VIETNAM VETERANS AGAINST THE WAR

The Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW) is a veterans' organization with a national office at 25 West 26th Street, New York, New York. Its first published objective is "to demand an immediate cessation of fighting and the withdrawal of all American troops from Indochina." VVAW has participated in several demonstrations including a massive demonstration in Washington, D. C., during the period April 19-23, 1971. U

On December 30, 1971, an Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) observed the VVAW commence a demonstration at about 1:00 p.m. at Park and Tremont Streets, Boston, Massachusetts. U

Various speakers related their experiences in the Vietnam War and condemned the United States for continuing the war. U

~~Howard Zinn, a Boston University, Boston, Massachusetts, professor, who is not a member of the VVAW, spoke concerning the war, the President of the United States, the United States Congress, and bankers in general for their part in the Vietnam War.~~ U

VIETNAM VETERANS AGAINST THE WAR

Howard Zinn is a professor of Government at Boston University, Boston, Massachusetts, and has publicly spoken out in opposition to the war in Vietnam at numerous rallies and demonstrations. [REDACTED] b7c

The VVAW group was augmented by representatives from the Peoples Coalition for Peace and Justice (PCPJ), Quakers for Peace, Gay Love, and Women's International League for Peace and Freedom and United Farm Workers Organizing Committee with a total of approximately two hundred in attendance.

A PCPJ press release dated March 1, 1971, described the PCPJ as being headquartered in Washington, D. C., and consisting of over one hundred organizations which are using massive, non-violent, civil disobedience to combat racism, poverty, repression, and war.

During the demonstration, it was announced that some members of the VVAW had left the area unannounced and were attempting to disrupt a part of the "war machine" in the Boston, Massachusetts, area and when word was received that they had accomplished their task the demonstration would move to their support.

An attempt was made to enter the United States Army recruiting office at 110 Tremont Street, Boston, Massachusetts, by the VVAW group; however, this attempt was thwarted by the presence of members of the Boston Police Department at the recruiting station.

About 2:00 p.m., the demonstrators left the area of Park and Tremont Streets, Boston, Massachusetts, and marched to Faneuil Hall, located in the Dock Square area of Boston. The group entered Faneuil Hall without any permit, occupied the auditorium for about fifteen minutes without any further speeches, and left when it was announced that another group

of the VVAW had successfully entered and were occupying a military recruiting station at Fields Corner, Dorchester (Boston), Massachusetts.

The group was asked to proceed to Dorchester, Massachusetts, and lend support to those who had entered and taken over the recruiting station.

The group then left Faneuil Hall in an orderly fashion and about seventy-five of the demonstrators proceeded to the military recruiting station in Dorchester, Massachusetts.

At Dorchester, Massachusetts, nine members of the VVAW entered without force the office of the United States Marine Corps recruiting office and barricaded themselves within. The Boston Police Department arrested the group and charged them with trespassing and malicious damage to property valued over \$25.

Those arrested appeared in the Dorchester District Court on December 31, 1971, and their cases were continued until January 20, 1972. Those arrested and charged as above are as follows:

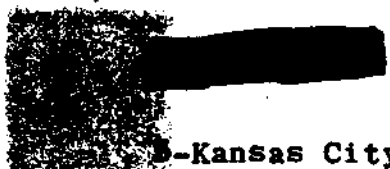

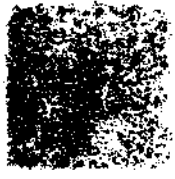

[redacted] they asked [redacted] and received information regarding the location of the VVAW headquarters for the Peace Action. They were told that the base camp for the VVAW action was named "Fire Base Pace II" which was located at the Stillhouse Reservoir near Comanche Gap. U

When they arrived at the base camp there were 15 or 20 people already there, most of them from Colorado and Kansas. The rest of the night was spent getting acquainted and "rapping" with those present. U

On the morning of December 24, 1971 [redacted] appeared at the [redacted]. They were taken to the campsite along with 11 persons who had come with them. They brought the total number of people to approximately 30. Several more hours were spent getting acquainted and "rapping." U

There appeared to be very little coordination among the VVAW members from [redacted].

On the afternoon of December 24, 1971, it was agreed that they would not burn a Christmas tree as previously planned. Instead, they went to the front gate at Fort Hood, Texas, and attempted to give a black Christmas tree to some military officers who were at the front gate. They were

turned away and went a short distance from the front gate where they placed the black Christmas tree in a stand and laid toy rifles under the tree. After that ceremony they went to the Oleo Strut where they talked with local GI's.

