THEY WILL HAVE WITH THEM ON THE STEPS OF THE STATE CAPITOL CASKETS REPRESENTING THE VIETNAM WAR DEAD.

VVAV IS A GROUP OF YOUNG VIETNAM VETERANS FOUNDED IN SIXTYSEVEN. PRESENT MEMBERSHIP CONSISTS OF EIGHT THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED MEMBERS.

As you are aware, the Peoples Coalition for Peace and Justice with the aid of such groups as the Attica Brigade and Vietnam Veterans Against the War, is sponsoring a "Blockade of the Pentagon" this morning to protest the war in Vietnam.

At 11:15 a.m. Special Agent [Redacted] of the Washington Field Office telephonically advised that a rumor is reportedly being circulated among the demonstrators at the Pentagon to the effect that when they finish demonstrating there they will return to the Justice building and "no one will stop them."

At approximately 11:25 a.m. Special Agent [Redacted] of the Administrative Division advised of receipt of information [Redacted]

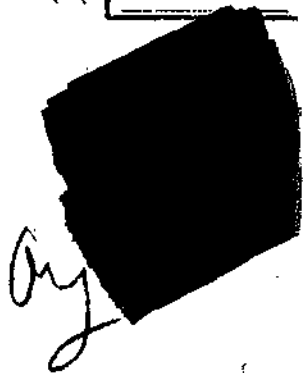

BY TOPEKA POLICE OFFICERS AND NO INCIDENTS OCCURRED ALONG PARADE ROUTE. MARCHERS TOOK ONE HOUR AND FIFTEEN MINUTES TO REACH THE CEMETERY AND UPON ARRIVAL WERE PERMITTED TO ENTER THE CEMETERY AS A GROUP. THEY WALKED TO A TRAFFIC CIRCLE APPROXIMATELY ONE HUNDRED YARDS INSIDE THE CEMETERY WHERE THEY HELD A FIFTEEN MINUTE MEMORIAL SERVICE FOR VIETNAM DEAD, THEN MARCHED OUT OF THE CEMETERY. AFTER DEPARTING FROM THE CEMETERY, THEY BEGAN TO DISBAND IN SMALL GROUPS.

ACTIVITIES OF VVAW GROUP WERE NON-VIOLENT AND PEACEFUL AND ALL WERE OBEDIENT TO POLICE REQUESTS. NO ARRESTS MADE AND NO POLICE ACTION REQUIRED TO MAINTAIN ORDER.

For example, during December, 1971, VVAW members seized the Statue of Liberty, New York City; The Betsy Ross House, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania; attempted to blockade the Lyndon B. Johnson Library, Austin, Texas; and, the Lincoln Memorial, Washington, D. C. VVAW members have indicated the intention to engage in civil disobedience during the forthcoming political conventions in Florida.

On May 18, 1972, a source advised that Scott Camil, who is the Southeast Regional Coordinator of the Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW), as well as the leader of the Gainesville, Florida chapter of VVAW, has withdrawn his offer of providing VVAW members to serve as marshals at the Miami, Florida demonstrations.

VVAW is an anti-war organization organized in 1967 and headquartered in New York City. Its published objective is "to demand an immediate cessation of fighting and the withdrawal of all American troops from Indochina." VVAW has participated in several demonstrations, including massive demonstration in Washington, D. C., April 19-23, 1971.

Source advised that Scott Camil and VVAW will be in Miami, Florida, in great numbers to participate and according to Scott Camil, they will organize into four main cells to perform acts of civil disobedience in wide spread areas of Miami. Scott Camil will act as coordinator so that the groups will be spread out and no duplication of efforts will occur.

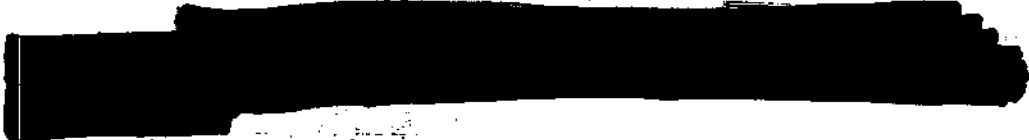

At 11:15 a.m. [redacted] Domestic Intelligence Division, advised that at 11:13 a.m. information was received from WFO that there is presently a rumor circulating on the grounds of the Pentagon that when the demonstration now in progress there breaks up some of the demonstrators will proceed to the Department of Justice building where another demonstration will be held. [redacted] pointed out that it is nothing more than a rumor at this point.

