- "5. To make clear that the United States has never undertaken an extensive open investigation of American war crimes in Indochina. As former G.I.'s, we recognize the responsibility of the individual soldier to refrain from committing war crimes. We also recognize that the responsibility and guilt of war crimes committed in the name of America lies with our policy makers at all levels.

Weierans Agains War Chief Asks Power Structure Change

The political power structure within the United States can and most change if the nation is to avoid violent efforts to seize power, John F. Kerry. 8 member of the executive committee of the Vietnam Veterans Against the War, said in Oklahoma City Saturday.

Meeting with reporters before speaking at the University of Oklahoma, Kerry said, "If it (the government) doesn't change we are asking for trouble. If it is not done, these who are talking about seizing it will have every right to go after it."

Kerry emphasized that he and those he represents are totally opposed to any such violence.

Kerry was en route from his home in Massachusetts to take part in a two-day conference on the OU campus. During the meeting local members of his organization were to voice their firsthand views of the Victnam conflict as well as testifying to what they termed "war crimes." that they had seen or been involved in.

Kerry was met at Wili Rogers World Airport by Roger DeVito, Oklahoma City, state coordinator of the organization, and several of its members.

Responsing to questions about growing apathy for audi-war movements the former Navy lieuterant said many persons have decided that the government will not respond to their desires, whether they are reflected through demonstrations or other meth-

"There is fantastic apathy in this country right now," he said noting that his group hopes to make the government more responsive through elections.

Claiming that veterans. who agree with his organization's position on the ward and the responsiveness of government, are running for office in many parts of the U.S., the Yale University graduate said they are determined to keep President Nixon from being re-elécted in 1972.

Asked about political candidates his group would be willing to support, he said. Democratic Senators Edmond Muskie. George McGovern and Edward M. Kennedy have the best chances for getting the nomination, but if Secator Hubert Humphrey or Henry Jackson were neminated there will be a fourth party movement in the U.S.

He said neither he nor his organization has yet chosen a candidate.

Kerry blained the Vietnam war for what he called the rapid growth of alleration of the people from the government. He said President Nixon campaigned for office partly on a chiim that he had a secret plan for ending the war.

"Now, the only thing is, it is still secret," he said.

Kurry said since President Nixon took office 19,000 persons have been billed and the number of bombing missions has doubled.

Since the current administration took office. Kerry said. Cambodia has been brought into the war and half of the population of Laos has become refugees.

He disagreed with reporters questions about American withdrawals from the war being the Nixon plan.

He contended that the administration still seeks a victory in Vietnani.

Kerry said Nixon is now telling the nation it will be able to do with a small force what it could not do with 500,000 troops.



VIETNAM VETERANS AGAINST THE WAR (VVAW)

A confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, furnished the following information on November 12, 1971: \

On the evening of November 11, 1971, beginning at 7:30 PM, the New Orleans VVAW conducted a self-styled "Candlelight Parade and Memorial Service." The word "amnesty" was not part of the title. The purpose of the activity was to pay silent tribute (presumably to U. S. war dead in Vietnam) in a totally peaceful manner.

The parade permit was applied for by New Orleans
VVAW activist Don Conner. That permit alerted the New Orleans
Police Department, and a motorcycle police escort was provided for the parade.

About 180 persons gathered at Galvez and Canal Street, at 7:30 and marched via Canal and Chartres Street to the French Quarter's Jackson Square where the "memorial service" was conducted in front of St. Louis Cathedral.

NOMDS, formerly a local chapter of Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) and affiliated with the Worker Student Alliance (WSA) faction of SDS, disassociated itself from WSA/SDS in February, 1971, and indicated it would function as an independent revolutionary organization in the future.\

SDS was founded during June, 1962, at Port Huron, Michigan, and in the 1960's functioned as the leading New Left campusbased student organization in the United From a stance of "participatory democracy", the SDS moved to a radicalrevolutionary position. It maintained a national office at 1608 West Madison Street. Chicago, Illinois, until February, 1970. Internal factionalism during 1969 produced. three main factions: Weatherman, Revolutionary Youth Movement (RYM) and WSA. The Weatherman and RYM no longer consider themselves associated with the SDS. The WSA faction continues to use the name SDS. \nearrow

WSA, a faction of SDS, was expelled from SDS in June, 1969, by the then dominant Weatherman faction, but continued to use the name SDS and opened an office in Cambridge, Massachusetts. WSA aligned ideologically with the Progressive Labor Party (PLP) and, in February, 1971, moved to Chicago, Illinois, where it opened the SDS National Office at 1225 South Wabash Street.

