Paris time; where a press conference would be held. All members of the delegation are veterans but one, who is in the active armed forces The VVAW would not hold a press conference prior to departure, for security reasons.

know if you have a vehicle you'd be willing to drive. We would like to get at least 50 people from our membership to commit themselves, and so far we have bout 8 that we are sure of. We will help pay for gas if necessary.

"There are some events going down which will probably raise a few eyebrows. You trgo, from the New York office of the VVAW went to Hanoi last month!! When you get your First Casulaty, read it - Joe will tell you all about it - really excellent!! There are twelve brothers going back to Hanoi within the next week and we can't wait to see what goes down this time!

"Out of the first trip, we set up a concrete liason between North Vietnam, the Provincial Revolutionary Government of South Vietnam and VVAW. Joe took 36 letters with him and brought 34 letters back. We also discovered two P.O.W.'s who were listed as M.I.A. and informed their families that they were still alive (because the U.S. Govt. refused to contact the families of these brothers). We have tape-recorded letters written by three P.O.W. brothers to different segments of the American population....two of whom were the M.I.A.'s we mentioned! brothers even have an organization called P.O.W.'s Against the Warl (What else). The PRG (Provincial Revolutionary Govt. - S. Vietnam) even lets them put out a newsletter each month!

"We've got some decisions on the National Action together. The Wisconsin delegation was hard to move on the decision that action be in Chicago, because we were all paranoid about the city itself. But, after we rapped to the co-ordinator, he convinced us (by all the stuff the VVAW has done down there) that the whole trip will be mellow and there won't be any super-heavy bad vibes from Daley's finest.

"The dates were set - Dec. 24 to Jan.

1st. This means we'll all have to skip
Christmas at home. But, if you're into it,
you're into it anytime. If our brothers
can't be home (and there's no excuse whey they
should't be by now) why should we forget em
and dig on the usual capitalist Christmas?
There are gonna be three actions which will
be co-ordinated nationally, and in Nam. On
Christmas Eve, when Nixon lights the trees
in D.C., we're gonna burn a tree and some
war toys. There will be simultaneous actions
on Christmas Day, and January 1, too.

"It all sounds very simple, but, believe us, its not. There are many logistical problems to be worked out, and we're operating on a very low budget. That we are asking of our members is to send us a commitment - in the form of a short note, and also let us





> 'This could be very important to students There is some Veterans Legislation in the state Joint Finance Committee right now, which would provide books and tuition for vets going to school on the GI The one stipulation on that is that it's for people who received a discharge after August 1, 1964. This bill has been knocked around in Madison for almost a year, and it's about time to get it through. It was tabled at the last meeting until Jan. 12 at which time it will be voted on again. 'Everyone in Madison' says that it'll get passed eventually. We want 'em to get off their dead political a--- and get it through, now. There just haven't been any vets around to pressure them. You can send a Public Opinion telegram for \$1, or write to your representative as soon as possible. one of the most important new bills for more bennies we've had around in many moons. It's bill Number 561. Please get in touch with your representative NOW.

"Enclosed is a tentative agenda for Operation Cease-Fire. If there are any questions, please contact us. There are some things we'd like everyone to remember to bring: eating utensils (cup, knife, fork, and spoon), a DD 214 or some other proof that you're a vet, a little money for wine, sleeping bags, a gift to exchange with a brother, any part of your old uniform, any





medals you received, and something to get high on!

"We are setting up rides for people without cars, so, if you need transportation, let us know about it.

"The address of the place we're gonna stay is 2440 North Lincoln--it's on the North Side or a big street, so it'll be easy to find. If you are any problems though, you can call the co-ordinator's place. His name is Bart Savage (really) and his number is (312) 770-6019. We have also arranged for lawyers to be on hand to help, if needed. We aren't concerned too much about arrests, 'cos we 'ain't gonna have none' unless somebody seriously screws up! This number belongs to the National Lawyers Guild -- (312) 939-2492.

