



DETAILS:

The Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW). formed in 1967 by Vietnam veterans to protest U.S. involvement in the war in Southeast Asia (changed name to VVAW/Winter Solder Organization (WSO) in 1973 to include non-veterans as members), has sponsored numerous anti-government demonstrations, some resulting in violence. The VVAW/WSO National Office (NO) and some key chapters are infiltrated and influenced by the militant Revolutionary Union (RU) organization, and VVAW/WSO leaders have told members that **VVAW/WSO** is a revolutionary organization, not "just another group of war veterans." The current Marxist-Leninist-Maoist oriented NO, which promotes education of the membership in Marxist-Leninist-Maoist doctrine and directs the organization into political growth along the same lines, has at VVAW/WSO National Steering Committee Meetings (NSCM), in 1974, portrayed VVAW/WSO as a mass anti-imperialist organization and a vanguard of the revolution eventually created by the masses.

VVAW/WSO leaders voted at the December, 1974, NSCM to align VVAW/WSO with the RU, which organization follows a strict Maoist line designed to bring about violent revolution in the U.S.

Characterizations of organizations mentioned in this report are set forth in the Appendix Section.

Those items in this report followed by the letter "C" are classified "Confidential". The remainder of this report is not classified.

I. ORGANIZATION

A. Location

The Chicago VVAW/WSO Chapter currently holds its weekly meetings at 2546 North Halsted Street, Chicago, Illinois. II. AIMS AND PURPOSES

The aims and purposes of the Chicago VVAW/WSO Chapter are identical to those expressed by the VVAW/WSO NO, Chicago, Illinois in its official publication, the "Winter Soldier" dated January, 1975 and are as follows:

- 1. To struggle for an immediate cessation of fighting and the withdrawal of all American troops, advisors, planes, and military and economic aid from Southeast Asia. We support as a basis for the cessation of these hostilities the various peace proposals of the people of Southeast Asia based upon their right of self-determination and actual control of their own destinies.
- 2. To struggle for the immediate termination of all other operations by the United States Government, its agencies, and American business interests that are designed to suppress the rightful struggles for liberation and self-determination of the people of the world. This includes the creation and maintenance of dictatorial governments, economic domination and the theft of the natural resources of this and other countries.
- 3. To struggle for the goal that all military people (Active-duty, Reserve and National Guard) be afforded their constitutional rights which are denied by the Uniform Code of Military Justice. We condemn the use of the National Guard, Reserves and Active-duty personnel as strikebreakers, and we support the efforts of service-people in the struggles against military repression. We oppose the use of the military as an oppressive and policy-making force domestically and overseas.
- 4. To struggle for universal unconditional amnesty. This will include a single-type retroactive discharge for all vets, and amnesty for all persons in prison, underground, or in exile as a result of their resistance to the imperialist war machine as well as the clearing of all their resulting civil and criminal records.
- 5. To struggle for decent benefits, full medical care (including the recognition of Post Vietnam Syndrome as

a service-connected disability), and productive employment for all veterans with parity for all war resisters. We demand an end to discriminatory corporate-hiring practices based on Vietnam-era service or Special Processing Numbers or descriptions, and the exploitation of veterans as a tool to divide the working class.

- 6. To struggle against racism which is historically used as a tool of U.S. imperialism to prevent and destroy unity among the people and justify the oppression and exploitation of third-world people at home and abroad. We must fight this dehumanizing tactic which divides us, and strive to build unity between all people.
- 7. Resolved to fight sexism, to show that sexism plays a major part in promoting war. We must show Americans our society is permeated by sexism, which forces an inferior status upon women, reducing them to subservient sexual objects, and which robs both men and women of their natural growth. This institutionalized sexism channels women into unfulfilling, lower-paying jobs which are servile in nature and purpose; it exploits their bodies for sex and profit; and it degrades and dehumanizes them by a double standard of morality wholly dependent on the myth of male supremacy. This sexism is exploited by the military, officially defining servicewomen as subordinate and thoroughly subjugating them to servile work and the role of a sexual object. We resolve to fight sexism within our society, within our own organization and within ourselves.
- 8. To struggle for the right of all workers to organize and strike to protect their income and safeguard their employment. We support progressive struggles aimed at improving working conditions.
- 9. To struggle against the use of the criminal justice system (police, courts, prisons, grand juries) as a tool of political repression, recognizing that this system now serves the interests of the rich and powerful while suppressing the majority of poor and working people. We will fight for the freeing of all political prisoners.
- and objectives which directly relate to the imperialist suppression of the People of the World by the United States Government. We understand this war is imperialist in origin and affirm that the membership of VVAW/WSO is not only concerned with ending this war, but with changing the domestic, social, political, and economic institutions that have caused and perpetuated its continuance.





VI. FINANCES





On March 4, 1975, SAs of the FBI, Chicago, Illinois observed a demonstration sponsored by the RU which was held in front of the Chicago Police Department Headquarters, Chicago, Illinois. Nine members of the Chicago VVAW/WSO Chapter were observed in attendance. This demonstration resulted in no incidents or arrests.

A SA of the FBI, Chicago, observed a demonstration on March 7, 1975, sponsored by the RU at the Civic Center Plaza, Chicago, Illinois, in support of ANTOWYN CAULEY. Approximately 45 individuals participated in this demonstration, six of which were members of the Chicago VVAW/WSO Chapter.