There was very little activity on December 25, 1971, and most of the day was spent at the Oleo Strut talking with GI's and gathering "movement" people.

On December 26, 1971, they went to the police department in Killeen, Texas, to get (FIRST NAME UNKNOWN) a former Army lieutenant, out of jail after he had been arrested on December 25, 1971, for a traffic violation and for possession of a billy club and a machete.

Then there was a caravan that went from Killeen, Texas, to the Veterans Administration Hospital in Temple, Texas. Along the road to Temple, Texas, an International Harvester station wagon occupied by several VVAW members was forced off the road by a farmer who threatened some of the members with a shotgun. The incident did not go any further,

When they arrived at the Veterans Administration Hospital in Temple, Texas, they talked with a couple of Vietnam veterans and a World War II veteran and then returned to Killeen, Texas.

On December 27, 1971, [REDACTED] took 11 of their people and left Killeen.

They all gathered outside at the library and occupied the grounds which are policed by the University of Texas Security Department. They decided to have a fast and vigil outside the library for four days until December 31, 1971.

On December 30, 1971, there was a "Command Inspection" of merchants in the downtown area of Killeen, Texas, on Avenue D which is also known as "Rip-off Alley." This was done to compare prices in the various shops and to organize the GI's at Fort Hood, Texas, into a boycott of the downtown merchants.

While the persons demonstrating in front of the LBJ Library were busy passing out literature to passersby, they were visited by persons from "Direct Action," an Austin-based organization, and some members of "Women's Lib."

On December 28 television cameras from Channel 7 came to the demonstration at the library and interviewed BILL LEMMER of Arkansas, who said that the demonstration would be non-violent and that the demonstrators would fast for four days. On December 29, 1971, a local radio station came to the library and interviewed a couple of the demonstrators. On December 30 television cameras from Channels 7 and 24 appeared at the library and interviewed some of the persons, including TERRY DUBOSE of Austin, Texas.

During one of the interviews it was learned that someone had released to the news media that the demonstrators were being paid \$50 each from the United Servicemen's Fund at Fort Hood. This fund provides grants to GI underground newspapers and is closely affiliated with the Fort Hood United Front which operates the "Fatigue Press," a Killeen underground newspaper.

During one of the interviews ~~DIANE WOLFE~~ of Denver, Colorado, stated she was being paid by a newspaper in Colorado and received \$50 for a story and additional funds for photographs and other news items.

The demonstration at the library ended at approximately midnight on December 31, 1971, and most of the persons there attended a party.

Referenced communications indicated that although San Diego Division has active chapter of VVAV, case is being closed by San Diego Office. As San Diego should be aware, during recent months VVAV, on national basis, has become more militant and actively engaged in disruptive tactics including takeover of Status of Liberty, New York City; occupation of Betsy Ross' House, Philadelphia; blockade of Lincoln Memorial, Washington, D. C.; attempted disruption of LBJ Library, Austin, etc. In view of considerable potential for various groups to plan and attempt disruptions during forthcoming Republican National Convention, consideration must be given that VVAV, already active in San Diego, would be one of the groups involved. For this reason, Bureau desires active investigation be maintained in pending status regarding VVAV to fully ascertain aims and objectives of San Diego area chapters and to determine any plans for disruptions during 1972. You concluded this communication with five lines stating in effect there were no incidents or arrests in connection with Rusk's appearance.

This manner of reporting by your office is totally unacceptable. Firstly, the information concerning the plans of the VVAW should have been furnished the Bureau on 1/21/72 when they were obtained by your office, not after this matter was a fait accompli. Secondly, it should be obvious that it is of vital interest to the Bureau to learn whether or not the planned activity of the dissidents materialized. Your communication lacks any evidence whatever that representatives of the VVAW were even on the campus of the University of Arkansas much less engaging in a protest demonstration.

Such lax reporting by personnel of your office will not recur. It must be borne in mind that information received at the Bureau is disseminated to The White House and other responsible high-level Government officials who rely on the Bureau to furnish them information concerning protest demonstrations on a daily basis. Bring this matter to the attention of appropriate personnel.

