The Oakland Chapter of the VVAW/WSO has supported the policies of the national office in the past. It does not function as a legitimate Veteran's organization.

The Santa Cruz Chapter of VVAW/WSO generally supports policies of the national office, however, this support varies from issue to issue. The Santa Cruz Chapter is somewhat independent not only of the national office but of the regional office and is attempting to function as a legitimate Veteran's organization within the Santa Cruz area.

The <u>California-Nevada</u> Regional Coordinator of the VVAW/MSO is from the San Jose area and is likely to <u>follow</u> the national policies.

(3) advised on 6/7/74 that he knew of no one in the VVAW/WSO at the time that he was a member in advocating Marxist or Maoist theories or other violent-prone philosophies.

The Oakland Chapter of the VVAW/WSO discusses the Marxist philosophy at those meetings in relationship to the local problems and activities of the Chapter. At a recent meeting, the Chapter voted to support the Symbionese Liberation Army (SLA).

There has been no indication of any Marxist-Leninist tendencies exhibited by leaders of the Santa Cruz Chapter of the VVAW/WSO other than some comments regarding support of the SLA philosophies. There has been no mention by members in support of violent-prone organizations or philosophies.

(4) Sources have provided no information that the San Francisco or San Jose Chapters of the VVAW/WSO are infiltrated or dominated by individuals supporting Marxist and Leninist ideologies advocating violent overthrow of the U.S. Government or other actions in violation of the laws of the U.S.

One member of the Santa Cruz Chapter has mentioned being knowledgeable in the Marxist-Leninist philosophies. This individual stated that he has studied Marxist-Leninist philosophies at the University of California at Santa Cruz,

however, he is not <u>violent-prone</u> nor has he attempted to dominate <u>Santa Cruz VVAW/WSO</u> meetings with his Marxist-Leninist philosophies or ideologies.

The <u>Qakland Chapter</u> is a small tightly-knit group who have known each other for sometime and they all believe in the same philosophies. They are against the present form of U. S. Government and support groups who feel the same way. They quote Marx more than any other social reformer. They are anti-law enforcement, however, there has been no reported evidence that they advocate violent overthrow of the U.S. Government.

On 6/10/74, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that the NYC Chapter generall supports the policies of the National Office as laid down by the National Steering Committee (NSC) at its quarterly meeting The Chapter is not independent of the National Office or the New York - Northern New Jersey Regional Office in Buffalo, NY, although it can exhibit some independence in relatively minor matters that are not contrary to the objectives of the organization such as endorsing a demonstration or actions of other organizations or of furnishing speakers for functions of other organizations. On matters of importance with respect to programs or actions, the Chapter consults with the Regional Office and the National Office.

The NYC Chapter at this time, functions or at least attempts to function as a legitimate veterans organization. Its main efforts in 1974 have been directed at amnesty, discharge upgrading, obtaining increased benefits for Vietnam War era veterans and at obtaining jobs for veterans. The NYC Chapter had affiliation with the Mayor's Office of Veterans Affairs (MOVA) in NYC, an organization aimed at improving the lot of veterans in NYC and has liaison with the City University of New York Veterans Action Committee (CUNYVAC), an organization composed of representatives of veterans organizations in the colleges of the City University of New York and participated in a CUNYVAC-sponsored demonstration in NYC. With respect to the amnesty issue, the VVAW/WSO is more interested in upgrading the discharges of veterans with less than honorable discharges than it is with the plight of non-veterans who fled the US to avoid military service.

Some of the leaders of the NYC Chapter subscribe to a Marxist-Leninist ideology but those persons are not known to source to have embraced a violence-prone philosophy. These persons are "communists" in belief but are not known to source to belong to communist organizations, or to follow the line of any particular communist organization. The politics of the Chapter at this time is undefined which is probably the reason it is willing to consider some sort of affiliation with the Revolutionary Union (RU) (See below)



With respect to a violence-prone philosophy the NYC Chapter is not known to source to have advocated the use of violence. It is the feeling among many members of the NYC Chapter that the reputation of the organization as being violence-prone is unwarranted and is largely due to the indictment and trial of some VVAU/VSO members in Florida in 1972-1973, on charges of conspiracy to violently disrupt the Republican National Convention in 1972, which received wide publicity. As a result, the discussion of the use of violence is considered bad "politics" in the NYC Chapter and is avoided.