'Many people have expressed skepticism at going to Chicago after the 'massacre of '68.' We were all the same way when the idea was brought up in Kansas City. Bart Savage is really together -- everything that the VVAW has done in the Windy City has come off without a hassle with the oinkers. We're convinced that we won't have any hassles this time, either, except logistically. Consider what just a handful (compared to the present membership) did in DC -- people are still talking about it -- and we're still receiving positive feedback.



"Tentative Agenda - December 24 - January 1:

"December 24: Official starting time is 4 p.m. At 7, we're going to the Moody Bible Institute to burn a Christmas tree and some war toys. At 10:30 p.m. it's Holy Name Cathedral for Midnight Mass! It's a huge place, holds about 1500 people, so we're gonna take up some room - no participation or disruption...just sit there, until the collection plate comes around. Then we'll put in our medals! The reason for this action is that this is where Mayor Daley and his partners go on Christmas Eve, and it's televised.

"December 25: We can sleep late. At about 12 or 1, we'll have a Christmas non-dinner, at which we charge a dollar for an empty plate with a message of Peace on it. At the same time, we'll have a short Winter Soldier Investigation (televised, we hope) on atrocities which took place during Christmas Truce. We'll also donate some blood to the Red Cross and symbolically dedicate it to the Vietnamese people. It will be earmarked for the dudes at Great Lakes.

"December 26: Will be a quiet day. We're sending small groups of vets to suburban churches to rap. In the afternoon



there will be a snowball fight to raise money -- VVAW vs. the Pigs!!!


"The Stock Exchange will never be the same! And you'll get to see some of our films, (expecially the one from DC III). That's December 27, sorry.

"December 28: How about the Museum of Science and Industry? We'll talk to the people who are walking around. There will be a lot of children, so we'll orientate our raps around them.

"December 29: It's off to the Induction Center at 6 a.m. to RE-UP!! Our diabetic friends can lay some 'good p---' on the brothers wanting to go out! What fun we'll have with the recruiters when we tell them we need a guarantee in writing that we won't have to commit any war crimes!!

"December 30: Is open to suggestions -- we'll see how the rest of the week goes.

"December 31: Of course we're gonna ring in the new year, heavy. There will also be some kind of hit and run civil disobedience action. It has been suggested that we hit a few armories with 'blood bombs.' People on parole or probation or who just don't get into getting busted, can cheer us on.

#### NATIONAL LAWYERS GUILD

National Lawyers Guild is a communist front organization of lawyers and law students dedicated to Communist Party, USA, and New Left ideals for radical change of the social, economic, and jucicial systems in the United States.

The Chicago Police Department advised on December 29, 1971, that the Museum of Science and Industry, Chicago, received a phone call that morning from John Lindquist, VVAW representative, requesting to meet with museum officials at 2:00 PM that date for the purpose of submitting a proclamation relative to the museum's exhibit on the United States Air Force. Lindquist was identified as VVAW regional coordinator for Wisconsin.

At 2:00 PM that date, a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation observed approximately 25 VVAW members at the United States Air Force exhibit of the Museum of Science and Industry. Leaflets were distributed urging recipients to write the museum asking that the Air Force exhibit be revised to include pictures


and statistics illustrating the results of United States bombing in Indo-China: The group dispersed at 2:30 PM, and no arrests were observed:

source advised on February 16, 1972, that VVAW representatives were scheduled to attend the National Steering Committee meeting in Denver, Colorado, from February 18 to 20, 1972. At this meeting, John Lindquist would resign his position as regional coordinator for Wisconsin, and Buzz Noves would take his place.

On February 24, 1972, source provided a VVAW newsletter printed in Milwaukee, which reflects the following concerning activities in Chicago, Illinois, over the states 1971;

"Chicago Illinois was righteous! It's j<u>su</u>t too bad that there wern't more people. We lived in the Industrial Workers of the World Hall for a week and partied until New Years Eve. During this time we had at least one action a day.

