





Source advised stated he and the others had met with French Veterans, the veterans contingent of the National Liberation Front (NLF) and the North Vietnamese Veterans. further stated that the Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAM) contingent voted 15 to 1 to completely support the fight against capitalism. the North Vietnamese Veterans stated that they would continue the war "to the last woman and child" and that a partial withdrawal would not end the war and that what was needed was a complete withdrawal of all U. S. troops from all of Southeast Asia.

VVAW is an antiwar organization organized in 1967 and headquartered in New York City. Its published objective is "to demand an immediate cessation of fighting and the withdrawal of all American troops from Indochina".

Source advised stated that the question of American prisoners of war was never brought up by the North Vietnamese or the Chinese people who were also in attendance but was brought up by the VVAW contingent. Source advised indicated the North Vietnamese contingent stated that they had no animosity against American prisoners of war. Source advised several occasions made the following statement; I told them (referring to the North Vietnamese contingent) I would come to Hanoi and execute all 1:500 POWs". Source indicated Tom who was with on the trip to Paris had made a statement to the North Vietnamese Veterans, "I would come to Hanoi and execute all 1,500 POWs". Source advised indicated all the orientals attending the meeting were extremely polite in referring to the U. S. President and Secretary of Defense as Mr. Nixon and Mr. Laird and did not degrade these people at any time. Source indicated that according to they had a lot of faith in Senator McGovern. The orientals also indicated nothing would come of the peace talks as they were just stalling for time feeling that North Vietnam and the NLF could talk better to the next president not mentioning who they felt the next president would be. Source advised during the meeting indicated the main fear of the North Vietnamese is the possible bombing of the dikes which they displayed pictures of bomb damage to the dikes, and are supposedly at VVAW Headquarters being reproduced for distribution. also stated that the North Vietnamese feared the "rain making machine", not further described Source advised on Secasions would-stop and become very tense, nervous to the point of shaking and would-state words to the effect that he was willing to die because he considered himself in

Source advised was interrupted by others in attendance expressing their views to statements he made.

Source advised stated in regard to the Republican National Convention, the VVAW was going to save everything for the last day of the convention. Source advised a caravan for the convention was to depart Los Angeles on August 13, 1972 for Miami and was to proceed 500 miles a day at the speed of 50 miles per hour. The Los Angeles caravan would be joined by other caravans coming from other parts of the country. Cars would proceed with their lights on and carry VVAW signs. The source provided this information to a Special Agent of the FBI on July 14, 1972.





An Exercise In Lynch Law

A small exercise in lynch law judgment at the closing session of the Democratic National Convention went generally unreported in the more spectacular business of choosing a vice presidential candidate which followed.

The lynch victim was the United States Department o Justice

It was convicted by hearsal and harangue of harassing a handful of Vietnam Veterans Against the War by calling them as witnesses before a grand jury in Tallahasssee when they wanted to be in Miami to demonstrate.

On the word of one young man who shrilly shouted that his buddles were being held on "trumped up charges" (though no charges at all had been filed at that moment) the convention howled a formal condemnation of the DoJ and the Nixon, administration which operates it now.

It adopted a resolution calling the mere summoning of 21 VVAWs while the Democratic convention was in session a denial of "their most fundamental constitutional rights to express their dissent and opposition to the war in Southage

The convention went on reccord against "this blatantly portain it is blatantly portain to intimidate and discredit" opponents of the war, and demanded that the witness subpoenas be withdrawn immediately "so that they may stage their protests at the national political conventions free of harassment."

It is self-evident that hardly anybody in the convention half at the time this action was talking place knew what it was all about, because at about that moment the first charges of contempt against some of the VVAWs were being announced in Talkahassee. The indictments charging others with plotting to do violence at the GOP convention next month were not announced until the next morning.

Nevertheless, the VVAWs and the convention peacenik delegates had a cause celebre

in mind, and they couldn't wait until tomorrow to try the Nixon administratioon and its Department of Justice with facts in hand. The convention was to end that night.

So they poured it on with angry shouts and oratory against the unfair "intimidation" which kept these young men from demonstrating against the war. Why the Republican administration should be interested in holding down demonstrations at the Democratic convention wasn't explained.

The party bosses who managed the convention must be recognized as a part of this night-rider foray, too, because they put the matter on their agenda which had to be made up by 4 p.m. under rules so rigid that even Senator Mc-Govern had to meet the deadline in order to get a nominator on the rostrum for his vice presidential choice. At that time, not even any contempt citations had been disclosed from Tallahassee.

The resolution did not pass unchallenged. A young man came forward from the Alabama delegation to respond to wild charges that our forces were bombing civilians, hospitals and striking against dikes to wipe out multitudes by mass-flooding (the latest North Vietnam propaganda line that received a great deal of attention at Miami Beach).

I didn't catch his name, but he said he was from Talladega, Ala. He also was a Vietnam veteran, wounded in action, and he hadn't come home to find rejection by his fellow citizens. They had elected him mayor.

☆ ☆ ★

As for harassment of the VVAWs at Taliahassee, he said "the only people I know who find harassment are those who go out looking for it. The people who stay here and work for this country are its backbone, not those who dodge their obligations."

For that he got loud boos.
"How many of you who are booing have been to Vietnam?" he inquired.

More boos, and hundreds of hands raised with clenched fists and two fingers spread in a "V" (remember when that was the symbol for World War II victory against the Nazis, not of surrender to the communists?)

The young man from Talladega commented that "most anybody can lift up two fingers of a hand", but it took something more to "defend your country and stand up for the obligations that go along with citizenship."

But even he didn't make the most valid point: That they were going off half-cocked, condemning a branch of their government without knowing the charges or the facts which might come forth by due process of law in trial of defendants.

He got, some voice vote support for his plea to reject the resolution, but the convention roared louder, much loudes, for its adoption—as if me delegates had come for their lynching and didn't mean to be denied it.





"The Ohio State Lantern", an official newspaper circulated on the campus of Ohio State University (OSU), Columbus, Ohio, contained an article dated April 24, 1972 which stated that a crowd of approximately 150 persons attended an anti-war rally held April 22, 1972 on the steps of the Statehouse, Columbus, Ohio. Speeches were made by representatives of various groups including the organization VAW. After the speeches, according to the article, VAW formed an honor guard and, carrying a coffin draped with a black peace flag, led a procession around the Statehouse which ended at the memorial in front of the Capitol Building.

According to the newspaper article, William Crandell, a VAW member, told the crowd they did not have to go to Vietnam to form an opinion about the war. After his speech, several members of the crowd read names of Ohio veterans killed in Vietnam.

On May 18, 1972, a source who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that Columbus, Ohio has only one chapter of VAW. Although some members attend OSU, not all are students. It is officially recognized, however, as a campus organization by OSU.

The first confidential source said members of VAW in Columbus, Ohio have never engaged in any violent activities. Many of the members seldom attend meetings, and those who do attend are not very active. Most of the activities of VAW are concerned with peaceful demonstrations

and distribution of literature at the main gate to Lockbourne Air Force Base, Ohio. Source stated a publication known as "Skydove", which is critical of the United States Air Force and particularly of Lockbourne Air Force Base, is distributed occasionally at the main gate leading to the military installation.

On June 15, 1972, a second confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that VAW, Columbus, Ohio, maintains Post Office Box 3056. The source stated that on or about June 15, 1972, a check in the amount of \$100 was sent to "Skydove", Lockbourne Project, P. O. Box 3056, Columbus, Ohio. Source advised the check was written on the account of United States Servicemen's Fund, 44 Greenwich Avenue, New York, New York, payable to "Skydove". The check was drawn on the Chemical Bank, 204 West, 4th Street, New York, New York, and was signed by

The July 3, 1972 issue of "The Ohio State Lantern", contained an article entitled, "Battle Fatigue Hits War Veteran Group". This article stated that VAW, at one time one of Ohio State's most active protest organizations, is almost out of business. The article said according to VAW President Arthur Flesch, a junior student from Columbus, Ohio, the group is presently inactive. The organization has moved out of the Ohio Union Building, and few, if any, projects or protests are planned for the summer quarter. The article continued that membership has fallen off drastically and Flesch is involved in other time consuming movements. The article stated officially, at least, VAW is still alive.