On December 28, 1971, representatives of the Federal Bureau of Investigation observed approximately 25 individuals wearing military fatigues begin to gather at the Peace Monument on Pennsylvania Avenue at the west side of the United States Capitol Building, Washington, D.C. (WDC). At the Peace Monument a large banner and two flags were displayed on which were printed the Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW) emblem. The banner stated it represented the VVAW from Bergen County, New Jersey, while the flags represented the VVAW, Bronx, New York. Joseph V. Bangert, VVAW, Philadelphia, and Timothy Butz, a Washington, D.C. VVAW spokesman, briefly addressed the group. While gathered at the Peace Monument, Congressional War Amendments were symbolically burned. U

At approximately 2:10 p.m. at the Lincoln Memorial, the demonstrators marched to the beat of a drum and carried a black coffin as well as the above banner and flags. U

At 2:45 p.m., while the group passed in front of the White House, an individual smashed a container of red liquid on the sidewalk. He was arrested by the Metropolitan Police Department (MPD), and identified himself as [redacted] of [redacted] New Jersey, and a VVAW leader. No other significant incidents occurred in the vicinity of the White House. U

The group proceeded to the Lincoln Monument, where they arrived at approximately 3:00 p.m. The black coffin was placed at the foot of the statue of Lincoln. Until 4:00 p.m., the demonstration continued without incident with participants gathered around the coffin and on the Memorial steps. However at 4:10 p.m., a smoke bomb was thrown down the Memorial steps. At 4:30 p.m., the demonstrators chanted "Peace now" and blocked the Memorial entrance by linking their arms. At approximately 4:40 p.m., a scuffle ensued when the United States Park Police attempted to remove a demonstrator who had climbed upon the structure of the Memorial. Two individuals were arrested at this time. U

The VVAW is a veterans organization with a National Office located at 25 West 26th Street, New York City, whose first published objective is as follows: "To demand an immediate cessation of fighting and the withdrawal of all American troops from Indochina. We cannot allow one more human being to be killed in Indochina."

Organization

On January 27, 1972 [redacted] ^{b2 b7D} advised that headquarters for MVVAW continues to be located at 1008 S.E. 8th Street, Minneapolis, Minnesota. This group was organized the early part of March, 1971, and is affiliated with the Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW), headquartered at New York City. It ascribes to the published objective of that organization as set out above. The group itself and all of its members are opposed to any type of violent activity or the use of disruptive acts of civil disobedience. It continually emphasized a non-violent theme. In view of this strong non-violent feeling and its earnest opposition to violence the group has no real potential for such activity.

Main activities of this group include providing speakers, publicizing the organization's antiwar position, and carrying out selected non-violent demonstrations as a call for the withdrawal of United States forces from Indochina. They also encourage communication with state legislators and United States Congressmen, emphasizing their anti-Vietnam War position.

On [Redacted] reliable in the past, advised that there has been no discussion at Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW) Headquarters regarding the 1/22/72 Mid-East Region meeting in Harrisburg, Pa., except for the statement that the Mid-East Region, (New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Maryland, and Washington, D.C.) had decided to break away from the National VVAW Executive Committee in New York City. This action was prompted by the fact that the Mid-East Region is ineffectual.

On [Redacted] furnished a two page announcement pertaining to the 1/22/72 meeting in Harrisburg. In brief, this announcement indicated a desire that the National Executive Committee be dissolved as it is felt that a loosely constructed system founded in regional autonomy would work more effectively. A Mid-Eastern Clearing House was proposed. This office, to be located in Philadelphia, would compile information concerning activities within the region and to disseminate all information in its possession to other regions.