"We completely outdid ourselves when we started." Holy Name Cathedral is the stomping grounds for Dayley, Percy, and other parts of the machine con Christmas Eve. The Vets sat in on the service, and the outcome was a surprise to everyone. We all agreed ahead of time that we wouldn't do anything to disrupt the service, but when the Cardinal began his sermon, there was so much shit piling up that it would take a bulldozer to shovel it allup!



The service was broadcasted on TV and the cameramen were desperately trying to keep the Vets off the camera. But, despite their efforts, they couldn't stop the audio because it was a live show! 'What about the people in Indochina?' - 'You're just a bunch of hypocrits' We all stayed and took it as long as we could, but, before the service was over, all the Vets were outside on the steps. We has planned to burn a Christmas Tree on the steps after the service, but the police 'arrested' the tree!!


"On Christmas Day we were supposed to have a symbolic sort of trip, where we'd give blood to the Red Cross, earmarked for for our brothers and sisters in the hospital at Great Lakes. This action was to be dedicated to all our wounded people in Vietnam. Unfourtunately, due to the holidays, the Red Cross didn't want our blood and the press didn't want to coverit. So, we went to visit our brothers in the hospital instead. It was a very rewarding experience.

"On Sunday we had a VVAW Film Festival. We will be getting all of the films for the first week in February, and will be showing them at different times all over Milwaukee. Look and listen for them, they promise to be worth while!!

"On Monday the Mid-West Stock Exchange




got hit. They knew we were coming so they closed the whole thing up! We had about 35 baby dolls, all battered and covered with blood, which we threw through the bars of the gate. The press was there and the employees confrounted us in the lobby. The employees were the comical aspect of the whole thing frantic, dumb, and all in all just silly!

"Tuesday we joined the Homen for Peace" on a march from the Federal Building around the downtown are during the lunch hour. It didn't really have too much of an effect but it was a goof!

"On Wednesday morning, the Regional Co-ordinator from Wisconsin called the director of the Museum of Science and Industry. He told the director that he should meet with the Vets at the Air Force exhibit for the purpose of issuing a statement of protest against the exhibit, and a few proposals for changing it. The director was also informed that if he didn't show up there would be a sit-in until he complied with the plans. He was there allright - with coffee, doughnuts, and handshakes! The press really got off on it too!


"All this time, in other places around the country, small groups of Vietnam Veterans Against the War were busy 'taking over' things





like the Statue of Liberty, Betsy Ross' House, and the South Vietnamese Embassy. So, we planned a 'take-over' of the Republican Party Headquarters! Unfortunately, there was a bad security leak, and, when we arrived down there, the office was locked, with bunches of porkers inside and out! When one of our members approached the door of the building, one of the cops (The Red - Squad), said with a hugh grin 'We're still number one!' Disgusting. We all got pretty bummed out, but, we still had a high energy level. As a result we've got some plans for the beer city.

"On Friday, our last day, we went on a six mile march with the Indians, From Lincoln Park to the city limits. The Vets did some guerilla theater and took all the Indians prisoner. They marched as POW's to the city limits, putting the Indians on trial as they went. When the two groups parted company, there was a genuine feeling of solidarity. The Indians were continuing on to Fort Sheridan, where they hoped to reclaim some land which belongs to them by treaty. Both groups of Americans - the mislead and the displaced - parted with wishes of Peace in the New Year. We'd like to take this opportunity to extend these sincere wishes for Peace in '72 to YOU. You know as well as we do that the only way to PEACE is through our all-out combined efforts... the time for sitting on our asses is all over,





the very fact that our president can get on national television and put forth bold face lies about the POW's, and other related Vietnam issues, is indication enough of this. We no longer can sit back and let the next person, or organization, take care of it. If you haven't done anything because there hasn't been anything for you to do we have a few suggestions which will be mentioned a little later on in this newsletter."