The Metropolitan Police Department was notified by WFO and the Alexandria Office was notified by Domestic Intelligence Division. Winslow H. Joy, Chief of the Office of General Service, Department of Justice, was notified at 11:27 a.m. The Tour Room, which had already discontinued public tours for the day, was notified at 11:31 a.m.

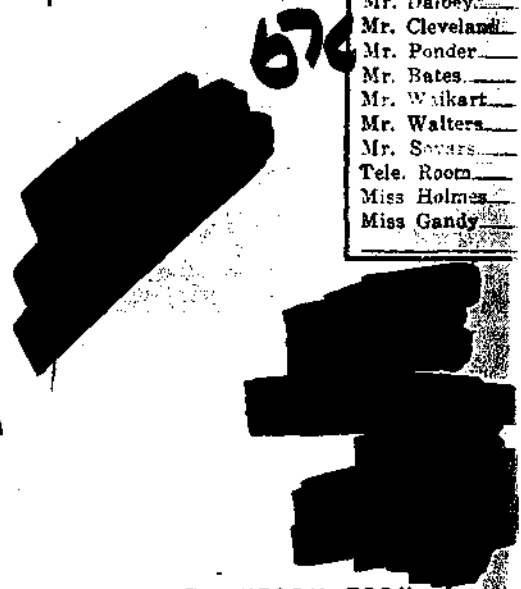

CONFIDENTIAL

Editor, The Journal:

I am responding to a letter written Dec. 2, 1971 by Mr. Neil Wallace for clarification reasons and for the personal edification of Mr. Wallace.

His allegations ring of the same tired rhetoric used by many uninformed trying to defend a policy that is indefensible.

Yes, Vietnam Veterans Against the War Inc. is against the U.S. presence in Indochina. Maybe U.S. withdrawal will not bring a total end to hostilities, but it will certainly reduce substantially the genocide perpetuated by the air war on the civilian population of Cambodian Laos, and Vietnam.

Since the time of Ghengis Khan's invasion, the Vietnamese people have been thwarting outside intervention, including Japanese, Chinese, French, and American involvement. The basic premise is that Vietnam is a civil war and whatever form of government they end up with will probably surpass their present regime. Mr. Wallace do you realize that U.S. military involvement in Vietnam dates back to 1944-45 when OSS units supplied Viet Minh guerrillas with arms to repel the Japanese? — And they were led by one Ho Chi Minh. In September of 1945, Ho proclaimed the Democratic Republic of Vietnam. Emperor Bao Dai abdicated in favor of the new regime, and elections were held throughout most of Vietnam. Vietnam had its leader. In March of 1946 the French recognized the Democratic Republic of Vietnam as a "free state within the French union."

In November 1946 at Hai Phong, French troops opened fire on the civilian population, killing an estimated 6,000

Vietnamese, and so began one of the grossest wars of annexation in history. The story of Vietnam has been one of constant struggle against outside aggression and they will not accept any puppet government of the U.S., or anyone else, no matter what our motivations.

Yes, VVAW is against U.S. involvement in Indochina, because we have been the instrument of U.S. aggression, or should I say intervention, and we have seen what this war has done to the peoples of Indochina while causing our own country to be torn and alienated. And, we realistically hope and feel that by speaking out maybe we can save a few lives, no matter what color, and bring the will of 73 per cent of the American people to bear on a callous and arrogant administration. We are not presumptuous to think that a residual force or continuing the bombing of Indochina will insure the self determination of a people that we do not appreciate nor can begin to comprehend.

