressed in fatigue clothes and claimed they were opposed to American involvement in the Vietnam War. The spokesman for the group was [redacted] a graduate student at the State University of New York, at Binghamton. These individuals stood by the County Building during the parade holding a wooden box supposed to be a coffin and signifying their opposition to the Vietnam War. No incidents occurred during the parade.

The Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW) is a national organization composed primarily of veterans of the war in Vietnam that has organized and participated in numerous demonstrations against the war in Vietnam during 1970-1972, including the seizure of the Statue of Liberty, New York City, and the occupation of the Betsy Ross House, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, in December, 1971. Six members of the VVAW were indicted by a Federal Grand Jury, Tallahassee, Florida, July, 1972, on charges of conspiracy to violate the Federal Antiriot Law.

On October 22, 1972, a group of four men participated in a silent vigil at the County Building in Binghamton, New York, during the Veteran's Day parade in the city that evening and these men indicated that they were members of the Vietnam Veterans Against the War Chapter in Binghamton. No incidents took place and no trouble resulted from this peaceful demonstration by these four individuals.

Sources who are familiar with subversive activities in the Binghamton, New York area have been contacted regularly during the period of October, 1972, through March, 1973, and these sources have all advised that there has been no activity on the part of the Vietnam Veterans Against the War except for the brief demonstration on Veteran's Day in October, 1972, and at the parade on Memorial Day in May, 1972. Contact made with sources in the Binghamton, New York area during the period January, February and March, 1973, concerning this organization has revealed that there has been no activity on the part of this organization during that period.

On March 14, 1973, a source who is in a position to furnish information of this type, advised that during the period of the current school year, from September, 1972, through March, 1973, there has been no activity of any kind on the campus of the State University of New York at Binghamton, or any organization of veterans of the Vietnam War.

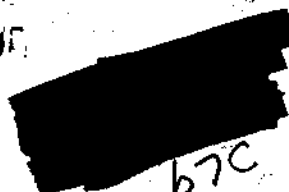

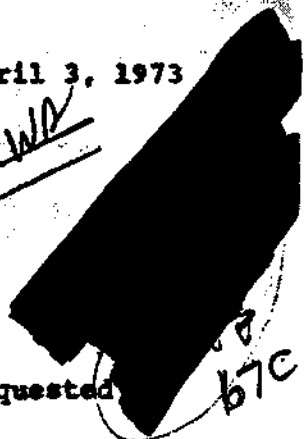

On December 11, 1972, a confidential source who has furnished reliable information in the past advised that a conference of the New York Region of the Vietnam Veterans Against the War was held at Oneonta, New York on December 9 through 10, 1972. (~~CONFIDENTIAL~~)

The Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW) is a national organization composed primarily of veterans of the war in Vietnam that has organized and participated in numerous demonstrations against the war in Vietnam during 1970 through 1972, including the seizure of the Statue of Liberty, New York City, and the occupation of the Betsy Ross House, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, in December, 1971. Six members of the VVAW were indicted by a Federal Grand Jury, Tallahassee, Florida, July, 1972, on charges of conspiracy to violate the Federal Antiriot Law.

The initial session began on December 9, 1972 and among those in attendance was [REDACTED] who supposedly represented the Oneonta Chapter. (~~CONFIDENTIAL~~) The final session of the conference was held at [REDACTED] New York, on December 10, 1972 at which session, a resolution was passed that the Vietnam Veterans Against the War do anything and everything to assist the Free Peoples of Indo China, defeat genocidal aggression, United States imperialism, to develop an anti-imperialist consciousness among American people by relevant programs of mass indoctrination.

On January 16, 1973, a third confidential source who has furnished reliable information in the past stated subject had never been arrested by the Oneonta, New York Police Department. He wrote to the address, which he does not recall at this time, and requested to join this organization since he is a peace loving person and felt that the war in Vietnam was wrong. He stated he sent a five dollar membership but never received any type of card showing he was a member. He said he has received mail which included brochures and literature concerning the Vietnam Veterans Against the War. He says he has attended some Vietnam Veterans Against the War meetings but declined to comment when or where the meetings were held.

He stated there was no Vietnam Veterans Against the War chapter at Oneonta, New York, but did state he was a member along with one other individual whom he declined to name.

