

Information furnished by sources contained in the LHM is classified "CONFIDENTIAL" because the unauthorized disclosure of either the information or the identity of the source would be detrimental to the national defense.

ADMINISTRATIVE

In the Spring of 1971, Cleveland opened a case on an organization at Bowling Green State University (BGSU), Bowling Green, Ohio, which was using the name Bowling Green Chapter of the Veterans Against the War; however, according to sources, this organization which apparently was formed in the Spring of 1971, did not get any support, either moral or otherwise from the students and the university officials paid little attention to it. This group was estimated at no larger than 15 - 20 malcontents at BGSU who did not enjoy the support of a large majority of veteran students at the university

This group was inactive in June, 1971 and Cleveland closed the case. It is noted also that graduated from EGSU in June, 1971.

Sources at EGSU contacted in September, 1971 and indicated that the Bowling Green Chapter of the Veterans Against the War is no longer active. \ \

Cleveland submitted an LHM on August 20, 1971 to the Bureau regarding the activities of the Veterans Against the War in Viet Nam, Kent State University, Kent, Ohio, and, therefore, this information is not being set forth again in this LHM.

This LHM sets forth information regarding the activities of the Viet Nam Veterans Against the War (VVAW) in the Cleveland area which group according to sources is called

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various names such as Veterans for Peace, Cleveland Area Veterans for Peace, and Vets for Peace, and is reportedly a branch or chapter of the National VVAW. This information was obtained through various file reviews plus a discreet preliminary inquiry through established informants and sources.

As shown in the details of this LHM, the only two reported officers are RICHARD CRAMER and MARTIN RATCLIFFE. CRAMER according to information available is a World War II veteran who lost a son in the war in Viet Nam; CRAMER has been described as a patriotic American who wants to see the war in Viet Nam ended. Cleveland files show that CRAMER has only been affiliated with various Cleveland peace groups, has never advocated violence, and has not been a member of any subversive group.

As for MARTIN RATCLIFFE, Cleveland files show he has been affiliated with various Cleveland peace groups, and he too has never been connected with any subversive groups nor advocated violence.

Mention is made in the details of this LHM regarding a JAMES TUCKER and PAUL TROOP being connected with the VVAW, but it would appear that these two individuals came to Cleveland on a temporary basis to hold some hearings and a demonstration. Apparently both men left Cleveland as there is no information in Cleveland files regarding either of them other than that set forth in this LHM.

Based on the information available regarding the Cleveland Chapter of VVAW, it appears that this organization has shown itself to be non-violent in its activities and its purpose is to bring about an end to the war in Viet Nam. There does not appear to be any infiltration, domination, or control of this Cleveland Chapter by any basic revolutionary groups or individuals.

Therefore, based on the above, it does not appear that this organization is presently a threat to the security of the United States, and as a result, this case is being closed by Cleveland. If, however, any information is received in the future that this Cleveland group has changed its approach, outlook and activities toward violence or affiliation with any subversive type groups, the case will be reopened for additional

I. CRGANIZATIONAL DATA

"The Cleveland Press", a Cleveland, Ohio, daily afternoon newspaper of general circulation, had an article "Father of Dead GI Trying to End War", and this article stated the following:

"Two years ago when RICHARD CRAMER lost his son in Vietnam, he left the death may have been for a good cause.

"Now he is sure his son's life was wasted. CACUPI Excluded from automatic iowngrading and eclassification

"So CRAMER, a World War II veteran, is doing everything in his power to end the war through an organization he founded called the Cleveland Area Veterans for Peace.

"At a Cleveland Area Peace Action Committee meeting yesterday CRAMER outlined his organization's plans for training student marshals to help keep peace at a rally and march planned for Vice President SPIRO AGNEW's vist here June 20.

"'For months I searched for the slightest reason to justify my son's death. But now I am convinced his life was wasted and I want to do everything I can to peaceably end this senseless war,' said CRAMER, a mechanical engineer for the National Telephone Supply Co.

"He added that he would not tolerate any violence or desecration of the flag.

"His group is made up of about 20 veterans mostly from World War II, all interested in ending the war.

"They plan to train more than 100 student marshals to keep peace during Cleveland anti-war activities.

"CRAMER of 6214 Norman Ln., Mayfield Hts., has two other draft-age sons. He said he would do everything possible to keep them from serving in Indochina."

RICHARD GRAMER is the head of this local group and he works out of 2102 Euclid Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio, which building is the Feace Center, housing the Cleveland peace group offices.

what he has neard the Cleveland Veterans for Peace is affiliated with the national Viet Nam Veterans for Peace as both are from the same roots with the Cleveland Veterans for Peace being one of the branches of the national group.

M-PUD mentioned on March 8, 1971 that a leaflet issued recently by the Cleveland Area Veterans for Peace showed they were located at 2102 Euclid Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio, Telephone No. 621-6516.

advised on March 8, 1971 that he had recently seen a leaflet issued by the Cleveland Area Veterans for Peace which stated the following as their aims:

reported on March 8, 1971 that a leaflet recently issued by the Cleveland Area Veterans for Peace showed that R. E. CRAMER was the coordinator and M.R. RATCLIFFE (MARTIN RATCLIFFE) was the Secretary

printed material was made available at this meeting. One such item was a printed sheet showing the members of the NPAC Steering Committee dated March 4, 1971 and one of the names on this list was that of RICHARD E. CRAMER, Cleveland Veterans for Peace in Viet Nam.

