





Information with respect to VVAW/WSO Regional Conference 5/25-27/74 at Riverside, California, has been referred to briefly in this report and will, in addition, be the topic of a separate letterhead memorandum (LHM) to be submitted, shortly by Los Angeles Division.

Detailed information regarding the VVAW/WSO meetings and for the California/Nevada Region including demonstrations has been previously furnished to Bureau and other offices by separate disseminatable communications and therefore only brief summarys are included in this report, where applicable.

Membership figure noted in this report are specifically set forth as estimates. Reliable informant coverage indicates a downward trend in membership recently. This may be in part a result of recent formation of the American Veterans Movement (AVM) as organized by RON KOVIC, former VVAW/WSO coordinator. Comment regarding AVM has been kept to a minimum in this report, however, as Bureau by separate communication has indicated it poses no revolutionary threat and Los Angeles case is closed per Bureau instructions.

This investigation is based on information which indicates that captioned organization is engaged in activities which could involve violations of Title 18, U.S. Code 2383 (Rebellion or Insurrection), 2384 (Seditious Conspiracy), 2385 (Advocating Overthrow of the Government), 2387 (Sedition), and 793 (Espionage).

VVAW/WSO was organized in New York City in 1967 as an organization of Vietnam veterans to protest the American involvement in the war in Southeast Asia. VVAW/WSO engaged in various protest activities but during late 1971 demonstrated increasing militancy, culminating in December 1971 with VVAW/WSO takeover of various American landmarks and public buildings. Information was also developed indicating that some VVAW/WSO chapters were cooperating with or infiltrated by communist-dominated groups including the Communist Party, USA (CPUSA), and the Socialist Workers Party (SWP). Certain VVAW/WSO leaders were quoted as telling members VVAW/WSO is a revolutionary organization and not "just another group of war veterais." VVAW/WSO leaders have traveled to North Vietnam and have reportedly established liaison with revolutionary or terrorist groups internationally. In January 1973 at a National Steering Committee meeting, VVAW/WSO leaders discussed programs aimed at obtaining support from or influencing active duty military personnel. They also discussed obtaining access to classified Government information to be used against U.S. interests and one leader subsequently actively engaged in such activity. There were also indications at this meeting that VVAW/WSO activists possessed the technical knowledge and training to carry out any revolutionary program proposed. In August 1973 at a National Steering Committee meeting, some members of the national leadership promoted education of the entire VVAW/WSO membership in Marxist-Leninist doctrine directing the organization into political growth along Marxist-Leninist lines. The VVAW/WSO currently has a factional dispute between Maoist and Stalinist groups. The Stalinist group is supported by the National Office of VVAW/WSO. Additionally, the National Office contributed financial


support to a program of recruitment of military personnel designed to promote political indoctrination with the objective of creating disruption and disorientation within the military at such time as there is a revolution within the United States. VVAW/WSO is currently headquartered in Chicago, Illinois.



I. ORIGIN AND SCOPE

(11/10/71) (6/6/74)

Source advised the Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW) movement was formerly known in the Los Angeles area as the California Veterans Movement (CVM). The CVM in 1971 was headquartered at 3503 West Pico Boulevard, Los Angeles, California.

The VVAW was formed in 1967 as an organization of Vietnam veterans to protest American involvement in the war in Southeast Asia. Since that time VVAW leaders have told members the VVAW is a revolutionary group, not "just another group of war veterans." Also, the membership has been told the VVAW has been æked to cooperate on an international level with many organizations, including communist and Maoist groups. Additionally, it was indicated that "anti-imperialist groups" consider the VVAW a potent organization of similar stature in the United In April 1973 the group changed their name to VVAW/WSO so that non-veterans could become members. Current VVAW/WSO national officers are Marxist-Leninist oriented and strive to educate their membership in Marxist-Leninist doctrine.

b2 b10 in 1974 advised the CVM was a loosely women ad hoc group of veterans and sympathizers opposed to United States' involvement and intervention in Southeast Asia. CVM advocated the immediate withdrawal of the United States military personnel and succession of all United States imperialistic activities in Southeast Asia.

(4/28/72)

Source reported on April 28, 1972, CVM officially changed its name to VVAW. CVM had previously supported the VVAW but had not until this time decided to call themselves a VVAW chapter.

(4/27/73)

Source reported at the VVAW National Steering Committee meeting held at Placitas, New Mexico, April 19-22, 1973, that the membership decided that immediately the organization would be called VVAW/Winter Soldier Organization (VVAW/WSO).

(5/28/74) (5/13/74)

Source reported in the Regional Office Report of the California/Nevada Regional Office VVAW/WSO published May 24, 1974, at 255 East Williams Street, San Jose, California, it was reported that within a few weeks the Region will file for nonprofit corporate status in the State of California. This reportedly will be under the section of the law which qualifies parental organizations, organized into lodges, which exist to get and give proceeds to their members. The report indicated there was no exclusion from political work and the new name of the organization will be California VVAW/WSO Incorporated, and will also be the California/Nevada Regional Office of an Illinois corporation known as VVAW/WSO. Membership will not be transferred from any existing association and a mailing will be sent asking people to join the new corporation for \$1.00 a year. The legal incorporators will be veterans and it is expected that this will make recognized veteran status in the State possible. The VVAW/WSO National Office has advised all regions to incorporate in their own state. National will incorporate under Section 501 (C) 19 of the Internal Revenue Service Code.