On March 28, 1972 source furnished a copy of the VVAW newsletter dated March 14, 1972, which sets forth the following proposal submitted by Wisconsin:

"From Wisconsin. 'The Wisconsin Region hereby proposes: 1) That a National Speakers Bureau be set up for fund-raising and publicity. This will enable the former New York Office personnel, (i.e. Al Hubbard, Joe Urgo, Larry Rottman, Jon Birch, and others who qualify), to continue their travelling and speaking activities for VVAW. In this way, the Clearinghouse will easily be able to set dates, so they aren't confused--and the people





> who ask for specific speakers by name, can get what they expect. 2) That the objectives be changed to include the two new objectives proposed by the WashColoOrg Regions: Americans that their society is structured by a sexism which promotes inferior status upon women, reducing them to subservient sexual objects of men. This institutionalized sexism channels women into unfullfilling, lower paying jobs which are servile in nature and purpose; it explaits their bodies for sex and profit and it degrades and dehumanizes them by a double standard wholly dependent on the myth of male supremacy. This sexism is explicitly exploited by the military, officially defining service women as subordinate and thoroughly subjagating them to nothing more than sexual objects." and "To demand there be no distinctions as to types of discharges and that a single type of discharge be issued, and that this be retroactive. also demand all veterans receive all rights and benefits under the VA; and compensation for disabilities be based solely on the degrees of disability for veterans and their families, whether or not service connected. and without regard to sex, race, rank, or length of service." On March 28; 1972, source furnished a list of regional coordinators as of March 7, 1972, which lists Buzz Noves 2594 North Stowell, Milwaukee, telephone numbers 964-1795 or 562-9371, as regional coordinator for the State of Wisconsin.

On April 11; 1972, source advised that at the VVAW Steering Committee meeting, which was held in Houston; Texas; from April 7 to 11, 1972, it was decided that the next Steering Committee meeting would be held in Milwaukee sometime between the Democratic and Republican Presidential Conventions.

Source advised on April 24, 1972, that VVAW representatives from Milwaukee were presently in Washington, D: C., to participate in the scheduled antiwar activities. These activities consisted of lobbying and siting on the steps of the Capitol Building. The Milwaukee VVAW representatives left Washington, D. C., on April 24, 1972.

source advised on May 5, 1972, that the VVAW in Milwaukee is strictly an anti-war organization, and they intend to remain as such. After the Vietnam War is settled, they will most likely direct their efforts towards finding employment for returning veterans.

Source advised on May 8, 1972, that the National Steering Committee meeting scheduled to be held in Milwaukee is rescheduled to be held in Gainesville, Florida, in view of the fact that both political con-

ventions are now scheduled for Miami, and the attendees can depart from Gainesville and travel directly to Miami.

620 670 source advised on May 9, 1972, that a group of approximately 200 people gathered at the University of Wisconsin - Milwaukee (UWM) on May 4, 1972, and began marching toward the Federal Building, Milwaukee. This march was marshaled by the VVAW and was in protest of President Nixon's escalation of the Vietnam War. When they arrived at the Federal Building, they joined about 300 people representing various peace groups in the Milwaukee area. From the Federal Building, they proceeded to the War Memorial, where speeches and mock displays were presented. This march and demonstration was peaceful, and no known violence occurred.

VVAW had a meeting on which was held at and indicated their disenchantment with other peace groups in the march on May 4, 1972, because of their pro-Vietcong chants and support. It was strongly emphasized at this meeting that this chapter will no longer associate with these people nor anyone who knowingly sympathizes with communistic ideas. The Milwaukee VVAW wants to be strictly an anti-war organization and to held returning veterans. It was also discussed that they want to get more favorable local press coverage, as the press is associating the VVAW with other so-called peace groups in the Milwaukee area who are more that just anti-war groups.