AMERICAN INDIAN MOVEMENT

The American Indian Movement (AIM) was formed in 1968 at Minneapolis, Minnesota, by Clyde Bellecourt, Dennis Banks and George Mitchell, Chippewa Indians, as a civil rights organization. Its stated goals are to secure Indian self-determination and the right to be and think Indian; to eliminate the destructive tendencies of Christianity, white-oriented education and the Federal Government from Indian life, along with the yoke of the Bureau of Indian Affairs.

All AIM chapters, leaders and members are not considered to be violence-prone. Members of AIM, however, led by violence-prone leaders, participated in the takeover of the Bureau of Indian Affairs Building, Washington, D.C., during November, 1972, and participated in confrontations with local authorities, resulting in violence at Scottsbluff, Nebraska, and the Rapid City-Custer area of South Dakota. From February 27, 1973, through May 8, 1973, these leaders with AIM members and supporters occupied Wounded Knee, South Dakota, by force of arms. Since that time AIM leaders, members and supporters have been involved in numerous confrontations with local and Federal authorities, including the shooting and killing of a deputy sheriff in Arizona, and the severe beating of two police officers in South Dakota. A country court house, Sioux Falls, South Dakota, was extensively damaged during a disturbance at the Wounded Knee nonleadership trials.

From January 1, 1975, through February 3, 1975, a group of Indians led by a Wisconsin AIM leader took over the Alexian Brothers Novitiate, Gresham, Wisconsin. Subsequent court appearances by those involved in the takeover have resulted in disturbances and violence with minor injuries to numerous individuals, including police officers.

REVOLUTIONARY STUDENT BRIGADE

The Revolutionary Student Brigade (RSB), formerly known as the Attica Brigade, is a student-based organization founded in New York City in the Fall of 1971. The RSB considers itself to be an anti-imperialist organization views United States imperialism as the main enemy of the people of the world and one of its stated objectives is to help build a revolutionary student movement and be a part of the overall revolutionary movement that will ultimately defeat U.S. imperialism. The RSB favors violent actions to further its cause and is moving closer in ideology to the Revolutionary Union (RU), which has significantly infiltrated the RSB and plays a major role in the RSB policies, decisions, and activities. As of September, 1974, the RSB is headquartered in Chicago, Illinois. The RU is a basic Marxist-Leninist-Maoist revolutionary organization.



REVOLUTIONARY UNION

The Revolutionary Union (RU), founded in early 1968 in the San Francisco Bay area, is a militant semicovert Marxist-Leninist revolutionary organization ideologically oriented towards the People's Republic of China and the teachings of Chairman MAO Tse-tung. Its objectives as set forth in its theoretical publication, "The Red Papers," and in its monthly newspaper, "Revolution," are the development of a united front against imperialism, the fostering of revolutionary working class unity and leadership in struggle, and the formation of a communist party based on Marxism-Leninism-MAO Tse-tung thought, leading to the overthrow of the United States Government by force and violence. Members of the RU have been identified as collecting weapons while engaging in firearms and guerrilla warfare training. As of July, 1974, RU national headquarters was located in Maywood, Illinois.





The ACWM hopes to implement a program of the working class in order to build its Marxist-Leninist Communist Party as the first step in overthrowing the capitalist class. The ACWM is headquartered in Boston, Massachusetts, as of 1974.

APPENDIX

COMMUNIST PARTY, USA (CPUSA)

Title 50, USC, Section 781 (Internal Security Act of 1950) stated that, as a result of evidence adduced before various committees of the Senate and House of Representatives, Congress found the existence of a world communist revolutionary movement, whose purpose is to establish a communist totalitarian dictatorship in the world's countries through the medium of a world-wide communist organization. Communist action organizations in various countries endeavor to carry out the objectives of the world communist movement by bringing about the overthrow of existing governments by any means. The communist organization in the United States -- the CPUSA -- pursuing its stated objectives, presents "a clear and present danger to the security of the United States." The Subversive Activities Control Board, established by Section 791 of the above Act, found the CPUSA to be a communist action organization. This finding was upheld by the United States Supreme Court in June, 1961. The CPUSA has continued to be an arm of the international communist movement dominated by the Soviet Union. The CPUSA, in its dependence on the Soviet Union, has never knowingly adopted a position contrary to Soviet policy. Its leaders frequently confer with Soviet leaders to receive guidance and direction on the policies the CPUSA is to follow. There has been no evidence that the primary aims of the CPUSA, as they conform to Soviet objectives, have changed over the years.

APPENDIX

NATIONAL CAUCUS OF LABOR COMMITTEES

The National Caucus of Labor Committees (NCLC) is a violence-oriented, Marxist, revolutionary organization which aims to replace democracy in the United States with a communist form of government. Headquartered in New York City, NCLC has nearly 1,000 members in chapters in more than 50 cities in this country and additional members in affiliated chapters in Canada, Mexico, Europe and Asia. LYN MARCUS, National Chairman, has predicted NCLC will have gained state power in the United States by 1979 and by the year 2000 in the world.

NCLC established a front group, the North American Unemployed and Welfare Rights Organization (NUWRO) to attract poor people to its philosophy; a youth group, the Revolutionary Youth Movement (RYM), to organize ghetto youths; and a political arm, the United States Labor Party (USLP) to acquaint the general public with its views through political campaigns.

REVOLUTIONARY STUDENT BRIGADE

The Revolutionary Student Brigade (RSB), formerly known as the Attica Brigade, is a student-based organization founded in New York City in the Fall of 1971. The RSB considers itself to be an anti-imperialist organization which views United States imperialism as the main enemy of the people of the world and one of its stated objectives is to help build a revolutionary student movement and be a part of the overall revolutionary movement that will ultimately defeat United States imperialism. The RSB favors violent actions to further its cause and is moving closer in ideology to the Revolutionary Union (RU), which has significantly infiltrated the RSB and plays a major role in the RSB policies, decisions, and activities. As of September, 1974, the RSB is headquartered in Chicago, Illinois. The RU is a basic Marxist-Leninist-Maoist revolutionary organization.