11/10/73) (6/3/74)

Source advised the Los Angeles area VVAW/WSO is broken down into organizing committees and chapters. The criteria necessary in attaining a chapter status is the collection of nine or more members in any given areas. If the Coordinator is unable to organize

the necessary number of members in his area that group then becomes an organizing committee by definition. The purpose of differentiating between a chapter and organizing committee is to create a more equitable arrangement with regular member representation when regional elections are held. A chapter is entitled to five votes and an organizing committee three votes. The aforementioned guidelines of chapters and organizations were advocated during the California/Nevada Regional Conference, September 22-23, 1973.

(3/20/74)

Source reported that prior to March 20, 1974, the California/Nevada Regional Office VVAW/WSO was located at 1810 East Anaheim Street, Long Beach, California. Effective on or about that date the Regional Office moved and is now located at 1255 East Williams Street, San Jose, California. The Regional Office functions as a coordinating center of VVAW/WSO chapter and organizing committees in the California/ Nevada Region and acts as spokesman for the Region to the National Office VVAW/WSO located at 827 West Newport Avenue, Chicago, Illinois. The Regional takes its directive from the Mational Office.



IV. MEMBERSHIP

Sources reported at one time there were as many as 100 to 200 members of the TVAW and VVAW/WSO in the Los Angeles, California area. At the present time, however, sources estimate the VVAW/WSO does not exceed 25 to 30 members. The estimated number of members in each of the four organizing committees, San Bernardino/Riverside Santa Berbara, Ervine, Sen Fernando Valley, are estimated to be two each maximum. It should also be noted also decled and joined a group called the American Petaras Suvement (AV.).

Los Angeles Times newspaper article of April 18, 1974 identified RON KOVIC as spokesman for the AVM and described it as identifying itself as an organization of veterans interested in increasing the rights of all veterans and improving conditions in Veterans Administration (VA) hospitals.

RON KOVIC is a Vietnam veteran, a former Sub-Regional Coordinator of the VVAW/WSO and a paraplegic.

VENICE CHAPTER

Source reported at regular meetings of the Venice Chapter, VVAW/WSO held May 1, 1974 through May 22, 1974, there were approximately five to nine individuals in attendance.



Source estimated on June 3, 1974 there are nine members of the Venice Chapter VVAW/WSO.

LONG BEACH CHAPTER

(4/12/74 - 6/4/74)

Source reported at a regular meeting of the Long Beach Chapter VVAW/WSO held on April 3, 1974 there were four members in attendance. Source estimates there are approximately seven to eight members of the Long Beach Chapter.



Sources reported at the VVAW/WSO California/Nevada Regional Conference held May 25-26, 1974, at Riverside, California, there were approximately 35 to 70 individuals in attendance, at different periods, and estimated no more than 18 are from the Los Angeles area.

V. PUBLICATIONS

(6/3/74) 3/1/74) 5/31/74)

Sources on dates indicated reported the California/ Nevada Regional VVAW/WSO publishes a monthly newsletter on an irregular basis entitled "Favorite Sons". The publication is mailed to members and nonmembers alike and contains general information regarding VVAW/WSO activities. The publication is a type-written Xeroxed machine copy document.

VI. FINANCES

(3/20/74 (5/28/74)

Source provided information that as of December 31, 1973, the California/Nevada Regional Office WWAW/WSO incurred a net operating loss of \$2,950.50 with the year ending 1973. In addition the Region has outstanding debts in the amount of \$8,473.32. income (source not specifically identified) was \$9,937.84 plus outstanding loans owed from individuals of \$8,473.32. Total operating expenses for the period listed as \$12,888,38.

Source reported March 20, 1974, when the California/New da Regional Office of the FYAW/WSO moved from 1810 Anahaim Struct, long Beach, to San Jose, Caldfornia, it left owing a transhone bill of \$900.00 to General Takapi the Commany, Santa Monica, Cailfornia.

Sources reported on June 4, 1974, the California/Nevada Region VVAW/WSO has no income that exceeds an amount estimated to be \$100.00 per month. Sources knew of no loans outstanding to the organization and felt sales of publications and other items such as buttons and posters was limited.

VII. CONNECTIONS WITH OTHER GROUPS

(5/28/74)

Source reported at the California/Nevada Regional Conference VVAW/WSO held January 26-27, 1974, at San Francisco, California, it was reported that the Los Angeles area VVAW/WSO had developed good contacts with the Movement for a Democratic Military (MDM) in the Long Beach, California, area, have good contacts with local "radical bookstores" in the Venice, California area, and are involved with La Raza Unida in the East Los Angeles area at the present time.

MDM was organized in Southern California in December 1969, and is an organization composed primarily of military personnel in opposition to present military procedures. MDM has sponsored Marxist-Leninist study groups and offered counseling to military personnel charged with unauthorized absences, refusing orders, destruction of government property, riots and other dissident activities.

La Raza Unida Party is a legally constituted political party in Los Angeles organized to promote the political interests of the Mexican-American community.

The RU was founded in early 1968 and is a military semiclandestine organization. Its objectives, as set out in its publications, are the development of a united front sgainst imperiation, the fostering of revolutionary working-class unity and leadership in streagle, and the formation of a communist party based on Marxism-Leninism-MAC Ise-tung thought, leading to the overthrow of the United States Government by force and violence.