#### OBJECTIVES OF VIETNAM VETERANS AGAINST THE WAR

To demand an immediate cessation of fighting and the withdrawal of all American troops from Indochina.

To demand Congress enect legislation for the immediate termination of all funds being utilized by the United States government, its allies and the Central Intelligence Agency to support their illegal operations in Latin America, Africa, China, Europe, and the countries of Vietnam, Cambodia, Laos, and Thailand.

To demonstrate that our military tactics dehumanize soldiers and civilians, and to make clear that the United States government is prosecuting an illegal, unjust, and immeral war in Indechina.

To-show Americans that their society is structured by a racism which allows us to view all non-whites as less than human. This racism pushes our minorities through inferior schools and into the combat arms. Thus we send our minorities off to die in disproportionately high numbers while we kill Asians indiscriminately. We demand that the military recognize its complicity in America, domestic and international racism.

To make clear that the United States has never undertaken an extensive open investagation of American war crimes in Indochina. We demand that the United States government, in its war in Indochina, affirm the principles of Nuremberg. As fermer G.I.'s we recognize the responsibility of the individual soldier to refrain from committing war crimes. We also cognize that the responsibility and guilt for war crimes committed in the name of America lies with our policy makers of all levels.

To demand that all active duty servicemen and women be afforded the rights as citizens that are guarenteed by the United States Constitution and Bill of Righrts that are presently denied them by the Uniform Code of Military Justice. We are appalled that servicemen and wemen are treated as les-than-first-class citizens. We endorse the efforts of our active duty brothers and sisters in their struggle to democratize the military.

To support all military personnel refusing to serve in wars of aggression at home and abroad. We demand Congress enact legislation for the immediate repatriation with full amnesty to those brothers and sisters who are in prison or in self exile by reason of their refusal to serve in the military. We support all persons refusing to be drafted.

To demand immediate legislation to provide proper care and service for all veterans in V.A. hospitals; to make available job training and placement for every returning veteran; and to provide the funds and means necessary for the V.A. to provide the services and subsistance required by veterans during their educational and vocational endeavers.

To affirm that the membership is not only concerned with ending the war, but changing the domestic, social, political and economic institutions that have caused and permitted the continuance of war.

on January 11, 1972 and advised that the VVAW seems to be more than just an antiwar group of veterans. Almost all members appear to be of Communist or socialist political thought. General trend of the group is an end to racism, sexism, capitalism, and an end to American involvement in other countries. Most members indicated that they feel past efforts of vVAW have been ineffective. There was a feeling that action of some type must be taken to make people aware that VVAW is serious, and to cause the government problems. They also indicated that they are willing to talk with other groups and to accept their help. Most members tend to want to be peaceful but future civil disobedience was discussed as a possibility:



On August 9, 1971 advised that on August 6, 1971, a "speakout" for peace and new priorities sponsored by the Peace and Freedom Center (PFC) was held in Mellon Square, Pittsburgh, Pa., as part of the commemerative activities against the war conducted on the anniversaries of Hiroshima and Nagasaki Days. Among the speakers was JOHN ONDA of the VVAW.

The PFC was founded in Pittsburgh, Pa., during 1967 and has as its primary purpose the sponsoring and promoting of peace and antiwar activities and coordinating such activities among other peace organizations.

On October 21, 1971 and ad Ised that on October 13, 1971, a Moratorium on Peace as Usual was held at the University of Pittsburgh (UP), Pittsburgh, Pa., attended by about 750 persons. Among the speakers was BOB CLARKE of the VVAW who announced a national thanksgiving boycott of turkey dinners, which is intended to bring personal sacrifice as a means of deriving solidarity between persons at home and the fighting men still in Vie tnam.

On October 18, 1971, and advised that on October 24. 1971, the Pennsylvania VVAW would sponsor a "Winter Soldier's Investigation" between the hours of 12:00 noon and 8:00 p.m. at Skibo Hall, Carnegie-Mellon University (CMU), Pittsburgh, Pa. # Vet <u>Parade Flap</u> Goes To County

A dispute over the refusal of organized veterans' groups to allow the Vielnam Veterans Against the War to march in Monday's parade was brought to the county commissioners today for settlement.