The NYC Chapter is not known to source to be infiltrated or dominated by individuals supporting Marxist-Leninist ideologies advocating violent overthrow of the US Government or other actions in violation of the laws of the US. In 1973, the NYC Chapter took precautions to insure that it was not infiltrated or dominated by the Progressive Labor Party (PLP).

Recently the RU has approached the VVAW/WSO concerning an affiliation of the organizations, the exact nature of which is unknown to source. Source learned that recently two members of the VVAW/WSO National Collective in Chicago, Illinois, were approached by leaders of the RU in Chicago concerning an affiliation between the organizations. This matter was discussed with the leadership of the NYC Chapter and at the General Membership meeting of the NYC Chapter on 6/3/74, the matter of the extent of RU participation in the VVAW/W 90 demonstration in Washington, D. C., 7/1-4/74, and future affiliation with the RU was on the agenda. Due to lack of time the matter was not discussed but it was announced that the matter of an affiliation with the RU will be the main item on the agenda of the next General Membership meeting of the Chapter, tentatively scheduled for 7/8/74, which will be attended by RU members who will make a presentation of RU politics and programs. Source surmised that the NYC Chapter will make a decision on this matter which will be presented at the

next Regional meeting of the New York-Northern New Jersey Region in July, 1974, and the regional proposal on this matte will be presented to the next NSC meeting in Buffalo, New York, in August, 1974. According to source, this matter of affiliation with the RU is being discussed openly.

62 670 On 6/11/74, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that the NYC Chapter generally supports the policies of the National Office in matters of importance on programs and actions, but that these policies appear to be a consensus of the views of the Chapters. In minor matters, the NYC Chapter has some independence of action that are not contrary to the policies of the National Office.

At the present time, the NYC Chapter attempts to act as a legitimate veterans organization but source believes that these activities on behalf of veterans has a higheriam of recruiting persons into the organization which source describes as an anti-imperialist, anti-capitalist organization. Source believes that when the "Winter Soldier concept" becomes fully implemented and the VVAW part of its name is dropped, the Chapter will lessen its activities on behalf of veterans.

Source advised that some members of the NYC Chapter and some of the leadership of the Chapter certainly are anticapitalist and anti-imperialist in their beliefs and profess to believe in the ten objectives of the organization. It is difficult to determine if these persons subscribe to a Marxist-Leninist philosophy or other violence-prone philosophy because the subjects of communism and violence are never openly discussed at meetings.

The NYC Chapter is not known to source to be infiltrated by individuals supporting Marxist-Leninist ideologies advocating violent overthrow of the US Government or other actions in violation of the laws of the US.

Source related that at the general membership meeting of the NYC Chapter on 6/3/74, it was announced that the matter of an affiliation between the VVAW/WSO and the RU will be discussed at the next general membership meeting of the Chapter in July, 1974, which will be addressed by RU speakers. At the present time, RU publications "The Worker" and "Revolution" are available at the headquarters of the NYC Chapter for Study by the membership of the policies and programs of the RU.

From the foregoing interviews and from a review of the recent activities of the NYC Chapter, the following analysis is made.

- 1. The NYC Chapter generally supports the policies of the National Office as laid down by the NSC in important matters. In minor matters that do not conflict with the policies of the National Office or the ten objectives of the organization, the NYC has some independence. The NYC Chapter attempts to function as a legitimate veterans organization although this might be an ostensible activity with the real aim of the recruiting/members.
- 2. The Chapter and some of its leaders follow an anti-capitalist, anti-imperialist line and some of the leaders subscribe to a Marxist-Leninist philosophy although they are not known to subscribe to a violence-prone philosophy. These leaders are not known to belong to any communist organizations.
- 3. The NYC Chapter is not dominated by individuals supporting Marxist-Leninist ideologies advocating violent overthrow of the US Government or other actions in violation of the laws of the US.

VIETNAM VETERANS AGAINST THE WAR/WINTER SOLDIER ORGANIZATION (VVAW/WSO)

On June 10, 1974, a confidential source furnished the following information:

On June 7th through the 9th, 1974, there was a conference of the Association of the Vietnamese Patriots in Canada, Held at the Pavilion Lafontaine, University of Quebec, 1301 Sherbrooke East, Montreal, Canada. Approximately ten members of the Vietnam Veterans Against the War/Winter Soldier Organization (VVAW/WSO) were in attendance at the conference.