NATIONAL PEACE ACTION COALITION (NPAC)

The National Peace Action coalition was founded in 1970 by members of the Socialist Workers Party (SWP). Its basic objective is to unite masses of people including labor unions, GIs, and the black community in the struggle to end U.S. intervention in Southeast Asia through orderly and peaceful tactics. The SWP has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

had observed a list of Ohio endorsers of the April 24, 1971 anti-war march on Washington, D.C. and one of the names on this list was that of the RICHARD CRAMER. Coordinator for the Cleveland



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advised on May 10, 1971 that DICK CRAMER, the head of the Cleveland Area Vets for Peace, took part in the anti-war demonstration at Washington, D.C. on April 24, 1971.

was the leader of the Veterans for Peace in the Cleveland, Ohio area.

advised on August 23, 1971 that he had heard that a group called the Viet Nam Veterans for Peace was being formed in Cleveland, Ohio, and RICHARD CRAMER would be the leader.

On August 25, 1971 indicated that RICHARD CRAMER was the head of the Cleveland Area Veterans for Peace, the local chapter of the Viet Nam Veterans Against the War.

mentioned on September 27, 1971, that RICHARD CRAMER was the leader of the Cleveland Veterans for Peace, but source did not know of any other officers of this group. CRAMER is a very patriotic individual who is very pro-American in his views, although he is against the United States being involved in Viet Nam. CRAMER is a former veteran who lost a son during the fighting in Viet Nam.

During the meeting, DICK CRAMER of the Cleveland, Ohio Veterans Against the War made an announcement dealing with some forthcoming marches as follows: \


4/3-4/71 - A local march to honor MARTIN LUTHER KING

4/24/71 - A peace march at Washington, D.C.

5/5/71 - A local march at Kent State University, Kent, Ohio

5/15/71 - An Armed Forces Day march against nearly military bases on a nationwide scale.

5/4-5/71 - Possible demonstration at Washington, D.C. if Viet Nam peace is not negotiated.



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University Circle Police
Department, Cleveland, Ohio, advised on February 18, 1971, that
around 9:00 AM, February 10, 1971, an individual named JAMES
TUCKER posted some signs at Thwing Hall, Case Western Reserve
University (CWRU), Cleveland, Ohio, regarding an anti-war
demonstration that was to be held at 3:00 PM, February 10, 1971
at the Cleveland Federal Building.

Around 12:30 PM, February 10, 1971, TUCKER spoke to a large group of CWRU students about the demonstration to be held later in the day and these students gave TUCKER a warm response, applause and a show of approval.

from New York and he was planning to set up a temporary headquarters for the VVAW at the Outpost Coffee House in Cleveland, Ohio.

Intelligence Unit, Police Department, Cleveland, Ohio, advised on February 16, 1971 that a press conference sponsored by the VVAW convened at 10:00 AM, February 16, 1971 in Room 435 at the Statler Hilton Hotel, Cleveland, Ohio, and approximately four (4) members of the press were present along with six (6) people from the Viet Nam Veterans Against the War.

PAUX TROOP and JAMES TUCKER, both members of the Viet Nam Veterans Against the War. /indicated that public hearings in the Cleveland area were to be held regarding Viet Nam war atrocities but no date has been set for these hearings as no facilities were then available.

In preparation for the hearings, TUCKER and TROOP advised that the VVAW was temporarily setting up headquarters at the Outpost Coffee Shop, 13037 Euclid Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio.

According to JAMES TUCKER gave his residence as Amarillo, Texas, and PAUL TROOP furnished a fictitious address in Cleveland when registering at the hotel.

On March 4, 1971, and advised that he had recently seen an announcement regarding a meeting to be held at Highland United Church of Christ, 11228 Detroit, Cleveland, Ohio, on February 26, 1971 at 8:00 PM, where JTM TUCKER and PAUL TROOP of the VVAW would speak on the Winter Soldier Program, the one which took place in Detroit with a future one planned for Cleveland. The Winter Soldier testimoney concerns accounts of war crimes committed in Viet Nam as a result of U.S. policy and testimony is given by American servicemen who were involved in or witnessed such acts.

The announcement went on that both TUCKER and TROOP served in Viet New and were just recently discharged. Both took part in the Detroit Winter Soldier testimony and signed the People's Peace Treaty in Windsor, Ontario.

pr 100 On April 22, 1971 mentioned that DICK CRAMER of the Veterans for Peace was one of the trainers at a marshal training session held at the Grand Ballroom, CWRU, Cleveland, Ohio, on April 21, 1971 to prepare for the forthcoming demonstrations in Washington, D.C. The training was based on the idea that peace had to be maintained during these demonstrations as much as possible without police interference. The basic idea was, that if a disturbance did occur during these demonstrations, they were to isolate the people causing the disturbance so that it would not turn into a riot. The marshals were to try to reason with these people causing the trouble to try to get them to calm down but if it became necessary, the marshals were to let the police arrest a few of those causing the disturbance.

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indicated on May 12, 1971 that DICK CRAMER and a small group of Clevelanders referred to as "Vietnam Veterans for Peace" were in Washington, D.C. on April 23, 1971 for the demonstration on April 24, 1971 in that city.

mentioned on June 14, 1971 that the Veterans for Peace were planning to have a group of people travel to the Dayton, Ohio area on May 15, 1971 to participate in a rally and demonstration to be held at 10:00 AM, May 15, 1971, sponsored by the Ohio Veterans for Peace and GI's for Peace held at Wright Patterson Air Force Base at Dayton. Following the rally, a picnic would be held from 1:00 PM to 4:00 PM.

indicated on July 16, 1971 that a rally was being planned at Cleveland, Ohio, on August 7, 1971

in commercation of the Hiroshima-Nagasaki Days, 8/6-9/71, and DICK CRAMER of the Veterans for Peace had invited DAVID HARRIS, JOAN BAEZ' husband to speak at this rally which was being sponsored by various Cleveland peace groups.


advised on August 20, 1971 that a number of people handed out leaflets in front of the Terminal Tower Building, Public Square, Cleveland, Ohio, on August 6, 1971 announcing meetings for the Hiroshima-Nagasaki commeration. There was supposed to have been some "guerrilla theater" put on by the Veterans for Peace, but they did not show up.

mentioned on August 25, 1971 that to his knowledge the Cleveland Area Veterans for Peace do not hold any regular meetings but they do participate in various anti-war

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Cleveland Area Vots for Peace,
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demonstrations. At times various individuals affiliated with the national VVAW have come to Cleveland to try to interest people in participating in demonstrations in Washington being sponsored by the national VVAW.