According to the article, William Payer, a past president of VAW, who is now graduated, said the difficulties of VAW are shared by the entire peace movement. "People have

seen that protesting has had no effect on the war or any other situation. They're frustrated".

The article said VAW always has had trouble interesting veterans in the movement. "It's hard to get a guy to join any group when he's just out of the service," said Payer. An added problem is that most veterans do not have the free time, they are usually older, often married, and they probably work while they attend school.

First confidential source on July 19, 1972 advised that VAW has had no activities during the summer of 1972 and the source knows of nothing planned for either summer or autumn, 1972.

A third confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that VAW is currently an officially recognized OSU campus organization. As of December, 1971, its President was William Payer, its Vice President was Ronald Matthews and its Treasurer was Ronald Davis.

Source stated Arthur Flesch was the most active person in a relatively inactive organization. Source said the group is not now active.







MOTION FOR STAY OF GRAND JURY APPEARANCE PENDING RETENTION OF AND CONSULTATION WITH COUNSEL

Movants, above listed, by their counsel, respectfully represent:

- 1. On July 8, 1972 (Friday and thereafter), Movants were subpoenced to appear before a federal grand jury now sitting in this District. These subpoenas, served at various locations in the states of Florida, Arkansas, Texas, and Louisiana, were made returnable at 9:30 A.M. at the Federal Court in Tallahassee, Florida (i.e., two (2) days, or less, later, with a weekend intervening).
- 2. Each of these prospective witnesses, with almost no exceptions, are members of the Vietnam Veterans Against the War in Vietnam, a national membership organization of armed services veterans who have served in Vietnam and who are actively opposed to this Nation's participation in that war. Those of Movants who are not VVAW members believe they have been subpoenced to testify concerning their knowledge of the activities of those who are so affiliated.

^{1.} Counsel for Movants represent to the Court that they have been retained by Movants for the purpose of representing them in the instant Motion; see Affidavit of Jack J. Levine, Esq., attached hereto as Exhibit 'A'. For reasons more fully set forth in the body of that Affidavit and this Motion, it appears to counsel at the present time that, because of possible conflicts in the legal interests of these witnesses, it will be inadvisable for some of them to be represented by the same lawyer as to matters relating to their substantive testimony.

- 3. The lawfulness of these subpoenas and the governmental purpose for their issuance is not in issue, so far as the instant Motion is concerned. While such issues are the subject of litigation filed simultaneous with this Motion, and will doubtless be raised to varying degrees in pleadings filed on behalf of individual witnesses, the only matter presented by this Motion relates to Movants' inability, due to the shortness of time, to retain and adequately consult with counsel as to the subject matter of their individual testimony. More specifically:
- (a) Movants, many of whom have travelled long distances, have literally had no time to retain counsel to represent them individually and to consult with them as to their own particular facts and circumstances and questions as to whether or not they will choose to testify and appropriate legal issues which must be argued in their individual behalfs.
- (b) Those counsel who are present, including counsel in this Motion, have determined that they cannot appropriately agree to represent any witness unless and until they have an opportunity to speak individually with each prospective client to determine not only his or her own facts and circumstances, but, of equal importance, whether potential conflicts exist which in some cases may preclude representation of more than one witness by any one attorney. This latter problem is of pressing concern because several of Movants have indicated a preliminary desire to be represented by those few attorneys now available.
- 4. All of us, Movants and counsel alike have taken and are continuing to take steps to secure additional attorneys. See Affidavit of Jack J. Levine, attached hereto.

WHEREFORE, Movants respectfully request that their appearances before the grand jury be stayed pending retention of and consultation with counsel, and in any event for a period of no less than seven (7) days from July 10, 1972.

AFFIDAVIT

Jack J. Levine, being duly sworn, deposes and states:

- 1. I am an attorney with offices located at 1427
 Walnut Street, Philadelphia. I am a member of the Bar of
 the Third Circuit Court of Appeals and have appeared pro
 hac vice in federal district courts in New Jersey, Massachusetts and California. I have also been admitted to
 practice and argue pro hac vice in the Supreme Court of
 the United States.
- 2. This Affidavit is being furnished this Court to aid its consideration of the substantive matters raised in the Motion attached hereto. It is based upon my own extensive litigation experience in grand jury proceedings in the above mentioned jurisdictions, and my familiarity with the nature of the legal issues relevant thereto.
- 3. Witnesses called before federal grand juries must necessarily adequately and thoroughly explore with their respective attorneys prior to testifying a variety of factors and decisions, including the substance of their testimony, whether or not it will subject them to possible self-incrimination, and the possible consequences of a refusal to testify. More importantly, our Supreme Court has recognized that grand jury process may violate a witness's rights in a number of ways. E.g., Blau v. United States, 340 US 332 (1951) (confidential marital communication); Hale v. Henkel, 201 US 43, 65 (1906); Silverthorne Lumber Co. v. United States, 251 US 385 (1920) (both unreasonable search and seizure); Hawkins v. United States, 358 US 74, 78-9 (1958) (interspousal testimonial immunity); Gelbard v. United States, 40 USLW. 4862 (1972) (prohibition against unlawful electronic surveillance).

See e.g. 28 USC Sec. 1826 allowing imprisonment for as much as eighteen months where such refusal is without just cause.

Lower federal courts have also recognized numerous constitutional and common-law rights of witnesses. E.g.,

Schwimmier v. United States, 232 F. 2d 855 (8th Cir.) cert

den 352 US 833 (1956) (Fourth Amendment and attorney-client
privilege); In Re Dionisio, 442 F. 2d 276 (7th Cir. 1971),
cert.granted 40 USLW 3568 (1972) (Fourth Amendment); United

States ex rel. Chestnut v. Criminal Court, 442 F. 2d 611

(2nd Cir.) cert den 92 US 111 (1971) (right to be interrogated by grand jury of one's peers); In Re Verplank, 329 F.

Supp. 433 (C.D. Calif., 1971) (freedom of association).

- 4. It is absolutely essential to a witness for his or her own protection that he or she consult with and familiarize his or her attorney with all the facts upon which the assertions of such rights may depend. It is equally important that an attorney be aware of the circumstances of his or her client-witness, for otherwise it is impossible and, indeed, irresponsible to attempt to counsel a witness, or determine conflicts between different witnesses who seek simultaneous representation.
- 5. Adequate consultation on facts with a witness is even more necessary in order to avoid what our Supreme Court has called "the cruel trilemna of self-accusation, perjury or contempt". Murphy v. Waterfront Commissioner, 378 US at 55: in addition to protecting the constitutional, statutory, or common-law rights of the witness, counsel may also avert the danger of a possible charge of perjury in connection with the witnesses' testimony. The determinations whether and how best to answer questions posed in the grand jury thus requires substantial legal expertise, notwithstanding a statutory grant of immunity from prosecution. Whatever may be said of the right of a witness to have his attorney accompany him into the grand jury room², these Movants must not be

practicably denied the right to retain and consult counsel. Such a denial would not only offend the Sixth Amendment, but would raise exceedingly serious and disturbing questions under the Due Process Clause of the Fifth Amendment.

6. At the time of this writing, (4:00 P.M., Sunday, July 9th), three attorneys (Doris Peterson, Nancy Stearns, and Jack J. Levine) are present in Gainesville, Florida, for the purpose of representing Movants in this Motion and a related matter filed simultaneously herewith. Most of the witnesses did not previously know of us, and we had never before met any of them. We are familiar only with the matters upon which we all agree: that they need time to retain and consult counsel individually, and that they object to their subpoenas on First Amendment grounds. Mr. Levine, at present, is obligated to return to Philadelphia before Wednesday to honor other court commitments; and we and Movants are attempting with all due diligence to arrange the appearance of counsel in sufficient numbers and with sufficient time to properly represent all those concerned.

