SAS OF FBI OBSERVED ABOUT TWENTY-FIVE DEMONSTRATORS GATHER AT FORTY-SEVENTH ST. ENTRANCE TO UN ON UN PLAZA, NYC, AT TEN AM, MAY ELEVEN, INSTANT. NUMBER OF DEMONSTRATORS INCREASED TO ABOUT FIFTY AT TEN THIRTY AM. AMONG DEMONSTRATORS WAS AL HUBBARD, A LEADER OF VVAW. AT TEN THIRTY AM FIVE DEMONSTRATORS JUMPED FENCE NEAR FORTY-SEVENTH ST. ENTRANCE ONTO UN GROUNDS, WERE IMMEDIATELY SEIZED BY UN SECURITY GUARDS, AND WERE REMOVED FROM UN GROUNDS. AS OF TEN THIRTY-FIVE AM THE FIVE HAD NOT BEEN TURNED OVER TO NYCPD.

VVAW IS NATIONAL VETERANS ORGANIZATION HEADQUARTERED IN NYC THAT HAS CONDUCTED ANTI-VIETNAM WAR DEMONSTRATIONS DURING NINETEEN SEVENTY - NINETEEN SEVENTY-TWO.

A second source also advised that a demonstration was being held by the VVAW at the St. Louis Gateway Arch. The second source as well as the first source advised one Richard Bangert, Co-Chairman of the St. Louis Chapter of the VVAW was the principal leader of the demonstration.

The second source stated that approximately seven demonstrators began the protest at the top of the arch but then after being advised of the danger of a large congregation at that point, retired to the vestibule of the Arch, where approximately fourteen demonstrators were noted. The demonstrators at that point held a news conference with local television stations and newspapers and stated they were desirous of being arrested at 5:00 P.M., when the Arch closed.

Attached concerns a demonstration at Portland, Oregon, on 5-11-72, by members of the Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW) and Student Mobilization Committee. During the demonstration which consisted of a march through the business district of Portland the demonstrators threw rocks, bricks, concrete and other missiles breaking windows of various business establishments including the Armed Forces Recruiting Station. Prior to the demonstration, two Agents of this Bureau observed individuals unloading a supply of bricks and realizing that these bricks would be utilized as missiles against the Recruiting Station, confiscated the bricks and preserved them as evidence.

These Agents have been subpoenaed to appear before a local Grand Jury on 5-24-72, concerning their observations of individuals unloading the bricks in the area near the Armed Forces Recruiting Station. U.S. Attorney interposed no objection and our Portland Office states testimony justified and will assist local authorities in prosecution. In line with existing instructions Departmental authority will be obtained for Agents to testify on 5-24-72.

This will confirm a conversation on May 24, 1972, between Deputy Assistant Attorney General Kevin T. Maroney of your Division and Special Agent (SA) [REDACTED] of this Bureau, at which time the following was discussed. On May 11, 1972, a demonstration involving approximately 500 individuals, sponsored by the above-named organizations, occurred in Portland, Oregon. Prior to the start of the demonstration, SAs [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] of the Portland FBI Office observed a vehicle parked in the vicinity of the Armed Forces Recruiting Main Station, 321 Southwest Salmon Street, Portland, and individuals unload a supply of bricks and secrete them in a nearby park. SAs [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] considered the likelihood that the bricks would be used as missiles to be thrown against the recruiting station and confiscated the bricks. During the demonstration, approximately 150 youths broke away from the main group of demonstrators and threw rocks, bricks, concrete, and other missiles, breaking windows at the Georgia Pacific Building, First National Bank of Oregon, U.S. National Bank of Oregon, Armed Forces Recruiting Main Station, Armed Forces Examining and Entrance Station, and various other establishments.

SAs [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were subpoenaed at 5 p.m., May 23, 1972, by the District Attorney for Multnomah County, Oregon, to appear before the Multnomah County grand jury on May 24, 1972, at 10 a.m. to testify concerning their observation of the incident involving the bricks on May 11, 1972. On May 23, 1972, U.S. Attorney Sidney I. Lezak, Portland, interposed no objection to FBI Agents testifying before the grand jury in this matter.

A confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that an unidentified representative from the McGovern for President Committee was present at a regular meeting of the Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW) in Los Angeles, California, on May 25, 1972.

VVAW is a nationally known antiwar organization which, in recent months, has adopted an ever-increasing militant posture in conducting demonstrations. VVAW members have advocated civil disobedience and engaged in several seizures and blockades of important buildings and national monuments in the United States. For example, during December, 1971, VVAW members seized the Statue of Liberty, New York City; The Betsy Ross House, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania; attempted to blockade the Lyndon B. Johnson Library, Austin, Texas; and, the Lincoln Memorial, Washington, D. C. VVAW members have indicated the intention to engage in civil disobedience during the forthcoming political conventions in Florida.

Rennie Davis, a leader of PCPJ, who also heads the Antiwar Union, which is a collection of militants from the old May Day Collective that "trashed" Washington in May, 1971, is one of the leaders in the Pentagon demonstration. It is evident that he is attempting to use the large group of demonstrators who may be in Washington for May 21 demonstration to cause disturbances at the Pentagon. While his public announcements indicate a demonstration at 11:00 a.m. followed by a march to the Pentagon, Davis and his followers are evidently planning to create disturbance much earlier. As our sources have indicated, demonstrators will attempt to block traffic by 6:00 a.m. or earlier. U

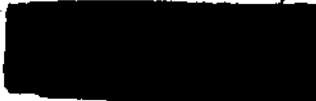

100,000 expected in Pentagon protest

By JUDY LUCE MANN

More than 100,000 persons are expected to take part in the antiwar demonstration here Sunday and some, at least, are expected to take part in a plan proposed by some activists to "blockade" roads leading to the Pentagon on Monday.

