Your inquiry of August 10, 1972, regarding Alton C. Foss, one of the defendants in the above-mentioned action, has been noted. The subject matter of that inquiry was orally discussed by Mr. Guy L. Goodwin of the Special Litigation Section and Special Agent [REDACTED] on August 9, 1972.

We have not yet received copies of the statement made by Foss and have seen only brief teletyped summaries.

[REDACTED] cannot be made until copies of the statements or the tape recording of the interviews of this person can be studied.

In view of his present status as a defendant awaiting trial in the same case, it is not considered appropriate to [REDACTED] at the present time.

After we have reviewed his statements in light of the other evidence in the case, we will communicate with you further with respect to this matter.

[redacted] current activities are with the Florida People's Platform Coalition, and not antiwar VVAW. U

in the Tampa area, with the idea in mind of requesting Bureau authority for interviews looking to possible sources in this area of VVAW.

There appears to be a lack of association between local VVAW groups and VVAW on a national level, even though SCOTT CAMIL, the Florida coordinator, has, on occasion, been in the St. Petersburg area. None of the local groups have sponsored any demonstrations in the recent past which resulted in violence and in fact, there has been no VVAW sponsored activity of any kind recently.

In view of the above information, no further investigation appears warranted at this time, and this case is being placed in a closed status.

A source who has furnished reliable information in the past advised August 11, 1972, that a Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW) caravan to the Republican National Convention, Miami, Florida, was scheduled to depart from 1380 Howard Street, San Francisco, California, on August 13, 1972, at midnight.

The VVAW is an anti-war organization organized in 1967 with headquarters in New York City, New York. Its first published objective is "to demand an immediate secession of fighting and the withdrawal of all American troops from Indochina".

Special Agents of the FBI observed a caravan of eight vehicles and a motorcycle depart 1380 Howard Street, San Francisco, on August 14, 1972, at 12:30 a.m. Approximately 25 persons were observed to depart with the caravan.

Included in the caravan were the following vehicles set out with their registered owners as recorded in the files of the California and Illinois Departments of Motor Vehicles.

Confidential Sources 1 and 2 advised that no formal business was conducted on July 28, 1972, but that individuals merely became acquainted with each other on that afternoon. These sources advised that individuals in attendance reportedly were from Ohio, Iowa, Missouri, Indiana, Illinois and possibly other states.

Confidential Source 2 advised that the primary purpose of the gathering was to exchange ideas regarding the upcoming election, and if any activity or position should be adopted by the VVAW in the respective states, to discuss the possibility of increasing the membership during the Fall term of school at their various campuses and to generally get together and have a good time.

Confidential Source 1 advised that during the morning of July 29, 1972, the primary activity of those in attendance was participation in a softball game.

Confidential Source 2 advised on July 29, 1972, that [redacted] and [redacted] indicated that the gathering was to be informal and that a good time was to be had by all. Both these individuals restated the VVAW's negative position on the Vietnam war and its philosophy that the so-called middle class of America is dominated by the Federal Government and by a biased news media, which does not allow it (the middle class) to generally obtain factual information concerning current political issues.

In addition, [redacted] (last name unknown), possibly identical with [redacted] of Chicago, Illinois, stated that the VVAW is taking an increasingly broader role in the political development of liberal thought within the United States. He indicated the VVAW would not curtail its activities however, as a result of a termination of the Vietnam war but would expand into other political issues demanding that the Government provide what he called "factual information" for the American people. [redacted] (last name unknown) stated it was

the intention of the VVAW to become identified with the demands of the "liberal press" and that VVAW would push for this type of action in their future relationships with their chapter members.

Confidential Source 1 advised that on Saturday, July 29, 1972, approximately one hour in the afternoon was devoted to "business" and that the remainder of the time was spent in physical activities consisting of a softball game, heavy drinking and "pot" smoking and other miscellaneous activities.