MEMORANDUM IN SUPPORT OF MOTION FOR A TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER AND/OR A PRELIMINARY INJUNCTION

Statement of Facts

This is an action seeking declaratory and injunctive relief against subpoenas served on Plaintiffs on July 7 and 8, 1972, demanding their appearance before a Federal Grand Jury in Tallahassee, Florida on July 10, 1972 at 9:30 A.M. Plaintiffs are members and employees of the Vietnam Veterans Against the War (hereinafter VVAW) a non-profit educational membership organization whose purpose is to educate American citizens concerning the illegal and unconstitutional war in Vietnam and stop that war.

As part of their program to educate the American public against the war, Plaintiffs have planned a series of public activities, protected by the First Amendment, to coincide with the Democratic and Republican National Conventions in Miami, Florida, a time when the attention of millions of Americans will be focused on the discussion of issues of major national importance. Plaintiffs were to participate in activities beginning on July 8, 1972. The first major activity sponsored by VVAW, however, was a peaceful march to the convention site on the evening of July 10, 1972, the opening day of the Democratic National Convention. Permits have been obtained for the march from the Miami Beach Police Department and plans for the march and other convention activities have long

been public.

 Plaintiffs are entitled to a Temporary Restraining Order while the Constitutional issues herein are litigated.

Plaintiffs have alleged in their complaint that the subpoenas challenged herein were issued in bad faith to harrass and prevent them from exercising First Amendment Rights and that there is no valid legal or constitutional purpose to the Grand Jury herein.

The standards which this court must apply in determining whether to grant a Temporary Restraining Order are as follows:

- Whether Plaintiffs will suffer irreparable harm if the relief is not granted;
- Whether there is a likelihood of success on the merits;
- The balance of equities to both parties if the relief requested is granted.

The matter at stake here is the First Amendment, the public discussion on the war in Vietnam, an issue of vital importance to this nation and the orderly functioning of the democratic process. If a Temporary Restraining Order is not granted by this court Plaintiffs will be effectively restrained in Tallahassee and prevented from exercising their First Amendment rights in the activities planned for Miami.

In the case of Carroll v. President and Commissioners of Princess Anne County, 393 US 175, (1968) the U.S. Supreme and Court voided an order enjoining/restraining petitioners from holding rallies or meetings in Princess Anne and Somerset Counties for a period of ten days. The Court recognized that in the case of "a rally and 'political' speech the element of timeliness may be important." Quoting Mr. Justice Harlan dissenting in A Quantity of Copies of Books v. State of Kansas, 378 U.S. at 224, the Court went on to state,

"'It is vital to the operation of democratic government that the citizens have facts and ideas on important issues before them. A delay of even a <u>day or two</u> may be of crucial importance in some instances.'" (Emphasis added.)

Here this Court must consider an "injunction" against rallies and demonstrations in the guise of Grand Jury subpoenas. It is clear that the federal government could not have gone into court and obtained an injuction to prevent Plaintiffs and the class they represent from exercising their protected First Amendment rights in Miami during the Demo-- cratic National Convention. Therefore what they have attempted to do is to prevent the exercise of those rights by subpoenaing Plaintiffs to appear in Tallahassee, Florida, and not only silence their voices of dissent against government policies regarding the war in Vietnam but also preventively detain them in Tallahassee for the duration of the Democratic and possibly the Republican National Convention as well so that the people of America cannot see its own Veterans speaking out against the war in which they have fought. It is the "hallmark of the police state" Shuttlesworth v. Birmingham, 382 U.S. 87,91 (1965) when the executive branch of the government abuses the Grand Jury process and therefore the process of this Court to silence this nation's Veterans from speaking out against the war in which they've fought at a time when the nation most needs to hear their voices. It is clear that if the subpoenas herein are not enjoined that not only will Plaintiffs' First Amendment rights be violated but "free expression - of transcendent value to all society, and not merely to those exercising their rights - might be the loser," Stamler v. Willis, 415 F 2d 1365 (7th Cir. 1969). Quoting Dombrowski v. Pfister, 380 U.S. 479, 486 (1965).

B. The likelihood of success on the merits is clear.

The record of the three factors to be weighed
in the granting of injunctive relief here is whether,

assuming the facts alleged in the complaint may be properly proved at trial, there exists a likelihood of success on the merits. It is clear, introductorily, that a federal court has jurisdiction over an action commenced to redress abuse of the subpoena power of a federal grand jury or other compulsory process. In Re Grand Jury Subpoena to Central States, Etc., 275 F. Supp. 923, 925 (N.D. Ill. 1964); Sheridan v. Garrison, 273 F. Supp. 673 (E.D. La. 1967), rev'd on other grounds, Sheridan v. Garrison, 415 F.2d 699 (5th Cir. 1969), cert. den., 90 S.Ct. 685 (1970). This is particularly true where the abuse challenged infringes First Amendment freedoms. Sheridan v. Garrison, supra; Wolff v. Selective Service Local Board, 372 F.2d 817 (2nd Cir. 1967); Stamler v. Willis 415 F 2d 1365 (7th Cir. 1965), cert. den., 399 U.S. 929 (1970). It is true notwithstanding whether the exercise of the power has already occurred or is threatened. Dombrowski v. Pfister, 380 U.S. 479 (1965); Zwickler v. Koota, 389 U.S. 241 (1967).

The grand jury is an appendage of the court. Application of United Electrical, Radio and Machine Workers of America, 111 F. Supp. 858, 864 (S.D.N.Y., 1953). Therefore, a misuse of its process is a misuse of the court's process. "The process by which witnesses are compelled to attend a grand jury investigation is the court's process and not the process of the grand jury, nor of the district attorney." In re National Window Glass Workers, 287 F. 219, 225 (1922). Courts of law have inherent power over their process to prevent abuse, oppression and injustice, Krippendorf v. Hyde, 110 U.S. 276 (1884), and, thus, have the power to prevent abuse of the grand jury subpoena power. Indeed, it is more than a matter of power, it is a matter of obligation. "A supervisory duty, not only exists, but is imposed upon the court, to see that its grand jury and its process are not abused, or used for purposes of oppression and injustice." Application of United Electrical, supra,

at 225. As the Supreme Court has noted with respect to the grand jury investigatory power: "Doubtless abuses of this power may be imagined. But were such abuses called to the attention of the court, it would doubtless be alert to repress them." Hale v. Henkel, 201 U.S. 43, 65 (1906). This case presents such an abuse.

B. The bad faith issuance of grand jury subpoenas, intended as a <u>de facto</u> injunction of activity protected by the First Amendment, must clearly be remedied by this Court.

We start first with our Supreme Court's most recent discussion of bad faith grand jury subpoenas intended to abridge First Amendment freedoms. Branzburg v. Hayes, 40 USLW 5025 (1972), in disallowing the First Amendment claims made by subpoenaed newsmen, specifically cautioned that where abuse of grand jury process can be shown, the federal courts must be quick to protect threatened First Amendment rights. Thus, Mr. Justice White, speaking for four members of the Court, specifically disavowed any intent to give free reign to any "governmental institution that has abused its proper function." 40 USLW at 5035. Concurring in this opinion, Mr. Justice Powell took pain to emphasize what he termed "the limited nature of the Court's holding": that no "harrassment" of newsmen--or, by implication, others who seek to exercise First Amendment rights -- "will be tolerated." 40 USLW at 5038-5039. This, wrote Mr. Justice Powell, is in keeping with "the solicitude repeatedly shown by this Court for First Amendment freedoms." Id.