Weatherman, formerly a faction of SDS, controlled the SDS National Office from June, 1969, until its closing in February, 1970. Weatherman then entered an underground status and adopted a tactic of "strategic sabotage," with police and military installations designated as primary targets.

The PLP was founded in 1962 by individuals expelled from the Communist Party, USA, for following the Chinese communist line. Its objective is the establishment of a militant working-class movement based on Marxism-Leninism and MAO-Tse-tung thought.

The VB was formed in June, 1969, by a coalition of New Left organizations to encourage American youth to travel to Cuba in defiance of a ban on travel to that country by the United States Department of State. The ostensible purpose of the travel was to assist the Castro regime in the harvesting of sugar cane and other agricultural products and to give young Americans the experience of living in a revolutionary communist country.\


During the march, some 20 odd persons joined the march.

Speakers at the rally in front of St. Louis Cathedral spoke in general terms urging an end to the war in Vietnam. These persons included John Bass, who added that he felt the elite ruling class generates wars for profit; Mike Duffy; Roger White; an unknown white female, age 18, who claimed to be widowed by the war and two unknown Negro males who spoke in drunken terms against general police oppression. David Duke also spoke, and made no attempt to hide the fact that he was a right winger but stated that he too was against the war. He was applauded warmly by the crowd.

The gathering, which by 9:15 totaled about 250 persons, was concluded by Al Ruhlman, who told the crowd to clean up after themselves and leave the area and stay out of trouble on their way home. Ruhlman led the group in singing "Our Father Who Art In Heaven."

There were no incidents noticed of any kind, none of the speeches were inflammatory in nature and there was no confrontation or arrests sought.

A confidential source who has furnished reliable information in the past advised the Regional Convention of the Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW) Convention was held at the University of Oklahoma, Norman, Oklahoma, November 5, 6, & 7, 1971.

The entire conference lacked coordination and appeared to be a platform for JOHNAKERRY, National Leader of VVAW, rather than for VVAW and Winter Soldier Investigation (WSI).

WSI was attended by many persons and approximately 20 persons testified. The testimony was taped but was not filmed.

The entire convention was attended by no more than 120 persons, approximately 50-75 of which attended the WSI Hearing. Approximately 50 of those at the WSI Hearing were VVAW members from the States surrounding Oklahoma.

The audience for a speech by JOHN KERRY was quite. large. A workshop held after KERRY's speech was attended by quite a few people including one student from Iran, who spoke to the crowd as well as the parents of a Marine who died in combat in Vietnam.





Reference is made to a memorandum at Washington, D.C. (WDC), dated September 15, 1971, concerning the VVAW.

On October 10, 1971, a confidential source, who has provided reliable information in the past, advised that at WDC the VVAW, an anti-war veterans organization incorporated in New York, lacks cohesiveness and direction. The source advised this condition has resulted from the disenchantment of local YVAN supporters, mainly

and John Kerry, a leading VVAW spokesman.


The source advised that local supporters became dissatisfie with the VVAW following a speech by John Kerry on September 27, 1971, at George Washington University (GWU), WDC.

A second confidential source, who has provided reliable information in the past, advised that on September 27, 1971, John Kerry addressed a capacity crowd at Gaston Hall, GWU. Kerry related his impression of national frustration resulting from an apparent powerlessness to bring about a change of United States policy toward Vietnam. Kerry stated that America's socio-economic condition has been adversely affected by this sense of frustration. source advised that Kerry emphasized the need to utilize the political process to bring an end to the war in Vietnam.