During this meeting, confidential Source 1 advised that [redacted] lead the discussion regarding the proposed VVAW convoy to Miami, Florida. [redacted] indicated that this convoy was not to engage in any type of violence. Security forces, not further described, are to be organized to travel along with the convoy to counter violence, however, it was not mentioned that they were to be armed. [redacted] estimated that approximately 1,000 cars would participate in this convoy by the time it reached Mississippi. While en route, several "educational teach-ins" are to be conducted, however, exact activities were not disclosed.

Confidential Source 1 advised that tentative plans, announced by [redacted] indicate that after arriving in Miami, Florida, the VVAW will conduct a "three-pronged assault" on Miami and reportedly VVAW has received permission from the Miami city officials to conduct such a mission consisting of:

1. a helicopter to drop a "path finder team"
2. airborne groups to participate
3. a marine water "assault".

[redacted] also indicated that members of the VVAW plan to have practice parachute jumps while en route to Miami.

[redacted] also indicated that the VVAW would be moving its national headquarters from New York to Chicago, Illinois. [redacted] stated that one truckload of VVAW material has been moved to Chicago, Illinois and the remainder of the move will be completed after the Republican convention.

In response to a question to define VVAW, [redacted] indicated that VVAW is a social organization with a few "revolutionaries" in the ranks. Confidential Sources 1 and 2 advised that no business was conducted on July 30, 1972 as all individuals returned to their respective residences.

An article appeared in the evening issue, July 31, 1972, of the "News-Gazette", Champaign, Illinois, a daily local newspaper, which was entitled "Antiwar Veterans Get Ready for Miami Trip". In this article, Jeff Hillier of Chicago, Illinois, reported spokesman for the Chicago chapter of the VVAW, indicated that VVAW members had come from seven states to participate in the meeting held July 28 - 30, 1972. Also, during this article, Hillier stated that the VVAW intended to sponsor a car caravan which reportedly would leave Los Angeles, California, San Francisco, California and Portland, Oregon on August 13, 1972 en route to Miami. The caravan will proceed by a southern and northern route and one group allegedly will be at the Lake of the Woods Park, Champaign County, Illinois on August 15, 16 and 17, 1972. The caravan plans to leave Champaign County, Illinois on August 17, 1972 en route to Miami.

Hillier indicated that VVAW hopes to collect 10,000 members at Miami who will meet at Flamingo Park, where protestors camped during the Democratic National Convention. Hillier said the caravan would include medical vehicles, mechanical vehicles, a "rear guard" and advance vehicles announcing the approach of the caravan. Jeff Hillier stated the VVAW's goal as "We will confront the present administration and make people realize that (President Richard) Nixon has been lying for four years and using the war to advance his political career".

VVAW is an antiwar organization organized in 1967 and headquartered in New York City. Its published objective is "to demand an immediate cessation of fighting and the withdrawal of all American troops from Indochina".

Source advised that VVAW members participating in "Last Patrol" leaving California would be searched for weapons and narcotics prior to leaving Los Angeles. Concern was expressed that other organizations participating in the caravan could possibly cause embarrassment to the VVAW through their possession of weapons and narcotics. *QU*

Source advised an additional change in the itinerary was made at the meeting to avoid "Red Necks" in the South-eastern part of the United States. The third stop would be at Shreveport, Louisiana. From Shreveport the caravan intended to avoid stop at Atlanta and drive straight through Jacksonville to Tallahassee, Florida, to meet Boston Contingent and then to proceed on to Miami. Source advised that at the meeting, it was apparent that there was much confusion regarding the travel itinerary and who would actually participate in the caravan. *QU*

Source advised California VVAW split into northern and southern regions and Jack Mc Closky became temporary coordinator of the northern California region to be replaced in three months when he stepped down by an individual known as Joe O'Donnell, nickname Jeff. Source advised the San Francisco contingent arrived at San Luis Obispo, California, in a blue Ford econo van, Illinois license [redacted] This same

van was used by the San Francisco contingent who traveled to Milwaukee for the National Convention last July. The San Francisco contingent included [redacted] Jack MC Closky, and Joe O'Donnell. These individuals video taped the proceedings at San Luis Obispo, California, and indicated they plan to film all important meetings for a future movie. The film was to be kept in a secure place in San Francisco.