APPENDIX

REVOLUTIONARY UNION

The Revolutionary Union (RU), founded in early 1968 in the San Francisco Bay area, is a militant semicovert Marxist-Leninist revolutionary organization ideologically oriented towards the People's Republic of China and the teachings of Chairman MAO Tse-tung. Its objectives as set forth in its theoretical publication, "The Red Papers," and in its monthly newspaper, "Revolution," are the development of a united front against imperialism, the fostering of revolutionary working class unity and leadership in struggle, and the formation of a communist party based on Marxism-Leninism-MAO Tse-tung thought, leading to the overthrow of the United States Government by force and violence. Members of the RU have been identified as collecting weapons while engaging in firearms and guerrilla warfare training. As of July, 1974, RU national headquarters was located in Maywood, Illinois.

On 11/30/84, settlement was reached in a civil action against the Department of Justice and the FBI by referenced Leagues. (FBIHQ Airtel to All SACS, 12/18/84, Captioned "SPARTACIST LEAGUE; SPARTACUS YOUTH LEAGUE; JAMES M. ROBERTSON AND SUSAN ADAMS V. ATTORNEY GENERAL OF THE UNITED STATES, et al., (U.S.D.C., S.D.N.Y.) CIVIL ACTION NO. 83-CIV-7680.)

In the settlement agreement, the FBI agreed to change its characterization of the Spartacist League. The text of the new characterization is provided below. Effective 11/30/84, all PLSs are instructed to advise the requester that a new characterization exists and should include the court-approved characterization in the disclosure letter of any future FOIPA releases containing a prior Spartacist League characterization.

"The Spartacist League (SPL), a Marxist political organization, was founded in 1966. The historical and theoretical roots of the SPL derive from the early Communist Party, U.S.A. and the Socialist Workers Party. The immediate precursor of the SPL was the Revolutionary Tendency of the Socialist Workers Party. The SPL has an official youth section named the Spartacus Youth League."

"The SPL was once the subject of an FBI domestic security investigation. The investigation was closed in 1977, however, and it did not result in any criminal prosecution."

VIETNAM VETERANS AGAINST THE WAR/ WINTER SOLDIER ORGANIZATION

The Vietnam Veterans Against the War, formed in 1967 by Vietnam veterans to protest United States involvement in the war in Southeast Asia (changed name to Vietnam Veterans Against the War/Winter Soldier Organization (VVAW/ WSO) in 1973 to include non-veterans as members), has sponsored numerous anti-government demonstrations, some resulting in violence. The VVAW/WSO National Office (NO) and some key chapters are infiltrated and influenced by the militant Revolutionary Union (RU) organization, and VVAW/WSO leaders have told members that VVAW/WSO is a revolutionary organization, not "just another group of war veterans." The current Marxist-Leninist-Maoist oriented NO, which promotes education of the membership in Marxist-Leninist-Maoist doctrine and directs the organization into political growth along the same lines, has at VVAW/WSO National Steering Committee Meetings (NSCM), in 1974, portrayed VVAW/WSO as a mass anti-imperialist organization and a vanguard of the revolution eventually created by the masses.

VVAW/WSO leaders voted at the December, 1974 NSCM to align VVAW/WSO with the RU, which organization follows a strict Maoist line designed to bring about violent revolution in the United States.



PCS, NLG, and VVAW/WSO operate in the Far East within what they call the Asia Project. In Japan they jointly operate out of the People's House (PH), Women's House (WH) and United Front (UF) in Okinawa Prefecture, Japan; the Semper Fi House (SFH) in Iwakuni City, Japan; and the New People's Center (NPC) in Yokosuka City, Japan. (U)

According to U. S. Naval Investigative Service Office, Japan (NISO-J), the following U. S. citizen, civilian activists are presently assigned to the indicated locations, all in the proximity of U. S. Naval, U. S. Marine Corps, or U. S. Coast Guard installations:

NISO-J further advises that, at each of these locations, PCS, NLG, and VVAW/WSO activists are engaged in counseling U. S. military personnel to dissent from the military regulations; and in some instances, NLG attorneys furnish free legal services. In addition, PCS, NLG, and VVAW/WSO cooperate with anti-military and anti-U.S. Japanese groups in collecting information, both fact and fiction, that might be valuable in public criticism of the U.S. military presence in the Far East. As organs primarily for the promulgation of their propaganda within the U.S. military population of their respective areas, "Freedom of the Press" is published at New People's Center at Yokosuka; "Semper Fi" is published at the Semper Fi House at Iwakuni; and "Omega Press" is published at People's House in Okinawa. Each of the publications appears at about two-week intervals and are mainly distributed on the streets near the U. S. bases. Donations are solicited from the persons accepting the papers. publications are made up of reprints from other underground and dissident publications, articles written by the full-time activists, and items written by U. S. military personnel.