On October 10, 1971, the first source advised that Kerry's speech was received by local VVAW supporters as a clear indication that Kerry is an opportunist with personal political aspirations. Therefore, the source advised, support has been withdrawn from the New York office in general and from John Kerry in particular. \

The VVAW was founded in the spring of 1967 by six young Vietnam veterans in New York City. the beginning of 1968, with 600 members, VVAW opened a national office, founded the first GI newspaper, Vietnam GI, and sent close to 500 veterans into the McCarthy campaign to beat down red baiters. After getting gassed at the Democratic Convention at Chicago and caught in the general "down" of the peace movement, VVAW was nearly inactive until the moratoriums in the fall of 1969. Members of VVAW led student strikes on major campuses across the country and battled **Veterans Administration Hospital authorities over threats** to throw amputeee Vietnam veterans out for signing anti-war petitions. At present, membership of the VVAW, nationally, consists of 8,500 members.



John Upton, regional coordinator:

The VVAW was founded in the spring of 1967 by six young Vietnam veterans in New York City. At the beginning of 1968, with 600 members, VVAW opened a national office, founded the first GI newspaper, "Vietnam GI," and sent close to 500 veterans into the McCarthy campaign to beat down the red baiters. After getting gassed at the Democratic convention at Chicago and caught in the general "down" of the peace movement, VVAW was nearly inactive until the moratoriums in the fall of 1969. Members of VVAW led student strikes on major campuses across the country and battled Veterans Administration Hospital authorities over threats to throw amputee Vietnam veterans out for signing anti-war petitions. At present, membership of the VVAW, nationally, consists of 8,500 members.

The 7 point peace plan was proposed in Paris two months ago, the government of this country has failed to respond to it, we as veterans and active duty people must. I propose that a call be put out to all active duty people, in Nam. CONUS, Europe and every other place troops are, that the annual Thanksgiving Day dinner be boycotted in protest of the war, followed by other actions by the troops in Nam.

Getting the word out will be difficult. The First Casualty is our prime means of communications with our members in Nam. We can get three issues printed and distributed before Thanks-giving, possibly four. I believe this is one way of bringing the american people to the realization that the troops do not want war. It will make them realize that nixon is fighting his own war, a war of aggression, not freedem. I believe that after the american public realizes the determination of the troops to end the war, support will be forthcoming.


We would be asking the sisters and brothers in Nam to do something that would leave them open for court martial and maybe imprisonment. We must do something here to show our solidarity with them. What that something is has to be worked out but I do not believe it can be anything less than what the folks in Nam do. Possibly some form of C.D., going to jail and starting a hunger strike?

There are a number of service organizations that might help us. I have not contacted any yet, some of these organizations are USSF, ASU, The GI Office, SOS, various Coffee Houses and GI Newspapers around this and other countries. Their support is a must if this project is to be successful.

The first thing that must be decided is, does VVAW wart to undertake this task? If so, contact all of the above organizations and ask for their support? Contact every other peace movement in this country and others and ask for their cooperation? I believe that the power of this action is in its scope, ie having US troops all over the world protest at one time.

SDS was founded during June 1962 at Port Huron, Michigan, and in the 1960s functioned as the leading New Left campus-based student organization in the United States. From a stance of "participatory democracy", the SDS moved to a radical-revolutionary position. It maintained a national office at 1608 West Madison Street, Chiago, Illinois, until February 1970. Internal factionalism during 1989 produced three main factions: Weatherman, Revolutionary Youth Movement (RYM), and Worker Student Alliance (WSA). Weatherman and RYM no longer consider themselves associated with the SDS. The WSA faction continues to use the name SDS

Weatherman, formerly a faction of SDS, controlled the SDS National Office from June 1969 until its closing in February 1970. Weatherman then entered an underground status and adopted a tactic of "strategic sabotage," with police and military installations designated as primary targets.

RYM, a pro-Communist revolutionary youth organization was organized in 1969, first as a faction within the SDS, then as a separate group with headquarters in Atlanta, Georgia. was unsuccessful in attracting support and by mid-1970, it was practically defunct.