As to Mr. Wallace's allegations that we (VVAW) have never protested Communist aggression or asked the North to demand peace, both are incorrect. In coalition with Peoples' Coalition for Peace and Justice, in August 1971, VVAW sent Joe Urgo (a Vietnam Vet) to Hanoi for direct negotiations with Hanoi, and we fully endorse the Provisional Revolutionary Government's seven point peace proposal presented to the Paris peace talks by Madame Nguyen Thi Binn on July 1, 1971, which the Nixon administration chose to reject. Their peace plan does explicitly make provision for free elections and many other issues that concern this country including the release of all POWs upon cessation of hostilities. It would be a true exercise in

democracy if the American people would study the seven point proposal and demand the right to decide for themselves by popular vote whether or not withdrawal, carefully aimed at the '72 elections, is satisfactory to them or not. If this had been done before the Gulf of Tonkin, 55,000 young Americans and countless Vietnamese might have had the right to decide their own destiny.

As for Mr. Wallace's statement that all non-Communists were able to run in the last election, this is a joke. Thieu purposely made it virtually impossible for any legitimate candidate to oppose him by requiring them to acquire endorsement from the many provinces and using the threat of political reprisal to anyone who offered such endorsement. The Thieu-Ky regime is one of the most corrupt in modern times, and this is what Mr. Wallace obviously supports and what our years of suffering have been for. I doubt, Mr. Wallace, if you have any more knowledge of Vietnam, North or South, than you do about Vietnam Veterans Against the War. If you think the South is free, I suggest you go there, look around and ask yourself why it is necessary to have 100,000 (by conservative estimate) political prisoners, the largest military in the world supporting them, in order to defeat (unsuccessfully) an indiginous guerrilla army which undoubtedly has the support of the people.

'Vietnamization'

Editor, The Journal:

Someone once said that in war truth is the first casualty. Isn't it interesting that Americans can be as altruistic when discussing what is being done in their names? Specifically, I speak of Ivan Jansen's letter to the editor Nov. 18. Generally I speak of those Americans who refuse to examine what is being done in America's name. It is much easier to let the politicians do it than it is to examine the acts and policies both at home and in Indochina. After all, isn't that what we elected them for.

The air war in Indochina has many facets and ramifications that cannot be discussed in a letter; however, I must marvel at Mr. Jansen's ability to dissect percentages, tonnages, increases, and decreases without so much as a reference to human life ... Vietnam for many has become a set of statistics that piles up year after year, body count upon body count, without them ever completely realizing the sheer extent of devastation reaped by our air war.

Yes, the politicians will tell us that Vietnamization is working, our objectives are being met, etc., etc., etc. But they don't tell us that Vietnamization means changing the color of the bodies from white to yellow. We went to save them from communism in the name of democracy and apple pie. Instead they end up with a dictator, no free elections, and millions of homeless refugees, not to mention their dead.

And the war goes on with U.S. air strikes spanning the borders of Cambodia, Laos, North and South Vietnam. Yes, we can afford to drop tons on tons of weaponry in our so-called

protective reaction strikes without ever seeing the faces of the children, villagers, and livestock that might happen to live there, but are no more.

When the Nixon administration talks of disengagement, it does not mean all troops and air power. Residual strength and airpower will remain as long as politicians deem it necessary — unless the American people force them to concede. The politicians and monied interests tell us that it is for the good of the Indochinese, but we never bothered to ask them.

A generation from now the Vietnamese and casualties can ask with validity the same questions John Kerry posed before the Senate Foreign Relations Committee on April 22, 1971.

"We are also here to ask, and we are here to ask vehemently, where are the leaders of our country? Where is the leadership? We are here to ask where are McNamara, Rostow, Bundy, Johnson and so many others? Where are they now that we, the men whom they sent off to war, have returned? These are the commanders who have deserted their troops, and there is no more serious crime in the law of war ... These men have left all the casualties and retreated behind a pious shield of public rectitude. They have left the real stuff of their reputations bleaching behind them in the sun."