On January 22-25, 1975, a conference sponsored by PCS was held at Okinawa. NISO-J reported that nine U. S. citizen PCS, NLG, and VVAW/WSO activists attended the conference plus Bob (last name unknown) from PCS in San Francisco, California. Military personnel who support PCS, NLG, and VVAW/WSO were excluded from the conference. Therefore, it appears that the entire PCS, NLG, and VVAW/WSO full-time complement attended the conference. To date, details of the conference have not been received. (**)

NISO-J further reports that recently the San Francisco Collective (SFC), which is headquarters for the Asia Project, pointed out to PH, WH, UF, SFH, and NPC that "the revolution is not going to be tomorrow." For there to be a revolution "we clearly need a multi-racial organization of men and women." SFC admonished members of the Asia Project to "work to constantly expose primary contradictions," and advised them that in "trying



The PCS, formerly known as the West Coast Counseling Service, was originally manned by anti-war, anti-military clergymen and their followers with the intent "to inform GI's of their rights within the military regulations and assist them in obtaining these rights whenever possible." Since its inception at Monterey, California, in 1969, the PCS has operated at various times in the States of Washington and California, with overseas offices in Japan, Okinawa, the Philippines and Hong Kong. Currently headquartered in San Francisco, with offices near many American military installations, it has directed its activities to counseling and aiding anti-war and dissident servicemen. PCS is now staffed by men and women, including anti-war activists, ex-GI's, draft resisters, and clergy.

The VVAW was formed in 1967 as an organization of Vietnam veterans to protest American involvement in the war in Southeast Asia. Since that time VVAW leaders have told members the VVAW is a revolutionary group, not "just another group of war veterans." Also, the membership has been told the VVAW has been asked to cooperate on an international level with many organizations, including communist and Maoist groups. Additionally, it was indicated that "antiimperialist groups" consider the VVAW a potent organization of similar stature in the U.S. April, 1973, the group changed their name to VVAW/WSO so that non-veterans could become members. Current VVAW/WSO national officers are Marxist-Leninist oriented and strive to educate their membership in Marxist-Leninist doctrine.

VIETNAM VETERANS AGAINST THE WAR/ WINTER SOLDIER ORGANIZATION (VVAW/WSO)

On March 18, 1975, a confidential source advised as follows:

The New York - Northern New Jersey Region, Vietnam Veterans Against the War/Winter Soldier Organization (VVAW/WSO) (characterization of which is contained in the appendix attached hereto), held a regional meeting at the State University of New York at Oneonta Campus, Oneonta, New York, on March 15 - 16, 1975. The chapters represented were: Oneonta, New York; New York City, (NYC) New York; Northern New Jersey; Syracuse, New York; Rochester, New York; Westchester-Putnam, New York; Old Westbury, New York; Buffalo, New York; and a representative from the National Office (NO) of VVAW/WSO. About 33 people were in attendance at the first portion of the meeting, held March 15, and approximately 25 people attended the second portion, held March 16, 1975.



The first item of business was an announcement by PETE SASNTROW that the previously scheduled Regional meetings were put off due to the fact that several chapters have been in disagreement recently with National Office policy and that putting off the meeting until now was an attempt to keep the chapters together.

Round robin reports followed. The source was able to obtain a copy of the Oneonta Chapter report only. A copy of this report follows: Coconta Chapter Report

The following report is divided into four sections: 1) a summary of chapter activities since the last Regional Meeting; 2) a report on our relations with other organizations; 3) implementation of the national program; and 4) an evaluation of strengths and weaknesses.

I. Chapter Activities

Chapter activity picked up considerably since the Cld Westbury Regional Meeting. On November 11, Veterans' Day, the chapter held a march and picket in downtown Oneonta. Leaflets and W.S. were distributed. The action was well-received by passersby and publicity was good. Planning for the action was done during the week prior, so the demo wasn't very big — there were 16 people participating. Originally we had planned to participate in the Buffalo action, but when it became clear that only a few people would be going, we decided to hold our own demo. Overall, the action was considered successful.

In early December, the chapter participated in a coalition with the People's Bicentennial Commission and the National Movement to Stop Rockefeller to oppose the nomination of Rockeffeler as Vice-President.

There was a rally and leafletting.

On January 27, the chapter leafleted and did a radio talk show. Also, chapter commandos painted a big-character postor depicting a Vietnamese liberation fighter and the slogan, "Implement the Aggreement-End All Aid to Thieu and Lon Nol-VVAW/WSO". The chapter had sent out a call for a demonstration to 39 other organizations and individuals who had participated in the anti-war movement in the past, but there was no response. This will be discussed further in section II.

On February 13, the chapter sponsored a program put on by the Black Workers Congress from Rochester. The EWC members showed the film, "No Longer in the News" and they put forth their political line on revolution in the U.S. They also distributed Marrist-Leninist literature.

On February 16, the chapter distributed leaflets at a lecture given by John Dean. The leaflets discussed Watergate and imperialism, as well as giving a class-analysis of the penal system in the U.S.

The chapter has been getting Gary Lawton petitions signed for a few weeks. We acknowledge the N.C. criticism in Newsletter #34 and

will got the patitions finished ASAP.

The Chanta Radical Women's Collective. The purpose of the group will be to form a political study group focusing on sexism and the oppression of women, as well as to reach out and organize more women into the anti-imperialist movement. Their first action was to distribute an International Women's Day leaflet at a lecture given by Florynce Kennedy, a national officer in the NOW. The leaflet set IWD in an historical perspective, and it criticized the organizers of Women's Week at Oneonta State for ignoring the principle and spirit of IWD.

On March 10, the chapter brought some Indians from the Eagle Bay encampment (Gantonkoh) to speak. Ever 200 people attended the program

and about \$75 was raised for Ganionko'l.

Our ongoing work includes our National Guard leafletting. W.S. distribution, and Literature tables. The NG work is considered successful. W.S. sales have not been going well, and we have reserted to distributing most of them for free. We don't at this time have a good idea of why the sales went down.