The October League (OL) was formed in 1969 in Los Angeles, Caidfoldia, as an informal group of Marvist-Louinist individuals with the purpose of instabling in the working class a Marxist-Louinist philotophy. In Late 1971, its founders detailed to organize

nationally to form a new communist party in the United States based upon the revolutionary theory of Marxism-Leninism-MAO Tse-tung, with the purpose of uniting and leading the working class and its allies, the oppressed minorities, in a military insurrection to establish a new proletarian state. Numerous leaders of the OL have visited the People's Republic of China to solicit the support of the Chinese Government in the OL's revolutionary activities.



Publicity and the general activities are correlated through the Peace Action Council (PAC) at Los Angeles, California. The SCDCP sought to control the CRDC by placing SCDCP members on the Steering Committee of the CRDC, and to broaden the appeal of various politically left oriented organizations particularly those with Spanish-Mexican or Latin descent.

The PAC is an umbrella organization which coordinates demonstrations and other forms of protests against American involvement in Southeast Asia. MARTIN HALL, its Chairman, has been publicly identified as having been a leading figure in the Communist Party in Germany.

The Long March is a building located at 715 South Parkview Street, los Angeles, California, and is a center of New Lest and radical-motivity in the Los Angeles area.

The YWLL is a front organization of the Communist Party USA (CPUSA). It was formed as a Marxist-Leninist youth group in February 1970.

The PFP is a legally constituted political party in the State of California.

The PLP founded in 1965 by former members of the CPUSA, who assertedly followed a Chinese Communist line, is a revolutionary Marxist-Leninist organization dedicated to a dictatorship of the working class.

Formed in December 1970, the VO, also known as Venceremos, is a militant Marxist-Leninist-Maoist organization composed of third world and white revolutionaries operating in the San Francisco peninsula area. The publicly stated goal of the VO is to build a united front against the United States Government by force and violence, armed struggle, and urban guerrilla warfare. The VO has publicly stated that all members must know how to operate and service weapons, and have weapons available.

The SPL was founded in 1964, by former members of the SWP. The objective of SPL is to destroy the capitalistic system and create a working-class system.

The YSA is a multi-national revolutionary socialist youth organization. It is the youth group of the SWP and controlled and dominated by that organization.

The AIM was founded in Minnesota in 1968, dedicated to improving conditions for the American Indian. AIM recently led and participated in confrontations with local authorities in Scottsbluff, Nebraska, and the Rapid City-Custer area of South Dakota. AIM led the takeover and occupation of Wounded Knee, South Dakota, in February - May 1973.

WSP is a peace oriented women's organization opposed to the United States foreign policy in Vietnam. Founded in 1961 Washington, D.C., local Southern California WSP headquarters are maintained at 5899 West Pico Boulevard, Los Angeles, California. WSP locally is quite active in draft counseling. WSP is a non-membership organization and has no officers. No effort is made to exclude from its activities members of, or persons sympathetic to, the Communist Party, USA, and related groups.

VIRTNAM VETERANS AGAINST THE WAR/ WINTER SOLDIER ORGANIZATION (VVAN/WSO)

The Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW) was formed in 1967 as an organization of Vietnam veterans to protest American involvement in the war in Southeast Asia. Since that time VVAW leaders have teld members the WVM is a revolutionary group, not "just another group of war veterans." Also, the membership has been told the VVAW has been asked to ocoperate on an international level with many ergadinations, including communist and Madist groups. Additionally, it was indicated that "enti-imperialist arraps" consider the VVAV a potent organization of similar statute in the U.S. In April, 1973, the group changed their name to VVAW/ Winter Soldier Organization (NSO) so that non-vauguous could become members. Current VVAW/WSO national officers are Marxist-Leninist oriented and strive to educate their membership in Marxist-Leninist doctrine.

On March 3, 1974, a confidential source who has furnished reliable information in the past advised that the Tampa Chapter of the VVAW is an independent chapter affiliated with the National VVAW, Chicago Illinois. As such, it adheres to the aims and purposes of the National VVAW. The Tampa Chapter withdrew from the Florida Region because of differences with the Miami VVAN Chapter and at present has no intentions of rejoining the Florida Region.

The Tampa Chapter will work with any other group in cooperation if the aims and purposes of the group coincide to some degree with those of the VVAW. The VVAW shares their headquarters with the Rod Star Cadre (RSC) and would be willing to share the space with other groups if they wish to join in the financing of the headquarters.

VIETHAM VETERANS AGAINST THE WAR/ WINTER SOLDIER OFFICANIZATION (VVAW/WSO)



The Red Star Cadre (RSC) was formed in Tampa, Florida, Suring October, 1972, as a Marxist-Leninist (M/L) study group. As of May, 1973, the RSC was in contact with other M/L groups attempting to form a new M/L Communist Party in the United States.

On March 9, 1974, the source advised that Scott Camil, former Florida Regional Coordinator, is currently writing a book on the "Gainesville Eight" trial in Cainesville, Florida, and has finished one chapter. CAMIL is keeping a low profile until after his book is finished and in the meantime is not participating in any VVAW argivities. He expects to finish the book in approximately one year.

On April 9, 1974, course advised that the National VVAW Office would not allow the Tampa Chapter to attend the April 11-15, 1974, National Steering Committee Meeting (NSCM) in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, because of the criticism of the National Office by individual Tampa members in letters written to the National Office. Reportedly the National Office was advised by Tampa that Tampa considered the actions of the National Office to be more in keeping with a capitalist state than with the ideals set down by the VVAW, and would contact all regions of the VVAW to inform the entire VVAW of the refusal by the National Office to allow the Tampa Chapter to attend the NSCM.