The modes of activity, expression and association in which Plaintiffs seek to engage at the Democratic National Convention are clearly of the sort requiring such "solicitude," as were all modes of lawful apposition to our government's domestic and foreign policies protected im the past. Dombrowski v. Pfister, 380 U.S. 479 (1965); Edwards "South Carolina, 377 U.S. 229 (1963); N.A.A.C.P. v. Button, 371 U.S. 415 (1963); Kiiskilla v. Nichols, 433


The point of these decisions and others like them is that injunctive relief is both necessary and proper; the fact of the possibility of raising the defense of First Amendment privilege in a future hearing (e.g. on charges of contempt for refusal to answer questions on First Amendemnt grounds) has been explicitly found to be insufficient groung for the avoidance of injunctive relief. As the Court said in Stamler v. Willis, 415 F. 2d 1365 (7th Cir. 1969), criminal proceedings, even if favorable to the subpoenaes, would not reach the question of the alleged chilling effect on the exercise of First Amendment rights. Further, as the Supreme Court noted in Dombrowski,

"Even the prospect of ultimate failure of such prosecutions by no means dispels their chilling effect on protected expression." 380 U.S. at 494

To the same effect, see Wolff v. Selective Service Local Board, 372 F. 2d at 823-24, in which the Second Circuit held that:

"the threat of recieving a 1-A classification upon voicing dissent from our national policies has an immediate impact on the behavior of appellants and others similarly situated. Since it is the mere threat of unconstitutional sanctions which precipitates the injury, the courts must intervene at once to vindicate the threatened liberties." [Emphasis added]

The Supreme Court has ordered that the courts "cannot close our eyes to the fact" that there are militant political movements which have "engendered the intense resentment and opposition of the politically dominant... community." Button, supra, 371 U.S. at 435. In such circumstances, normally valid legislative and judicial processes may be used as "weapons of oppression." Id. at 436, a contingency which the courts cannot countenance. In its opinion in Button, the high Court noted that the NAACP "is not a conventional political party," but it "makes possible the distinctive contribution of a minority group to the ideas and beliefs of our society." 371 U.S. at 431. The VVAW too may be characterized as an "unconventional"



Our form of jovernment is built on the premise that every citizen shall have the right to engage in political expression and association. This right was enshrined in the First Amendment of the Bill of Rights. Exercise of these basic freedoms in America had traditionally been through the media of political associations. Any interference with the freedom of a party is simultaneously an interference with the freedom of its adherents. All political ideas cannot and should not be channeled into the programs of our two major parties. History has amply proved the virture of political activety by minority, dissent groups."

C. If the relief requested is granted Defendants will suffer no harm.

In determining whether to grant temporary relief this court must consider the balance of equities. Plaintiffs have already shown that if the relief requested is notgranted they will be irreparably harmed. If, on the other hand, this Court agrees to grant the relief requested Defendants will suffer no harm whatsoever. As Plaintiffs have alleged in their complaint their grand jury subpoenas have been issued in bad faith and for no legitimate purpose. Plaintiffs have further alleged that Defendants already have all of the alleged information they could ask of Plaintiffs in a grand jury hearing and that they have had this information since late May. What is more, though the subpoenas herein were dated July 3, 1972 they were not served until July 7 in a coordinated sweep. Therefore, it is clear that the subpoenas and grand jury hearing are designed to harrass Plaintiffs and deprive them of adequate notice and counsel. Furthermore, even if there were a legitimate purpose to the investigation herein, it is apparent that time is not of the essence and that the relief requested herein would in no way impede such an investigation.

Thus balancing the irreparable harm to Plaintiffs if relief is not granted against the lack of harm to Defendants if the relief requested is granted this Court should immediately grant the relief requested herein.

II. This Court had the power to grant the relief requested.

It is clear that this Court has the power to grant the relief requested. In the case of <u>Buie v. Pigott</u>, 439 F. 2d 153 (5th Cir. 1971) this Court directed the District Court for the Southern Disdrict of Mississippi to enter an order enjoining the grand jury for Pike County, Mississippi.

In the case of <u>Cravel v. Philad States</u>, Civil Action # E.B.D. Nos. 71-172, (D. Mass. 1971) The First Circuit Court of Appeals, Nos 71-1331 and 71-1335 twice enjoined

a grand jury sitting in Boston, Massachusetts investigating the publication of the "Pentagon Papers" and the subpoenas issued pursuant thereto, while a fuller determination was made of Plaintiffs constitutional claims. In one instance the grand jury was enjoined for two weeks.

Other subpoens have been enjoined by federal Courts of Appeals. In the case of <u>United States Servicemen's</u>

<u>Fund v. Eastland</u>, Appeal Nos. 24, 279 and 24, 412 the Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia entered emergency stays enjoining the enforcement of subpoenss issued by the Committee on Internal Security of the United States Senate. Certainly if the federal courts have the power to enjoin a subpoens of a coordinate branch of government they have the power to enjoin a subpoens which is the process of the Federal court itself.

CONCLUSION

For all of the foregoing reasons, plaintiffs respectfully urge that this Court grant the relief requested.

VERIFIED COMPLAINT

Plaintiffs, for their verified complaint say and allege:

JURISDICTION

- 1. The jurisdiction of this Court arises under 28 U.S.C. \$1331, 1343(4), 1346, 1651, 2201 and 2202.
- 2. The amount in convtroversy exceeds \$10,000 exclusive of interests and costs, in that the value of each of the rights of which plaintiffs have been deprived is in excess of \$10,000.
- 3. Plaintiffs causes of action arise under the First, Fourth, Fifth, Sixth, Eigth and Ninth Amendments to the Constitution of the United States; 28 U.S.C. 8 2201-02; 18 U.S.C. 82510-20; and 47 U.S.C. 8605; and 42 U.S.C. 81983, 1985(3) and 1988.

CLASS ACTION ALLEGATIONS

4. Plaintiffs and plaintiff organization sue in their own behalf and on behalf of all others similarly situated, including: those for whom the complained of subposens have been issued and/or served; those Vietnam Veterans Against the War who wish to be present in Miami, Florida, to participate in VVAW activities during the week of July 10, 1972, more fully described in the body of this complaint; all members and staff of plaintiff organization; and all members of the general public who wish to hear and participate in VVAW Miami activities.

The class is so numerous that joinder of all members would be impracticable, there are questions of law or fact common to the class, the claims or defenses of the plaintiffs are typical of the claims or defenses of the class, and the plaintiffs will fairly and adequately protect the interests of the class.

PARTIES

5. The Vietnam Veterans Against the War (hereinafter VVAW), is a membership organization whose purposes include the following:

a) to contribute toward ending the war in Vietnam and Southeast Asia by developing the abilities of its members to collect and disseminate information to the public;

b) to encourage all responsible efforts not in violation of 50 U.S.C. \$1522 and 1523 to effect peace in Southeast Asia through the knowledge and experience of the membership;

; c) to aid and assist veterans; and

d) to participate in activities relating to issues of veterans rights.

5a. Plaintiff SCOTT CAMIL is a resident of Gainesville, Florida, and is Florida Regional Coordinator of VVAW. He has been active in planning VVAW activities for the Democratic National Convention in Miami, and is a recipient of one of

the subposmas complained of herein.

6.Plaintiff NANCY McCOWN is a student at Santa Fe
Junior College and is a resident of Gainesville, Florida.

She is a staff worker for VVAW and has been active in
planning the above mentioned Convention activities. She is
a recipient of one of the subpoenas complained of herein.

- 7. Plaintiff MARITNIORDAN is a resident of the State. of Arkansas, and is Regional Coordinator for VVAW in that state. He is coordinaing VVAW Convention activities for VVAW members from his region, and is a recipient of one of the subpoenas complained of herein.
- 8. Plaintiff BRUCE LOGSTON is a resident of Gainesville, Florida, and is a member of the VVAW Executive Committee at the University of Florida. He is a recipient of one of the subpoenas complained of herein.
- 9. Plaintiff STANLEY MICHELSON, Jr., is International Liason Coordinator for VVAW, and has been active in planning VVAW activities in Miami for the Convention. He is a recipient of one of the subpoenas complained of herein.
- 10. Plaintiff DONALD DONNER, is a resident of the State of Arkansas, and is a member of VVAW and has been active in planning Miami Convention VVAW activity. He is a recipient of one of the subpoenas complained of herein.
- 11. Plaintiff JOHN W. KNIFFIN is a resident of the State of Texas, and is Texas Regional Coordinator for VVAW. He is coordinating the activities of Texas VVAW members in connection with the Miami Convention, and is a recipient of one of the subpoenas complained of herein.
- 12. Plaintiffs BRUCE HORTON, ALTON FOSS, DON. PURDUE, and WAYNE BEVERLY are VVAW members who have been active in preparing, or are planning to attend, VVAW Miami Convention activities. They are all recipient sof subpoenas complained of home.