Seeing the need for an anti-imperialist student organization in Oneonta, chapter members have been actively trying to get an RSB chapter going. There have been 2 meetings in Oneonta with RSB people and chapter members and students have gone to two recent RSB conferences. There is enthusiasm among some students to organize a chapter and one will probably come into existence soon. However, chapter members report some misgivings about many of the RSB members they have met at conferences. These misgivings mainly stem from what apparently is an appaling lack of theory at all levels of RSB.

At the present time, very few Third World students in Oneonta are politically active. We see the need for Third World students to get organized and that's why we spensored the BWC program. We have also been talking to some people about the February First Movement, a black anti-imperialist student organization. Nothing concrete has come out of these efforts yet, although there has clearly been some interest shown.

From the looks of the zero response we got from our call for a January 27 demo, it looks like we cannot depend on support from AFSC, the churches, and other assorted liberals. When AFSC members were asked why they didn't respond, some didn't realize we had sent out the call and the person who received the call said that they were too busy organizing for the Assembly to Save the Peace Agreement in Washington, D.C. This was obviously an evasion since most of the AFSC people didn't go. A coalition of church groups, including AFSC, got a Vietnamese dinger together which featured a speaker from the Methodist church who recently returned from Vietnam. The thrust of the program was write your congressman. VVAW/WSO was not asked to help in organizing the event.

III. Implementation of the national program

There has been a degree of uncertainty and confusion over the definition of the organization and the national program. Our National Guard work, which is micking up, definitely fits into the focus and the program. The only action we've taken recently that was specifically aimed at vets was the November 11 demo. Also, an action will be taken on or around March 29. On that basis, and on the basis of section I, we feel that our recent practice amounts to a partial implementation of the program. We have not contemplated any action such as the Buffalo chapter's, i.e., formally voting on whether or not to implement the program. We are certain that discussion at this Regional Meeting will





advance our understaiding of both the focus and the program, and of how we will relate to it in the coming months.

At least a partial explanation for the uncertainty is found by looking at the make-up of the chapter members up and the fact that we are the only anti-imperialist organization in this area. In terms of make-up of the membership, of 12 active members, 4 are vets. This fact makes us shy away from a vets focus. The fact of us being the only anti-imperialist organization in the area also makes us shy from a vets focus.

We feel that the national program is flexible enough so that our practice fits into it, given the objective conditions this chapter faces. We remain opposed to the veteran and GI focus.

IV. Strongths and weaknesses

The chapter has 12 active members. We have eliminated the idea of a paper membership. The 12 members are people who regularly come to the weekly meetings, take part in the collective efforts to prepare leaflets, programs, actions, etc. A few of the members are new. Also, there are a few prospective new members. There are also supporters who help leaflet. A complete breakdown of the nature of the membership follows: 4 vets and 8 non-vets; 3 students and 9 workers (employed and unemployed); 7 men and 5 women.

The main weakness of the chapter is that we still den't have a study group, although everybody studies on their own. We are closer to rectifying this than ever before, though. We still haven't implemented the dues program. We also need to improve communications with the

Regional and National Offices.

On the basis of this report, the Operata Chapter requests three (3) votes at this meeting.

Characterizations of the Black Workers Congress, also known as the International Black Workers Congress (IBWC) and the Revolutionary Student Brigade (RSB), both of which are referred to in the Oneonta Chapter report, are contained in the appendix attached hereto. It is noted that the AFSC refers to the American Friends Service Committee.

Prior to the presentation of the Oneonta Report, it was announced that would shortly be moving to California and that and the oneonta Chapter. Will be the new co-coordinators of the Oneonta Chapter. job as a sub-regional coordinator has not been filled; however, no mention was made regarding his successor.

Following the round robin reports, the better part of the day was spent in a discussion of the National Office policy. The National Office has taken a pro-PLO (Palestinian Liberation Organization) (a characterization of which is contained in the appendix attached hereto) view point. This region is against the pro-Arab position and does not want to lobby for the PLO or for what it stands.

PETE SASNTROW also brought on lengthy discussions on whether or not to continue as a mass-oriented organization, or whether to function as a small cadre of dedicated followers. The heaviest factor favoring non-support of the National Office was the fact that the VVAW/WSO gained quite a bit of legitimacy over the amnesty program. By going mass-based and being open about membership and recruiting activities, the VVAW/WSO incurred a loss of membership, mostly due to those who wished for anonymity. It was further brought out that the legitimacy of the organization should outweigh the efforts of a clandestine oriented cadre type of membership.

The Buffalo chapter is directly opposed to the National Office policy. PETE SASNTROW advised that the National Office would not dictate how regional structures are set up; however, he advocates giving complete and ultimate power to the National Office in deciding what programs each of the regions follows.





Buffalo argued that the chapters should unite around the demands of the members; i. e. what most of the members feel is most important at the time, whether it be a matter of National Office interest or a matter pertinent to the Buffalo Chapter only. Each chapter discussed the National Office Program and ways they could implement it.

A vote was taken concerning support of the National Office Program. Twenty-six people voted against the National Office Program and six or seven voted for it. It was agreed; however, that for now, each of the chapters will go along with the National Office under protest, pending the outcome of the decisions made at an Interim Steering Committee Meeting which will be held in Chicago in three weeks.

On March 16, 1975, very little was accomplished as PETE SASNTROW and others debated and discussed similar issues involving National Office Policy. The first item discussed concerned the by-laws; i. e. its format and principals of unity. A return to the previous days discussion of a mass-oriented organization versus a small cadre followed; however, nothing was decided upon. A vote concerning the current format only, not the wording, of the by-laws was taken. Sixteen people voted in favor of the present format and six were against it.