He further stated he was not a militant individual, did not believe in the overthrow of our government and had no intention of performing any acts which would be anti-American. He stated he is a member of the Vietnam Veterans Against the War only because it represents a peace movement. He believes the organization will soon be disorganized due to the end of the war in Vietnam. He considers himself as a loyal and patriotic American citizen.

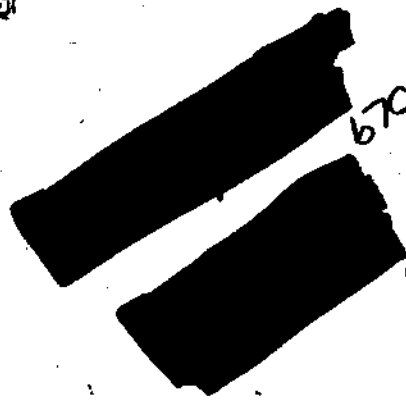

Subsequent to the truce agreement in Vietnam, the VVAW sponsored a demonstration demanding amnesty for deserters and other "exiles" from the Vietnam War. On April 2, 1973, the VVAW participated in a demonstration sponsored by the Young Socialist Alliance (YSA), which

demonstration protested the current visit to the United States of South Vietnamese President Nguyen Van Thieu. All of these demonstrations have been in the Downtown Cincinnati area, and with the exception of one, none have been accompanied by either incident or arrest.

YOUNG SOCIALIST ALLIANCE

As the youth organization of the Socialist Workers Party (SWP), the Young Socialist Alliance (YSA) serves as the main source of recruitment into that organization. The YSA is described in the masthead of its official publication, "The Young Socialist Organizer," as "A multinational revolutionary socialist youth organization."

The SWP has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

On May 29, 1972, a Memorial Day Parade was held in the community of North College Hill, which is a suburb of Cincinnati. This parade was sponsored by the Veterans of Foreign Wars. Five members of the Cincinnati Chapter of VVAW joined this parade carrying anti-war placards. When they refused to leave the parade, they were arrested and charged with "disturbing the good order of a parade." This charge was subsequently dismissed against all five.

The number of persons participating in demonstrations has ranged from a low of two persons to a high of 75 for the amnesty demonstration.

The Cincinnati VVAW had a small group participate in the anti-war demonstration in Washington, D.C. at the time of the inauguration of President Nixon on January 20, 1973. They also had three persons travel to Miami, Florida in August, 1972, to join in anti-war protests in the vicinity of the Republican National Convention. Cincinnati VVAW members participated in a demonstration supporting the lettuce boycott which demonstration was sponsored in Cincinnati by the United Farm Workers Union.

VVAW demonstrations have included support from known members of the YSA and the Revolutionary Union (RU).

B. Aims and Objectives

On March 29, 1973, [REDACTED] advised that the following continue to be the aims and objectives of the VVAW:

1. To demand an immediate total cessation of fighting and the withdrawal of all American troops from Indochina.
2. To show Americans that their society is structured by a racism which lets us view all non-whites as less than human. This racism pushes our minorities through inferior schools and into the combat arms.
3. To make clear that the United States has never undertaken an extensive open investigation of American war crimes in Indochina. We demand that the United States government, in its war in Indochina, affirm the principles of Nuremburg. As former G.I.'s, we recognize the responsibility of the individual soldier to refrain from committing war crimes. We also recognize that the responsibility and guilt of war crimes committed in the name of America lies with our policy makers at all levels.
4. To demand that all active-duty servicemen and women be afforded the rights as citizens that are guaranteed by the United States Constitution

and the Bill of Rights that are presently denied them by the Uniform Code of Military Justice.

- 5. To support all military personnel refusing to serve in wars of aggression at home and abroad.
- 6. To demand immediate legislation to provide proper care and services for all Veterans in V.A. hospitals; to make available job training and placement for every returning veteran; and to provide the funds and means necessary for their educational and vocational endeavors.

[redacted] advised that the Memphis Chapter of the VVAW has performed work in the areas of jobs for veterans and drug treatment centers at Veterans Administration hospitals.

The Memphis Committee to Free Angela Davis, also known as the Angela Davis Defense Committee, was organized in Memphis, Tennessee, in late January, 1971, by members of the Young Workers Liberation League (YWLL), a Communist Party, USA youth organization, primarily to increase the membership and influence of the YWLL and incidentally to provide financial assistance to Angela Davis.

