INFORMATIVE NOTE

Attached reports 5/4/72 arrest\* of a member of the Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW) at West Haven, Connecticut. He was lodged at a New Haven, Connecticut jail. When word of the arrest reached New Haven VVAW office a contingent of members and sympathizers went to the jail and attempted to block jail entrances as a shore patrol vehicle arrived from New London, Connecticut, for the deserter. State and local police arrested 20 demonstrators.

Copy of attached sent to Internal Security Division of the Department and pertinent parts will be included in summary to the White House, Vice President, Acting Attorney General, Secret Service and Defense Intelligence Agency.



## VIETNAM VETERANS AGAINST THE WAR UNIVERSITY OF NEVADA, RENO, NEVADA

On October 7, 1971, a confidential source advised that on October 6, 1971, a group calling themselves the Veterans for Peace held a meeting in the Student Union Building on campus at the University of Nevada at Reno, Nevada.

During the course of the meeting it was announced that the purpose of the group was to bring about an end of the war. In addition, the name of the group was changed to the Congregation for Peace in order to attract students who were not weterans.


Approximately 42 people were in attendance, 15 of which were females. No definite date was set for the next meeting.

Approximately 150 youths participated. The parade began at the University of Nevada, Reno, Nevada, at about 8:12 PM and proceeded downtown through the casino area of the city and culminated at the Washoe County Courthouse, where the group disbanned at approximately 9:15 PM.

There was no violence, no arrests were made, and no property was damaged.

The "Nevada State Journal", a daily newspaper published in Reno, Nevada, issue October 19, 1971, reflected that Bill Ellis, a representative of the Committee to End the War in Vietnam secured the parade permit for the above march.

On February 7, 1972, Robert Malone, Chief of Police, University of Nevada, Reno, Nevada, advised that a group calling themselves the Committee to End the War in Vietnam was attempting to gain status as an official campus group at the University. He advised the following were associated with this group:

At approximately 11:00 AM on April 21, 1972, an anti-war rally sponsored by the Vietnam Veterans Against the War was held on campus at the University of Nevada, Reno, Nevada. Approximately 150 students were in attendance, at which time speeches protesting the war were given by students and faculty members.

Joseph Ratliff, student, spoke and ended his speach by stating, "Let's go down to the recruiting offices on Fourth Street and raise hell".

The group marched to downtown Reno and gathered in front of the recruiting offices of all branches of the armed forces located at Fourth and Virginia Streets, Reno, Nevada. They chanted anti-war slogans in the area until approximately 1:25 PM when they returned to the campus.

The demonstration was peaceful, no arrests were made, and no property was damaged.

Robert Malone, Chief of Police, previously mentioned, advised none of the aforementioned groups have University sanction. He stated he believed they had no organizational structure as such, and merely assumed whatever name served their purpose of the particular activities they wished to engage in at that time. He stated he believed they had no slated officers, and no permanent headquarters.

The "Nevada State Journal" issue of March 25, 1972, carries an article captioned "Do Ideas Die" signed by the following:

The above individuals described themselves as veterans of Vietnam conflict. The article states the undersigned, set out above, speaking with some knowledge of what is taking place in Indo-China and the horror that the United States is doing in Vietnam. United States action is increased air bombardment of Vietnam, Laos, and Cambodia with a substantial increase in civilian casualties.

Attached reports representatives of Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW) plan to march to United Nations (UN) Headquarters. New York City (NYC) on 5-9-72 to protest U.S. "aggression" in Vietnam as announced by President Nixon in 5-8-72 speech and asking UN to censure U.S. Number of marchers not known. Local VVAW units urged to send telegrams to all presidential candidates and congressmen asking them to stop activities in order to start impeachment proceedings against President Nixon. Separate information received substantlated VVAW visit to UN on 5-9-72 and indicated VVAW national office, NYC. has called for "total disruption" in response to President Nixon's speech. New York Office advised. State Department and Secret Service advised at Seat of Government.

On April 24, 1972, a confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that VVAW would stage a demonstration in the form of a guerrilla theater at Tulane University Alumni Center, New Orleans, Louisiana, during the appearance of Vice President Spiro T. Agnew and/or unidentified Generals at that location at 3:00 PM. April 24, 1972. According to information available these New Orleans

A second confidential source, who has also furnished reliable information in the past, advised on May 2, 1972, that on the evening of Monday, April 24, 1972, an ad hoc meeting was held at Tulane University's Student Center, apparently called by students and former general sympathizers of New Left activities in New Orleans. 

On February 28, 1972, advised that on February 24, 1972, a meeting was held at 53 Wall Street, New Haven, Connecticut, with twenty-three persons attending representing the lietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW). Also at the meeting were two people, male and female not further identified, who represented a group known as Number Nine, which is quartered in a building on State Street between Chapel and Crown Streets in New Haven, Connecticut. These two individuals told the group that Number Nine provides therapy and advice for runaways. alcoholics, drug addicts, possible suicide cases and anyone else who has a problem that they would like to talk about. These two individuals went on to say that they have been inoperative during the past several months while they remodeled their quarters, and that they would be willing to rent a space to the VVAW for \$200.00 a month with the stipulation that there be no liquor or drugs on the premises, and that the VVAW does not attempt to levy their political opinions on the Number Nine group or anyone receiving assistance from the Number Nine group.