A discussion then followed regarding the actual rewording of the VVAW/WSO by-laws. Debates and arguments regarding the use and non-use of various by-laws words and their definitions took most of the afternoon. PETE SASNTROW was also in favor of putting the power into the National Steering Committee to decide the wording and format of the by-laws.

It was brought out by PETE SASNTROW that an Interim Steering Committee Meeting will be held in three weeks in Chicago, Illinois to adopt the new by-laws.



A proposal will be made at the July National Steering Committee Meeting (NSCM) to have all regions and chapters change their by-laws. The changes in the by-laws will come out of the Interim Steering Committee Meeting. All interim committee delegates will be charged with getting various committee papers on the agenda at the July NSCM. Only one member from each region will attend the Interim Steering Committee Meeting. will represent the New York - Northern New Jersey Region.

The July NSCM will be held either in Chicago, Illinois, or St. Louis, Missouri.





APPENDIX

VIETNAM VETERANS AGAINST THE WAR/ WINTER SOLDIER ORGANIZATION (VVAN/WSO)

The VVAW, formed in 1967 by Vietnam veterans to protest U. S. involvement in the war in Southeast Asia (changed name to VVAW/WSO in 1973 to include non-veterans as members), has sponsored numerous anti-government demonstrations, some resulting in violence. The VVAW/WSO National Office (NO) and some key chapters are infiltrated and influenced by the militant Revolutionary Union (RU) organization, and VVAW/WSO leaders have told members that VVAW/WSO is a revolutionary organization, not "just another group of war veterans." The current Marxist-Leninist-Maoist oriented NO, which promotes education of the membership in Marxist-Leninist-Maoist doctrine and directs the organization into political growth along the same lines, has at VVAW/WSO National Steering Committee Meetings (NSCM), in 1974, portrayed VVAN/WSO as a mass antiimperialist organization and a vanguard of the revolution eventually created by the masses.

VVAW/WSO leaders voted at the December, 1974 NSCM to align VVAW/WSO with the RU, which organization follows a strict Maoist line designed to being about violent revolution in the U.S.



REVOLUTIONARY UNION

The Revolutionary Union (RU), founded in early 1968 in the San Francisco Bay area, is a militant semicovert Marxist-Leninist revolutionary organization ideologically oriented towards the People's Republic of China and the teachings of Chairman MAO TSE-TUNG. objectives as set forth in its theoretical publication, "The Red Papers," and in its monthly newspaper, "Revolution", are the development of a united front against imperialism, the fostering of revolutionary working class unity and leadership in struggle, and the formation of a communist party based on Marxism-Leninism-MAO TSE-TUNG thought, leading to the overthrow of the United States Government by force and violence. Members of the RU have been identified as collecting weapons while engaging in firearms and guerrilla warfare training. As of July, 1974, RU national headquarters was located in Maywood, Illinois.

REVOLUTIONARY STUDENT BRIGADE

The Revolutionary Student Brigade (RSB), formerly known as the Attica Brigade, is a student-based organization founded in New York City in the Fall of 1971. The RSB considers itself to be an anti-imperialist organization which views United States imperialism as the main enemy of the poeple of the world and one of its stated objectives is to help build a revolutionary student movement and be a part of the overall revolutionary movement that will ultimately defeat U. S. imperialism. The RSB favors violent actions to further its cause and is moving closer in ideology to the Revolutionary Union (RU), which has significantly infiltrated the RSB and plays a major role in the RSB policies, decisions, and activities. As of September, 1974, the RSB is headquartered in Chicago, Illinois. The RU is a basic Marxist-Leninist-Maoist revolutionary organization.



APPENDIN

INTERNATIONAL BLACK WORKERS CONGRESS (IBWC)

The International Black Workers Congress (IBWC) was formed in February, 1971, headquartered in Detroit, Michigan. Its objective was the organizing of black workers and students as well as other Third World groups to further revolutionary struggles in the United States (U.S.) and other parts of the world. At an IBWC conference held in Gary, Indiana, in September, 1971, a functionary for this group called for the overthrow of the U.S.'s "racist system" and urged those in attendance to return to their home areas to organize workers into a massive revolutionary force.



VIETNAM VETERANS AGAINST THE WAR/ WINTER SOLDIER ORGANIZATION (VVAW/WSO)

The VVAW, formed in 1967 by Vietnam veterans to protest U. S. involvement in the war in Southeast Asia (changed name to VVAW/WSO in 1973 to include non-veterans as members), has sponsored numerous anti-government demonstrations, some resulting in violence. The VVAW/WSO National Office (NO) and some key chapters are infiltrated and influenced by the militant Revolutionary Union (RU) organization, and VVAW/WSO leaders have told members that VVAW/WSO is a revolutionary organization, not "just another group of war veterans." The current Marxist-Leninist-Maoist oriented NO, which promotes education of the membership in Marxist-Leninist-Maoist doctrine and directs the organization into political growth along the same lines, has at VVAW/WSO National Steering Committee Meetings (NSCM), in 1974, portrayed VVAW/WSO as a mass anti-imperialist organization and a vanguard of the revolution eventually created by the masses.



The VVAW/WSO, Revolutionary Union (RU), and the Revolutionary Student Brigade (RSB) are characterized in the Appendix attached hereto.