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A meeting of the Memphis Chapter of the VVAW was held on [REDACTED] at [REDACTED] Memphis. At this meeting there was discussion concerning the possibility of disbanding the chapter because the chapter had participated in so few activities. It was agreed to maintain the chapter as a "paper" organization, although no plans were made for future activities at the time.

Attached relates that two Indians spoke at Miami University, Ohio, 3/28/73 regarding situation at the village of Wounded Knee, South Dakota, currently occupied by Indians. Committee at University is reportedly coordinating efforts for three states in the collection of food, funds, and medical supplies for Wounded Knee occupants. Funds collected at meeting were donated to Cleveland American Indian Center for new equipment. Other teletypes advise Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW), St. Louis, and other affiliated groups reportedly will travel to Wounded Knee, weekend of 3/30/73 with supplies for Indians.

A source of our Charlotte Office indicates there will be no caravan from that area to Wounded Knee, as previously planned. In Chicago eleven persons in demonstration of Young Workers Liberation League (youth wing of Communist Party USA) on 3/30/73 distributed leaflets urging an end to Government interference at Wounded Knee.

Seven Indians en route from Denver by car to Wounded Knee were stopped 3/30/73 by local police and FBI Agents near Kyle, South Dakota, but no evidence was obtained indicating they planned to join occupation of Wounded Knee or had illegal intent while headed in that direction. Cincinnati source advises convoy plans to depart Cincinnati 3/31/73 en route to Wounded Knee with members of VVAW, Revolutionary Union, and 'Movin' on Up' organizations. Philadelphia source advises VVAW members, Philadelphia, are considering travel to Wounded Knee to assist Indian occupants. A Chicago source advised an Indian spokesman in that area stated Chicago news media will be invited to observe 3/31/73 collection of food and clothing for Wounded Knee occupants as well as departure and travel of truck with those supplies.

Pertinent information related above will be furnished to Internal Security and Criminal Divisions of the Department.

Investigation conducted and contacts with Seattle sources familiar with revolutionary activities, including VVAW activities, has failed to show any information indicating subject has a propensity for violence or poses a realistic threat or current danger to the national security. Subject is not regarded as dangerous now.

An attempt was made to interview subject at his current residence, [REDACTED], Seattle, Washington, on March 21, 1973, by SAs [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. Subject was not cooperative and advised he had nothing to discuss with [REDACTED] FBI.

The meeting will mark the first time veterans from opposing armies have met in peaceful discussion while the conflict is in progress. This will be a profound human encounter between former "enemies" to seek a mutual understanding about what can be done to end the war and how each can work toward peace.

"The delegation from Indochina will include veterans and war victims from the South Vietnamese National Liberation Front, the North Vietnamese Army, and Cambodian Liberation Government. [REDACTED] was advised he was not wanted by the FBI and that the FBI had desired to talk to him concerning any specific information he might have concerning violence planned by the VVAW during the Republican National Convention. He was told that this was an outgrowth of an article which appeared in the "Straight Creek Journal," which indicated [REDACTED] was aware of VVAW activities in Florida in July and August, 1972. *u*

SA [REDACTED] advised [REDACTED] that the Denver Office was in receipt of a letter purportedly signed by him saying that he did not want to talk to the "Gestapo." [REDACTED] said he remembered writing a letter to the FBI, but did not recall what he said. [REDACTED] was asked if he knew of any planned violence by any organization at the Republican National Convention, and [REDACTED] replied that he did not. Further, he said he did not know of any violent acts or plans by VVAW members in Denver. *u*

The Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW), is a national organization composed primarily of veterans of the War in Vietnam, that has organized and participated in numerous demonstrations against the War in Vietnam during 1970-1972, including the seizure of the Statue of Liberty, New York City, and the occupation of the Betsy Ross House, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, in December, 1971. Six members of the VVAW were indicted by a Federal Grand Jury, Tallahassee, Florida, July, 1972, on charge of conspiracy to violate the Federal Antiriot Law.

On March 20, 1973, a confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised the following.

The Young Workers Liberation League (YWLL), is a front organization of the Communist Party, USA (CPUSA). It was formed as a Marxist-Leninist youth group in February, 1970.