The commissioners got into the argument because the county appropriates between \$3,000 and \$4,000 annually for the Veterans Day observance.

Nicholas A. Vigitone, commander of the Federation of War Veterens Societies, said the antiwar group had been banned from the parade because they wanted to march with a coffin and peace signs.

He said he had told the group that the parade was not a peace march but strictly a memorial to the war dead.

Robert Clark. 22, of 3617 Dawson Si Dakland, said he headed the Vielnamese Vets organization. He said he had made the application to participate in the Monday march.

The Vietnam Veterans hadtaken their cause to the American Civil Liberties Union and were represented by Atty. Marjorie Hasson Matson.

advised that on N On October 23, 1971 October 22, 1971, the VVAW at Pittsburgh held a press conference at the University and City Ministries, Oakland section, Pittsburgh, The purpose of the press conference was to make known the outcome of a negotiation between the VVAW and the Veterans of War Federation regarding the Veterans Day Parade October 25, 1971. JON BIRCH, Regional Coordinator of VVAW, was the spokesman at the conference. He announced that he had just finished a meeting with the Veterans of War Federation representatives in the Office of County Commissioner LEONARD STAISEY, where an agreement had been reached that the VVAW would be allowed to march as a contingent in the parade, but that they would only be allowed to carry their own flag, the American Flag, and to wear black arm bands. BIRCH reported they had been denied permission to cary a coffin draped with the American flag in the parade because it was considered a "prop" or float, and all such "props" have been eliminated from Veterans Day Parade. BIRCH stated that a vote would be taken of VVAW to decide whether to march or not. added that the organization would either abide by the rules or it would not march.

### Gesture of Peace By Anti-War Group Draws Jeers, Cheers

By GEOFFREY TOMB

Gray skies, an occasional drizzle and the Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW) caused problems for some partiripants in yesterday's annual Veterans' Day parade through Downtown.

A number of older veterans were enraged that the group of some 75 anti-war veterans was allowed to take part in the two-hour parade which extended from the Civic Arena in the lower Hill District to Gateway Center.

Several heated arguments and a couple of pushes and shoves took place when the parade was forming on Colwell Street in the Hill District, as long haired veterans in olive drab fatigues faced older vets in tight fitting World War II uniforms.

ONCE THE LONG procession of veterans' organizations and high school bands got going, at 11:45 a. m., everything went smoothly with the Vietnam veterans the last group in line.

Chief Police Inspector Meyer DeRoy estimated the size of the holiday crowd to be from 20,600 to 25,000, but some of that figure must include Downtown shoppers and office workers on the way to lunch.

The crowd's reaction to the Victnam veterans' silent, kneeling brief demonstration for peace in front of the reviewing stand on Liberty Avenue was mixed, with most of the younger members applauding and cheering while some of the older generation boord and jeered. The members knelt in the street and gave the peace sign.

Officers in the Veterans of Foreign Wars, the American Legion and Mayor Flaherty and Commissioner Thomas J. Foerster stood motionless without expression, on the reviewing stand while the silent demonstration took place.

The group passed out literature criti-

cizing those who "glorify war" adding that Veterans' Day "should be a day of sorrow and mourning for those who will never march again."

"We had no trouble from anybody and heard nothing but cheers," Bob Clarke, VVAW president, said after the parade,;

"It makes the wish I had never come nome when I see something like this," John Nolan of Brookline said when he saw the anti-war veterans. Nolan said he had seen action in the Pacific during World War II beginning at Pearl Harbor.

"NOBODY SHOULD be in the parade unless they are invited," William Tepsic of Brentwood said, "We don't each fet our Ladies Auxiliarias march, All those people (the latti-war group) destroy the reasons for the parade."

