Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW) is an anti-war organization organized in 1967 and headquartered in New York City. Its published objective is to "demand an immediate cessation of fighting and the withdrawal of all American troops from Indochina". VVAW has participated in several demonstrations, including massive demonstration in Washington, D. C., April 19-23, 1971.

On August 7, 1972, a source in a position to logically obtain the reported information but with whom sufficient contact has not been had to definitely establish reliability, made available an envelope bearing a postmark of August 3, 1972, Alabama 354, with the return address 1317 14th Avenue, Tuscaloosa, Alabama 354012.

This envelope contained a three page printed News Letter Number 17, bearing the letterhead of the Alabama - Mississippi Region Vietnam Veterans Against the War, Inc., 1317 14th Avenue, Tuscaloosa, Alabama 35401. This news letter set forth that it was desired to mobilize as many vets as possible to attend the Republican Convention in Miami, and that convoys from Los Angeles, Seattle and Boston would converge on Atlanta, Georgia, August 18, 1972, and from there proceed to Miami Beach en masse.

This news letter is set forth as follows:

*****FEDERAL GRAND J. Y BEING USED TO HEUTRILIZE VVAN & FIVITIES IN MIAMI******

A federal grand jury convened in Tallahassee, Florida to question 24 members of WAW, according to the Justice Department, for weapons conspiracy and crossing-state lines with intent to cause a riot. The subpoenas were served by PRI agents during the weekend of July 6th just at the time when planned demonstrations at the Democratic National Convention in Miami were to get underway. It was a deliberate move by the Nixon Administration to disrupt peaceful demonstrations and, eventually, cause the neutralization of VVAV as an effective anti-war organization which could embarrass the Republican Party during its convention. Called for questioning were Poter Lahoney, a National Coordinator; three regional coordinators: John Kniffen, Texas, Scott Camil, Florida, and Jon Donner, Arkansas-Oklahoma; and 20 chapter coordinators and members from Florida, Louisiana, Alabama, Texas, and Arkansas. For the past three months, this 30,000 member veterans organization has been the target of concentrated attacks by infiltration and disruption by foderal agents. One confessed informer from Arkansas was uncovered by the vets in May of this year. In a confession made to the voterans under his own free will, the informer stated that the Government intends to keep VVAN coordinators form the scene of the conventions. Two other agents who were posing as antiwar vets were exposed last Saturday by VVAN Dado County Coordinator, Alton Foss. As soon as the Vots made it clear to the undercover agents that they know of their identity, the pair tried to recruit Foss into setting up some members of VVAW on weapons charges. Foss, instead, went to some lawyers and exposed the underhanded tectics to the press in Florida.



FAI agents in at least two cities in Mahama have questioned numbers of the Ala.

VV/N, Inc. In Auburn, Van Thomson, a member of the State Office, was questioned about borbings and other activities completely foreign to the non-violent tactics and peaceful philosophy deminstrated by all members of the Ala VV/N. The FMI and the Justice Department (the co-conspirators) are apparently attempting to discredit the VV/N and distroy the machinery of peaceful protest before it can be brought to bare at the Republican Convention. In Tuscaloosa, Bob Weston was subpoenced by the FBI to testify in Tallahassee and his report follows:

iost questions asked by the grand jury were totally alien to anything I was evere of. Our atterneys sought to Obtain a 20-day delay but we were told that serious crimes against the U. S. were being investigated and the dalay was not granted. We felt the action was a violation of our constitutional rights. We were given only three days prior notice and some of the guys had to drive more than 1,000 miles to get there. It was just harassment on the part of the Fed. government to keep us from attending the Democratic Convention.

The indictment cane only hours after the Democrats, on the last night of their convention, passed a resolution which condemned the Mixon administration for attempting to "intimidate and discredit" the Vietnam Veterans Against the War. The six indicted were accused of plotting to launch attacts on police stations, patrol cars and stores. Held in Tallahassee under \$25,000 bend were john Kniffin, Peter Maheney, and Scott Camil. Alten Fest was held in custody by US narshals in Dade County. Den Perdué and William Patterson were also indicted. An atterney for the voterans insedictely protested the arrests and said motions would be filed to quash the indictments and to lower the bonds. VV/N members outside the federal court said the indictments were an attempt by the Nixon administration to discredit the organization. "This is another Chicago and Harrisburg" said Dave Rosen, Col. Coordinator. "They're just trying to get us out of circulation." In Gaineville, members recalled the May Day demonstrations where Scott Camil had curbed some sporadic window smashing and street fighting by protesters. Thanks to concerned citizens 75,000 dellars was reised to free our brothers.