In a briefing on conditions of the VVAW in the Los Angeles area, it was disclosed that there are 13 chapters in the Greater Los Angeles area and although addresses were not disclosed for these chapters, [REDACTED]

On Wednesday, March 14, 1973, Camil, Jane Fonda and Alex Knopp, antiwar activist, spoke at a college in Costa Mesa, California. Camil talked on the indictment of the Gainesville 8; Knopp spoke on the bombing of Bach Mai Hospital in North Vietnam, and Fonda spoke on the Vietnamese women's role in their fight for freedom. She stated that the United States Government would have to rebuild North Vietnam because of the extensive damage which has been caused there. She also discussed extensive support for the AIM whom she said were the true Americans and also for the black people of the United States.

After the speeches, a discussion was held with Jane Fonda pertaining to getting medical supplies to the Bach Mai Hospital. She stated that any supplies obtained would have to go through a neutral country in order to be delivered to North Vietnam. Fonda requested that speaking engagements in Florida

be obtained for her in the future in order to raise money for the Bach Mai Hospital. Alex Knopp also requested speaking engagements and stated that if such engagements could be obtained, he could be contacted in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, at telephone number R15-REBATES, which he said was a code for the actual number.

Following the speeches, the VVAW members attended the AIM-sponsored demonstration at the Federal Building at Los Angeles. About three hundred persons were present and they carried posters condemning repression of Indians. This demonstration was in support of Wounded Knee. Speaking at the demonstration was Angela Davis, Los Angeles Communist Party member, who talked about oppression of the red, black and white persons in the United States. She stated the Federal Government must provide a better standard of living for all persons and said that first there was red slavery, then black slavery, and now poor white slavery. She stated that all the oppressed people must unite.

On March 15, 1973, Camil and Fonda again spoke, this time at the El Camino College. Camil again spoke of the Federal indictment against himself and others. Fonda talked about the bombing of the dikes in Vietnam and the Bach Mai Hospital. She discussed about her speech on radio in North Vietnam and said that she asked to speak rather than being asked by the North Vietnamese.

During a question and answer period after the speech, Fonda told about the visit to Los Angeles on March 31, 1973, of President Thieu of South Vietnam. She said that her group, the IPC, will sponsor marches and demonstrations upon Thieu's arrival. She said the VVAW would also be a sponsor of the demonstrations. Planned at present were demonstrations at Thieu's hotel, including an all-night vigil. She stated Thieu is coming to the United States to get big business to invest in South Vietnam and to make further slaves of the people. She said all those interested in demonstrating will have a meeting in a Los Angeles park on the night of March 31, 1973, to plan for a march on April 1, 1973, against the California White House. She also said that it is planned to light bonfires in the streets to tell President Thieu that he is not wanted in the United States.

Also met by Camil and [REDACTED] was a friend of Jane Fonda, who took photographs of combat actions in South Vietnam and who smuggled these films back to the United States. The films were 16mm. This individual never gave his name. These films were talked about by another friend of Jane Fonda, one [REDACTED] of [REDACTED] New York, New York, telephone number [REDACTED] stated that she would talk to appropriate producers to see if a feature film could be made from the film that was brought back from North Vietnam. [REDACTED] also stated she could get national news coverage of the VVAW convention if it were held in a northern state where good coverage was available. She said she wanted exclusive rights to any such coverage. She stated that for further information she could be contacted at the New York address or in Los Angeles at [REDACTED] telephone number [REDACTED] where she is staying with her daughter.

Discussed at this meeting was support by the VVAW of the YWLL in Watts, AIM, and IPC. It was noted that it is necessary to gain support from all VVAW members in the area for the demonstrations against President Thieu on March 31, 1973. In addition, the convention in New Mexico was discussed and it was agreed by all concerned that the convention site should not be switched to Ohio, but should be held in New Mexico as previously planned.

After getting gassed at the Democratic Convention in Chicago and caught in the general "down" of the peace movement, VVAW was nearly inactive until the moratoriums in the fall of 1969. Members of VVAW led student strikes on major campuses across the country and battled Veterans Administration Hospital authorities over threats to throw amputee Vietnam veterans out for signing anti-war petitions. The VVAW is a national organization, composed primarily of veterans of the Vietnam War, which has conducted demonstrations against the war during 1970-1972. Its first published objective is to demand an immediate end to the fighting and withdrawal of all American troops from Indochina.