WSA, a faction of SDS, was expelled from SDS in June 1969, by the then dominant Weatherman faction, but continued: to use the name SDS and opened an office in Cambridge, Massachusetts. WSA aligned ideologically with the Progressive Labor Party (PLP) and, in February 1971, moved to Chicago, Illinois, where it opened the SDS National Office at 1225

At the beginning of 1968, with 600 members, VVAW opened a national office, founded the first GI newspaper, "Vietnam GI", and sent close to 500 veterans into the McCarthy campaign to beat down the red baiters. After getting gassed at the Democratic convention at Chicago and caught in the general "down" of the peace movement, VVAW was nearly inactive until the moratoriums in the fall of 1969. of VVAW led student strikes on major campuses across the country and battled Veterans Administration Hospital authorities.over threats to throw amputee Vietnam veterans out for signing anti-war petitions. At present, membership of the VYAW, nationally, consists of 8,500 members.

Source One advised on October 12, 1971, that an anti-war demonstration is scheduled to be held on campus. at the University of Florida (UF), Gainesville, Florida on October 13, 1971. Source One advised that this demonstra-tion is being sponsored by the Student Mobilization Committee (SMC) and the Vietnam-Weterans Against the War (VVAW). Source One advised there would be speakers and the demonstration is expected to be a quiet offe.

Anti-War Speak Out Rally Sponsored By Student Mobilization Committee (SMC) and Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW) University of Florida, Gainesville, Florida October 13, 1971

Source Two advised on October 13, 1971, that the following individuals spoke at the "Anti-War Speak Out Rally," sponsored by the SMC and the VVAW at Gainesville, Florida. This rally was held on the Plaza of the Americas at UF.

Scott Camil, Southeast Regional Coordinator of the VVAW, spoke on the "atrocities" of the Vietnam War. He stated there was not enough support to end the war and that there must be more demonstrations. Camil stated too many people watch football games when people are dving in Vietnam and that people just don't seem to care. Camil stated that there must be more support.

Camil played taped recorded message allegedly recorded by Prisoners of War (POW) in Vietnam. One POW was a Captain Krishner or Kishner in the Army Medical Corps. He allegedly made this tape while a POW. Camil stated this tape was sent to the United States Government who refused to play it publicly. This recorded tape related the "atrocities" in Vietnam by American soldiers and his, Captain Krishner's desire to come home and be with his family.

Lynne Edelman spoke for about two minutes about the SMC and asked support for the anti-war rally in Tampa, Florida, on November 6, 1971.

Robert Markel, a professor at UF and President of the American Federation of Teachers local at UF spoke briefly on the Vietnam War and asked for support to end the war and encouraged student voting registration.

Kenneth Megill, Professor of Philosophy at UF spoke and his opening remarks were that he represented the American Federation of Teachers (AFT) at its recent convention in San Francisco, California, and that the AFT are supporting the End the War Moratorium. Megill did not agree that the people are becoming apathetic about the Vietnam War. Megill also talked about the 18 year old voter. He further stated what the people need now is a true sense of the history of the war.

Students for a Democratic Society . (SDS) was founded during June, 1962, at Port Huron, Michigan, and in the 1960's functioned as the leading New Left campusbased student organization in the United States. From a stance of "participatory democracy," the SDS moved to a radicalrevolutionary position. It maintained a national office at 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois, until February, 1970. Internal factionalism during 1969 produced three main factions: Weatherman, Revolutionary Youth Movement (RYM), and Worker Student Alliance (WSA). Weatherman and RYM no longer consider themselves associated with the SDS. WSA faction continues to use the name SDS.

Anti-War Speak Out Rally Sponsored By Student Mobilization Committee (SMC) and Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW) University of Florida, Gainesville, Florida October 13, 1971

Weatherman, formerly a faction of SDS controlled the SDS National Office from June, 1969, until its closing in February, 1970. Weatherman then entered an underground status and adopted a tactic of "strategic sabotage," with police and military installations designated as primary targets.