On March 31, 1975, a confidential source advised the Chicago VVAW/WSO Chapter sponsored a demonstration in conjunction with the RU and RSB at the Veterans Administration (VA) facility, Damen and Taylor Streets, Chicago, Illinois, on March 31, 1975. Approximately 30 individuals were in attendance for this demonstration which commenced at 10:00 a.m. The demonstrators conducted a picket line demonstration in protest of current VA policies and at approximately 10:30 a.m. eight individuals attempted to gain access to the VA building in an effort to submit various demands and grievances to VA officials regarding current VA policies.

Upon entering the building, the eight individuals were maced by VA security guards. These individuals immediately left the building without further incident and returned to the picket line demonstration which terminated at approximately 11:00 a.m.



During the course of this demonstration no injury resulted to demonstrators, VA security guards or Chicago police officers who were on the scene. The individuals maced did not become seriously ill and proceeded to demonstrate outside the VA building until the demonstration terminated without further incident.

Its objectives as set forth in its theoretical publication, "The Red Papers," and in its monthly newspaper, "Revolution," are the development of a united front against imperialism, the fostering of revolutionary working class unity and leadership in struggle, and the formation of a communist party based on Marxism-Leninism-MAO Tse-tung thought, leading to the overthrow of the United States Government by force and violence. Members of the RU have been identified as collecting weapons while engaging in firearms and guerrilla warfare training. As of July, 1974, RU national headquarters was located in Maywood, Illinois.

REVOLUTIONARY STUDENT BRIGADE

The Revolutionary Student Brigade (RSB), formerly known as the Attica Brigade, is a student-based organization founded in New York City in the Fall of 1971. The RSB considers itself to be an anti-imperialist organization which views United States imperialism as the main enemy of the people of the world and one of its stated objectives is to help build a revolutionary student movement and be a part of the overall revolutionary movement that will ultimately defeat U.S. imperialism. The RSB favors violent actions to further its cause and is moving closer in ideology to the Revolutionary Union (RU), which has significantly infiltrated the RSB and plays a major role in the RSB policies, decisions, and activities. As of September, 1974, the RSB is head-quartered in Chicago, Illinois. The RU is a basic Marxist-Leninist-Maoist revolutionary organization.

A review of the file and contact with the Agents who conducted this surveillance in the Akron, Ohio Resident Agency on 4/17/75 resulted in the following information which is being set forth in response to the questions enumerated above:

- 1.) No Representatives of the Special Services (Intelligence) Unit of the Akron, Ohio PD took photographs for the use of that department.
- 2.) No photographic prints made by Bureau Agents during the surveillance on 1/27/75 have been disseminated to any individual or agency outside the FBI.
- 3.) During discussion of the surveillance prior to its occurrence with both the Akron PD and the GSA Building Manager at Akron, Ohio, no specific individuals were identified. Information concerning the proposed demonstration was discussed only in terms of the organization itself and, as the Bureau has been previously informed, the building manager was informed that members of captioned group had discussed the possibility of defacing the Federal Building through some act to symbolize their opposition to U.S. involvement in Southeast Asia. Agents of the Akron, Ohio RA who are familiar with various individuals active in militant circles in the Akron-Kent, Ohio area, did view the photographs taken by the Special Services Unit of the Akron PD. In some instances individuals depicted in these photographs who were known to Bureau Agents were identified by name to the Special Services Unit of the Akron PD. Except for this normal cooperative liaison with a local law enforcement agency, no individual identifications of participants in the demonstration were made to any individual or agency outside the FBI.



Since its inception at Monterey, California, in 1969, the PCS has operated at various times in the States of Washington and California, with overseas offices in Japan, Okinawa, the Philippines and Hong Kong. Currently headquartered in San Francisco, with offices near many American military installations, it has directed its activities to counseling and aiding anti-war and dissident servicemen. PCS is now staffed by men and women, including anti-war activists, ex-GI's, draft resisters, and clergy.

The VVAW was formed in 1967 as an organization of Vietnam veterans to protest American involvement in the war in Southeast Asia. Since that time VVAW leaders have told members the VVAW is a revolutionary group, not "just another group of war veterans." · Also, the membership has been told the VVAW has been asked to cooperate on an international level with many organizations, including communist and Maoist groups. Additionally, it was indicated that "antiimperialist groups" consider the VVAW a potent organization of similar stature in the U.S. April, 1973, the group changed their name to VVAW/WSO so that non-veterans could become members. Current VVAW/WSO national officers are Marxist-Leniaist criented and strive to educate their membership in Marxist-Leninist doctrine.


The VVAW, formed in 1967 by Vietnam veterans to protest U. S. involvement in the war in Southeast Asia (changed name to VVAW/WSO in 1973 to include non-veterans as members), has sponsored numerous anti-government demonstrations, some resulting in violence. The VVAW/WSO National Office (NO) and some key chapters are infiltrated and influenced by the militant Revolutionary Union (RU) organization, and VVAW/WSO leaders have told members that VVAW/WSO is a revolutionary organization, not "just another group of war veterans." The current Marxist-Leninist-Maoist oriented NO, which promotes education of the membership in Marxist-Leninist-Maoist doctrine and directs the organization into political growth along the same lines, has at VVAW/WSO National Steering Committee Meetings (NSCM), in 1974, portrayed VVAW/WSO as a mass anti-imperialist organization and a vanguard of the revolution eventually created by the masses.


VVAW/WSO leaders voted at the 12/74 NSCM to align VVAW/WSO with the RU, which organization follows a strict Maoist line designed to bring about violent revolution in the U. S.