The "Nevada State Journal", a morning newspaper published in Reno, Nevada, issue of September 30, 1971, page 12, columns 1 through 3, carries an article captioned, "Vietnam Vet Speaks Out Against War".

The article reflects John Kerry, spokesman and organizer for the Vietnam Veterans Against the War, spoke on campus at the University of Nevada, Reno, Nevada, on the evening of September 29, 1971.

The thurst of his talk, according to the article, was a plea for political activism.

He stated, "The United States has become a society based on whose ox is being gored, but on paper our political system is the best as any other system leaves inability of the people to change the system".

He stated that the John Mitchells have retrenched behind slogans.

He remarked that people around the country have voted the most important issue to be pollution and that Spiro Agnew has been voted the first most polluted body in the country.

The September 21, 1971, edition of The Boston Globe, a daily and Sunday newspaper published in Boston, Massachusetts, carried an article reflecting that the New England Chapter of the Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW) would sponsor an open hearing on the topic "The Other Side of Vietnamization" at Faneuil Hall, Poston, October 7-9, 1971. The four major areas of testimony at this hearing were listed as aerial bombardment, development and use of "electric battlefields", total impact of the war on the Indo-Chinese people, and the problems of returning veterans.

The Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW) is an anti-war organization organized in 1967, and headquartered in New York, New York. Its published objective is "to demand an immediate cessation of fighting and the withdrawal of all American troops from Indo-China". VVAW has participated in several demonstrations, including a massive demonstration in Washington, D.C., during the period April 19-23, 1971.

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On November 25, 1969, President Nixon announced a ban on the production, stockpiling, and use of bacteriological weapons and a ban on the first use of deadly and incapacitating chemical weapons by the United

States. On December 9, 1969, a special report, issued by a group called NARMIC, revealed that the only useful bacteriological weapon in the nation's arsenal had been redefined as chemical and that certain chemical weapons useful in suppressing insurgency at home and abroad were exempted from the first-use ban and were being employed in Vietnam.

The chief disclosure uncovered by the NARMIC researchers was that toxins, the non-living, disease-causing byproducts of bacteria, were being retained as "chemicals" in the U.S. arsenal, despite their previous classification as biological warfare agents. This "reclassification" was acknowledged by the Pentagon, when pressed by Washington Post

ALLING WATCH CONTAIN ALLING WATCH SHOWN EXCHANGE TO THE SHOWN OTHERS reporter about the NARMIC report. There after, numerous newspapers and broadcast networks across the country carried stories and editorials on toxins and the ensuing intragovernmental debates on the subject.

Finally, after a National Sceurity Council study, the White House announced that stockpiling and production, as well as follensive research and development on loxins, would cease. NARMIC is continuing its efforts to discover just what "defensive research and development" on biological arms will entail and to work for an end to the use of herbicides and tear gas in conjunction with the killing in Vietnam:

The NARMIC report may not have been the direct cause of the President's new policy announcement. But it has played a significant part in informing the nation of the facts behind the ban.

NARMIC (National Action/Research on the Military-Industrial Complex) is a program of the American Friends Service Committee. Six researchers and organizers (1) circulate information on the inferrelated establishments-military, industrial, educational, and labor—that promote and profit from the increasing militarization of American life and (2) help local groups across the country to take research-based nonviolent action against the representatives of this military-industrial complex in their own communities. The program will concentrate on exposing and combatting the production of anti-people weapons, such as chemical and biological agents, anti-personnel bombs, and incendiaries.

To help local groups organize opposition to the producers of these weapons, NARMIC has recently published a handbook entitled Weapons for Counterinsurgency.

The investigation of the VVAW in the NY office has been pending since July, 1970. The investigation has been primarily aimed at obtaining intelligence information concerning the upsurge in anti-Vietnam War activities on the part of the organization since September, 1970, in order that the Bureau's responsibilities in these matters be met. No active investigation has been conducted relative to the organization as such because of the abscence of any significant information that subversive elements have been involved in its activities. No attempt has been made by the NY office to infiltrate the VVAW. through informants. Only established sources and confidential informants engaged in furnishing information on general New Left activities in the New York City area have been used and these informants are not in any manner directly affiliated with the VVAW. LL.

The information developed by these sources and informants indicate that in the NYC area the VVAW is engaged primarily in anti-Vietnam War activities basically calling for the immediate withdrawal of United States military forces from South east Asia, and is not in any significant way infiltrated with subversive elements. Information has been developed that the VVAW has ties with New Left organizations and individuals, namely the Peoples Coalition for Peace and Justice and WILLIAM KUNSTLER. Although arrests have been made at demonstrations sponsored by the VVAW in NYC, no significant information has been developed that the organization has a propensity for violence.