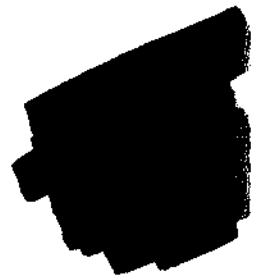

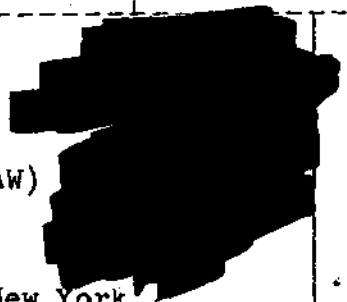

ORIGINAL PLANS WERE TO BLOCK THE MAIN GATE TO PREVENT VISITORS FROM ENTERING THE ACADEMY, BUT THESE PLANS WERE LATER CHANGED AND THE CURRENT PLAN OF ACTION IS TO MERELY PICKET AT THE MAIN GATE OF THE ACADEMY AND UTILIZE AN ECONOLINE VAN WITH SOUND EQUIPMENT TO BROADCAST ANTI-WAR PROPAGANDA. JOHN R. SMITH, REGIONAL COORDINATOR FOR VVAW, WHO CALLED FOR THE ACTION, ADVISED THAT A SMALL CONTINGENT OF DEMONSTRATORS IS EXPECTED.

VIETNAM VETERANS AGAINST THE WAR

The Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW) was founded in the spring of 1967 by six young Vietnam veterans in New York City. At the beginning of 1968, with 600 members, VVAW opened a national office, founded the first GI newspaper, "Vietnam GI," and sent close to 500 veterans into the Mc Carthy campaign to beat down the red baiters. After getting gassed at the Democratic Convention in Chicago and caught in the general "down" of the peace movement, VVAW was nearly inactive until the moratoriums in the fall of 1969. Members of the VVAW led student strikes on major campuses across the country and battled Veterans Administration Hospital authorities over threats to throw amputee Vietnam veterans out for signing anti-war petitions. At present, membership of the VVAW nationally, consists of 8,500 members.

On May 26, 1972, a source who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that JOHN R. SMITH, Regional Coordinator for the Connecticut Chapter of the VVAW, sent a communication from the Connecticut VVAW Office on or about May 9, 1972, to the North Vietnam Embassy, Paris, France, offering to send a medical assistance team to North Vietnam. On May 12, 1972, [redacted] Seattle Police Department, Seattle, Washington, reported seven persons were cited for criminal trespass following a peaceful sit-in at the King County Republican Party headquarters, Seattle, Washington, during the afternoon of the previous day. The participants distributed leaflets indicating they were members or supporters of the Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW). The demonstrators were escorted from the premises without difficulty by police about fifteen minutes after the sit-in began.

On May 19, 1972, [redacted] made available a copy of an offense report which indicated [redacted] of the King County Republican Headquarters, 1319 Second Avenue, Seattle, stated seven persons entered the office about 12:05 p.m., March 11, 1972, and began telling the employees they would have to leave as the office was being taken over. VVAW is a militant nation wide veterans organization opposing the war in Vietnam.

New Haven has advised Secret Service, state police, local police, U. S. Marshal, and U. S. Attorney.*

Separate communication reported that on same date about 25 persons, some of them children, also demonstrated against the war at the Presidential Compound. They said they represented the Women's International League for Peace and Freedom and the American Friends Service Committee, and presented a letter for the President requesting cessation of the war. There were no incidents or arrests.

Dade County Public Safety Department, other appropriate authorities and Secret Service cognizant locally. Copy sent to Internal Security Division of the Department and pertinent parts will be included in summary to White House, Vice President, Acting Attorney General, Secret Service and Defense Intelligence Agency.

Your request to interview on SAC authority local and "visitor" VVAW members, including students, who will be in Miami during period up to and including completion of Republican National Convention is denied. Bureau has carefully considered your request and appreciates your interest in interviewing persons who might be in position to furnish reliable information concerning possible violations of Federal laws during the political conventions. However, Bureau considers it unlikely that militant VVAW members who will participate in demonstrations in Miami would cooperate with FBI. Further, when weighing the potential disadvantages of adverse publicity against the FBI should several VVAW members complain of harassment, it is not considered in Bureau's best interest to grant authority for large-scale interview program of VVAW members despite the fact it would be done on a selective basis.