HE STATED THAT THE OOD AT THE TIME SAID HE HAD RECEIVED A CALL AT 1430 FROM CAPT. [REDACTED] (MC) USN. CAPT. [REDACTED] WHO HAS QUARTERS ABOARD THE HOSPITAL COMPOUND FACING PATTISON AVENUE, ADVISED THAT A GROUP OF APPROXIMATELY 30 INDIVIDUALS WAS WALKING TOWARDS THE MAIN ENTRANCE OF THE HOSPITAL. THE OOD MET THE GROUP AT THE MAIN ENTRANCE OF THE HOSPITAL AT WHICH TIME INDIVIDUALS IN THIS GROUP IDENTIFIED THEMSELVES AS MEMBERS OF THE VVAW. NO FURTHER IDENTIFYING DATA WAS OBTAINED. THIS GROUP, WHICH NUMBERED ABOUT 30 PEOPLE, THE MAJORITY OF WHICH WERE MEN WITH A COUPLE OF WOMEN, WAS ORDERLY AND DID NOT HAVE PLACARDS OR DEMONSTRATE IN ANY MANNER. BECAUSE VISITING HOURS HAD NOT YET COMMENCED, THE GROUP WAS DETAINED OUTSIDE DURING WHICH TIME CAPT. [REDACTED] THE C.O. OF THE HOSPITAL, WAS NOTIFIED OF ITS PRESENCE. IT WAS AGREED THAT MEMBERS OF THIS GROUP WOULD BE PERMITTED TO VISIT WITH PATIENTS BUT THAT ONLY TWO AT A TIME COULD ENTER THE HOSPITAL. VISITING HOURS COMMENCED AT 1500 AT WHICH TIME TWO MEMBERS OF THE GROUP ENTERED THE HOSPITAL TO VISIT AND UPON THEIR EXIT, TWO MORE WERE PERMITTED TO VISIT. THE VISIT WAS SOMEWHAT CONFINED TO WARD 1A (ORTHOPEDIC WARD) WHERE LOW KEYED CONVERSATION TOOK PLACE. THERE WAS NO PICTURE TAKING AND NO LEAFLET DISTRIBUTION. THE VISITS LASTED ABOUT TEN MINUTES AND CONCLUDED AT 1730 WHEN THE GROUP DEPARTED. THOSE MEMBERS OF THIS GROUP THAT WERE WAITING TO VISIT THE PATIENTS REMAINED IN THE PARKING LOT OUTSIDE THE MAIN LOBBY OF THE HOSPITAL. On December 14, 1971, [REDACTED] ^{b2 b7D} who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that as a part of captioned demonstrations scheduled by Vietnam Veterans Against The War (VVAW), Civil Disobedience was planned on December 26, 1971, at Fort Dix, New Jersey. The stockade was to be the main objective of the demonstration and participants were expecting to be arrested. If participants were refused admittance to Fort Dix, they were to demonstrate at the main gate to Fort Dix.

The Constitution of the organization known as VVAW states:

VVAW members had been in contact with University of Arkansas officials and had been reserved some seats in the front row of the men's gymnasium where the formal convocation was being held.

Outside the auditorium immediately before the formal convocation, VVAW planned a solemn protest, including ten persons dressed in black tunics holding a 40-foot banner bearing the names of Americans killed in the Vietnam War.

In addition, some faculty members, names unknown, who were not participating in the formal ceremony, have planned a peaceful demonstration outside the auditorium.

RUSK had agreed to a private conference with VVAW members on the afternoon of January 22, 1972, which meeting would take place in the "Deep End," an activity room at the Presbyterian Campus Center.

On January 24, 1972, the same confidential source advised as follows:

SOUTHERN STUDENT ORGANIZING COMMITTEE (SSOC)

On November 1, 1966, a first source advised that the Southern Student Organizing Committee (SSOC) was formed on the weekend of April 3-5, 1964, to stimulate activity of southern student groups in areas of civil rights, peace, academic freedom, civil liberties, capital punishment, and unemployment. Originally, it was to be a white counterpart of the Student Non-violent Coordinating Committee (SNCC). It has agreed to work with similar interested groups such as SNCC and Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) and Southern Conference Educational Fund, Inc. (SCEF). SSOC was as of that time a fraternal affiliate of the SDS.

Beginning in the fall of 1966, SSOC became a membership organization and embarked on a campaign to form local chapters on various college campuses throughout the South. SSOC publishes, October through May each year, a publication, "New South Student," which, according to the above source, has increasingly espoused and defended the pro-Communist and anti-United States position on domestic and foreign policy.

On July 2, 1968, a second source advised that SSOC continues to be headquartered at 1703 Portland Avenue, Nashville, Tennessee, and continues to defend and espouse the pro-Communist and anti-United States position with particular emphasis on attacking United States policy in Vietnam and emphasis on attacking the Selective Service System. Source two noted that SSOC Chairman Thomas N. Gardner in the summer of 1967 traveled to Prague, Czechoslovakia, where he met with representatives of the National Liberation Front (NLF) and the Democratic Republic of Vietnam (DRV), and that SSOC staff members Bruce Smith and Alan Levin traveled to Cuba in the summer of 1967 and February, 1968, respectively.

By letter dated April 26, 1968, on SSOC letterhead mailed to the general SSOC membership over the signature of Mike Welch, Executive Secretary of SSOC, it was announced that as a step toward close relations with the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) and better communications with the movement nationally, SSOC and SDS have worked out an exchange of the "New South Student" and the "New Left Notes," and that SDS and SSOC were exchanging contact lists of their respective memberships for this exchange.