The VVAW was formed in 1967 as an organization of Vietnam veterans to protest American involvement in the war in Southeast Asia. Since that time VVAW leaders have told members the VVAW is a revolutionary group, not "just another group of war veterans". Also, the membership has been told the VVAW has been asked to cooperate on an international level with many organizations, including communist and Maoist groups. Additionally, it was indicated that "anti-imperialist groups" consider the VVAW a potent organization of similar stature in the United States. In April, 1973, the group changed their name to VVAW/WSO so that non-veterans could become members. Current VVAW/WSO national officers are Marxist-Leninist oriented and strive to educate their membership in Marxist-Leninist doctrine.

Regional Coordinator, New York-Northern New Jersey Region, Buffalo, New York, plus an unidentified female attended from Buffalo. Two members of the VVAW/WSO from Burlington, Vermont, were in attendance plus five or six VVAW/WSO members from New York City, including head of the Oneonta, N. RE: VIETNAM VETERANS AGAINST THE WAR/ WINTER SOLDIER ORGANIZATION (VVAW/WSO)

Attendance at the conference was approximately 350 to 400 people over the course of the weekend. About half the people at the conference appeared to be Americans. There were approximately 20 Vietnamese and no blacks in attendance. The purpose of the conference was to commemorate the fifth anniversary of the founding of the provisional revolutionary government of the Republic of South Vietnam.

Organizations which attended the conference were the Provisional Revolutionary Government, Young Socialist League, Revolutionary Union, Indonesia Peace Campaign, American Servicemen's Union, Chilean Liberation Organization, Quebec Federation Union and a small delegation from the United Arab Republic.

On the evening of June 7, 1974, the session consisted of discussion by JANE FONDA in French which gave a picture of the current situation in Vietnam. Saturday, June 8, 1974, consisted of a series of workshops from 9:00 AM to 5:30 PM. The evening hours consisted of cultural programs with artists, singers and dancers from several countries. June 9, 1974, consisted of a meeting from 9:00 AM to 2:00 PM at which time a resolution was drawn containing demands on the Canadian and American governments.

JANE FONDA indicated at the conference she would participate in the VVAW/WSO demonstration to be held in Washington, D. C., July 1 through 4, 1974.

The Revolutionary Union (RU) was founded in early 1968 and is a militant, semiclandestine organization. Its objectives, as set out in its publications, are the development of a united front against imperialism, the fostering of revolutionary working-class unity and leadership in struggle, and the formation of a communist party based on Marxism-Leninism-Mao Tse-tung thought, leading to the overthrow of the United States Government by force and violence.

RE: VIETNAM VETERANS AGAINST THE WAR/ WINTER SOLDIER ORGANIZATION (VVAW/WSO)

The American Servicemen's Union (ASU) was founded in 1968 by the Workers World Party (WWP). Its objectives are to cause discontent among military enlisted personnel and call for the establishment of a servicemen's union. Its main propaganda weapon is the publication "The Bond - The Servicemen's Newspaper".

The WWP was founded in 1959 by individuals who disagreed with policies of the Socialist Workers Party (SWP). The WWP dissidents advocated unconditional support of the Soviet Union and the building of a revolutionary party geared to the overthrow of Capitalism. More recently, the WWP has called for peaceful solutions to Sino-Soviet disputes, however, the WWP generally supports the Peoples Republic of China in its ideological differences with the Soviet Union.

- (1) There will be an amnesty demonstration sponsored by VVAM/MSO in Mashington, D. C. from July 1-4, 1974. Logistic sheets, posters and leaflets are available from the national office.

ROUND ROBIN REPORT - REGIONAL MEETING, BUFFALO, MAY 4th & 5th, 1974

REGIONAL GROWTH: The Region is slowly gaining in size and activity. Since the last Regional meeting, we have gained 2 chapters in Fredonia and Old Westbury. The rest of the Region remains approximately as it was in February. NYC, Buffalo, Rochester and Oneonta maintain a consistent and collective presence in their communities. Suffolk County, Ithaca, the chapters in the mid-Hudson coalition and Potsdam function consistently but remain dependent on the efforts of one or two individuals. Albany is totally inactive and the Regional Office has had no word from them since the fall.

ACTIVITY: Since the Monroe meeting, the only Regional level activity was the Gary Lawton speaking tour. Gary spoke in NYC, Suffolk County, Massau, Oneonta, Buffalo and Fredonia. He was well received and developed solid ties with the Attion Brothers and other political prisoners and progressive groups.