The Pittsburgh Chapter of VVAW was formed during 1971, primarily to bring an immediate cessation of fighting and the withdrawal of all American military personnel from Indochina.

PITTSBURGH GUERRILLA THEATER (PGT)

The PGT is the name of a group formed in late 1968 or early 1969 to dramatize, through theater, some issues of the war. Membership changes frequently due to the interest or lack of interest in the current activity being planned.

ORGANIZATION:

When interviewed by a Special Agent of the FBI on March 7, 1973, [REDACTED] Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, advised as follows:

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The Pittsburgh Chapter of the VVAW has no headquarters, [REDACTED] He stated the chapter was loosely affiliated with the National VVAW, but operated independently. The chapter has an outstanding phone bill of \$300, and only \$2.10 in the treasury. He stated the Pittsburgh VVAW has no publication, does not recruit, and has no future plans now that the Vietnam War has been brought to an end. He said the Pittsburgh VVAW, for all intents and purposes, has ceased to function as an organization.

On March 8, 1973, [redacted] advised the Pittsburgh VVAW has fallen apart and ceased to exist. It has no headquarters, officers, members, meetings or activities at this time. There are no finances available and no literature or material of a local nature being distributed.

II: ACTIVITIES:

On June 9, 1972, [redacted] furnished a list of VVAW coordinators for the Western Pennsylvania - Western Maryland - West Virginia (WPA-WMD-WVA) area. Named on that list were [redacted]

On March 7, 1973, [redacted] supra, identified the above individuals as former members of the Pittsburgh VVAW. According to [redacted] the National VVAW headquarters at one time gave the title of Regional Coordinator to anyone who paid their dues and who had no active chapter in the area where they lived. It was expected that they would recruit members and form a new chapter. He described [redacted] and [redacted] as being Pittsburgh residents.

On July 13, 1972, [redacted] furnished a VVAW Coordinator list, issued by the VVAW headquartered in New York City, which indicated that [redacted] 3601 Boulevard of the Allies, Pittsburgh, Pa., was the VVAW Coordinator for the WPA-WMD-WVA area.

On July 13, 1972, [redacted] advised the Pittsburgh VVAW had lost their office at 3601 Blvd. of the Allies, Pittsburgh, Pa.

[redacted] furnished information during the period July 21 - 24, 1972, concerning persons who attended the VVAW National Steering Committee Meeting held those dates at Milwaukee, Wisconsin. One of those reported in attendance was [redacted] Regional Coordinator, WPA-WMD-WVA, 3601 Blvd. of Allies, Pittsburgh, Pa.

On August 2, 1972, [redacted] advised that [redacted] are no longer active in the Pittsburgh VVAW.

On August 17, 1972, [redacted] advised that [redacted] and [redacted] Pittsburgh VVAW members, planned to depart Pittsburgh on August 18, 1972, to go to Miami, Fla., to participate in VVAW demonstrations at the Republican National Convention.

On March 7, 1973, [redacted] supra, identified [redacted] as Pittsburgh VVAW members who travelled to Miami, Fla., to participate in the VVAW sponsored demonstrations at the Republican National Convention.

On September 11, 1972, [redacted] advised that the VVAW was holding meetings at the residence of [redacted] Pittsburgh, Pa.

On September 25, 1972, [redacted] advised that [redacted] and [redacted] were the only active Pittsburgh VVAW members at that time. According to this informant, most of the Pittsburgh VVAW members got tired of the endless meetings and bickering of [redacted]. As a result, most of the VVAW members dropped out of the organization.

On September 26, 1972, [redacted] reported that [redacted] had withdrawn from the VVAW.

On October 20, 1972, [redacted] advised that the Pittsburgh Guerrilla Theater met with two members of VVAW on October 1972, and decided to take part in the Veterans Day Parade along with the Pittsburgh VVAW. At the conclusion of the parade the group was to proceed to Nixon election headquarters and put on an anti-war skit consisting of mock-up airplanes in a simulated air raid. Bomb explosions were to be duplicated by fly ash or smoke grenades.

On October 24, 1972, [redacted] advised that [redacted] and [redacted] representing Pittsburgh VVAW, participated in an anti-AGNEW demonstration which took place on October 21, 1972, at the Pittsburgh Hilton Hotel.

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