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

VVAW reportedly has chapters in ALL 50 states and Vietnam and in August, 1971, published first S issue of its publication, "The First Casualty". VVAW is my on a daily basis by National Executive Committee; its policy is set by National Steering Committee composed of 26 Regional Coordinators. Information on finances set out. Among those on National Executive Committee are MICHAEL OLIVER, SCOTT NOORE and AL HUBBARD: Membership reportedly approaching 10,000. Attorneys are WILLIAM KUNSTLER and PETER WEISS. Activities in New York City area, 1968 - 1971, and participation in New York City of VVAW march from Morristown, New Jersey, to Valley Forge, Pennsylvania, September, 1970, anti-war demonstration at Washington, DC, October, 1970, Winter Soldier Investigation, Detroit, Michigan, January, 1971 - February, 1971, anti-war demonstrations at Washington, DC, April, 1971, and the collection of supplies for Blacks in Cairo, Illinois, July, 1971 - August, 1971, set out. Certain members of VVAW attended International Commission for Inquiry into US War Crimes in Indo China, Stockholm, Sweden, June, 1971. Affiliation with People's Coalition for Peace and Justice set out.

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DETAILS:

I. ORGANIZATION

A. Origin

Source furnished during September, 1970, a one page undated document under the letterhead of the Vietnam Veterans Against the War, Incorporated (VVAW) which set out in part the following concerning the origin of the VVAW:

"Vietnam Veterans Against the War, Incorporated, organized in 1967, has been trying to provide an alternative to the 'American Legion' and 'Veterans of Foreign Wars', two organizations that reinforce militarism in this country through massively funded lobbying."

Source furnished during August, 1971, a two page document under the letterhead of the VVAW bearing the heading, "History". This document disclosed that the VVAW was founded in the Spring of 1967 by six young veterans living in New York City (NYC).

B. Incorporation

The records of the New York County Clerk's Office, Room 117, New York County Courthouse, Foley Square, New York City, as examined by a representative of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) on October 4, 1971, disclosed that the VVAW submitted a Certificate of Incorporation with the New York County Court on July 19, 1970, and was incorporated under the laws of the State of New York, as a corporation located in the City of New York, the County of New York, and the State of New York, on August 21, 1970.





C. Location

During the week of May 30, 1971, the VVAW moved its National Office from 156 5th Avenue, NYC, to 25 West 25th Street, NYC. It had been located at 156 5th Avenue, since 1968.

OBJECTIVES OF VIETNAM VETERANS AGAINST THE WAR, INC.

- 1. To demand an immediate cessation of fighting and the withdrawal of all American troops from Indochina. We cannot allow one more human being to be killed in Indochina.
- 2. To demand Congress enact legislation for the immediate termination of all funds being utilized by the United States government, its allies and the Central Intelligence Agency to support their illegal operations in Latin America, Africa, China, Durope, and the countries of Vietnam, Cambodia, Laos, and Thailand.
- 3. To demonstrate that our military tactics dehumanize soldiers and civilians and to make clear the United States government is prosecuting an illegal, united just and immoral war in Indochina.
- y. To show Americans that their society is structured by a racism which lets us view all non-whites as less than human. This racism pushes our minorities through inferior schools and into the combat arms. Thus, we send our minorities off to die in disproportionately high numbers while we kill Asians indiscriminately. We demand that the military recognize its complicity in America's domestic and international racism.
- 5. To make clear that the United States has never undertaken an extensive open investigation of American war crimes in Indochina. We demand that the United States government, in its war in Indochina, affirm the principles of Nuremberg. As former GI's, we recognize the responsibility of the individual soldier to refrain from committing war crimes. We also recognize that the responsibility and guilt of war crimes committed in the name of America lies with our policy makers at all levels.
 - 5. To demand that all active-duty servicemen and women be afforded the rights as citizens that are guaranteed by the United States Constitution and Bill of Rights that are presently denied them by the Uniform Code of Military Justice. We are appalled that servicemen and women are treated as less-than-first-class citizens. We endorse the efforts of our active-duty sisters and brothers in their struggle to democratize the military.
 - 7. To support all military personnel refusing to serve in wars of aggression at home and abroad. We demand Congress enact legislation for the immediate repatriation with full amnesty to those brothers and sisters who are in prison or in self-exile by reason of their refusal to serve in the military. We support all persons refusing to be drafted.
 - 8. To demand immediate legislation to provide proper care and services for all veterans in V.A. hospitals; to make available job training and placement for every returning veteran; and to provide the funds and means necessary for their educational and vocational endeavors.
 - 9. To affirm that the membership is not only concerned with ending this war;

The undated document, "History" under the letterhead of the VVAW furnished during August, 1971, disclosed that the VVAW is run on a daily basis by a six man National Executive Committee.

"The First Casualty", dated August, 1971, column 1 disclosed that policy making of the VVAW is performed by a National Steering Committee composed of the Regional Coordinators of the 26 regions of the VVAW. The official functions of the regional coordinators are as follows:

"1. Regional coordinators will be the official representatives of VVAW in their respective geographic areas.

"2. Regional coordinators will be responsible for and have full authority to make all decisions relative to VVAW operations consistent with VVAW philosophy and policy as



determined by the National Steering Committee in their respective geographical area of responsibility.