A characterization of RYM is contained in the appendix section of this memorandum. \backslash ,

WSA, a faction of SDS was expelled from SDS in June, 1969, by the then dominant Weatherman faction, but continued to use the name SDS and opened an office in Cambridge, Massachusetts. WSA aligned ideologically with the Progressive Labor Party (PLP) and, in February, 1971, moved to Chicago, Illinois, where it opened the SDS National Office at 1225 South Wabash Street.

The PLP was founded in 1962 by individuals expelled from the Communist Party, USA, for following the Chinese communist line. Its objective is the establishment of a militant working-class movement based on Marxism-leninism and Mao Tse-tung thought.

Anti-War Speak Out Rally Sponsored By Student Mobilization Committee (SMC) and Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW) University of Florida, Gainesville, Florida
October 13, 1971

Source Four advised on October 14, 1971, that Eric Johns was one of the SMC speakers at captioned rally. Johns condemned the United States for its participation in the war. Johns compared President Nixon; former President Johnson; and former Secretary of Defense, Robert McNamara to Hitler and described them as "war criminals."

Source Five advised on October 13, 1971, that in addition to the speakers mentioned herein, a Neil Fullagar spoke against the draft and American policy in Vietnam. Fullagar stated it was not a question of religion and that everybody should outwardly be against the draft. Fullagar spoke primarily about his cause, that being his trial scheduled in Federal Court in Gainesville on October 19, 1971, on a draft charge. He appeared to be trying to raise public sympathy for himself.

Source Five advised that the rally concluded with recorded speeches from United States servicemen reportedly captured in Vietnam. One of the recorded speeches was by a John A. Young, a POW and he stated he had been captured three years ago. Source Five advised that these taped speeches called for support of the North Vietnamese and were against the United States Government.

Source Five stated the general theme of the rally was anti-war and calling for an end to "U. S. imperialism" and calling for support of the "People's Peace Treaty."

Source Five advised the rally did not appear to be well organized and it appeared the speeches were not thought out beforehand. Source Five noted that during the entire rally there were several children between the ages of five and twelve passing out literature.

Source Two advised that the SWP table was manned by a girl whose last name was claimed she was from Atlanta, Georgia. She stated she was supporting Linda Jenness and Andrew Pulley for president and vice president, respectively on the SWP ticket.

APPENDIX

REVOLUTIONARY YOUTH MOVEMENT

A source advised that the Revolutionary Youth Movement II (RYMII) faction of Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) held a national conference at Atlanta, Georgia, from November 26 to 30, 1969. At this conference it was decided to form a new organization to be known as Revolutionary Youth Movement (RYM), characterized as a mass anti-imperialist youth organization, said organization being proposed as separate and distinct in form and content from SDS. The "Principles of Unity" adopted by the conference included a struggle against white supremacy and male supremacy; fights against imperialism, anticommunism, facism and oppression of youth; and support of the right of self-determination of all "oppressed nations," also support of the right of all "oppressed and exploited" peoples "to armed self-defense." It was agreed that RYM would not be a Marxist-Leninist organization; however, source said this was decided in order to indicate an organization broad enough in form to be acceptable to everyone. A termporary National Steering Committee (MSC) made up of eight females and two males was elected to govern RYM until national officers could be elected during the Spring of 1970.

RYM publications have listed the RYM National Office (NO) at Post Office Box 5421 and Post Office Box 77012 C, both Atlanta, Georgia, and a second source has advised that the NO has no office space but would probably be considered as located at Apartment 27, 1067 Alta Avenue, Northeast, Atlanta.

Second source advised that women dominated the founding conference and have continued to dominate NSC meetings to the point that "women's liberation" has apparently become the RYM's principal issue - also that RYM's poor financial condition has resulted in its failure to publish a paper. During early 1970, RYM has decided to cater to the working class rather than youth, since the potential for social revolution lies in workers.

A third source has stated that it was decided at the March, 1970, NSC meeting that RYM women had decided the organization will be molded into a "working class, Marxist-Leninist, revolutionary, anti-imperialist, problack nationalist, people's women's liberation organization."