As you are aware, our missions during forthcoming political conventions and during all other demonstrations are to provide advance intelligence information and to conduct investigations when Federal laws are violated. Numerous contacts with VVAW members prior to any violation of Federal laws or outbreak of violence as indicated in referenced airtel for purpose of obtaining the cooperation of VVAW members concerning possible violations of Federal antiriot statutes, bombings and related matters could conceivably be misconstrued or purposely twisted by VVAW resulting in contacts with news media alleging that Government expects riots, bombings and other violations

Miami has pointed out that although at present there is not a large volume of VVAW activity in Miami area, large influx of VVAW members is expected during the forthcoming political conventions. Miami points out that Scott Camil, violence-prone leader of VVAW in Florida [redacted] will be in Miami and have available to him all facilities of the VVAW. For this reason Miami requested authority to interview on SAC authority all local and visiting members, including students, in attempt to obtain cooperation concerning possible violations of Federal laws. Other purpose of interviews was to have deterrent effect on individuals who might otherwise engage in unlawful activities. Current informant coverage of VVAW is excellent and it is considered that any large-scale interviewing program of VVAW members in Miami could result in developments contrary to Bureau's best interest since VVAW is extremely publicity-prone organization which could easily consider itself harassed and singled out by FBI unjustly should numerous VVAW members be interviewed for no reason that is clear cut and in absence of actual violations of Federal laws. This has been coordinated with SA [redacted] Research Section, Domestic Intelligence Division.

Survey Results:

1. There are presently two VVAW chapters in the Miami Division, one for Greater Miami (Dade County) and the second covers Broward County (Hollywood, Ft. Lauderdale and environs). These chapters are autonomous but advise each other of public activities.

2. There are currently no more than eight active VVAW-Greater Miami members. There are about 15 currently active VVAW-Broward County members. Investigations are being conducted to identify all current area VVAW members. Pending and newly-opened investigations will include military backgrounds and determinations whether individual VVAW members are bona fide Vietnam veterans. Recommendations for or against ADEX inclusion will be made in each case.

Miami also receives information regarding VVAW-Greater Miami activities from the Intelligence Unit, Dade County Public Safety Department (DCPSD), Miami,

Miami expects greatly increased VVAW activity in this area due to the upcoming political conventions. VVAW members from outside South Florida reportedly will be here in large numbers, particularly, for the Republican Convention in August. The charged atmosphere is certain to stimulate local VVAW activities and probably will inspire joint actions by local and visiting VVAW members. Miami recommendation to meet this potential problem is set out in below request of Bureau.

Miami is preparing an LHM setting out results of VVAW investigation in this area. For the immediate information of the Bureau, VVAW activity in South Florida has been limited. Poor leadership and general apathy have combined to render local chapters virtually impotent. They have no office space; no fixed meeting place; irregular meetings; no funds and no prospects for funds. Their few and intermittent activities, such as anti-Vietnam war leaflets distributions, have been poorly coordinated. They generally align themselves with several other local peace groups to ensure at least a modest turnout for a

planned activity. It is further noted that none of their activities have resulted in arrests.

There has been no violence, nor intimations of same in local VVAW public activities. It is felt, however, that SCOTT CAMIL, above, who will return to the Miami area (where his family resides) prior to the Democratic Convention, could effect a radical change in the South Florida VVAW outlook. He reportedly will be accompanied to Miami by Gainesville, Florida, VVAW hardliners. Additionally, there is no doubt that the local VVAW reins are his for the asking, and little doubt that he will take these reins. His leadership could galvanize the local chapters. An immediate drive to recruit militant VVAW members could be expected. To counteract this eventuality, the following is submitted:

REQUEST OF BUREAU

The Bureau is requested to authorize Miami to interview, on SAC authority, local and "visitor" VVAW members, including students, this authorization to extend until the completion of the Republican Convention. Those interviewed will be advised that the basis for contact is to obtain their cooperation concerning possible violations of Federal anti-riot statutes, bombings, and related matters in connection with the political conventions. Such interviews are expected to produce individuals with potential for furnishing pertinent information during the upcoming conventions. Interviews could also be expected to have a deterrent effect on individuals who might otherwise engage in unlawful activities during these conventions. Authorization to conduct these interviews under SAC authority would enable Miami to conduct selective interviews promptly in a compressed time situation, the period ending with the Republican Convention.

8. To demand immediate legislation to provide proper care and services for all veterans in V.A. hospitals; to make available job training and placement for every returning veteran; and to provide the funds and means necessary for their educational and vocational endeavors.

9. To affirm that the membership is not only concerned with ending the war, but changing the domestic, social, political, and economic institutions that have caused and permitted the continuance of war.