The Vietnam Veterans Against
the War (VVAW) was founded in the
spring of 1967 by six young Vietnam
veterans in New York City. At the
beginning of 1968, with 600 members,
the VVAW opened a national office,
founded the first GI newspaper
"Vietnam GI", and sent close to 500
veterans into the MC CARTHY campaign

until the moratoriums in the fall of 1969. Members of the VVAW led student strikes on major campuses across the country and battled Veterans Administration Hospital authorities over threats to throw amputee Vietnam veterans out for signing anti-war petitions. At present, membership of the VVAW nationally, consists of 8,500 members.

On April 28, 1972, an article entitled "Number Nine Opens Today" appeared on Page 3 of the Yale Daily News, a newspaper published daily by Yale University students at New Haven, Connecticut. This article contained information that the Number Nine Counseling Center would reopen on May 1, 1972, under remodeled conditions. This remodeling was necessary as the premises used by Number Nine had been found in violation of the New Haven Building Code, and it was necessary to renovate the heating system, wiring, plumbing and fire escape system. The article contained a statement yby the Executive Board of Number Nine, DENNIS JAFFEY, TED CLARK, SHEILAXGAGE and BARBARA/SMITH, to the New Haven community, in which these individuals said that they were attempting to cope with the problem of loneliness and depression of youths, as well as more dramatic personal crises, such as running away from home and attempted suicide. The executive board said that in an effort to combat these problems they provided a twenty-four hour telephone "hot line". individuals and group counseling, residences for young people needing a temporary place to live, and research on topics ranging from drug use to alternative life styles. The executive board further advised that they would not charge for their services because most of the fifty staff members of Number Nine are volunteers and non-professional, and that the total yearly and salaries for operating costs for Number Nine was \$30,000.00. The board concluded its statement by saying that their major financial problem was completing payment on the cost of renovations, which was \$40,000.00, of which \$10,000.00 has yet to be paid.  $\setminus$   $\setminus$







On April 24, 1972, a confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that VVAW would stage a demonstration in the form of a guerrilla theater at Tulane University Alumni Center, New Orleans, Louisiana, during the appearance of Vice President Spiro T. Agnew and/or unidentified Generals at that location at 3:00 PM. April 24, 1972. According to information available these New Orleans

uemonstrators planned to "attack" the building with water balloons filled with red dye and toy M-16 rifles. 2

A second confidential source, who has also furnished reliable information in the past, advised on May 2, 1972 that on the evening of Monday, April 24, 1972, an ad hoc meeting was held at Tulane University's Student Center, apparently called by students and former general sympathizers of New Left activities in New Orleans. The meeting's purpose was to organize an anti-war activity around the visit of several high-ranking Mexican military visitors on the campus. abla A

About fifteen individuals were at the meeting to plan those activities, and most were students. Those recognized were PETE MAHONEY GIASCHAFER (SCHAFER is a well-known New Left and Teader in New Orleans, MAHONEY is a local advocate of VVAW, had shown interest in high school Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) in 1969.) moved to a radical-revolutionary position. It maintained a national office at 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois, until February, 1970. Internal factionalism during 1969 produced three main factions: Weatherman, Revolutionary Youth Movement (RYM), and Worker Student Alliance (WSA). The Weather and RYM no longer consider themselves associated with the SDS. The WSA faction continues to use the name SDS.

Weatherman, formerly a faction of Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), controlled the SDS National Office from June, 1969, until its closing in February, 1970. Weatherman then entered an underground status and adopted a tactic of "strategic sabotage," with police and military installations designated as primary targets.

Worker Student Alliance (WSA), a faction of Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), was expelled from SDS in June, 1969, by the then dominant Weatherman faction, but continued to use the name SDS and opened an office in Cambridge, Massachusetts. WSA aligned ideologically with the Progressive Labor Party (PLP) and, in February, 1971, moved to Chicago, Illinois, where it opened the SDS National Office at 1225 South Wabash Street.

The Progressive Labor Party (PLP) was founded in 1962 by individuals expelled from the Communist Party, USA, for following the Chinese communist line. Its objective is the establishment of a militant working-class movement based on Marxism-Leninism and MAO Tse-tung thought.

None of the well-known local New Left activists were observed participating. No crowd was drawn, no untoward incidents occurred, no red balloons were noted, and no embarrassment materialized to the campus or for the visiting Generals.



former sergeant, United States Marine Corps, commenced demonstrating at the main gate of the United States Navy Submarine Base, Groton, Connecticut. Approximately 39 demonstrators participated. SMITH read a proclamation urging the closing of the submarine base.

At 12:40 p.m., about 19 demonstrators took up positions at two entrance lanes and one exit lane of the main gate at this base. The demonstrators sat on the pavement and blocked traffic, causing traffic to be rerouted to other gates.

Two demonstrators took similar positions and blocked traffic at the north gate of the base. Both were arrested by the Connecticut State Police and charged with disorderly conduct. They are identified as

both West Haven, Connecticut. Each posted \$50 cash bond pending appearance in Tenth Circuit Court, Groton, Connecticut, May 23, 1972.

The demonstration continued until shortly before midnight at which time those who participated in the sit down were arrested by the Groton Town Police Department, Groton, Connecticut, and charged with disorderly conduct. The demonstration was orderly and no damage was caused to the property.

Police Department, Groton, Connecticut on April 26, 1972 advised that 42 individuals were arrested by this department shortly before midnight on April 25, 1972. All were charged with disorderly conduct and were released on their own recognizance pending appearance in Tenth Circuit Court, Groton, Connecticut on May 9, 1972.