ALL VEHICLES ENTERING AND PARTICIPATING IN THE LAST PATROL MUST OBSERVE THE DISCIPLINE AND GENERAL OPERATIONAL PROCEDURE AS OUTLINED BELOW.

SPEED OF CONVOY--50 MILES PER HOUR
MILES PER DAY--500 MILES
5 CAR LENGTHS WILL BE KEPT BETWEEN EACH VEHICLE

THERE WILL BE TWO MARKED CONVOY LEAD AND TWO MARKED CONVOY REAR VEHICLES WHICH WILL ACT AS COORDINATORS AND ORGANIZERS FOR THE OPERATION OF THE LAST PATROL. THESE VEHICLES WILL BE EQUIPPED WITH RADIO EQUIPMENT TO KEEP IN TOUCH WITH ALL ELEMENTS OF THE CONVOY. THERE WILL ALSO BE TWO MECHANICAL PARTS VANS WITH A BASIC SUPPLY OF PARTS. MECHANICS WILL BE AVAILABLE IF ON-THE-SPOT REPAIRS CAN BE MADE. AS PART OF OUR FACILITIES, THERE WILL ALSO BE MEDICAL CENTERS WITH DOCTORS AND MEDICS. ATTORNEYS WILL ALSO BE TRAVELLING WITH THE CONVOY AS OBSERVERS OR IN CASE OF ANY PROBLEMS ALONG THE ROUTE. THERE WILL BE 20 TO 20 CONVOY INSPECTION VEHICLES TO DEAL WITH ANY PROBLEMS OR CRISIS THAT ARISE. THESE VEHICLES WILL BE EQUIPPED WITH RADIO GEAR AND BE SITUATED THROUGHOUT THE CONVOY.

WE WOULD LIKE TO HAVE EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS DURING OUR STOPS FOR LUNCH AND DINNER AT NIGHT. IT WOULD REALLY BE GOOD IF WE COULD HAVE LOCAL COMMUNITY PARTICIPATION AND ATTENDANCE IF THE ARRANGEMENTS COULD BE MADE THRU LOCAL AND REGIONAL CONTACTS. IF YOU MUST STOP FOR REPAIRS OR FOR MEDICAL AID OR WHATEVER, PULL OUT OF LINE AND ONTO THE SHOULDER OF THE ROAD. A CONVOY INSPECTION VEHICLE WILL STOP AND ARRANGE FOR ANY ASSISTANCE NEEDED. DO NOT BLOCK FREEWAY ACCESS RAMPS WHEN YOU STOP. IF YOU'RE STOPPING FOR GAS OR THE BATHROOM, THE ENTRANCE BACK INTO THE CONVOY WILL BE MADE AS FOLLOWS; ENTER AT THE REAR OF THE CONVOY IN FRONT OF THE REAR CONVOY CONTROL VEHICLES. OTHER REMINDERS

GAS AND MACE WILL WASH OUT OF HAIR AND CLOTHING WITH SOAP AND WATER. HAIR SHOULD BE WASHED AS SOON AS POSSIBLE IF IT HAS BEEN EXPOSED. Attached is a copy of a complaint filed August 11, 1972, in U. S. District Court, Boston, Massachusetts, by plaintiffs Civil Liberties Legal Defense Fund, Inc. (CLLDF), the Legal In-Service Project (LISP), the Massachusetts Political Action for Peace (MAX PAX), and the Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW), against you, myself, and others, in a suit alleging wiretapping of plaintiffs' telephones. The suit seeks a permanent injunction against any such electronic surveillances; \$100 for each day of illegal surveillance since May 15, 1970; \$50,000 in exemplary damages; and legal expenses incurred by plaintiffs in the suit.