There were no incidents. **b7c**

The OU WRL sponsored various activities at OU, Norman, Oklahoma, over a three-day period, April 19 - 21, 1972, protesting escalation of the Vietnam war, with the assistance of the OU VVAW. All activities were peaceful and involved as few as five or six and as many as fifty to sixty individuals who are members or sympathizers of the OU WRL and OU VVAW. These activities were as follows: antiwar leaflets distributed at OU Air Force ROTC building, talks with passersby, lying outstretched on the sidewalk leading to main entrance to the Air Force ROTC building to symbolize Vietnam dead from escalated air war, painted signs on buildings and walkways expressing antiwar sentiment, and call for a student strike on April 21, 1972, latter of which resulted in voluntary moratorium and teaching not approved by OU. A confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on April 28, 1972, as follows:

There was a small gathering of VVAW members including some regional coordinators in Washington, D. C. on April 17, 1972. Some of the persons were gathered on the steps of the Capitol Building and others were in a meeting at a Lutheran Church located at 9th and Maryland, N. E. There were 19 members from Connecticut, 11 members from Pennsylvania, four members from Milwaukee, and some from New Jersey for a total of approximately 40 or 50 persons.

RUSTY LINDLEY is the legislation liaison officer for VVAW and a resident lobbyist who resides in Washington, D. C.

Some of the people gathered early in the afternoon at Room 4221, New Senate Office Building, where Secretary of State ROGERS was testifying for the Senate Foreign Relations Committee. During the hearing some of the members left the hearing room and [redacted]

The proposed demonstration in Washington was given the name, "Rolling Thunder III", inasmuch as it was the third protective reaction by VVAW in response to the escalated bombing venture by the President of the United States.

On Tuesday night, a few VVAW members including PETE MAHONEY of the National Office in New York, traveled to the University of Maryland to talk to VVAW representatives and observe a meeting of a Trotskyite group.

Late on Tuesday night, a meeting took place where plans were laid to occupy the Washington Monument.

The word was put out that there would be some activity on Thursday when, in fact, the occupation was planned for Wednesday.

The group planned to enter the Washington Monument at approximately 9:30 or 10 p.m. and would not leave the monument when it closed at 11 p.m. After the monument closed, the VVAW members would notify the building guard they had liberated the property, force them to leave, and fly the flag up the top of the monument. the Washington Monument and hanging of the flag was to be a signal for all VVAW members from around the country to travel to Washington, D. C. The entire operation was rather poorly planned.

On Wednesday, April 19, 1972, several persons arrived to assist in the demonstrations including E. DEL ROSARIO from the VVAW National Office in New York.

During Wednesday afternoon there was additional planning and surveilling of the Washington Monument; however, when the VVAW members arrived at the monument on the evening of April 18, 1972, there were numerous police officers waiting for them. At that point the "mission" was aborted.

On Thursday, April 20, 1972, there was a token demonstration on the steps of the Capitol while VVAW awaited the arrival of more members. Some VVAW members spoke with U. S. Senators and Representatives in an effort to get congressional sympathy for their cause.

On Friday, April 21, 1972, the VVAW members were ordered to leave the church they had used as a headquarters and for sleeping by noon.

Dear Friend,

The National Steering Committee of Vietnam Veterans Against the War met for its quarterly convention in Houston, Texas on April 7 to April 11, 1972.

The discussions there centered around our successful projects and programs and their further implementation; our project failures and organizational problems and methods of correcting them; a redefinition of Regional Coordinators responsibilities and an expansion of the National Coordination Staff to facilitate our expanding programs.

These discussions led to our decision to continue our militant actions against the war. We also decided it is necessary to secure and build our community base through continuing agitation.

Al Hubbard and Joe Urgo did not stand for re-election, saying they wanted a rest from National VVAW responsibilities. Mike McCain, Del Rosario, and Rusty Bronaugh were re-elected and Peter Mahoney, Regional Coordinator for Louisiana; Jack McCloskey California State Representative; and Barry Romo, Regional Coordinator for California-Hawaii-Nevada were elected.