On April 24, 1974, source advised the Tampa VVAW Chapter called a meeting on April 23, 1974, to determine if the Chapter wanted to rejoin the Florida Region. The Chapter voted 13 to 0, without the coordinator voting, not to meenter Florida Region.

The Tampa Chapter decided not to attend the Florida Regional Meeting set for Gainesville, Florida. In addition, Tampa decided to advise the Mational Office of their decision and tell the Mational Office that Tampa would never rejoin the Florida Region as long as Don Pennington remained as leader of the Miami Chapter.

On May 30, 1974, source advised that the Florida-Georgia Region is assentially inactive with the exception of the Tampa Chapter, which has been highly active in areas such as veteran's rights and prison reforms. Although an independent chapter, the Tampa Chapter continues to support the aims and purposes of the Nacional VVAV. The Tampa Chapter has approximately 15 active members.

The Chapters currently comprising the Florida Region are Tallohassee, with three members, Gainesville, with two members, Ft. Laudqudale, with two members, and Mismi, with three members.

On May 20, 1974, source advised that the National VVAW had requested the Tampa Chapter to return to the Florida Region and was advised the Tampa Chapter had voted not to return. The National Office was also advised that since Tampa was not allowed to attend MSCMs to present its position to all the regions, Tampa would send newsletters to all regions presenting the Tampa resultion. Tampa feels the Florida Region is inactive due to fighting, arguing and back stabbing among chapters and members and Tampa refuses to become involved.

The National Office also requested the Tampa Chapter to participate in the VVAW sponsored Amnesty Demonstration to be held in Washington, D.C., July 1-4, 1974. In addition, Tampa was contacted by the American Veterans Movement (AVM), a new veterans group in Los Angeles, California, and asked to join the AVM in their demonstration in Washington, D.C., beginning July 4, 1974.

On June 5, 1974, source advised that the Tampa Chapter voted to attend both the VVAN demonstration on July 1-4, 1974, at Washington, D.G., and remain for the AVM demonstration beginning on July 4, 1974. Approximately 20 members and non-member students at the University of South Florida (USF), Tampa, Florida, have expressed a desire to attend the demonstrations in Washington, D.C.

This investigation is based on information which indicates that captioned organization is engaged in a ctivities which could involve violation of Title 18, U. S. Code, 2383 (Robellion or Insurrection), 2384 (Seditions Conspiracy), 2385 (Advocating Overthrow Of The Government), 2386 (Sedition), 793 (Espionage), 844 (Explosives and Incendiary Devices), 2155-56 (Sabotage), and 2101 (Anti-Riot Laws.)

On April 8, 1973, advised the Chicago Chapter, Vietnam Veterans Against The War/Winter Soldier Organization (VVAW/WSO) was present at a meeting of the Northern Illinois - Iowa VVAW/WSO region.

VVAW/WSO was organized in New York City in 1967 as an organization of Vietnam veterans to protest the American involvement in the war in Southeast Asia. VVAW/WSO engaged in various protest activity, but during late 1971, demonstrated increasing militancy, culminating in December 1971, with VVAW/WSO takeover of various American landmarks and public buildings. Information was also developed indicating that some VVAW/WSO Chapters were cooperating with or infilitrated by communist-dominated groups including the communist party, USA, and the Socialist Workers Party (SWP). Certain VVAW/WSO leaders were quoted as telling members VVAW/WSO is a revolutionary organization and not "just another group of war veterans". VVAW/WSO leaders have traveled to North Vietnam and have reportedly stablished liaison with revolutionary or terroist groups internationally. During July, 1972, VVAW/WSO leaders and members were indicted by a Federal Grand Jury (FGJ), Tallahassee, for violation of Foderal statutes, including Conspiracy to Riot During Republican National Convention, August, 1972. One of these individuals was also









indicted for possission of an unregistered explosive and incondiary device. In January, 1973, at a National Steering Committee meeting, VVAW/WSO leaders discussed programs aimed at obtaining support from or influencing active military personnel. They also discussed obtaining access to classified Government information to be used against U.S. interests and onleader subsequently actively engaged in such activity. There were also indications at this meeting that VVAW/WSO activitists possessed the technical knowledge and training to carry out any revolutionary program proposed. In addition, information has been reported from a source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, that a VVAW/WSO member previously discussed engaging in sabotage and was possibly involved in the destruction of an ammunition train in Arizona. VVAW/WSO is currently headquartered in Chicago, Illinois.



VII. ACTIVITIES

The December 8, 1971 issue of the "Chicago Daily News", a Chicago daily newspaper, contained an article indicating about thirty VVAW/WSO members led by BART SAVAGE were thwarted from tossing decapitated dolls smeared with red paint onto the floor of the Midwest Stock Exchange, Chicago. SAVAGE stated the dolls symbolized the children killed in Vietnam by weapons and explosives manufactured by U. S. firms. There were no arrests.

On December 28, 1971, about 65 demonstrators from various groups, including VVAW/WSO, conducted a praceful non-violent demonstration against the bombing of Vietnam at the Federal Building, Chicago.

On October 25, 1971, a veterans day march and rally sponsored by VFP and VVAW/WSO was held in downtown Chicago under permit issued by the City of Chicago. Approximately 400 individuals participated. Speakers were introduced by BART SAVAGE and included LEROY WOLINS.

A member of the North Chicago Police Department advised that on May 20, 1972, approximately 800 persons representing VVAW/WSO and two other groups marched approximately one mile adjacent to the boundary of the Great lakes Naval Training Center in opposition to the war in Southeast Asia. The march was followed by speakers, one of whom represented the Black Panther Party (BPP). There were no arrests.