- "3. Regional coordinators will be supported in all decisions consistent with VVAW policy and philosophy, by the National Executive and National Steering Committees.
- "4. Regional coordinators will be responsible for establishing media and political contacts within their respective regions.
- "5. Regional coordinators will be expected to support all national fund raising efforts.
- "6. Regional coordinators will be responsible for the calling of press conferences and the issuance of press conferences and the issuance of press releases and statements at the request of the National Executive Committee. U
- "7. Regional coordinators will be responsible for the maintaining of communication between the national office and the chapters in their respective areas. U
- "3. Regional coordinators will be required to attend the regular scheduled semi-annual meetings of the National Steering Committee and those non-scheduled or emergency meetings convened at the request of the National Steering or Executive Committees. W_
- "9. Regional coordinators will convene regional meetings at least once every six months. These meetings will be convened for the purpose of elections and/or advising the National Steering Committee prior to its semi-annual meetings.
- "10. Regional coordinators will be responsible for making recommendations to the National Executive Committee relative to the granting or terminating of chapters charters in their respective areas.
- "Il. Regional coordinators will be responsible for having an assistant coordinator to cover his respective area when he is unavailable.

WILLIAM MOSES KUNSTLER is publically known as one of the attorneys who represented prominent members of the New Left who were charted with violation of the Federal Anti-Riot Law and Conspiracy and whose trial was held in the United States District Court, Chicago, Illinois, during 1969 through 1970. KUNSTLER was adjudged guilty of contempt of court and was sentenced to four years and thirteen ways in jail on February 19, 1970, in connection with his activities during the trial. He is currently free on bond of \$15,000.00 pending appeal.

II. _ACTIVITIES

A. In MYC Area

Source furnished a press releasissued by the Mational Emergency Civil Liberties Committee (NECLC) which disclosed that the VVAW was one of the organizations that would participate in a demonstration at the Federal Eureau of Investigation (FBI) Office, 201 East 59th Street, MyC, on September 25, 1968, to protest the hearings of the House Un-American Activities Committee in Mashington, DC, on the disturbances that had occurred in Chicago, Illinois, during August, 1968.

The "Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications" of December 1, 1961, by the Committee on Un-American Activities stated the ECLC was established in 1951, and "although representing itself as a non-communist group, actually operates as a front for the Communist Party". The ECLC changed its name in 1968 to the NECLC to "develop a vital civil liberties organization in all 50 states as rapidly as possible."


Special Agents of the FBI observed a demonstration that was held at the office of the FBI located at 201 East 69th Street, NYC, on September 25, 1968, at 2:00 PM. About 15 persons participated. No incidents or arrests were noted.

Special Agents of the FBI observed a demonstration against the involvement of the United States in the war in Vietnam that was held at Union Square, NYC, on November 11, 1968, between 2:00 PM and 4:00 PM. This demonstration was co-sponsored by the VVAW. About 250 persons attended. No incidents or arrests were noted.

Special Agents of the FBI observed a rally at the Castle Clinton Monument, Battery Park, NYC, on April 15, 1970, between 10:15 AM and 11:35 AM, sponsored by the FAVPPC, VVAW and the War Tax Resistance. Speakers spoke against the War in Vietnam and the payment of that portion of income taxes used on behalf of the war effort.

Special Agents of the FBI observed AL HUBBARD, representing the VVAW speak at an Anti-Armed Forces Day Rally held at East 17th Street and 3rd Avenue, NYC, on May 16, 1970, at 1:00 PM. HUBBARD asked for support for GI's hospitalized in Veterans Administration Hospitals in NYC who had circulated anti-war petitions in the hospitals.

The "Liberated Guardian" issue of May 23, 1970, in a news story entitled, "Viet Vets Harassed" reported that on the previous week the VVAW had circulated anti-war petitions at the Veterans Administration Hospital, East 23rd Street and 1st Avenue, NYC. L



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to produce a "more revolutionary" paper, to operate collectively within it and to maintain by design a loose political position.

The "Guardian" is self-described as an "independent radical news weekly" which takes a strong left position but is not identified with any organized group. It is considered to be the largest radical weekly in America.

A Special Agent of the FBI observed AL HUBBARD speak at a rally to stop the war and repression at home sponsored by the Queens Coalition for Peace held at Gerald Mc Donald Park, Toth Avenue and Queens Boulevard, New York, on June 6, 1970. HUBBARD who was introduced as a VVAW spokesman spoke in favor of the No Govern - Hatfield Amendment to and the War in Vietnam and calledfor an immediate withdrawal of United States Armed Forces from South East Asia.

Ipocial Agents of the FAI observed demonstrations in the form of picket lines at the Americana Hotel, West Bird Street and 7th Avenue, NYS, on September 14, 1970, between 11:10 AM and 3:30 PM, on September 16, 1970, between 1:00 PM and 3:30 FM and on September 17, 1970, between 5:20 PM and 7:00 PM. The demonstrations were sponsored by the FAVPPC and the VVAW and held in protest to the convention of the Rational Mard Association of the United States which was being then held at the Americana Hotel . Signs carried by the demonstrators indicated that the protest was in particular against the action of the Mational Guard at the Kent State University Campuc, Ohio, in the Spring of 1976, which resulted in the deaths of four Kent State University students. Eight persons participated in thedemonstration on September 14, 1970, three persons on Esptember 15, 1970, and about 200 persons on September 17, 1970. No incidents or arrests were noted on September 14 or 16, 1970, but a number of arrests were noted on September 17, 1970. LL

On September 22, 1970, a representative of the MYCPD, Security and Investigations Section, adviced that four persons were arrested during the demonstration at the Americana Hotel on the early evening of September 17, 1970, after they had attempted to start a second picket line in an area restricted by the NYCPD near the main entrance of the Americana Hotel.


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A Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), observed about 25 persons picketing in front of the United States Marine Corps Recruiting Station, Northern Boulevard and Main Street, Flushing, Queens, New York, on October 15, 1970, at 10:00 AM. Signs carried by the demonstrators, indicated that the sponsoring group was the VVAW, 156 5th Avenue, New York City. The signs also indicated that the demonstration was in opposition to the war in Vietnam. The demonstration ended about 12:00 noon.