The plaintiffs allege that five telephone lines used by LISP, MAX PAX, and VVAW, and two telephone lines used by CLLDF, all at premises 67 and 67A Winthrop Street, Cambridge, Massachusetts, were tested on or about February 11, 1972, and that the tests indicated the lines were being tapped.

For your information, the records of this Bureau fail to indicate that it ever conducted--prior to, during, or since the reported test by plaintiffs--any electronic surveillance on the telephone lines or premises set forth in the complaint.

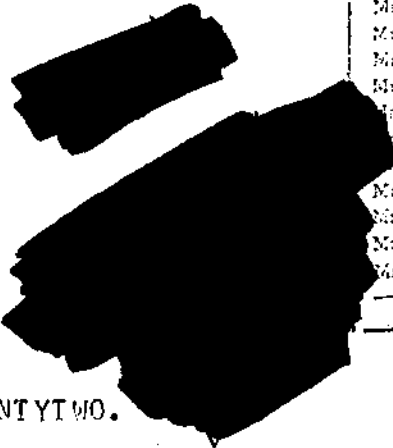

MARK LANE:

MARK LANE has been described in Boise, Idaho; news media as a lawyer, former New York State Assemblyman, author of the book "Rush to Judgment," and a civil rights and anti-war activist. LANE appeared in the Boise area on April 24, 1971, as a speaker at an anti-war festival of life, held at Boise, April 24 - 25, 1971. LANE returned to Boise in mid-May, 1971, and in June, 1971, together with CAROLYN JANE MUGAR, established The Covered Wagon, a "GI Coffee House," at Mountain Home, Idaho. Mountain Home, Idaho, is the nearest community near Mountain Home Air Force Base. The Covered Wagon has become the center of VVAW activities in the area.

LANE and MUGAR at the same time established the "Helping Hand," an underground newspaper that first appeared in July, 1971, and has appeared monthly since that time.

Since arriving in the area, LANE and MUGAR have participated in various peace demonstrations at Mountain Home and Boise, Idaho, the most recent on July 13, 1972, at Mountain Home Air Force Base.

LANE is a close associate of MUGAR in all his endeavors and has also been associated with the actress, JANE FONDA, at various times. LANE was FONDA's attorney following her arrest, November 3, 1970, by the U. S. Customs at Cleveland, Ohio, and at various other times when FONDA faced charges in connection with her anti-war activities.

LANE, MUGAR, and six of their associates were arrested by the Ada County Sheriff's Office, Boise, Idaho, on August 21, 1971, for Disturbing the Peace and/or Interfering with a Police Officer. The group had engaged in a disturbance at the RODEWAY INN, Boise, protesting the appearance of General WILLIAM C. WESTMORELAND on the evening of August 20, 1971. All charges were dismissed on September 23, 1971.

LANE and MUGAR were arrested on April 21, 1971, by the Supreme Court Building Police, Washington, D. C., for refusal to leave the Supreme Court Building with other demonstrators. Motion of Acquittal was subsequently granted. U

LANE was arrested by the Baltimore County Police Department, Towson, Maryland, on July 4, 1963, in an integration demonstration. Disposition of this arrest is not known. U

LANE was arrested on June 3, 1961, at Jackson, Mississippi and convicted of Breach of the Peace. The conviction was subsequently reversed and LANE acquitted.

On October 19, 1971, LANE was served with a letter of expulsion by the Mountain Home Air Force Base Commander for LANE's continued trespassing on the Base and the Base Commander also banned distribution of the newspaper "Helping Hand" on the Base. LANE has subsequently been identified as trespassing on the Base on February 11, 1972, April 9, 1972, and April 10, 1972.

On April 19, 1972, LANE and MUGAR were elected as Idaho delegates to the Democratic National Convention as delegates committed to Senator McGOVERN and they did attend that convention.