The Black Panther Party (BPP) is a black extremist organization started in Oakland, California in December, 1966. It formerly advocated the use of guns and guerrilla tactics to bring about the overthrow of the United States Government. Since early 1971 it has preached a policy of "survival pending revolution", and is seeking to organize the black community for the revolution it claims will ultimately follow.







On September 9, 1972, a representative of the Chicago Police Department advised 23 members of VVAW/WSO gathered at President Nixon's campaign office 110 South Dearborn Street, Chicago, demonstrating and demanding an end of the war in Vietnam. The group then marched to the Federal Building, where two participants attempted to turn themselves in to building guards for "war crimes" committed in Vietnam. Becoming impatient after a short time, the group returned to the campaign office, where they handed in war medals. The demonstration was peaceful and non-violent.



On November 4, 1972, therewas a peaceful non-violent demonstration consisting of approximately 200 people at the Civic Center, Chicago, and subsequent march to the Federal Building, 219 South Dearborn Street. The theme of the demonstration was "Stop the War". Speakers included members of RU and VVAW/WSO.



On November 3, 1972, there was a political rally at the Illinois Air National Guard, O'Hare Airport, consisting of about 7,000 people. A few minutes after the President began his speech about a dozen peace activists staged a demonstration. It appeared this was led by a member of the VVAW/WSO and a member of the Chicago Peace Council (CPC). The demonstrators were noisy and called the President a "murderer". They caused considerable disruptions. No arrests were noted.

On September 28, 1973, an Indo-China Peace Campaign (IPC) tour featuring JANE FONDA and TOM HAYDEN was present in Chicago. The Chicago Chapter VVAW/WSO was presenting the tour.

The IPC was organized in August, 1972, to make the then opcoming national election a referendum on the United States war activities in Vietnam. The organization continued subsequent to the election and later ceased fire in Vietnam, calling for removal of all American Armed Forces from Indo-Chiaa, directing its attention to returned American prisoners of war and the issue of so called political prisoners was held in South Vietnam.

HAYDEN, married to FONDA in January, 1973, was one of the founders of Students for a Democratic society (SDS), in early 1960's. He was a defendent in the so-called Conspiracy 7 trial in Chicago, in 1969-1970, with defendents convicted of having violated the Federal Anti-Riot Statute as a result of activities surrounding the Democratic Mational Convention, August, 1968, in Chicago. That conviction was overturned on appeal.

In late 1970, FONDA undertook an Anti-War speaking tour of college campuses throughout the country. In 1971, she participated in a "Free the Army" anti-war anti-establishment entertainment review presented near military establishments across the United States. In the summer of 1972, FONDA visited North Vietnam and upon her return to this country criticized United States Military Forces for bombing dikes in North Vietnam.



SDS was founded during June, 1962, at Port
Huron, Michigan, and in the 1960's functioned as
the leading New Left campus-based student organization in the United States. From an initial posture
of "participatory democracy", SDS moved to a radicalrevolutionary position, with debate centering on how
best to create a revolutionary youth movement. Internal factionalism produced a split during the SDS
National Convention in June, 1969, Which resulted in
the following three factions: Weatherman; Worker
Student Allianc: (WSA); and Revolutionary Youth





(RYM). The Weatherman and RYM are no longer affiliated with SDS. (REAL MSA continues to use the name SDS and maintains lis national headquarters in Boston, Massachusetts.

On November 11, 1973, VVAW/WSO leafleted the activities of the Veterans of Foreign Wars at the Civic Center, Chicago, and on November 28, 1973, members of the VVAW/WSO sold copies of the official nowspaper "Winter Soldier" on the University of Chicago () campus.

Numerous Chicago Chapter members of VVAW/WSO were recognized in a peaceful non-violent demonstration and march, Chicago, Illinois, January 26, 1974, the main theme of which was to impeach the President.

The Chicago Chapter VVAW/WSO participated in a peaceful non-violent demonstation against the President, Chicago, Illinois, March 15, 1974.

On March 29, 1974, six individuals representing the Chicago Chapter VVAW/WSO passed out flyers at the Veterans Administration (VA) complex, 820 South Damen, Chicago. The flyers indicated the VVAW/WSO non-acceptance of "Nixon's Token Holiday" (Vietnam Veterans Day) and their demand for better veterans benefits.

The Chicago Chapter VVAW/WSO holds weekly meetings, attends regional and national meetings, and holds various other peaceful non-violent functions and social activities.

It is the opinion of each of these individuals that the group demonstrating at the Federal Building in Phoenix on 3/29/74 was strictly an ad hoc coalition of "long hairs, professional demonstrators and malcontents" not affiliated with the national organization and further, that there is no VVAW organization chapter or membership in the Phoenix area. Phoenix concurs with these feelings.

The conclusion of the above-mentioned police sources has been reached after numerous contacts and extensive investigation inasmuch as all police agencies in the Phoenix area were extremely interested in making a determination as to whether there was or was not a VVAW chapter in the Phoenix area.

It appears to Phoenix that the opinions stated above are substantiated by the following:

On 4/10/74, reported that the Internal Report of the 12th National VVAW/WSO National Steering Committee Meeting held at Milwaukee, Wisconsin, on dates 4/11-4/15/74 contained the following statement:

"...other areas that are basically defunct are New Mexico/Arizona...these areas may have to remain separate regions for the simple reason that there is not a strong adjacent region to annex them to which would be capable of taking on the extra work at this time."