This whole rediculous affair errese out of a VVMN mooting in May in Gainesville where the Southern regions were planing peaceful actions at the Democratic Convention. Plans for the Ropublican convention were to be made on the national level-not at the meeting in Gainesville. Mahoney, a former Army lieutement and a Mational coordinator for the VVMN said he was grateful to those who had raised the bail money but we shouldn't have been there in the first place. He went on to say that plans for the Republican convention weren't even discussed at the meeting in Gainesville.



On 4/17/72, a coalition of approximately 500 individuals interested in ending the war in Vietnam, gathered at the Civic Center, San Francisco, to obtain support for an anti-war demonstration scheduled for 4/22/72 in cities throughout the United States. After 16 representatives of Vietnam Veterans against the War occupied the U.S. Air Force Recruiting Office at the Federal Office Building, 50 Fulton Street, San Francisco, additional demonstrators arrived at the scene where a crowd of approximately 750 demonstrators chanted anti-war slogans and blocked the entrances to the building. U.S. Attorney JAMES L. BROWNING, JR., personally directed a group of Deputy U.S. Marshals to effect the arrests of the 16 demonstrators within the U.S. Air Force Recruiting Office, charging them with disorderly conduct on General Services Administration property. Thirteen other demonstrators were subsequently arrested by the San Francisco Police Department (SFPD) outside of the Federal Office Building for interferring with the police.

During the demonstration, the captioned vehicle, which had been left parked and unoccupied in front of the Federal Office Building, was set afire after all of the windows had ... been broken and all four tires had been slashed. The entire interior of the vehicle was destroyed by flames prior to the arrival of Engine 17, Battalion 2 of the San Francisco Fire

Department, and the vehicle was declared a total loss after being extinguished. No arrests were made by the San Francisco. Police Department in connection with the destruction of the government vehicle during the demonstration.

Contacts with numerous individuals present at the demonstration have failed to produce any information which might lead to the development of any suspects responsible for the fire.

Contact has been made with Inspectors of the Intelligence Detail and General Work Detail, San Francisco Police Department; however, no positive information has been developed. The incident reports of the SFPD concerning the arrests of individuals interferring with the police during the demonstration have been reviewed with negative results.

An All Agents' Memorandum was prepared within the San Francisco Division on 4/26/72, and no positive information has been developed.

Inquiry has been made at the Bureau of Fire Investigation, San Francisco Fire Department in an attempt to obtain any information which might lead to any new developments in the case with negative results.

Dispositions of the arrests of the 16 individuals charged with trespassing within the U.S. Air Force Recruiting Office on 4/17/72 are being forwarded to the Bureau under separate communication, SF File entitled ET AL, DGP, OO: San Francisco.

In view of the above, and insofar as all logical investigation conducted to date has been negative, this matter is being closed.

who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised today that Tom Hall, Kansas City Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW) chapter head said at a VVAW meeting that the VVAW National Steering Committee meeting date has been changed from October 6, 7, 8 and 9, 1972, to September 29 to October 2, 1972, Palo Alto, California. The date was changed as it conflicted with the Gainesville trial to start on October 10, 1972.

The VVAW was founded in the spring of 1967 by six young Vietnam veterans in New York City. At the beginning of 1968, with 600 members, VVAW opened a national office, founded the first GI newspaper, "Vietnam GI," and sent close to 500 veterans into the McCarthy campaign to beat down the red baiters. After getting gassed at the Democratic convention at Chicago and caught in the general "down" of the peace movement, VVAW was nearly inactive until the moratoriums in the fall of 1969. Members of VVAW led; student strikes on major campuses across the country and battled Veterans Administration Hospital authorities over threats to throw amputee Vietnam veterans out for signing anti-war petitions. At present, membership of the VVAW, nationally, consists of 8,500 members.

Since late August, 1971, the CCSD has been planning a response to the Republican National Convention to be held in San Diego in August, 1972. This response is being called the Congress August Project (CAP), which will include provision of human care services and politically relevant programs.