13. Defendant RICHARD KLIENDIENST is Attorney General of the United States; defendant L. PATRICK GRAY is director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation; WILLIAM H. STAFFORD, JR., is United States Attorney for the Northern District of Florida; JOHN DOE and RICHARD ROE are agents of the above defendants whose identities are presently unknown to plaintiffs.

- 14. This is an action for dearatory and injunctive relief to challenge the constutionality of a grand jury proceeding to be convened by defendants on or about July 10, 1972, in Tallahassee, Florida, and the issuance of subpoenas served upon plaintiffs pursuant thereto.
- 15. Plaintiffs Camil, Jordan, Logston, Michelson, Donner, Kniffen, Horton, Foss, Purdue, and Beverly are all veterans of this nation's armed forces and have served in the war in Vietnam. They are also members of the Vietnam Veterans Against the War.
- 16. Plaintiffs are amongst the regional and national leadership group in the VVAW and most have participated in the planning of the official VVAW educational actions scheduled in Miami during the Democratic and Republican National Conventions in July and August 1972, including but not limited to consultation with local law enforcement and elected officials concerning the issuance of parade permits, the procedures to be utilized in First Amendment protected marches and demonstrations, and the like.
- 17. The organizational activities themselves were to begin on July 8, 1972, one day after the service of the grand jury subpoenas which are the subject of the instant lawsuit. They were and are intended to focus the attention of the American public, including those present at the two conventions, upon what plaintiffs believe to be the illegal and unconstutional acts of the American government in Indochina.

The decision to engage in such activities was initially made on April 11, 1972 and was announced in a press conference in Houston, Texas on April 12, 1972, receiving national coverage. In response to the apparent renewed escalation of the War, including the bombing of North Vietnam, the increase in troop movements, the mining of the ports and rivers of North Vietnam, and ultimately the bombing of river dikes in the Red River Valley in which 12-15 million Vietnamese people are living, plaintiffs felt

that it was extremely urgent to present their information to the National Party Conventions in Miami. Consequently they increased their educational programs and activity to meet the American government's escalation of its policies in Indo-China. As part of their coordinated effort to make this education in Miami as comprehensive and complete as possible, plaintiffs held a conference on 27 May, 1972, in Gainesville, Florida to better coordinate their educational activities at the Democratic and Republican National Conventions. A person who later identified himself to be in the employment of the defendants was present and participated in that meeting. In late June the planned educational programs and activities which were announced publicly and appeared in the Miami press, and sent out across the country.

- 18. Plaintiffs planned and announced the following educational activities for the week of the Democratic Convention:
- (a). July 8; VVAW, in conjunction with the National Tenants Organization will hold a rally.
- (b). July 9: Southern Christian Leadership Conference will open Resurrection City and hold a rally in which VVAW members will participate.
- (c). July 10: Vietnam Veterns Against the War and National Welfare Rights Organization will hold a rally and march to the convention site.
- (d). July 11-12: VVAW will hold guerrilla theater and meet with Democratic Party Delegates.
 - (e). July 11, morning: VVAW seminar on drugs.
 - (f). July 11, afternoon: VVAW seminar on VA hospitals.
- (g). July 11, evening: VVAW seminar on bombings of Indochina, including latest photosand NARMIC slide show.
 - (h). July 12, morning: VVAW seminar on racism.
 - (. July 12, afternoon: VVAW seminar on repression.

- (j). July 13: VVAW march to convention site.
- 19. From the outset of the plans for the actions the plaintiffs have been in constant contact with the Miami Beach Police Department and have continually apprised them of their plans and activities. The first major public action the plaintiffs are sponsoring is a peaceful march to take place on July 10th, in the evening of the first day of the Democratic National Convention. Plaintiffs have obtained parade permits from the Miami Beach Police Department.
- 20. On Friday July 7, starting at or about 12:00 noon, and continuting thereafter until the present, in excess of twenty (20) grand jury subpoenas, most of which bore dates of issuance four days earlier, were served upon the named plaintiffs and other members of plaintiff . organization in a coordinated sweep. These subpoenas were made returnable sixty-nine (69) or less hours later in Tallahassee, Florida at 9:30 A.M. (with a weekend intervening). They were served not only on those of the plaintiffs who live or had arrived in Florida, but also on VVAW members in the states of Arkansas, Texas and Lousiana. All the subpoenas were reutrnable at the same time, notwithstanding the obvious impossibility of the grand jury hearinf this testimony all at once; or, indeed, the apparent lack of necessity that said testimony need be taken durning the dame time as the abovementioned organizational activities of which the defendants were already aware.
- 21. These subpoenss were deliberately served to coincide with the opening of the Democratic National Convention and the planned VVAW activities already described, and were intended to prevent, chill, and deter plaintiffs and members of their class from engaging in these lawful activities. In addition to the timing and number of these subpoenss, the following also appears: An employee

of the VVAW, one William Leamor, has aemitted to various of plaintiffs and to others that he was participating in their activities as a government informant and that he had personal knowledge that defendants planned to remove the leaders of VVAW from the Miemi area during the Democratic National Convention to prevent their participation in the above-described activities (See, e.g. affidavits of Barbara Stocking attached as an Exhibit hereto), and to discredit the "new left".

FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION FIRST AMENDMENT

- 22. The grand jury convened by defendants and the subpoenas served upon plaintiffs and other members of plaintiff: organization are in violation of the First Amendment in that:
- a) they constitute a prior restraint on plaintiffs' exercise of their rights under the First Amendment to engage in lawful and protected activity during the Democratic and Republican National Conventions.
- b) they are designed and intended to prevent, chill, and deter plaintiffs and the class they represent from speaking out against the illegal and unconstitutional war in Indochina.
- b) irrespective of their intended effect, these grand jury proceedings have the practical effect of effecting the consequences set forth in paragraphs (a) and (b), supra.

SECOND CAUSE OF ACTION
FOURTH AND NINTH AMENDMENTS,
18 U.S.C. \$2520 & 47 U.S.C. \$605

23. Upon information and belief, and in furtherance of and in conjunction with the facts already set forth, defendants through their agents have and continue to conduct illegal and unconstitutional surveillance of the national VVAW office, (See, e.g., Affidavit of Michael McCain, attached hereto as an exhibit,) all in violation of plaintiffs' constitutional and statutory rights.

THIRD CAUSE OF ACTION FIFTH, SIXTH AND EIGTH AMENDMENTS

24. The grand jury convened by defendants, and the subpoenas they have issued to compel appearance therein, convert the grand jury within into an instrument of preventive detention in that they detain plaintiffs without lawful process in Tallahassee, Florida, at a time when they wish and need to be elsewhere. On information and belief, this round-up and detention of plaintiffs was opposed by local

25. The receiving of these subpoenss on such short notice was intended to, and in fact has the effect of denying plaintiff witnesses the ability to retain and consult individually with counsel, in violation of their Fifth and Sixth Amendment rights to counsel and due process of law.

CONCLUSION

· Unless this Court enjoins the enforcement of the subpoenas complained of, plaintiffs and their class will be irreparably harmed in that their constituional rights will be denied and the democratic process irrevocably disrupted. Plaintiffs have no adequate remedy at law:

WHEREFORE, plaintiffs pray that this Court immediately enjoin enforcement of the subpoenas challenged herein, or in the alternative, adjourn the subpoenas challenged until after the conclusion of the Republican National Convention on August (1972); and, after a hearing on the merits of this complaint:

- 1) Enter declaratory judgment that the abusive practices comp(Ained of are illegal and unconstitutional;
- 2) Enter an order permanently enjoining defendants from engaging in such acts and practices in the future:
- 3) Award damages against defendants in the sum of \$25,000 compensatory damages and \$25,000 exemplary damages, such damages to be awarded against each defendant;
- 4) Award other and further relief as this Court may deem just and proper, together with costs, disbursements and reasonable attorney's fees in connection with this action.