CAROLYN JANE MUGAR:

MUGAR has been traveling around the United States with LANE since at least 1963. She also is an associate of the actress JANE FONDA. [REDACTED]

We do not support any presidential candidate. All our actions at both conventions will be non-violent. We are proposing the following scenario for the Republican Convention:

AUGUST 18-23:

Expose '72--a humanized peoples world's fair centering around domestic and foreign liberation movements. Exhibits, films, booths, theater, art, music, slide-shows. Confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on August 1, 1972, that the New York State Regional Office of the Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW), located at 25 West 26th Street, New York City, mailed flyers on July 29, 1972, to VVAW subcoordinators in New York State advising that the Regional Office was organizing a motor convoy to the Miami Republican Convention.

VVAW is an anti-war organization organized in 1967 with headquarters in New York City. Its first published objective is "to demand an immediate secession of fighting and the withdrawal of all American troops from Indo-China."

The convoy, which is being called "The Last Patrol", is scheduled to leave New York City at 11 a.m. on August 17, 1972, and arrive in Miami on August 20, 1972. It was set forth that the convoy would make stops each day at military installations and cities with the purpose of leafletting and talking to GI's and local people.

The purpose of "The Last Patrol" was set forth as follows:

On August 1, 1972, an individual purporting to be the Regional Coordinator for Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW), 918 West Addison, Chicago, telephone number 935-2129, made the following comments concerning the VVAW's proposed actions for the Republican National Convention being held in Miami Beach, Florida, over Radio Station WGLD-FM, Oak Park, Illinois.

The VVAW is a national organization composed of veterans opposed to the war in Vietnam who have sponsored demonstrations against the United States Government's participation in the Vietnam war.

The spokesman stated the VVAW planned to confront President Nixon with "realities." He did not further explain what realities he was referring to. The spokesman indicated that by doing this the VVAW would not be able to change republican party policies, but would be able to gain national attention via the media which would be covering the convention in large numbers.

The spokesman stated that caravans of VVAW members would be leaving Portland, San Francisco, Los Angeles and New York on an unspecified date, and as they crossed the country would be picking up additional members. The Portland and San Francisco groups would join up at Salt Lake City while the midwest area would meet at the Lake of the Woods area near Champaign, Illinois, on August 15-16, 1972, and then join the Salt Lake caravan which leaves August 17, 1972.

The convention center will be surrounded and non-violent take-overs of businesses in the area who are engaged in war work will take place. Examples given were IBM and Honeywell. The objective will be to stop the work going on at these companies. The VVAW will not allow violence to take place. Each group that takes over a company will make the decision about whether or not to disperse if and when they are told to do so.

The spokesman stated that the VVAW will police itself to prevent any trouble and would deal harshly with anyone causing trouble. He stated that the VVAW did not want a recurrence of the 1968 Democratic Convention.

He also stated that since the VVAW felt that all Americans are veterans of the Vietnam war, a person need not be an actual veteran of the conflict to qualify for membership, but that all leadership positions would continue to be filled only by authentic Vietnam veterans.

BOB FIELDS, PVVAW MEMBER, WAS MAIN SPEAKER AND STATED THAT WHEN CAMPAIGNING IN NINETEEN SIXTYEIGHT, PRESIDENT NIXON STATED AN ADMINISTRATION THAT HAS HAD FOUR YEARS TO BRING PEACE AND DIDN'T, SHOULD NOT BE GIVEN ANOTHER CHANCE. HOWEVER, NIXON, AS HE PROMISED, HAS NOT ENDED THE WAR. RATHER, HE HAS ESCALATED THE WAR WITH RESULT THAT TWENTY THOUSAND MORE G.I.'S HAVE BEEN KILLED, AS WELL AS THOUSANDS OF INDO-CHINA CIVILIANS. FIELDS STATED THAT SINCE A GERMAN GENERAL WAS PROSECUTED FOR WAR CRIMES RESULTING FROM HIS FLOODING OF HOLLAND DURING WORLD WAR II, THEN NIXON SHOULD BE CONSIDERED A CONVICTED WAR CRIMINAL BECAUSE HE HAS BOMBED DIKES IN NORTH VIETNAM RESULTING IN FLOODING AND CIVILIAN CASUALTIES.