On October 15, 1970,
New York City Police Department, 109th Precinct. Queens,
New York, advised that prior to 9:30 AM, on October 15, six persons
entered the Marine Corps Recruiting Station and refused to leave upon
request. After being advised they would be arrested, two
individuals, not further identified, departed. The four
remaining were arrested, and were charged with "obstructing
Governmental Administration". The arrested persons, all
of whom were affiliated with the VVAW, are as follows:



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A representative of the New York City Police
Department, Security and Investigations Section, advised
on May 12, 1971, that the second of the VVAW, had made
arrangements for the VVAW to hold an anti-Vietnam War
demonstration on May 15, 1971, at 9:30 AM, at 101st Street
and Fort Hamilton Parkway, Brooklyn, New York, as part of
GI - Citizen Solidarity Day. The demonstration would consist
of a march, rally and guerrilla theater, between 10:00 AM
and 2:00 PM. Supporting the VVAW, will be the Park Slope
Peace Center, Brooklyn. The VVAW had requested to hold this
demonstration, inside Fort Hamilton, Brooklyn, on May 16, 1971,
but were turned down, by Army authorities.

A Special Agent of the FBI, observed about 100 demonstrators assemble at 101st Street and Fort Hamilton Parkway, Brooklyn, at 10:00 AM on May 15, 1971. Speeches in opposition to the war in Vietnam, were given by unidentified individuals. At 11:00 AM, the demonstrators marched to 86th Street and Fourth Avenue, Brooklyn, chanting anti-Vietnam war slogans, along the way. They dispersed shortly thereafter. Some demonstrators carried petitions against the war in Vietnam and attempted to obtain the signatures of bystanders. No arrests or incidents were noted.

On May 12, 1971, WILLIAM WAGNER, Chief of Police, Floral Park, New York, furnished documents, announcing that the Queens VVAW, 229-15 88th Avenue, Queens Village, Queens, New York, and the Long Island VVAW, 876 Brushollow Road, Westbury, Long Island, New York, were sponsoring a march, on May 22, 1971, from the Quaker Heeting Place, Main Street and Northern Boulevard, Queens, New York, starting at 8:00 AM. The marchers would proceed from that location to Adelphi College, Garden City, Long Island, New York. This group would also sponsor a Winter Soldier Investigation (WSI), on May 23, 1971, at 10:00 AM, in the Grand Ballroom, of the Garden City Hotel, 7th Street and Park Avenue, Garden City, New York. The purpose of the march would be to dramatize the tactics used by United States military forces in Vietnam. The WSI was billed as "an inquiry into war crimes, and overall American policy in Vietnam."




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On May 22, 1971

County Police Department, Garden City, New York, advised that about 200 demonstrators departed the Quaker Meeting Hall, Main Street and Northern Boulevard, Queens, New York, at 9:15 AM, on May 22, 1971. The demonstrators marched to Adelphi College, Garden City, arriving there at 3:45 PM. The demonstrators picked up recruits along the march and about 350 demonstrators arrived at Adelphi College. No activity occurred at the college, and the demonstrators dispersed at 6:00 PM. Signs carried by some demonstrators indicated that the march was sponsored by the Queens and Long Island Chapters of the VVAW. There were no incidents or arrests.

The WSI, sponsored by the Queens and Long Island Chapters of the VVAW, was held in the Grand Ballroom of the Garden City Hotel, Garden City, New York, on May 23, 1971, from the early morning, until about 7:15 PM. It was attended by about 150 persons. It was announced that the purpose of the WSI, was to let the American public hear, from the lips of veterans of the war in Vietnam, actual accounts of atrocities committed by American military personnel against the Vietnamese people. The activity consisted of speeches, given by persons, who claimed to be veterans of the war in Vietnam, of their experiences in Vietnam which they claimed to be atrocities. A film entitled, "Evil Hour", which depicted the effects of United States military actions on children in Vietnam was shown. At 6:00 PM, a "guest panel" was formed and discussions were held concerning the "testimony" previously given. The activity was closed with an address by an individual, who was introc and a Vietnam war veteran, who had lost both legs in the war. The speech given by this person was critical of United States policy in Indochina. The WSI was orderly, and no arrests were noted. U

Source furnished a leaflet announcing that an anti-Vietnam War March and Rally would be held at Prospect Park, Brooklyn, New York, on June 19-20, 1971, known as "Prospect Park Peace Weekend." The sponsors were the Coalition to Take Brooklyn Out Of The War and the VVAW. The march would take place on June 19, 1971, at 12:00 noon, from Kings Highway and Ocean Parkway, Brooklyn, and would proceed into the Long Meadow in Prospect Park, where films and "rap" sessions would be held. The demonstrators would remain in the park during the night of June 19-20, 1971, during which time guerrilla theater, involving mock "search and destroy missions" performed by the VVAW would be held. At 2:00 PM, on June 20, 1971, the peace rally would be held.

June 17, 1971 & W

On June 19, 1971, at about 11:15 AM, demonstrators began gathering at the corner of Ocean Parkway and Kings Highway, Brooklyn. The march started from that location, at about 1:30 PM, and consisted of about 100 persons, most of whom were dressed in army fatigue type clothing. The march proceeded by way of Ocean Parkway, Campus Road and Flatbush Avenue, into Prospect Park, where it ended in the Long Meadow late in the afternoon.

During the evening of June 19, 1971, rap sessions on the war were held by small groups. When darkness appeared, the VVAW held a Memorial service, for the dead servicemen in Vietnam. Approximately 250 persons remained in the park overnight.