Sunday's demonstration, which will include a march to the Capitol, is being sponsored by the National Peace Action Coalition and the People's Coalition for Peace and Justice. PCPJ has called for the Monday road blockade. It is the same group, which sponsored May Day demonstrations here last year which resulted in 10,000 arrests.

The PCPJ spokesman, a veteran of the MayDay siege, stopped short of predicting that Monday's action would definitely lead to a repeat of MayDay. "We're really operating in the blind," he said. "It's not like MayDay, where we had a year to organize. MayDay was very carefully done by a lot of people who had years of experience organizing. This is an emergency action," which was announced as recently as Friday.

Many of the people organizing Monday's blockade "are new people," he said, and while at least two architects of May Day—Rennie Davis and John Froines—have joined up, they do not have the leadership roles they did in MayDay, he said. MayDay survivors have formed a new group, the Anti-War Union, which is essentially an information unit and is disseminating films, broadcasts and written material about the war, rather than organizing street actions.

PCPJ so far has been refused a permit for a march from the Lincoln Memorial to the Pentagon, but negotiations are continuing. The exact route for marchers has not yet been decid-

ed, according to the spokesman. "We have three contingency plans right now," he said. Permits for demonstrators to camp on park land have also been denied.

He said that "if we've determined the mood of the country correctly" Sunday will bring out "tens of thousands of people" and Monday will result in a high number of arrests.

The attempt to block the Pentagon, unlike MayDay, will be focused on one specific area. On MayDay activists spread thruout the city, a tactic that divided their numbers into small, isolated groups that could be handled by police.

"MayDay didn't work. We didn't stop traf- we didn't stop the government. All we did w succeed in getting a lot of people busted a making the cops act like brutes," said t spokesman.

At a press conference last Friday, Renu Davis also emphasized the change in tactic "This protest is not aimed at disrupting t lives of people who work in this community he said.

Only the roads leading to the Pentagon w be blocked "so we can isolate the men direct responsible for carrying out the war in t names."

The Peoples Coalition for Peace and Justice (PCPJ) and the National Peace Action Coalition (NPAC) and other supporting groups are sponsoring a demonstration to protest the "escalation" of the war in Vietnam. Demonstrators are scheduled to assemble at the Ellipse at 11:00 a.m. and march to the Capitol for a rally at 1:00 p.m. The route of the march will be via Constitution Avenue. It is anticipated that this rally will last until 5:00 or 6:00 p.m. We have no firm figures for attendance. Sponsors have indicated they would be happy if "tens of thousands" attend. A survey of public transportation indicates that these facilities may bring as many as 10,000 persons from out-of-state to the demonstration. We received information from a source this morning stating that between 650 and 700 members of the Attica Brigade from the New York, Boston, and Philadelphia areas would assemble at 17th and Constitution and join the march. At 2:00 p.m. this group would leave the march and proceed to the Justice building for civil disobedience and trashing and would remain in the area for the Pentagon demonstrations on Monday. The Attica Brigade is a group of militants organized around the Attica prison riots of 1971.

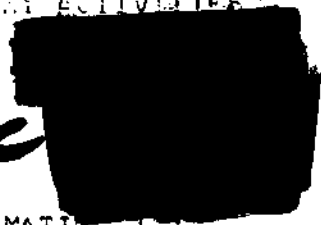

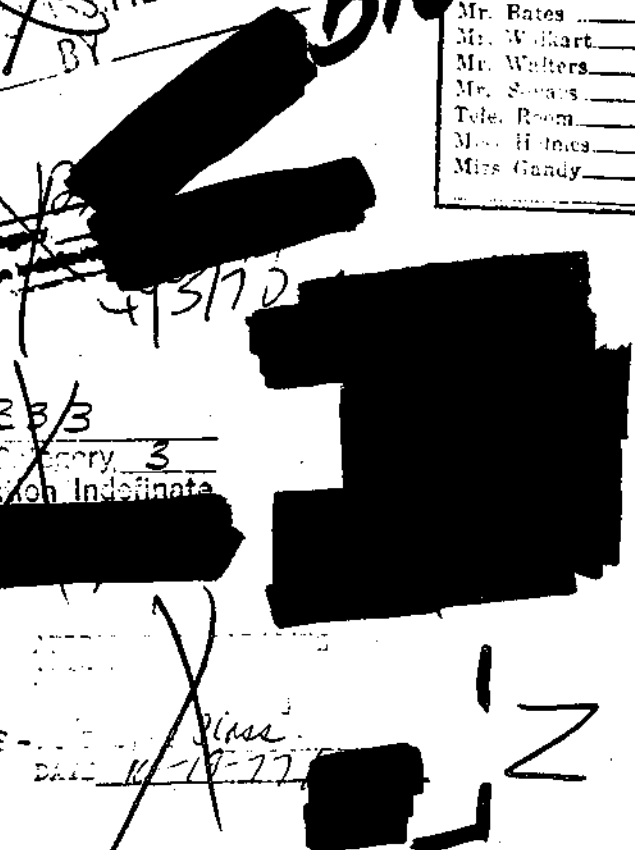
