The second source stated that approximately seven demonstrators began the protest at the top of the argument to the after being advised of the danger of a large congregation at that point, retired to the vestibule of the Arch, where approximately fourteen demonstrators were noted. The demonstrators at that point held a news conference with local television stations and newspapers and stated they were desirous of being arrested at 5:00 P.M., when the Arch closed.

Attached concerns a demonstration at Portland, Oregon, on 5-11-72, by members of the Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW) and Student Mobilization Committee. During the demonstration which consisted of a march through the business district of Portland the demonstrators threw rocks, bricks, concrete and other missiles breaking windows of various business establishments including the Armed Forces Recruiting Station. Prior to the demonstration, two Agents of this Bureau observed individuals unloading a supply of bricks and realizing that these bricks would be utilized as missiles against the Recruiting Station, confiscated the bricks and preserved them as evidence. \setminus_{λ}

These Agents have been subpoensed to appear before a local Grand Jury on 5-24-72, concerning their observations of individuals unloading the bricks in the area near the Armed Forces Recruiting Station. U.S. Attorney interposed no objection and our Portland Office states testimony justified and will assist local authorities in prosecution. In line with existing instructions Departmental authority will be obtained for Agents to testify on 5-24-72.







A confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that an unidentified representative from the McGovern for President Committee was present at a regular meeting of the Vietnam Veterans Against the Var (VVAV) in Les Angeles, California, on May 25, 1972.

VVAV is a mationally known autiwar organization which, in recent menths, has adopted an ever-increasing militant posture in conducting demonstrations. WVAY members have advocated civil disobedience and engaged in several seizures and blockades of important buildings and mational monuments in the United States. For example, during December, 1971, VVAV members seized the Statue of Liberty, New York City; The Betsy Boss House, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania; attempted to blockade the Lyndon B. Johnson Library, Austin, Texas; and, the Lincoln Memorial, Washington, D. C. VVAV nembers have indicated the intention to engage in civil disobedience during the forthcoming political conventions in Florida.



In addition, Clergy and Laymen Concerned About Vietnam and Vietnam Veterans Against the War plan to hold a memorial service at Sylvan Theater from 8:00 p.m. May 21, to 4:00 a.m. May 22, followed by a candlelight march to Arlington Cemetary. These groups hope to have as many as 3,000 participate.

Rennie Davis, a leader of PCPJ, who also heads the Antiwar Union, which is a collection of militants from the old May Day Collective that "trashed" Washington in May, 1971, is one of the leaders in the Pentagon demonstration. It is evident that he is attempting to use the large group of demonstrators who may be in Washington for May 21 demonstration to cause disturbances at the Pentagon. While his public announcements indicate a demonstration at 11:00 a.m. followed by a march to the Pentagon, Davis and his followers are evidently planning to create disturbance much earlier. As our sources have indicated, demonstrators will attempt to block traffic by 6:00 a.m. or earlier.

100,000 expected in Pentagon protest

By JUDY LUCE MANN

More than 100,000 persons are expected to take part in the antiwar demonstration here Sunday and some, at least, are expected to take part in a plan proposed by some activists to "blockade" roads leading to the Pentagon on Monday.

Sunday's demonstration, which will include a march to the Capitol, is being sponsored by the National Peace Action Coalition and the People's Coalition for Peace and Justice.? PCPJ has called for the Monday road blockade. It is the same group which sponsored May Day demonstrations here last year which? lice. resulted in 10,000 arrests.

The PCPJ spokesman, a veteran of the MayDay siege, stopped short of predicting that Monday's action wiuld definitely lead to a repeat of MayDay. "We're really operating in the blind," he said. "It's not like MayDay, where we had a year to organize. MayDay was very carefully done by a lot of people who had years of experience organizing. This is an emergency action," which was announced as recently as Friday.

MayDay, he said. MayDay survivors have formed a new group, the Anti-War Union, which is essentially an information unit and is disseminating films, broadcasts and written material about the war, rather than organizing street actions.

PCPJ so far has been refused a permit for a march from the Lincoln Memorial to the Pantagon, but negotiations are continuing. The exact route for marchers has not yet been decid-

ed, according to the spokesman. "We have three contingency plans right now," he said. Permits for demonstrators to camp on park land have also been denied.

He said that "if we've determined the mood of the country correctly" Sunday will bring out tens of thousands of people" and Monday will result in a high number of arrests.

The attempt to block the Pentagon, unlike MayDay, will be focused on one specific area. On MayDay activists spread thruout the city, a tactic that divided t heir numbers into small, isolated groups that could be handled by po-

"MayDay didn't work. We didn't stop traf! we didn't stop the government. All we did w succeed in getting a lot of people busted a making the cops act like brutes," said t spokesman;

At a press conference last Friday, Renr Davis also emphasized the change in tactic "This protest is not aimed at disrupting t lives of people who work in the community he said.

The U.S. March for Victory Committee, a group headed by Dr. Carl McIntire, is sponsoring a rally and march to call for victory in Vietnam. Participants will assemble at 11:00 a.m.

Demonstrators are scheduled to assemble at the Ellipse at 11:00 a.m. and march to the Capitol for a rally at 1:00 p.m. The route of the march will be via Constitution Avenue. 