My name is Barbara Stocking. I am a PhD candidate and Teaching Fellow in Philosophy at Boston University.

I met Rill Lemmer in Washington, D.C., at the time of the peace demonstrations this spring (I think May 20-21, 1972). I was standing beside him and I met him simply by chance because he asked me to take care of his dog for a while, while he was busy at the demonstration on the Capitol grounds. Later we talked for a while, and I told him I was on my way from Baltimore to Orlando, Florida, after the demonstrations, and he offered me a ride, because he was going to Gainesville then. A few days later he called me in Baltimore (he was in New York) and said he would come through Baltimore and pick me up there and give me a ride to Florida.

We spent most of two days on the trip to Florida, and nearly the whole time he talked about himself, about his childhood, his time in the service, and his current activities. He said that I should not go to the Miami conventions because, he said, all of the VVAW leaders were going to be picked up and taken out of circulation, he and some other people were going to shoot leaders of the New Left, and start a riot, and there would be a lot of fighting and shooting, and everyone would be arrested. He also spoke of shooting the "Trots" and Progressive Labor movement people and pretending that VVAW had done it, and this would discredit the VVAW and split the peace movement. He said he had a source of unlimited funds to carry this out, and would go into hiding

afterwards and leave the country.

The reason he told me all this, he said, was that he was grateful to me for "taking care of him", feeding his dog for him, and helping him keep awake on the trip to Floride.

He talked about having a lot of trouble in the service, and was very angry that the ACLU was "investigating" him, because he was an informer, and that the FBI and CIA were hassling him, and that he had made deals with them. Whenever we stopped to eat along the way, as soon as we were at a table or counter, he began talking in a loud voice about shooting, bombing, and the like. I asked him to stop, but he still did it. When we got to Gainesville, and went to the house of Scott Camil, which was where he was going to stay, he again talked of shooting and bombing. The only response I heard to this, during the night and day I was there, was people telling him that shooting and bombing were not good things to do; I remember someone saying "I don't think I could kill anyone", and someone else said " there's been too much killing already", and other similar ststements. It seemed to me he was acting an agent provacateur.

I stayed in Orlando, Florida, visiting for two weeks and then went to New York City, where I volunteered to help the national office of the VVAW. I told them what Lemmer had said on the trip to Florida, and they told me Lemmer had confessed, in <u>fifteen hours of</u> taped information, to being an FBI informer. I was worried about

the shooting he had kept talking about, but we all were reluctant to think it could possibly be true, so we didn't do anything about it at that time, or until now. When the VVAW leaders got subposed Friday, I became very concerned that the rest of what Lemmer had said might be true as well.

MARTIN JORDAN, being duly sworn according to law deposes and says:

I am a veteran of Vietnam having served in the United States Army for three years and spent two years in Vietnam.

I have known Bill Leamer for a period of about one year. We have been closely associated for about the same period of time.

Recently, at the end of May 1972, I spent two days with Bill Leamer during the entire time our conversation was recorded with, of course, his full permission. Also present was Don Donner.

The conversation was the result of our di scovering that Bill was working as an FBI informer. He admitted to being an FBI informer at that time.

Bill admitted to Don Donner and myself:

- 1. that he was paid by the FBI and had been for about nine months
- 2.he was also paid by the FBI lending it's assistance and influence in a criminal case in which he was a defendant or potential defendant. In addition he received expenses and on occasions bail bonds were posted by the FBI for him. On another occasion he was released on personal recognizance after the FBI intervened. This took place at Oklahoma City where Bill was busted at Tinker AFB, Oklahoma.
- 3. lately he has been receiving travelling expenses, plus payments for his car, apartment and telephone bills.

He works through FBI agents Dick O'Connell and Les Leadbetter of Fayetteville, Ark. They are the local resident going to blow up or burn down a building known as "Old Kain" which is at the University of Arkansas. He admitted going to the scene and helping him by telling him how to build a bonb and went with him to place it.

He denied advising the FBI of the teenager's actions, however the FBI were at the building waiting for the teenager and he was arrested and convicted.

On another occasion, Bill Leamer's release from jail at Oklahoma City, Oklahoma after the TinkerAFB arrest, was secured by the FBI by allowing him to sign a personal recognizance bond after which he left the state of Oklahoma and came to Arksansas, then went to New York, Baltimore, South Carolina, Florida and Georgia.



DON DONNER, being duly sworn, according to law, deposes and says:

I am a veteran of the Vietnam war, having served in the U.S. Army for two years. I spent 10 months in Vietnam.

I know Bill Leamer and have known him for about one year. I have been loosely associated with him on a speaking basis for about six months.

Recently, at the end of May, 1972 I spent two entire days with him. Our conversation was tape recorded with his full knowledge and permission. Also present was Martin Jordon.

This conversation was the result of our discovery that Bill Leamer was an FBI employee, informer and agent provocatuer. He admitted to Marti and myself:

1.that he was in the employ of the FBI and had been for the past nine months;

2.he was originally paid by the FBI having exerted its influence in criminal cases in which he was a defendant or potential defendant. In addition, he received expenses and on occasion bail bonds were posted for him by the FBI; On another occasion he was released on personal recognizance after FBI intervention. This was at Tinker AFB, Oklahoma;

3. lately he has been receiving travelling expenses, plus payments for his car, his apartment and his telephone:

4.he works through FBI agents Dick O'Connell and Les Ledbetter.

He admitted to us that:

٥.

l.counselled, aided and abetted a teenager at the University of Arkansas to blow up a building known as Old Main. He admitted going to the scene and helping him place the bomb. He said the night before that he told the student how to make the bomb. He denied advising the FBI of this. The student was arrested and convicted.

2.he advised us of his role at the Tinker AFB arrests.

He told us that the FBI was able to secure his release on

personal recognizance after he advised arresting officers that
they should contact Dick O'Connell, his agent.

I believe that Bill set up several drug busts but he has denied this. He has said that he was not working for the FBI in that connection. He did say that the FBI posted his bond in one case. In one case his bond was twice as high as anyone else's. Once bail was set he was told to contact the local FBI in Fayetteville.

Bill is unclear about when he started working for the FBI.

Bill is separated from his wife. She is securing a divorce. According to Bill, he has been court-martialed for conspiracy to steal federal weapons. His wife says that she believes that he has been court-martialed but that she did not know the nature of the charges, but that he was busted in rank.

Bill also told me that the FBI was preparing a list of people who would be likely to be leaders in organizing protest demonstrations, and that he had given them a list of names of "movement" people in Fayetteville, Arkansas. He said that his assumption due to his talks with the FBI was that such people would be detained in a preventative action before the Miami Conventions.

MICHAEL D. McCAIN, being duly sworn, deposes and says:

- 1. I am and have been since February 1972 one of six national coordinators comprising the National Coordinating Committee of the Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW). Since March 1972, I have carried out my responsibilities as a national coordinator principally from the National Headquarters of the VVAW-located at 25 West 26th Street, New York City.
- 2. As national coordinator, I am responsible for implementing, coordinating, and facilitating various activities and programs in which VVAW participates, including the planned peaceful anti-war protests scheduled in Miami, Florida during the Democratic and Republican National Conventions. My work in this regard has involved me in frequent telephonic communications with VVAW offices and individual members throughout the country.
- 3. On information and belief, the telephones of the National Headquarters in New York City and those of the regional offices listed below have been and are the subject of illegal and unconstitutional wiretapping and other unlawful interception by defendants and their agents:

... New York City which telephone numbers are (212) 725-5660, 5681,5682, and 5683.

(b) These calls have been placed to VVAW offices in Austin, Texas, tcl. (512) 451-2841; in Gainsville, Florida, tcl. (904) 378-0774; in Hialean, Florida tcl. (305) 681-7982; and Fayetteville, Arkansas tcl. (501) 521-7384.