VIETNAM VETERANS AGAINST THE WAR/ WINTER SOLDIER ORGANIZATION (VVAW/WSO)

The VVAW, formed in 1967 by Vietnam veterans to protest U. S. involvement in the war in Southeast Asia (changed name to VVAW/WSO in 1973 to include non-veterans as members), has sponsored numerous anti-government demonstrations, some resulting in violence. The VVAW/WSO National Office (NO) and some key chapters are infiltrated and influenced by the militant Revolutionary Union (RU) organization, and VVAW/WSO leaders have told members that VVAW/WSO is a revolutionary organization, not "just another group of war veterans." The current Marxist-Leninist-Maoist oriented NO, which promotes education of the membership in Marxist-Leninist-Maoist doctrine and directs the organization into political growth along the same lines, has at VVAW/WSO National Steering Committee Meetings (NSCM), in 1974, portrayed VVAW/WSO as a mass anti-imperialist organization and a vanguard of the revolution eventually created by the masses.


VVAW/WSO leaders voted at the 12/74 NSCM to align VVAW/WSO with the RU, which organization follows a strict Maoist line designed to bring about violent revolution in the U. S.



COMMUNIST PARTY, USA PUSA

Title 50, USC, Section 781 (Internal Security Act of 1950) stated that, as a result of evidence adduced before various committees of the Senate and House of Representatives, Congress found the existence of a world communist revolutionary movement, whose purpose is to establish a communist totalitarian dictatorship in the world's countries through the medium of a world-wide communist organization. Communist action organizations in various countries endeavor to carry out the objectives of the world communist movement by bringing about the overthrow of existing governments by any means. The communist organization in the United States -- the CPUSA -- pursuing its stated objectives, presents "a clear and present danger to the security of the United States." The Subversive Activitie Control Board, established by Section 791 of the above Act, found the CPUSA to be a communist action organization. This finding was upheld by the United States Supreme Court in June, 1961. The CPUSA has continued to be an arm of the international communist movement dominated by the Soviet Union. The CPUSA, in its dependence on the Soviet Union, has never knowingly adopted a position contrary to Soviet policy. leaders frequently confer with Soviet leaders to receive guidance and direction on the policies the CPUSA is to follow. There has been no evidence that the primary aims of the CPUSA; as they conform to Soviet objectives, have changed over the years.

VVAW leaders have traveled to North Vietnam in 1972-1973 and have reportedly established liaison with revolutionary or terrorist groups internationally. During the January, 1973 National Steering Committee (NSC) meeting, VVAW leaders discussed programs aimed at obtaining support from or influencing active duty military personnel to act contrary to orders. Members of the RU have been identified as collecting weapons while engaging in firearms and guerrilla warfare training. As of July, 1974, RU national headquarters was located in Maywood, Illinois.

VIETNAM VETERANS AGAINST THE WAR/ WINTER SOLDIER ORGANIZATION

The VVAW was formed in 1967 as an organization of Vietnam veterans to protest American involvement in the war in Southeast Asia. Since that time VVAW leaders have told members the VVAW is a revolutionary group, not "just another group of war veterans". Also, the membership has been told the VVAW has been asked to cooperate on an international level with many organizations, including communist and Maoist groups. Additionally, it was indicated that "anti-imperialist groups" consider the VVAW a potent organization of similar stature in the U.S. In April, 1973, the group changed their name to VVAW/WSO so that non-veterans could become members. Current VVAW/WSO national officers are Marxist-Leninist oriented and strive to educate their membership in Marxist-Leninist doctrine.



APPENDIX

NATIONAL CAUCUS OF LABOR COMMITTEES (NCLC)

The NATIONAL CAUCUS OF LABOR COMMITTEES (NCLC) is a violence-oriented, Markist, revolutionary organization which aims to replace democracy in the United States with a communist form of government. Headquartered in New York City, NCLC has nearly 1,000 members in chapters in more than 50 cities in this country and additional members in affiliated chapters in Canada, Mexico, Europe and Asia. Lyn Marcus, National Chairman, has predicted NCLC will have gained state power in the United States by 1979 and by the year 2000 in the world.

NCLC established a front group, the North American Unemployed and Welfare Rights Organization (NUVRO) to attract poor people to its philosophy; a youth group, the REVOLUTIONARY YOUTH MOVEMENT (RYM), to organize ghetto youths; and a political arm, the UNITED STATES LABOR PARTY (USLP) to acquaint the general public with its views through political campaigns.





VIETNAM VETERANS AGAINST THE WAR/ WINTER SOLDIER ORGANIZATION (VVAW/WSO)

The VVAW, formed in 1967 by Vietnam veterans to protest U.S. involvement in the war in Southeast Asia (changed name to VVAW/WSO in 1973 to include non-veterans as members), has sponsored numerous anti-government demonstrations, some resulting in violence. The VYAW/WSO National Office (NO) and some key chapters are infiltrated and influenced by the militant REVOLUTIONARY UNION (RU) organization, and VVAW/WSO leaders have told members that VVAW/VSO is a revolutionary organization, not "just another group of war veterans." The current Marxist-Leninist-Maoist oriented NO. which promotes education of the membership in Marxist-Leninist-Maoist doctrine and directs the organization into political growth along the came lines, has at VVAW/WSO National Steering Committee Meetings (NSCM), in 1974, portrayed VVAW/WSO as a mass antiimperialist organization and a vanguard of the revolution eventually created by the masses.

VVAW/WSO leaders voted at the December, 1974 NSCM to align VVAW/WSO with the RU, which organization follows a strict Maoist line designed to bring about violent revolution in the U.S.