Phoenix is confident that at least one of the above sources would be aware of VVAW-type activity if it was present in the Phoenix area; therefore, based







They request the letters be ment to the Police Department in Oakland, California or to the VVAW/WSO Defense Committee in Oakland, California.

On 6/9/74, the same source advised that during the national VVAW/WSO demonstrations in Washington, D.C. from 7/1 ~ 7/3/74, there will be militant actions at the Veterans Administration, the Justice Department, the White House, the Pentagon, the Congress, and the Court of Military Appeals. On 7/4/74 there will be a large rally and march and anyone will be allowed to join in; however, they will be required to stay with the people from their region which they hope will cut down on any Agent provocaters causing trouble. They currently have places where they will be allowed to stay in Washington, D.C. and each region will be responsible for its members, including providing for their own internal affairs, keeping their members in line, and dealing with anyone who is suspected of being an Agent of some sort.

The St. Louis chapter is currently attempting to obtain as many medical supplies as possible to take with them on this demonstration in Washington, D.C. in the event of violence towards them on the part of local authorities.





Sources report that <u>non-violence</u> is always stressed within the VVAW meetings. There are no political teachings or discussions in the meetings as it is felt that nothing can be accomplished, and the majority of the people attending the meetings are not interested in political teachings or discussions. further advised that political education classes are given every Sunday, a.m., for those interested, but these classes are not required by the organization and seem to be on an individual basis. These classes are attended by 5-10 people. edvised that these classes are structured along Marxist-Leninist-Maoist lines; however, do not teach violence. As stated above. advised that the local VVAW believes that the revolution will come about through non-violent means. They believe that capitalism will destroy itself, and eventually the general public will become disenchanted with capitalism. At that time the people will be right for the revolution and thus, the revolution will occur non-violently. To substantiate this, they are using the Watergate incident, energy crisis, and the current economic situation in the United States where hopefully these situations will turn into crises, and capitalism will destroy itself by the public eventually falling on hard times, thus becoming disenchanted and blaming the Government. The public will then, in turn, overthrow or dissolve the Government, thus opening the way for a nonviolent revolution.





Source believes the Oneonta Chapter is not a legitimate Veterans Organization as membership is now largely non-veteran. Source advised the leader of the chapter is definitely not violence-prone and steers the group away from situations where any violence may occur. Source stated is anticipating a long hard struggle of many years to obtain the organizations objectives such as anmesty for draft evaders. Source is not aware of Marxist-Leninist infiltraters in VVAW/WSO and knows of no plans for violence or overthrow of the U.S. Government.

The following information is provided in response to referenced communication, as requested, it has been gleaned from informants and review of VVAW/WSO files:

The sub-regional office of the California Nevada Region, VVAW/WSO is headquartered in Long Beach, California, and also serves as the Long Beach Chapter Office. One other group reported to be large enough for chapter status (nine or more members) exists in Venice. California Long Beach Chapter is covered by members, and a non-member. The venice Chapter is covered by a member. Recently, all sources noted have agreed it is doubtful if either of these, so called chapters, have in reality the required number of members to qualify for chapter status. Informants feel, to a large degree, the subregional office is keeping the Los Angeles area subregion "alive" with unsubstantiated membership figures in order to exist as an organization and keep the National Office thinking they are a functionary body Additionally, there are four (4) organizing committees (00), namely, Inland Empire (Riverside and San Bernardino, California) Irvine, San Fernando Valley, and Santa Berbara. covered by all members, and non members. is provided through general involvement with the VVAW/WSO at any level. It should be noted, however, at the VVAW/WSO Regional Conference held 5/25-27/74, Riverside, California, as many as 70 people attended but sources felt the large majority were not generally Los Angeles area members.

In this same regard, sources feel there are, at present, perhaps 35 individuals in the Los Angeles area that are "connected" with VVAW/WSO activities. Membership, as such, in the Los Angeles VVAW/WSO does not appear directly tied to faithfull attendance at meetings or participation in every event. It is, therefore, extremely difficult to do more than estimate membership figures, which continually vary and seem to include many peripheral "members".

2. The sub-regional office and its chapters generally support the policies of the National Office and function as a legitimate veterans organization, to the extent the National Office does so.

Jos Angeles Area. VVAW/WSO, are current ADEX subjects, and None are in a direct leadership position of the sub-regional but do appear to have some influence. This influence appears limited to opinions and general personal philosophy, however, and the sub-regional continues to follow the general guidelines of the National Office. Whether or not these three individuals or any others including the two sub-regional coordinators express Marxist-Leninist philosophy has not been specifically reported by informants. Any reference to this philosophy whether direct or subtle has seemed to eminate from the National rather than any local influence being directed upward, thereto.

Los Angeles would also like to point out that there appears to be great concern at the sub-regional levels regarding RON KOVIC and the American Veterans Movement (AVM). A portion of the recent Regional Conference at Riverside was devoted to this group and informants have indicated a discussion in this regard frequently occurs at VVAW/WSO meetings.

Informants feel the AVM has contributed to the decline in membership perhaps because as an organization it presents an alternative to the Marxist-Leninist approach to the so-called Veterans Movement.