4. My belief that the above phones are tapped is based on the following occurrences: On numerous occasions since March 1972, while making telephone calls from the New York office, I have heard actual playbacks of prior conversations that I and others in that office have bad over those telephones. In addition, I have frequently experienced a two or three second delayed echo of the very conversations in which I was then engaged. Also, when calling other VVAW offices and other telephones which I believe themselves to be subject to illegal taps, I have experienced great difficulty in getting direct and clear connections. Finally, approximately 20% of all long distance calls which I have placed during this period have been so beclouded by interference that connection was impossible.

5. My belief that the above -described interferences were not simple or usual circuit problems but rather the product and effects of electronic surveillance equipment attached to some prall of the above-listed telephones is based on my knowledge of, and training and experience in electronics and communications systems. In 1962, I took electrical engineering and electronics courses at the Louisianna Polytechnic Institute. Subsequent to this university training, I was trained, in San Diego, California by the United States Marine Corps between September 1966 and April 1967 to be a radio-telegraph operator and functioned in that capacity in the Marine Corps from April 1967 to April 1969. The training included courses in basis electronic theory and in scrambling and coding devices. After an eighteen-week course, I graduated scond in my class and received a Military Occupational

Specialty certificate (Specialty Number and Title 2533). Subsequently, in approximately February 1969, I completed a program of training in microwave relay systems (ANTRC-97Operators Course) at Camp Lejeune, North Carolina. This course involved study and operation of equipment comparable to commercial long distance dialing transmission equipment. (This training and certification is reflected on the DD-214N"Report of Transfer or Discharge" attached hereto as Exhibit "A"). In addition, from June 1964 to August 1965, I worked as a pay station maintenance and collection worker for the Southern Bell Telephone Company in Shreveport, Louisianna. In this capacity I had access to the frame (awitching and dial systems) and the microwave relay systems (long distance systems). The knowledge, experience and expertise gained from this university and marine training and work form the basis of my belief that the above described interferences encountered while using VVAW telephones are not simple or usual circuit problems but rather the product and effects of electronic bugging equipment attached to some or all of the listed telephones.

A large number of the phone calls in which the above-described interference occurred concerned specific plans for the projected anti-war protest and educational activities of the VVAW at the Democratic and Republican National Conventions in Miami. 



Proposal of New York

To establish a National Committee to Defend VVAW and a National Defense Fund-

1. To establish a National Committee to Defend VVAV

Preamble: In view of the present nature and thrust of the government we see the establishment of these committees as a necessary step in dealing with the repression directed towards VVAV and these committees will be responsible to the Steering Committee to build support and prepagandize the true majore of the government's actions.

Purpose: To defend VVAV and its members engaged in VVAV activities and all political priscretion of the and all repressive political attacks by the government with the primary emphasis at this time to be directed to the grand jury proceedings in Tallahassee. And to raise money for the MIDVVAV.

Function: To coordinate all information and propagande between the local defense committee and the press and the regions of VVAV. To coordinate fund raising and dissemination of those funds to the local committees under political attack and to raise money for continuing defense efforts.

Tallahassee- California Amendments

Guidelines for funding:

- a. only for direct defense-lawyers, bond, expenses for mailings, etc.
- b. priority for cases affecting the continuing function of VVAN
- c. checks made out to the National Defense Fund
- d. all money that is sent to the VVAV National Defense Fund will be dispersed by the National Defense Committee as determined by necessity of meeting the political attacks on VVAV and other political prisoners.
- e. any money sent to the NDC ear mark for a particular local must be immediately sent to that fund or committee and that one only.

Structure: Michigan-Missouri Amendment To be directed by the VVEN National Steering Committee with two national coordinators, one representative and one lawyer of each committee under political attack to be responsible to the NSC to administer the program.

- 1. To demand an immediate cessation of shting and the withdrawal of all Ama can troops, planes, and military and economic aid from Southwest Asia. We cannot allow one more human being to hilled there. We support as a basis for cessation of these hostilities the various peace proposals of the peoples of South east Asia, such as the Seven Points program of the PRS of SVN c such future plans as they develop based upon their rights of self-determination and actual control of their own destinies.
- 2. To demand the immediate termination of all other operations by the United States government, its agencies, and American busine interests that are designed to suppress the rightful struggles for liberation and self-determination of the Peoples of the Ear This includes the maintenance of dictatorial governments, econodomination, and the theft of the natural resources of other countrat the United States should make reparations acceptable to the Indo-chinese for damages done by the United States.
- 3. To demand that all active-duty servicemen and women and reserved and National Guard be afforded the same rights that are quaranted by the United States Constitution and Bill of Rights that are possently denied by the Uniform Code of Military Justice. We are appalled that our active-duty GI's are treated as less than fire class citizens. We express the efforts of our active -duty sist and brothers in their struggle to demogratize the military.
- 4. To support all military personnel refusing to serve against thei consciences in wars at home and abroad. We demand that Congress enact legislation for the immediate repatriation to those brothe and sisters who are in prison or in self-exile by reason of their refusal to serve in the military. It must also involve an end that repression and a freeing of all political prisoners.
- 5. To demand there be no distinctions as to types of discharges and that a single type of discharge be issued, and that this be retractive. We also demand all veterans receive all rights and bene fits under the VA; and that compensation for disabliities be bas solely upon the degree of disability for veterans and their family without regard to sex, race, rank or length of service.
- 6. To make clear that the United States have never undertaken an extensive open investigation of American war crimes in Indochina, in its war in Indochina the US has violated the principles of Nuremburg. As active-duty and former GI's we recognize the responsibility and guilt of the individual soldier to refrain from committing war crimes. We also recognize that the responsibility and guilt of war crimes committed in the name of America lies without policy makers at all levels.
- 7. To show Americans that our society is permeated by racism, which manipulates whites into viewing non-whites as inferior or less the human. This racism pushes Third World People through inferior schools to inferior jobs and into combat arms. Thus Third World are sent off to die in disproprtionately high numbers as we till Asians indiscriminately. We also demand the U.S. military recogits complicity in America's domestic and international racism. We resolve to fight racism in society and in ourselves.

- 8. To show that semismolays a major part in providing war. We must show Americant our society is permented by semism, which forces an inferior status upon women, reducing them to subservient sexual objects, and which robs both men and women of their natural growth. This institutionalized semism channels women into unfulfilling, lower-paving jobs which are servile in nature and purpose: it exploits their bodies for sex and profit; and it degrades and dehumanizes them by a double standard of morality wholly dependent on the myth of male supremacy. This sexism is exploited by the military, officially defining servicewomen as subordinate and thoroughly subjugating them to service work and the role of a sexual object. We resolve to fight sexism within our society, within our own organization, and within ourselves.
- 9. To dedicate ourselves to these principles and objectives which directly relate to the imperialist suppression of the People of the World by the United States government. We undestand this war is imperialistic in origin and affirm that the membership of VVAW is not only concerned with ending this war, but with changing the domestic, social, political and economic institutions that have caused and perpetuated its continuance.
- O. To support the democratic right of Americans to unionize and strike to protect their income and safeguard their employment. We consider all legislation designed to suppress these right, including mandatory arbitration to be illegal, and not in the interests of American working people. We also demand full employment for all Americans, including free educational and vocational training for all who need or want it. We refuse to participate in the efforts being made to separate us from other working people, making veterans enemies by giving us the characte of employment priority. We condemn this as a method of encouraging military enlistment by the false promise of employment after service. We condomn the use of active-duty GI's, National Guard, and Reserves as strike breakers.

California Recommendation

The following recommentation is to provide the national organization of VVAV with a program sforwnational focus for the next 6 months. It - is not meant to be a substitute for local programs nor actions. We feel it is necessary for the national organization to provide a united thrust so that all across the nation, chapters will have a focus to deal as a national group. Local programs must continue during this period August 1-20th

INTERNAL SECURITY - REVOLUTIONARY ACTIVITIES

PURPOSE:

To furnish up-to-date developments and extremely beneficial results to date based on indictment of six VVAW members in Tallahassee 7/13/72 for violations of Federal statutes, including conspiracy to riot during forthcoming Republican National Convention.