On June 20, 1971, at about 12:00 noon, the VVAW conducted mock "search and destroy missions" in the park. At about 2:00 PM, a rally was held in the Long Meadow. It consisted of rock music and speeches. The speakers were mostly political figures. The speeches all advocated a quick end to the war in Vietnam. Another speaker was Sister ELIZABETH MC ALLISTER, who also spoke in opposition to the war in Vietnam. A crowd of about 2500 - 3000 persons attended L

the rally. It ended about 4:00 PM. No incidents or arrests were noted.

Brothers,

In the past VVAW has had success in conveying to the people of this country the experiences of our tours of duty in Vietnam. We have shown through guerrilla theater and mock search and destroy missions the effects of our dehumanizing training. We have told of atrocities committed by Americans, by us, at "Winter Soldier Investigations". We have lobbied in Washington D.C., trying to get Congress to end the war that has torn the country apart and has changed the course and outlook of our lives. We have and will continue to support the black people of Cairo, Illinois and other people of this country who suffer the same oppression as the governments of the United States and South Vietnam inflict on the Vietnamese. In all our endeavors we have raised the conciousness of our neighbors on a moral level and we shall continue to do so as this is the main objective of VVAW.

This week we will begin to attack the war on a different level. We will talk to heads of Corporations that profit from the war. We will ask them why they support a war that has given them profit at the expense of the Vietnamese and the millions of Americans who served there. Sperry Rand, AMF, Pan Am, and DuPont have agreed to meet with us. As of now General Motots will not. The enclosed leaflet will give you details. Three or four members from Brooklyn, Nassan, Queens, Suffolk and Rockland counties will present our case. It is imperative that we give them the support they will need in confronting these war profiteers. We need an impressive showing at Kennedy Airport to demand that the airlines stop complying with the government's pressures in flying to Vietnam. We need you at the concert and teach-in to make it effective.

The American devastation in Southeast Asia is not ending and we must continue to make America know it. Most of the aforementioned actions have been attended by a minority of the membership. In the face of a general slack-off in the peace movement it becomes absolutely necessary that we, the veterans of the war, show a much stronger presence. Many of us say "But I have a job." and yes, this is true. But you and I have a much greater job. We must make sure that what we went through is never experienced by our brothers and sons. If you agree with me, and you must, you will help make this and future VVAW actions more effective.



Source furnished a leaflet distributed by the FAVPPC, New York City, which announced that a giant anti-Vietnam War rally would be held on August 8, 1970, at 3:00 PM, in the Band Shell, Central Park, New York City.

Special Agents of the FBI, observed that an anti-Vietnam War rally was held in the Band Shell at Central Park, Hew York City, on August 8, 1970, at 3:00 PM. About 500 persons attended. Among the speakers was AL HUBBARD, representing the VVAW, who announced that the VVAW would sponsor "Operation Raw" for "Rapid American Withdrawal", from Vietnam. This would consist of a four day march from Morristown, New Jersey, to Valley Forge, Pennsylvania, by active duty GI's and war veterans, during September 4 - 7, 1970. This march of protesters would culminate in a mass rally at Valley Forge, on Labor Day, September 7, 1970.

A meeting of members of the Youth International Party (YIP), was held at the office of the YIP. 5 West 21st Street. New York City.

The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the plans for the participation of the YIP in the march from Morristown, New Jersey, to Valley Forge, Pennsylvania, during September 4 - 7, 1970, sponsored by the VVAW. It was learned that the YIP had been previously approached by the sponsors of the march to participate in it. At this meeting it was decid d that the YIP would participate in the action as the "Vietcong", in mock military skirmishes and battles along the march.

August 18, 19/1

The YIP, also known as Yippies, is a loosely-knit, anti - establishment revolutionary youth organization formed in New York City, in January, 1968.

It had been learned from members of the YIP in New York City, that the YIP would not participate in the VVAW sponsored march from Morristown, New Jersey, to Valley Forge, Pennsylvania, during September 4 - 7, 1970. The YIP had been originally approached by the VVAW to participate as the "Vietcong", in mock skirmishes along the march. The YIP had agreed to participate in this capacity. At a meeting between members of the YIP, and the VVAW in New York City, on August 17, 1970, the representatives of the VVAW cancelled the mock skirmishes in favor or having the members of the YIP participate as Vietcong "prisoners": The VVAW representatives expressed the feeling that the skirmishes may cause antagonism among the citizens residing along the route, and confusion in the event of harassment from the citizenry. The YIP had agreed to march dressed as "Vietcong prisoners", blindfolded and shackled together. During the week of August 24, 1970,

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the members of the YIP reconsidered the matter and decided not to participate as "Vietcong prisoners" because such activity was too passive and would be a bore.

AL HUBBARD, Executive Secretary of the VVAW, was in attendance at a meeting of the New York Region of the National Peace Action Coalition (NPAC) held at 135 West 4th Street, New York City, on August 27, 1970. At this meeting HUBBARD announced that the VVAW was sponsoring a "Rapid American Withdrawal" march from Morristown, New Jersey, to Valley Forge, Pennsylvania, during September 4 - 7, 1970.

4. Demonstrations in Washington, DC, April 19-23, 1971.

It was learned from the office of the VVAW in New York City, that the National Office of the VVAW would lend full support to the VVAW sponsored demonstrations in Washington, DC, which were scheduled for April 19-23, 1971, known as "Dewey Canon III". The VVAW in New York City, was intensively attempting to recruit veterans to participate in the demonstration and that a "recruiting bus" would visit campuses in the New York City area, attempting to solicit veterans for participation in the demonstration. Buses had been obtained by the VVAW for the trip, from New York City, to Washington, DC, and that the travel expenses for veterans would be paid by the VVAW.