Certain VVAW/WSO leaders were quoted as telling members VVAW/WSO is a revolutionary organization and not "just another group of war veterans". VVAW/WSO leaders have travelled to North Vietnam and have reportedly established liaison with revolutionary or terrorist groups internationally. During July, 1972, VVAW/WSO leaders and members were indicted by a Federal Grand Jury, Tallahassee, for violation of Federal Statutes, including conspiracy to riot during Republican National Convention, August, 1972. One of these individuals was also indicted for possession of an unregistered explosive and incendiary device. In January, 1973, at a National Steering Committee meeting, VVAW/WSO leaders discussed programs aimed at obtaining support from or influencing active duty military personnel. They also discussed obtaining access to classified Government information to be used against US interests and one leader subsequently actively engaged in such activity. There were also indications at this meeting that VVAW/WSO activists possessed the technical knowledge and training to carry out any revolutionary program In addition, information has been reported from a source that a VVAW/WSO member previously discussed engaging in sabotage and was possibly involved in the destruction of a munitions train in Arizona. VVAW/WSO is currently headquartered in Chicago, Illinois.

The SWP is a Trotskyist organization founded in the United States during 1938, with headquarters currently in New York City. While the SWP, like the CP, USA, does not openly advocate the violent overthrow of the United States Government at this time or violations of other Federal or state laws, the SWP believes that eventual revolution to overthrow the present capitalist system of government in the US is inevitable. The objective of the SWP, like the CP, USA is to organize a membership to take action to precipitate such a



revolution when conditions are ripe and to direct and seize control of the revolution when it occurs.



The following breakdown corresponds to questions and parts of questions as set forth in referenced airtel:

- (1) There is one chapter of the VVAW/WSO in the St. Louis Division located at 1023 Allen Avenue, SIMO, which location is also considered a regional headquarters for Eastern Missouri, Southern Illinois, Arkansas, and Oklahoma. There are approximately 20 members in this chapter; however, only approximately members are currently active. Currently there is nember informant in this chapter.
- (2) This chapter supports most of the policies of the national organization but feels that the national, New York region, and Bay area of San Francisco, are Maoist or Marxist dominated or oriented. The chapter does have some legitimate interests in Veterans' affairs.
- (3) The chapter does not completely subscribe to a Marxist-Leninist ideology; however, it could be considered as a Marxist or Socialist organization and has gone so far as condemning other organizations' violence such as the Symbionese Liberation Army and the Black Muslims while at the same time verbally supporting the Black Panthers in shoot-outs with police. The chapter has been very peaceful during the past few years although some members could resort to violence if they felt the need was great enough.
- (4) The chapter is not believed infiltrated or dominated by individuals supporting a Marxist-Leninist ideology or advocating the violent overthrow of the U.S. Government; however, if they feel a law is bad, it is felt they would go to great aims in order to change it and several members of the organization would not rule out the use of violence, however, the majority would completely oppose violence under any circumstances.

Collective is the Marxist/Leninist philosophy. One of the objectives of the VVAW/WSO is the peaceful conversion of our democratic form of government to a form of government more closely aligned with Marxism/Leninism. The National Collective has stated it will continue the policy of building take-overs as well as mass demonstrations to project the aims and goals of this organization. The National Collective is of the opinion the masses will eventually create a revolution and the VVAW/WSO will be considered as one of the "Vanguard Organizations" of this revolution. The current National Collective Staff does not subscribe to violent tactics, such as kidnappings, bombings, and the use of weapons, in order to project the organization's aims and beliefs.

It is to be noted the current National Collective Staff does not advocate the use of violent tactics, however, changes in Staff personnel will occur over the course of future months and the possibility exists more Militant personnel could very well be elected to positions of the National Collective.



SAMUEL R. SCHORR is considered the number one VVAW/WSO National Coordinator and is the leader of the National Collective. SCHORR formerly was the National Coordinator of the California Collective and during 1973, was elected to a position on the National Collective. SCHORR is a very articulate and outgoing individual and thus when he began participating in the National Collective, he asserted himself more so than any of the other National Coordinators. SCHORR at that time reorganized the structure of the entire organization. SCHORR projects this organization will become a mass based Marxist/Leninist Organization and will be the "Vanguard" Organization of the revolution. He has stated in the past that he would hope this organization remains small in size (a thousand individuals), and in this respect, could best be controlled and function as a hardcore Marxist/Leninist Organization. SCHORR's number one objective within the organization is the educating of the National Collective and chapters to the Marxist/Leninist philosophy. SCHORR feels that the regions are not accepting the Marxist/Leninist philosophy basically due to their lack of understanding regarding the Marxist/Leninist concept. In addition, SCHORR feels that over the years if a revolution occurs involving the masses, this organization will have to assert itself and be at the forefront of any revolution.

At this point in time SCHORR considers his entire life as the VVAW/WSO.

3) As set forth above, the regions and chapters are not responsive to the Marxist/Leninist Philosophy, thus greatly disturbing the members of the National Collective. The National Collective rationalizes this lack of acceptance on the part of regions and chapters as "these individuals do not understand the Marxist/Leninist Philosophy, are uneducated, and will eventually become educated to the philosophy of the National Collective."

It is to be noted that even though the regions and chapters reject the Marxist/Leninist Philosophy at this point in time, they do continually obtain authority from the National Collective prior to the implementation of any action on their part, such as rallies, demonstrations, and building takeovers.

Apparently, various regions and chapters feel the National Collective expresses an elitist and/or "country "" attitude. In this respect, various regions and chapters are of the opinion the National Collective is not concerned with their problems. This impression on the part of the regions and chapters, probably stems from the fact the National Collective is obviously in a position to make the final decision in all matters and is a very close-knit group.