SUBSEQUENTLY, TWO MALES AND ONE FEMALE, NOT IDENTIFIED, REPEATED THE ABOVE REMARKS MADE BY FIELDS.

ACTIVITIES TERMINATED ONE THIRTEEN P.M. WITHOUT INCIDENT AND MAXIMUM OF TWENTYTHREE PARTICIPANTS. HEAVY LUNCH HOUR PEDESTRIAN TRAFFIC DISPLAYED LITTLE INTEREST IN ACTIVITIES, WITH GREAT MAJORITY REFUSING EVEN TO ACCEPT LEAFLET. MAXIMUM OF TEN PEDESTRIANS AT ANY ONE TIME PAUSED LONG ENOUGH TO LISTEN TO SPEAKER OR READ PLACARDS.

On December 28, 1971, representatives of the Federal Bureau of Investigation observed approximately 25 individuals wearing military fatigues begin to gather at the Peace Monument on Pennsylvania Avenue at the west side of the U. S. Capitol Building, Washington, D. C. (WDC). At this time a large banner and two flags were displayed on which were printed the Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW) emblem.

At approximately 2:10 p.m. at the Lincoln Memorial, the demonstrators marched to the beat of a drum and carried a black coffin as well as the previously mentioned banner and flags.

At 2:45 p.m. this group passed in front of the White House and later proceeded to the Lincoln Monument where the black coffin was placed at the foot of the statue of Lincoln. Until 4 p.m. the demonstration continued without incident with the participants gathered around the coffin and on the Memorial steps. Later at approximately 4:10 p.m. a smoke bomb was thrown down the Memorial steps. At 4:30 p.m. the demonstrators chanted "peace now" and blocked the Memorial entrance by linking arms. At approximately 4:40 p.m. a scuffle ensued when the U. S. Park Police attempted to remove a demonstrator who had climbed upon the structure of the Memorial.

At approximately 4:55 p.m. the U. S. Park Police requested the demonstrators, numbering approximately 115, to leave the Memorial. This request was ignored and at 5:00 p.m. the demonstrators began willingly to submit to arrest by placing their hands behind their heads and by being led to a waiting Park Police van. By 6:00 p.m. the Memorial was cleared and approximately 90 individuals had been arrested

The VVAW is a national veterans organization with a national office located in New York City. Its first published objective is "to demand an immediate cessation of fighting and a withdrawal of all American troops from Indochina."

On March 27, 1972, a representative of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, reviewed the record of the Superior Court of the District of Columbia and determined that [REDACTED]

On May 21, 1972, 178 individuals were arrested by officers of the Metropolitan Police Department (MPD), WDC, at 3rd and Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., on charges of parading without a permit during a large anti-war demonstration. The demonstration, sponsored by the National Peace Action Coalition (NPAC) and the Peoples Coalition for Peace and Justice (PCPJ), was peaceful in nature until a portion of the group smashed windows at the U. S. Department of Justice, 9th and Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., WDC, and at the U. S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare (HEW), 4th and Independence Avenue, S.W., WDC, and engaged in civil disobedience at the base of the U. S. Capitol at 1st and Maryland Avenue, N.W., near the Peace Monument. That incident resulted in tear gas being used on the demonstrators who were engaged in throwing missiles at the police and approximately 21 police officers, including Chief of Police Jerry V. Wilson, being injured.

The National Peace Action Coalition was founded in 1970 by members of the Socialist Workers Party (SWP). Its basic objective is to unite masses of people including labor unions, GIs, and the black community in the struggle to end United States intervention in Southeast Asia through orderly and peaceful tactics. The SWP has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450. U

The People's Coalition for Peace and Justice (PCPJ) has described itself as being headquartered in 156 5th Avenue, New York, New York, and as consisting of over 100 organizations which are using massive civil disobedience to combat racism, poverty, repression, and war. U