FINANCES: Right now the Region is in bad straits. The balance on hand is \$4.59. Since the last meeting, our expenses have totaled \$287.31 and income has been only \$9.00. The great bulk of our expenses have been in postage and snipping. While there is no danger or the Regional Office folding, this lack of funds does limit our effectiveness and our ability to distribute resource material.


POLITICAL EDUCATION: There has been no PE work on the Regional level other than trying to provide resource material. The larger chapters are all building ongoing and structured PE programs while smaller chapters have only sporadic and unorganized efforts.

PERSONAL ASSESSMENT: This meeting makes slightly over seven months since I became coordinator. I feel that a basis for further growth has been built and maintained. What generally existed prior to last October has grown stronger. However, there has been little progress or growth other than that. One main deterrent has been the amount of the I've been able to spend on Regional offcirs, I believe, particularly since I started a full-time job in February. Most of the effort I've

been able to pull into Regional affairs has been spent on the mechanistic details that come with being coordinator: news-letters, minutes, mailing lists, petitions, etc. This hurts\*\* prison support work and general outreach. It is to the credit of the general membership of the region's chapters that growth has proceeded to the extent it has on local levels. I feel optimistic about the near future, however, for at least four reasons - 1) the growth and development of VVAM/WSO on a National level; 2) the formation of a regional support committee by the Buffalo Chapter; 3) the fact that much of the shitwork involved in the Regional Office is now pretty much established and 4) that I feel that soon I'll be in a position to look for a job that is less demanding on my - and the Regional Office's - time.

The most important aspect of chapter development since the last regional meeting is the division of most efforts into the action and speaking # publicity committees. Coordination and direction between committees and between meetings is still of course handled by the steering committee. The staff continues to perform necessary day-to-day duties.

Building an amnesty campaign in the NYC area is the basic activity of the chapter. On March 29 there was an action at the NY State Regional VA which was moderately successful in terms of the exposure given to a confrontation with Nugent, Regional Director. He agreed that it would be better administratively to have a single type discharge, but refused to sign a petition for it.

A second action outside the VA (on April 26) was co-sponsored by us and CUNY Veterans Action Coalition (including 16 city colleges and ASU). WBAI covered both this and the first deco, and we were also covered by two tw channels. There is very bad faeling from several quarters toward ASU. Because of that and a lack of political definition we feel wary of giving too much energy to CUNY VAC's activities right now, although we certainly continue to nudge them (as diplomatically as possible) with our politics and to maintain relations. This is because there is a real potential in the coalition: the increasing awareness of 40,000 vets in the CUNY system.

We participated in the Indochina Brigade at the impeachment rally in DC, sent a speaker to the Gay Rights Action Coalition rally which supported passage of Intro II (a civil rights bill now before the City Council), and helped organize a speaking tour of southern MY state for Gary Lawton. (In was quite successful both money and his apirits were raised. His meeting with our chapter was followed by a social which we hope to make a monthly affair so that members can more easily build a spirit of friendship.

The Discharge Upgrading Project has become firmly established, though it will always be on a small scale because we must not sacrifice political motives to the risk of becoming merely a service group.

Some of the badly discharged vets from the DUP have begun to work with some chapter members in order to prepare for appearances on the media; they have lately been clamouring for them -- bad discharges are in.

The speaking & publicity committee continues to arrange and fill speaking engagements before community groups, in high schools and colleges, on radio and to etc, to help give increasing exposure to the amnesty issue.

Of course weaknesses still abound. Attendance at general membership meetings has levelled off at around 20 and few new people have become involved. We hope that public exposure will increase recruitment. A fundraiser with speakers and a showing of The Last Petroducs a total flop; however, it was not actually a chapter activity.

A women's group was meeting fairly regularly but is now defunct. Winter Soldier unfortunately does not cell itself; we must start selling then regularly again, along with getting the amnesty petitions signed.

Revenue for the past 4 months was just under \$1700, and expenses were under \$1600.

In regard to the tentative agenda for this meeting: WEI status -- a peripheral chapter member is collecting data

Prisons -- we actively supported the Attica demo in front of the Waldorf Astorie

work, helping support the family of a brother in Leavenworth military barracks, etc

-- I member is working on her own with the LBODC

May 18 -- we've done a leaflet, checked out buses, and mentioned it wherever appropriate.