4) The National Collective continues to maintain the attitude the organization will initiate demonstrations, rallies, and in particular, building take-overs to project their publicly-identified objectives. The purpose of these take-overs is to focus news media attention on the organizations objectives.

There is no information available to indicate specific actions taken in the past and/or planned in the future which go beyond publicly-identified objectives,





Source advised that a person is considered to be a "member" of the VVAW/WSO if they attend the majority of the activities sponsored by their Chapter, perform work on behalf of the Chapter, and either agree with or can conceivably learn to agree with the ten objectives of the VVAW/WSO. is providing coverage of regional activities.

Regarding the relation between the regional office and the national office of the VVAW/WSO who is the New York-Northern New Jersey Regional Coordinator, feels that it is the duty of the Regional Coordinator to act as liaison between the national office and the Chapters within the region. He feels that he must reflect to the national office any dissatisfaction expressed by the Chapters within the region if such dissatisfaction has been agreed upon as being justified by a majority of the delegates to regional conferences. He further feels that it is his duty to speak on behalf of the National Collective regarding decisions made by the National Collective which are binding by all members of the VVAW/WSO. As a decision which is binding by all members, an example might be that all members of VVAW/WSO support the amnesty demonstration being called for Washington, D. C., 7/1-4/74.

Support of the VVAW/WSO clinic in Alabama is also something that is required of members.

Political considerations as to whether decisions of the National Collective might reflect a Marxist-Leninist line or other left wing political philosophy are not points of question. The Regional Coordinator does not look upon the VVAW/WSO as a veterans affair organization; however, he does consider it to be a legitimate political organization that is interested in educating the people in the evils of the American imperialist society through legitimate protest activity.

(2) The Buffalo Chapter generally supports the policies of the national office and the New York-Northern New Jersey Region. The Chapter may operate independently; however, if it feels that a decision by the national office or the region does not fit within the ten objectives of VVAW/WSO, the Chapter may interpret the ten objectives and reach decisions concerning this interpretation by democratic process within the Chapter.

There has been recent criticism of the activities of the Buffalo Chapter and the VVAW/WSO in general indicating that the organization is becoming chauvinist in nature due to its emphasis on veterans problems. It is felt that the VVAW/WSO was a veterans organization four years ago and now must be an organization that appeals on a full spectrum basis to all oppressed people. This is a minority viewpoint within the Chapter and most people in the Chapter continue to emphasize veterans problems as paramount.

that they are Marxists-Leninists; however, neither of these individuals appears to be violence prone. Most members of the Buffalo Chapter ascribe to the same theory regarding violent activity that is exhibited by namely violence should only be used as a defense mechanism.

On several occasions during the planning of demonstrations and protest activities at Buffalo, the question of activity which would result in arrests by the members has arisen. This activity has normally been of a non-violent nature such as sit-ins or leafleting that had been prohibited by local regulations, etc. Even these activities, however, were not approved by the general membership and all activities to date at Buffalo and sponsored by the region have been non-violent legitimate protest activities that have been held in accordance with local legal requirements as to parade permits, use of bullhorns, etc.

(4) The Buffalo Chapter does not appear to contain any individuals who advocate the violent overthrow of the

U. S. Government. Efforts by groups in Buffalo, such as Young Workers Liberation League (YWLL), Communist Party, USA (CPUSA), Youth Against War and Fascism (YAWF), American Servicemen's Union and RU, to infiltrate Buffalo Chapter, VVAW/WSO have met with negative results. The policy of the Buffalo Chapter is that persons belonging to these other groups may become members of VVAW/WSO; however, when they attend VVAW/WSO functions, they may not promulgate any doctrines other than those within the framework of the ten objectives. For instance, a RU member cannot attend a VVAW/WSO function and act as a RU member. They must act as a VVAW/WSO member.

The following general information was also provided by regarding VVAW/WSO activities:

The VVAW/WSO reference to the works of LENIN, MARX, ENGELS and Chairman MAO relates in general to the theory of bringing about radical political change. By radical political change, according to the VVAW/WSO, is not change brought about by violence but rather by educating the people in political Ideas that are currently unfamiliar to them such as the pro-LENIN, MARX, ENGELS mulgation of a socialist political system. and Chairman MAO have been successful in bringing about the socialist system and their writings can be used as guidelines to bring about a democratic type of socialism in America. The socialism in America that the VVAW/WSO would like to see would not be based on socialism in any other country but would be unique, truly representative of the wishes of the people and very idealistic in nature. It is in these terms that the VVAW/WSO also talks about "revolution." They consider the revolution to be the scraping of imperialism and the embracing of socialism by the American people.

stated that this non-violent theory of revolution is evidenced by the fact that at the last National Steering Committee meeting in Milwaukee, it was felt that this revolution will take 60-100 years to occur. feels that the VVAW/WSO is working to create a populous or socialist party as a third party alternative in the U. S.

stated that a lot of people in VVAN/WSO are extremely idealistic in their political outlook and the certainty of this drift to a democratic socialism is a dream that they embrace. Source stated, however, that there are some people within the organization who have the capability of engaging in violent activities and consider themselves revolutionaries who would take to the streets and take up the gun if the need should arise. Source stated, however, that these individuals do not reflect the position of the VVAW/WSO and are usually kept in check by the majority of the members of the organization.

Source stated that these comments are made strictly through source's experiences as who has had only very limited contact with other individuals associated with the VVAW/WSO nationally.