BACKGROUND:

On basis of information developed by FBI six VVAW members, including Scott Camil, John Kniffin, Peter Paul Mahoney, Alton Foss, Donald Perdue, and William Patterson, were indicted by Federal Grand Jury, Tallahassee, Florida, 7/13/72, charging conspiracy to riot during Republican National Convention. addition, indictment charged that Camil was in possession of unregistered incendiary devices and was teaching technique to others which could cause death or injury. Prior to meeting at Gainesville, Florida, 5/27-29/72, during which plans of conspiracy concretely formulated, it was known to FBI that VVAW planned to engage in civil disobedience and other forms of disruptions during national political conventions in Miami during July and August, 1972. These plans were known to VVAW national headquarters in New York and no apparent effort was made to thwart or change plans. It is noted that Peter Paul Mahoney, one of six indicted, is currently national VVAW officer assigned to PTO 16 100 - 448092 VVAW headquarters, New York City.

As a result of indictment, reactions of VVAW members in various parts of country have been interesting and AUG 4 1972 encouraging. For example, VVAW in Michigan held meeting on 7/19/72 and proposal was made to establish legal fund for those members indicted. There was general disagreement with proposal to establish legal fund and majority of members made

According to mood of the majority of the delegates was to "let the" VVAW members hang if they are guilty" and to avoid any confrontation with police at Republican National Convention. VVAW, Philadelphia, is currently in process of mailing newsletter to all members in Eastern Pennsylvania, Eastern Maryland and Delaware which contains article captioned "On to Miami" and makes specific appeal for nonviolence on part of VVAW, stating in part ". . . . actions will be nonviolent and nondisruptive. Violence will not only discredit us and bring retaliatory action upon us, but it will also harm our six brothers who have been indicted in Tallahassee. Violent actions by us would lend credibility ; to the Government's conspiracy charges. No lethal weapons such as firearms or long knives will be allowed on our convoy. . . ."

Meeting of VVAW, Dade County, which covers Miami, was held 7/24/72 and one of the speakers was Alton Foss, indicted VVAW Miami leader. It was decided during meeting that none of six indicted VVAW members was to participate in demonstrations at forthcoming Republican National Convention or even be in Miami area at that time. One member went so far as to state that no encouragement was being given by VVAW national headquarters for VVAW groups throughout the country to come to Miami Beach for the Republican National Convention.




- 1. Subpoens of scuthern coordinators. On the afternoon of July 7, FBI agents in four states (Nrkansas, Florida, Louisiana, and Texas), served subpoens to at least 20 coordinators and members of those states. They are to appear July 10 in Tallahassec, Florida before a federal grand jury. All coordinators and members are advised to contact the National Office immediately upon being served subpoens or contacted by investigators of any agencies.
- 2. 82nd Airborne. Already at Homestead AFE are the 15th PsyOps and forward elements of the 82nd and 101st Airborne. The units to be committed from the 82nd are the 1st and 2nd Brigade. Additionally, 1000 paratroopers from the 101st will be in position for immediate deployment from their encampment at Homestead. Most of the personnel are hand-picked career PCOs. Live ammunition has been issued. Training has been intensive for the last month. Horald in most units of the 82nd and 101st are low. Certain personnel and elements of the 82nd will not obey mands to move or fire upon the demonstrators. THESE ARE MILITARY REALITIES, BROTHERS AND SISTERS. IF YOU EXPECT TO SURVIVE, IT'S BEST THAT WE START THINKING IN HILITARY WAYS.
- 3. Location of steering committee meeting. Because of the focus of activities in Florida, and the compromise of information about the Milwaukee meeting, it is recommended to the steering committee that they reconsider the location of the steering committee meeting. Scott Camil has said that Gainesville can provide adequate facilities and housing for such a meeting. Flease let me know of your decision immediately.
- Security measures. Because of the subpoena served to 20 coordinators and members over the past few days, it is highly recommended that security checks be made on all members in key and influential positions within the regional, state, and chapter structures. This, of course, includes national. It is further recommended that levels of clearances be "en, at the discretion of the regional coordinators, which does not not remaily guarantee acceptance of clearance by other regional and national coordinators. Clearance classifications to be used by this office are as follows: 4 - top security clearance, access to any information on a need-to-know basis; 3 - tactical security clearance, access to information pertinent to the operations of national, regional, state, and chapter activities, on a need-to-know basis; 2- organizational security clearance, access to all information except top and tactical security information, on a need-to-know basis; 1 - regular security clearance. access to information normally distributed to members only; 0 - no security clearance, access to information available to the public; Alpha possible security risk; Bravo - confirmed security risk; Charlie - suspected agent or informar; Delta - confirmed agent or informer. To macords, tapes, documents, or broadcasts should be made of security information 4, 3, rulie, and Delta. 2*

stated that after reading the letter, the consensus of the membership was that the contents of the letter were "ridiculous." The comments heard especially took issue with the invitation to bring firearms to Miami. Although the membership believes in defensive measures, such measures would include items such as gas masks, protective helmets and padded clothing. According to this source, the Philadelphia members feel that in Miami the VVAW should "keep as cool as possible," because they actually desire to avoid arrest. They feel that being in jail would be self-defeating because the effects of demonstrations, lobbying and press coverage would thereby be diminished. In addition, violence would actually play into the hands of the Republican party and President NIXON.

stated that in his opinion the Gainesville letter had no real effect upon the Philadelphia VVAW members planning to attend the political conventions. Thus, those planning to attend prior to receipt of the letter were still planning to attend after the receipt thereof. There has been no increase or decrease in the number of participants as a result of either being incited or disuaded by the contents of the Gainesville letter.

Although it is known by the Philadelphia VVAW membership that SCOTT CAMILE is from Gainesville, none of the members immediately connected the letter with CAMILE. In fact, some members were more inclined to believe that JOE BANGERT, VVAW member from New York City, would naturally be the author of such a letter. In these comments, some members indicated the letter was "something like BANGERT would dream up."

further advised that the Philadelphia VVAW is currently mailing its newsletter to the membership of the Eastern Pennsylvania Eastern Maryland and Delaware regions of the VVAW, which contains an article captioned "On to Miami." According to the source, the article contains the following appeal for non-violence on the part of VVAW in Miami:

"... Actions will be non-violent and non-destructive. Violence will not only discrett us and bring retaliatory violence upon us, but it will also harm our six brothers who have been indicted in Tallahassee. Violent actions by us would lend credibility to the government's conspiracy charges. No lethal weapons such as firearms or long knives will be allowed on our convoy. Anyone found with them will be expelled from the group. There is a possibility of searches, so carry dope and alcohol at your own risk. Some of the actions planned at the convention may involve civil disobedience and arrest, but for those who cannot risk arrest, there will be many strictly legal actions. There will be room for all forms of non-violent action..."

The above information is not being set forth in an FD-302 for the following reasons:

The Philadelphia VVAW did not receive any slingshot and the Gainesville letter was considered "ridiculous" by the membership. In addition, the Philadelphia VVAW feels that activities at Miami should be kept "as cool as possible." In the opinion of the letter had no effect, one way or the other, on those planning to travel to Miami. As noted above, the reaction of the Philadelphia VVAW was to circulate a letter which is in contradiction with the Gainesville letter, in that it calls for non-violent and non-destructive demonstrations in order to avoid discredit to and retaliatory action against the VVAW.

Information has just been developed that during recent VVAW National Steering Committee meeting, Hubbard was severely criticized and his position eliminated. It was also reported that he had planned to make a press release acknowledging guilt of six VVAW members indicted by Federal Grand Jury. Distinct possibility that discreet interview with Hubbard at this time would be of extreme benefit to Bureau's interest and in interest of avoiding militant disruptions during Republican National Convention. If given opportunity, Hubbard could yet follow through idea to discredit six indicted VVAW members and issue call to other VVAW chapters to avoid violence and militant disruptions in future activities to preserve image of VVAW. In so doing, of course, Hubbard could propagate his own image as VVAW leader and savior.