VVAW is working in many areas in our communities. Our action programs range from active duty GI projects to community survival programs. We work in Veterans' Hospital rehabilitation programs. We are aiding our brothers in psychiatric counseling programs. We are working with community based organizations such as La Raza Unida, Black Panther Party, N.W.R.O., United Farm Workers Organizing Committee, Angela Davis Defense Committee, Billy Dean Smith Defense Committee and many more.

Thru the implementation of our revised objectives (enclosed) we will be continuing and expanding our community support and survival programs. The time will come when all our strength and energy will be directed against those conditions here in our land which sent us to murder our Brothers and sisters in Indo-China.

Our society has taught us inhumanity. The Vietnamese people's struggle has taught us the falsity of those lessons which took us to Indo-China to commit genocide in the name of democracy and peace. The lessons which we learned, we will teach to others. Racism, sexism, and institutionalized oppression must be confronted and exposed. The exploitation of the people of the world must stop. Vietnam Veterans Against the War will continue to fight for the liberation of the people of Indo-China; the people of America; the people of the world.

Your financial aid and personal support has enabled us to continue our work. In this most crucial period of our history, it becomes more important than ever to stop the insane policies of Nixon and his administration. Struggle and sacrifice are called for to end the domination of so much of the world by the U.S. and its business interests.

REVISED OBJECTIVES OF VVAW

1. To demand an immediate cessation of fighting and the withdrawal of all American troops, planes, and military and economic aid from Indochina. We cannot allow one more human being to be killed in Southeast Asia.
2. To demand the immediate termination of all other operations by the United States government, its agencies, and American business interests that are designed to suppress the rightful struggles for liberation and self-determination of the Peoples of Africa, Asia, and Latin America. This includes the maintenance of dictatorial governments, economic domination, and the theft of the natural resources of other countries.
3. To demand that all active-duty servicemen and women be afforded the same rights that are guaranteed by the United States Constitution and Bill of Rights that are presently denied by the Uniform Code of Military Justice. We are appalled that our active-duty GI's are treated as less than first class citizens. We endorse the efforts of our active-duty sisters and brothers in their struggle to democratize the military.
4. To support all military personnel refusing to serve against their consciences in wars at home and abroad. We demand that Congress enact legislation for the immediate repatriation to those brothers and sisters who are in prison or in self-exile by reason of their refusal to serve in the military. It must also involve an end to all repression and a freeing of all political prisoners.
5. To demand there be no distinctions as to types of discharges and that a single type of discharge be issued, and that this be retroactive. We also demand all veterans receive all rights and benefits under the VA; and that compensation for disabilities be based solely upon the degree of disability for veterans and their families, without regard to sex, race, rank, or length of service.
6. To make clear that the United States has never undertaken an extensive open acknowledgment of American war crimes in Indochina. We demand that the United States government, in its war in Indochina, affirm the principles of Nuremberg. As active-duty and former GI's we recognize the responsibility and guilt of the individual soldier to refrain from committing war crimes. We also recognize that the responsibility and guilt of war crimes committed in the name of America, lies with our policy makers at all levels.
7. To show Americans that our society is permeated by racism, which manipulates whites into viewing non-whites as inferior or less than human. This racism pushes Third World People through inferior schools to inferior jobs and into combat arms. Thus Third World People are sent off to die in disproportionately high numbers as we kill Asians indiscriminately. We also demand the U.S. military recognize its complicity in America's domestic and international racism.
8. To show that sexism plays a major part in promoting war. We must show Americans our society is permeated by sexism, which forces an inferior status upon women; reducing them to subservient sexual objects, and which robs both men and women of their natural growth. This institutionalized sexism channels women into unfulfilling, lower paying jobs which are servile in nature and purpose; it exploits their bodies for sex and profit; and it degrades and dehumanizes them by a double standard of morality wholly dependent on the myth of male supremacy. This sexism is exploited by the military, officially defining servicewomen as subordinate and thoroughly subjugating them to servile work and the role of a sexual object. We resolve to fight sexism within our society, within our own organization, and within ourselves.
9. To dedicate ourselves to these principles and objectives which directly relate to the imperialist suppression of the People of the World by the United States government. We understand this war is imperialist in origin and affirm that the membership of VVAW is not only concerned with ending this war, but with changing the domestic, social, political, and economic institutions that have caused and perpetuated its continuance.