A representative of the New York City Police
Department, Security and Investigation Section, advised on
April 15, 1971, that the VVAW, New York City, had hired a
sound truck, which traveled around New York City, on April 15,
1971, announcing the VVAW sponsored demonstration in Washington,
DC, during April 19-23, 1971, and soliciting funds for the
demonstration. These individuals were in the truck, and at
various street corners throughout the City, some of them
alighted from the vehicle and distributed leaflets concerning
the demonstration. No incidents were reported on these activities.

At was learned, at the National Office of the VVAW, New York City, on April 15, 1971, that the VVAW had hired six buses for the trip from New York City, to Washington, DC, for the VVAW sponsored demonstration. The buses were scheduled to depart from the south side of Washington Square Park, New York City, between 9:00 AM and 10:00 AM, on April 18, 1971. A fare of \$7.00 would be paid by the VVAW. Veterans and nonveterans and their families were welcomed to participate.

5. Cairo, Illinois Project, July - August, 1971

The VVAW recently began a city-wide collection of clothing and medical supplies for members of the black community of Cairo, Illinois. This was done in support of the United Front of Cairo, a group of militant blacks. In NYC, the War Resistor's League (WRL), 339 Lafayette Street, the FAVPPC, 17 East 17th Street, and the Episcopal Peace Fellowship, 300 9th Avenue, are cooperating as collection points for these supplies.

The WRL was founded in 1923, and is the American Section of the War Resistor's International, a world wide pacifist movement.

It was learned that the "Cairo Project" of the VVAW, which involves the gathering of supplies for the armed black community in Cairo, Illinois, is shipping trucks of food and other materials on August 16, 1971. The contact for this activity is ED DAMATO of the VVAW, NYC.

The letter set out the identities of five veteran witnesses to attend the second session of the ICI, to be held in Oslo, Norway, June 20-26, 1971, to testify to alleged American war crimes. FRANCK was ineligible for entry into the United States due to admitted membership in the Swedish Communist Party in the late 1940's, but was granted a waiver.


VIETNAM VETERANS AGAINST THE WAR (VVAW)

On October 8, 1971, a Confidential Source, who has provided reliable information in the past, provided a letter from Vietnam Veterans Against the War, Inc., (VVAW), 25 West 26th Street, New York, N. Y., dated "10 August 1971," addressed to Regional and State Coordinators from Mike Oliver, Executive Committee. A copy of this letter is attached hereto.

VVAW is an anti-war organization organized in 1967 and headquartered in New York City. Its published objective is "to demand an immediate cessation of fighting and the withdrawal of American troops from Indo-China." VVAW has participated in several demonstrations, including massive demonstration in Washington, D.C., April 19-23, 1971.

Paragraph 8 of the attached letter states, "Nixon has embarked on his re-election campaign. I urge you all to organize demonstrations wherever he goes; let's lock the m---- f---- (obscene) up in the white house." The obscene phrase was set forth in the attached letter but has since been blocked out in the interest of propriety.

This document contains neither recommendations nor conclusions of the FBI. It is the property of the FBI and is loaned to your agency; it and its contents are not to be distributed outside your agency.

Brothers:

- You have not heard from me in a while. I was on vacation, sick for most of it but I managed to have a good time.
- The Cairo thing is together. Two trucks are leaving NYC for St. Louis today. It would be nice if we could continue this program; it could be widened to include other communities.
- Two coordinators have resigned: Dewey Ames of Michigan and Don Smartt of New Jersey.
- I do not have to reiterate the importance of the enclosures. Our anti-war work is of vital importance, but let us not forget the many problems veterans have to deal with. Please comply with Skip's request to the best of your ability.
- I would like to talk about the St. Louis meeting. I thought our meeting, while leaving a lot to be desire, was, for the most part, a fine exchange of ideas. Committeents were made from both ends. Of prime importance was the necessity of national for an updated list of members -- only 9 of the 25 regions have responded. I realize the many problems facing you in your areas, but I can see no reason why this request has been ignored by so many. Some of the regions are doing fantastic work. If an area such as Texas can be so successful I cannot think why other regions cannot do the same. I am aware of approximately 7 areas that are receiving no leadership whatsoever from the coordinator. The reasons for this are probably numerous but please, if you do not feel like organizing let me know so we can do something about it.
- I have attempted to keep open a good line of communications with you. Apparently I have failed because I only hear from a few areas on a regular basis. What's the problem?
- The first issue of our newspaper is finished, finally. I apologize for all the delays. Also, since it is our first issue, you will notice we have a lot of room for improvement. We will continue to learn and improve it. We really need articles and reports from the various regions. It is our newspaper so please make use of it.

It is no big secret that our economy is all fucked up so maybe we can help it a little. The most reactionary of our polls show that well over 50% of the population are for immediate withdrawal, yet our national leaders persist in talking about saving our "national honor" as though a nation can preceive its honor by slaughtering the people of another nation, and of "winding down the war" while we bomb and invade two other nations beside Vietnam. Summer sickness has taken hold of our movement. Nixon has embarked on his re-election campaign. I urge you all to organize demonstrations wherever he goes; let's lock the up in the white house. Many of us have expressed interest in another national action to bring the war back into perspective. It seems to me that some kind of economic boycott would be most effective; please write and let me know your ideas.

Areas such as 4, 15, 21, 22, 19, 12, etc., have organized or are organizing meetings of vets from throughout the regions; it is a great opportunity to get our shit together. Hopefully, more of the regions will follow suit.

Thats about all for this time. Please write and give me a precise listing of area activities so that I can get into the next issue of The lat Casualty.