We've discussed the necessity and feasibility of making an amnesty film or video tape. This meeting might wish to discuss it. Since 2 members of the national office are in NYC this wack to them as part of the national collective so that a decision can be made quickly.



As FBIHQ and Chicago are aware, Georgia was absorbed into the Florida Region.

Tampa Division recently advised that since Florida absorbed the inactive Georgia region, no efforts had been made to re-activate Georgia VVAW and no persons in Georgia had been contacted.

In addition, Tempa noted that regional VVAW headquarters had been changed from Tampa to Miami, and it was unknown whether any contact was contemplated by Miami WAM with persons in Georgia.

By letter dated 4/29/74, Miami Division reported that no known contact has been made between Miami VVAW and Georgia. The chapter leader at Miami has made efforts to regenerate interest at Tampa, however, no mention was made of any effort to re-activate the Georgia Region or even to contact former Georgia VVAW members.

The VVAW was formed in 1967 as an organization of Vietnam veterans to protest American involvement in the war in Southeast Asia. Since that time VVAW leaders have told members the VVAW is a revolutionary group, not "just another group of war veterans." Also, the membership has been told the VVAW has been asked to cooperate on an international level with many organizations, including communist and Maoist groups. Additionally, it was indicated that "anti-imperialist groups" consider the VVAW a potent organization of similar stature in the U.S. In April, 1973, the group changed their name to VVAW/WSO so that non-veterans could become members. Current VVAW/WSO national officers are Marxist-Leninist oriented and strive to educate their membership in Marxist-Leninist doctrine.

A preliminary investigation was initiated to determine whether or not the subject was identical to living in Wisconsin.

Bureau and Chicago will note that the only VVAW/ WSO chapter in Cleveland Division is the nominal chapter at Kent State University (KSU). furnished a report and a copy of the minutes concerning the Ohio-Indiana Kentucky-Michigan-West Virginia-Western Pennsylvania VVAW/ WSO regional meeting held 5/11-12/74 at Cincinnati. in which it was reported that Regional Coordinator Columbus, Ohio, had visited the Kent chapter with reference to whether their charter should be revoked. While the cause was not specified, it apparently related to dissatisfaction with the leadership at Kent inasmuch as at the Regional Meeting it was voted to retain the Kent chapter predicated upon a re-organization of the Kent chapter.

Cleveland has in the past received information from the National or Regional VVAW/WSO offices indicating interest in the organization by individuals in this



This investigation is based on information which indicates that captioned organization is engaged in activities which could involve violations of Title 18, U.S. Code, Sections 2383 (Rebellion or Insurrection). 2384 (Seditious Conspiracy), 2385 (Advocating Overthrow of the Government), 2387 (Sedition), and 793 (Espionage).

VVAW/WSO was organized in New York City in 1967 as an organization of Vietnam veterans to protest the American involvement in the war in Southeast Asia. VVAW/WSO engaged in various protest activities but during late 1971 demonstrated increasing militancy, culminating in 12/71 with VVAW/WSO takeover of various American landmarks and public buildings. Information was also developed indicating that some VVAW/WSO chapters were cooperating with or infiltrated by communist-dominated groups including the Communist Party, USA, and the Socialist Workers Party. Certain VVAW/ WSO leaders were quoted as telling members VVAW/WSO is a revolutionary organization and not "just another group of war veterans". VVAW/WSO leaders have traveled to North Vietnam and have reportedly established liaison with revoluationary or terrorist groups internationally. 1/73 at a National Steering Committee meeting, VVAW/WSO leaders discussed programs aimed at obtaining support from or influencing active duty military personnel. They also discussed obtaining access to classified Government information to be used against U.S. interests and one leader subsequently actively engaged in such activity. There were also indications at this meeting that VVAW/WSO activists possessed the technical knowledge and training to carry out any revolutionary program proposed. In 8/73 at a National Steering Committee meeting, some members of the national leadership promoted education of the entire VVAW/WSO membership in

Since that time VVAW leaders have told members the VVAW is a revolutionary group, not "just another group of war veterans." Also, the membership has been told the VVAW has been asked to cooperate on an international level with many organizations, including Communist and Maoist groups. Additionally, it was indicated that "anti-imperialist groups" consider the VVAW a potent organization of similar stature in the U. S.