VVAW is in the forefront of planning for violence during the national political conventions in Miami. If we can embroil VVAW leadership in a Federal Grand Jury action of serious consequence at this late date, it would probably frustrate much of their planning to date and go a long way to discourage others of like mind. In view of the foregoing, this situation was brought to the attention of Section Chief Guy L. Goodwin, Special Litigation Section, Internal Security Division of the Department, on 6/13/72. Goodwin stated he desired to review the entire matter in depth and would like to initiate Grand Jury action against VVAW leaders, if possible, [REDACTED]. Goodwin indicated that based on a preliminary review of the information available, it appears that several VVAW leaders could be indicted for conspiracy to violate antiriot or other Federal laws.

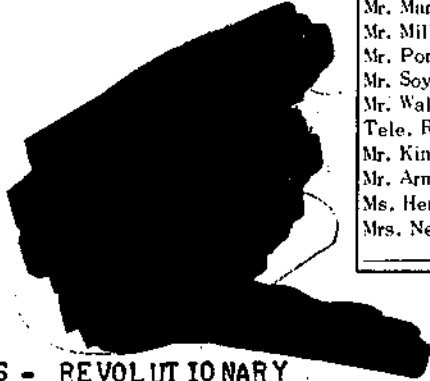

baiters. After getting gassed at the
Democratic Convention in Chicago and
caught in the general "down" of the peace
movement, VVAW was nearly inactive until the
moratoriums in the Fall of 1969. Members of
the VVAW led student strikes on major campuses
across the country and battled Veterans Ad-
ministration Hospital authorities over threats
to throw amputee Vietnam veterans out for
signing anti-war petitions. At present,
membership of the VVAW nationally consists of

BACKGROUND:

VVAW is major antiwar organization in U. S. today and has adopted ever-increasing militant approach to demonstrations. VVAW has recently advocated civil disobedience and has engaged in seizures and blockades of major buildings and national monuments, including Statue of Liberty, New York City; Betsy Ross House, Philadelphia; Lincoln Memorial, Washington, D. C.; and Lyndon B. Johnson Library, Austin. VVAW members have expressed definite intention to engage in disruption during forthcoming political conventions.

Los Angeles informant has advised that an unidentified representative from McGovern for President Committee, which supports the campaign of Senator George McGovern (D, South Dakota) for President in 1972 election, attended a regular meeting of VVAW in Los Angeles on [REDACTED]. At this meeting the McGovern representative stated that a station wagon would be leased by the McGovern Committee and furnished to VVAW for the purpose of "barnstorming" college campuses between Los Angeles and San Francisco during period 5/30 - 6/2/72 to voice opposition to Vietnam war.

Source advised on May 8, 1972, that Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW) organizers from Arkansas arrived in New Orleans in late Spring, 1971. They were hailed by local subversives as the most promising and effective anti-war organization in New Orleans. Their activities have consisted of anti-war demonstrations as well as demonstrations demanding prison reforms. The New Orleans VVAW has not spoken of, organized or participated in any violent activities and its membership has always been small. Even though local VVAW members have traveled to out-of-state VVAW conferences, as of late Spring, 1972, the New Orleans VVAW has not had any close contact with the national headquarters and is now virtually inactive locally.

The local VVAW leader later left New Orleans in April, 1972, to join the VVAW headquarters in New York saying he was disgusted with the New Orleans group's ineffectiveness.

[redacted] told him that Vietnam Veterans Against the War in Jacksonville, Florida, have a cache of weapons allegedly stored outside Jacksonville. [redacted] stated the Jacksonville group recently talked of an "action" in Washington, D. C., which would involve an attack on U.S. Capitol and perhaps some police installations. There was no indication as to when this "action" would occur.

This possibly relates to the violence-prone chapter VVAW in Gainesville, Florida, whose activities are well-known to the Bureau and the organization is under intensive investigation. Metropolitan Police Department and U.S. Capitol police are being advised of possible attacks on the Capitol and police installations. A copy of attached is being furnished to the Internal Security Division of the Department. Pertinent parts of attached are being included in the teletype summary to The White House, Vice President, State Department, the military, Secret Service, and Attorney General. We are interviewing [redacted] regarding the above information.