Volume 4, No. 13, issue of the "New Left Notes," a publication of the SDS, dated April 4, 1969, indicated that at the SDS National Council meeting held March 27-31, 1969, at Austin, Texas, a resolution was presented by the Southern Caucus of SDS calling for SDS to break ties with SSOC and to begin building the SDS in the South. The resolution was passed by the National Council of SDS. U

An article with a Mt. Beulah, Mississippi, dateline appeared on page 11 of the June 18, 1969, edition of the "Daily World" captioned "Stormy Meeting Ends Southern Student Group." This article, in part, indicated that SSOC, described as a white radical organization which had functioned in the South since 1964, was dissolved following a "stormy" 4-day conference at Mt. Beulah, Mississippi, which ended June 8, 1969. U

The "Daily World" is an East Coast Communist daily newspaper. U

The June, 1969, edition of the "Southern Patriot," self-described as published by the Southern Conference Education Fund (SCEF), on page 1, carried a brief article captioned "SSOC Dies" with a Nashville, Tennessee, dateline, indicating that SSOC was dissolved June 8, 1969, at a convention in Edwards, Mississippi. The article indicated that a committee of five was chosen to liquidate the organization following criticism of SSOC by SDS. U

The Progressive Labor Party (PLP) was founded in 1962 by individuals expelled from the Communist Party, USA, for following the Chinese communist line. Its objective is the establishment of a militant working-class movement based on Marxism-Leninism and MAO Tse-tung thought. u

SOUTHERN CONFERENCE EDUCATIONAL FUND, INC.

Southern Conference Educational Fund, Inc. (SCEF), Louisville, Kentucky, is headed by former Louisville Communist Party, USA, figures Anne and Carl Braden. SCEF supports the New Left, black militant, and peace movements. u

STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) was founded during June, 1962, at Port Huron, Michigan, and in the 1960's functioned as the leading New Left campus-based student organization in the United States. From a stance of "participatory democracy", the SDS moved to a radical-revolutionary position. It maintained a national office at 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois, until February, 1970. Internal factionalism during 1969 produced three main factions: Weatherman, Revolutionary Youth Movement (RYM), and Worker Student Alliance (WSA). The Weatherman and RYM no longer consider themselves associated with the SDS. The WSA faction continues to use the name SDS. u

To advise of planned VVAW caravan to carry supplies from Colorado, Utah and Wyoming to black community in Cairo, Illinois, plagued for months with racial unrest, and to advise of planned VVAW National Steering Committee meeting, 2/18-21/72, Denver, at which decisions to be made regarding VVAW participation in activities during forthcoming political campaigns and discussion of VVAW plans to send delegation to Hanoi to effect release of prisoners of war. *u*

BACKGROUND:

b7D [redacted] informant has developed preliminary information that VVAW chapters in Colorado, Utah and Wyoming plan caravan, 2/10-14/72, to Cairo, Illinois, to take food and supplies to black community. Informant advised considerable interest being aroused for participation in caravan and all activity being coordinated at Kansas City, Missouri. We have received information from informants in the past that similar caravans to Cairo actually transported arms and ammunition in addition to food and supplies. Pertinent field offices have been instructed to be especially alert for any indication that arms are being carried during planned caravan. Pertinent local police authorities being advised. *u*

Informants have advised of VVAW National Steering Committee meeting planned for Denver, 2/18-21/72. Topics to be discussed include internal organizational structure of VVAW, proposals for activities during political campaigns, 1972, and selection of delegation to travel to Hanoi to attempt to effect release of prisoners of war. Attendance of 70 VVAW representatives expected at meeting. During a similar National VVAW Steering Committee meeting in Kansas City, 11/71, our informants detected first indications of overt VVAW militancy. It was during that meeting that Scott Camil, violence-prone VVAW leader in Gainesville, Florida, who is currently under intensive investigation, was first heard to make revolutionary statements advocating violence which





On November 17, 1971, the Office of Special Investigations (OSI), Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio, furnished information that a radio broadcast, entitled, "Radio Free Wright-Patterson", was made on November 13, 1971, which was broadcast by station WYSO, Antioch College, Yellow Springs, Ohio. The announcer of this program stated that it was "brought to you by the Dayton Vets Against the War" (DVAW). This broadcast features two telephone calls, anti-establishment stereo tapes, and an interview with a former Army Recruiter about faults of the military service. On January 18, 1972, OSI, Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, advised that "Radio Free Wright-Patterson" had a broadcast on January 15, 1972, during which listeners were urged to join a "peace vigil" at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, every Saturday from noon until 1:00 p.m.