Internal factionalism produced a split during the SDS National Convention in June, 1969, which resulted in the following three factions: Weatherman; Worker Student Alliance (WSA); and Revolutionary Youth Movement (RYM). The Weatherman and RYM are no longer affiliated with SDS. The WSA continues to use the name SDS and maintains its national headquarters in Chicago, Illinois.

Weatherman, formerly a faction of Students for a Democratic Society, controlled the SDS National Office from June, 1969, until its closing in February, 1970. Weatherman then entered an underground status and adopted a tactic of "strategic sabotage," with police and military installations designated as primary targets.

Worker Student Alliance (WSA), a faction of SDS, was expelled from SDS in June, 1969, by the then dominant Weatherman faction but continued to use the name SDS and opened an office in Boston, Mass. WSA aligned ideologically with the Progressive Labor Party (PLP) and in February, 1971, moved to Chicago, Ill. SDS/WSA currently shares office space with the PLP in Chicago.

## MARCH AND PEACEFUL TAKEOVER AT KANSAS STATE CAPITOL

Veterans of Foreign Wars parade was scheduled and the Veterans of Foreign Wars parade was to end at the cemetery in Topeka. The VVAW parade started late and all of the Veterans of Foreign Wars activities had finished at the cemetery when the VVAW members arrived. Source stated that the VVAW still conducted their activity at the cemetery which consisted of an individual in a body bag simulating the dead in Vietnam. Source advised that John Musgrave gave a speech which lasted approximately fifteen minutes. During this time, individuals taking part in the activity numbered about 100. There were very few people watching the activity as most of them had left at the conclusion of the Veterans of Foreign Wars parade.

1968, with 600 members, VVAW opened a national office, founded the first GI newspaper, "Vietnam GI," and sent close to 500 veterans into the McCarthy campaign to beat down the red baiters. After getting gassed at the Democratic convention in Chicago and caught in the general "down" of the peace movement, VVAW was nearly inactive until the moratoriums in the fall of 1969. Memb ers of VVAW led student strikes on major campuses across the country and battled Veterans Administration Hospital authorities over threats to throw amputee Vietnam veterans out for signing anti-war petitions. At present, membership of the VVAW, nationally, consists of 8,500 members.

There were no arrests or police confrontations over the night of May 27, 1972.

advised that on Sunday morning, May 28, 1972, a meeting took place on the Capitol steps to talk over the day's actions and later they left the Topeka State Capitol and participated in the following actions:

advised that at 11:00 a.m., the members who were present went to three different churches in the Topeka area. One of the groups went to the United Presbyterian Church and conducted an action at the church exit when the service was terminated. The activity consisted of holding up a picture of a B-52 bomber with several of the members laying down on the sidewalk with red paint on them indicating they were bleeding.

There were no confrontations and after the activity was over, they went back to the Capitol steps. After all the members had congregated, they then went to downtown Topeka, 10th and Topeka Avenue, to wait for a parade scheduled to take place. There were approximately 75 people located at 10th and Topeka and it was later determined that the parade would not take place as the authorities called it off.

advised on June 27, 1972, that Vietnam Neterans Against the War (VVAW) members, particularly Scott. Camil, Southeast Regional Organizer who resides at Gainesville Florida, have encouraged members of the organization to arm themselves for "defensive purposes" with "wrist rocket" slingshots. Camil has indicated he has access to as many as 3,000 of these slingshots and will make them available to VVAW members at \$3.00 apiece.

> VVAW is an anti-war organization organized in 1967 and headquartered in New York City. Its published objective is to "demand an immediate cessation of fighting and the withdrawal of American troops from Indochina".

On June 27, 1972 advised that their records reflect no large or unusual shipments of Wham-O produced "wrist rockets" to their Florida distributors. He further advised Wham-O makes no sales to individuals and they have received no report of non-receipt to Florida distributors or inventory losses