The VVAW was founded in the Spring of 1967, by six young Vietnam veterans in New York City. At the beginning of 1968, with 600 members, VVAW opened a national office, founded the first GI newspaper, "Vietnam GI," and sent close to 500 veterans into the McCarthy Campaign to beat down the red After getting gassed at the Democratic Convention in Chicago, and caught in the general "down" of the peace movement, VVAW was nearly inactive until the moratoriums in the Fall of 1969. Members of the VVAW led student strikes on major campuses across the country and battled Veterans Administration Hospital authorities over threats to throw amputee Vietnam veterans out for signing anti-war petitions. At present, membership of the VVAW nationally, consists of 8,500 members.

Review of the information discloses if such a source exists as alleged, "a clerk who sees the VVAW file in the Bureau as it is shuffled back and forth between their filing system and those Bureau Agents drawing the file," it would of necessity be an employee within Files and Communications Division or within the mail room of the Domestic Intelligence Division. It is recognized, of course, that any clerk at FBIHQ, with access to the file number and who is in position to obtain files in the regular routine course of his or her official duties, can request the VVAW file. Further, if the leak were from within the Unit handling VVAW, more precise and accurate information would be available from ticklers, work papers and general knowledge within the Unit. Access to the file would be unnecessary in the latter instance.

A lengthy discussion was held between Assistant Director John W. Marshall, Files and Communications Division, and 1 Domestic Intelligence Division. concerning this matter. Mr. Marshall pointed out there are 30 volumes of the VVAW file and any one of the 381 employees of that Division in the Identification Building could conceivably have access to the VVAW file. Further, Mr. Marshall stated through serializing and the many other procedures of processing mail and handling file requests there would be no practical way to establish which clerical personnel had legitimate access to a given file in the past REC- 118 / 00- 42

It was mutually agreed, for security reasons in view of the alleged leak, to move the 30 volumes of the VVAW file to the Unit in Domestic Intelligence Division to be maintained in locked, secure cabinets. The reason given within Files and Communications Division will be that the forthcoming trial at Tallahassee warrants maintaining the file in Revolutionary Activities Section for ready access to meet trial needs and Departmental requests on an emergency and expedite basis. A short routine memorandum to this effect is being forwarded to Files and Communications Division. A particular benefit of this arrangement is any request for the file will now be cleared through the case Agent who has physical custody of it and a firm basis established for need before it is released to an Agent.

As to the investigation to identify the alleged leak, the following background is pertinent:

During past conferences of VVAW, several claims have been made that VVAW has informants or sources in various intelligence and police agencies. For example, during a VVAW National Steering Committee meeting, Houston, 4/7-11/72, a VVAW leader from Kansas City claimed that his chapter had a contact in military intelligence who had proof of Government surveillance of VVAW and stated that this information would be publicized in the near future. At the same meeting, VVAW leader of the St. Louis chapter claimed that he had sources at the Federal Records Center who could photostat any information in military records upon request of any VVAW member. All information concerning the claims of VVAW penetration of other agencies was furnished immediately to the agency involved, including Army intelligence, or in other cases local police departments. To date, there has been no corroboration from these agencies, even after intensive investigation, that VVAW infiltrators are inside the organizations.

Per conversation today, in regard to Mr. Kinley's observations, following information is set forth: While we can identify the employee who performs any one of the many steps involved in processing a piece of mail for file, we do not, for practical purposes, maintain a record of the identity of all employees who have legitimately handled or reviewed the file after mail has been filed. The enormity of the volume of work connected with legitimate file activities makes the maintenance of such a record administratively impractical. In connection with the Bureau's name check program, during the last fiscal year, we handled approximately 2, 145, 000 name checks and it is estimated that we reviewed approximately 708,000 files on these name checks alone. Additionally, approximately 1, 014, 000 files are charged out and returned to the file cabinet for official purposes annually based on current statistical data. This tremendous volume of activity makes it highly impractical to maintain administrative records showing the identity of employees who have reviewed or handled files.

Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) was founded during June, 1962, at Port Huron, Michigan, and in the 1960s functioned as the leading New Left campus-based student organization in the United States. From an initial posture of "participatory democracy," SDS moved to a radicalrevolutionary position, with debate centering on how best to create a revolutionary youth Internal factionalism produced a split movement. during the SDS National Convention in June, 1969, which resulted in the following three factions: Weatherman; Worker Student Alliance (WSA); and Revolutionary Youth Movement (RYM). The Weatherman and RYM are no longer affiliated with SDS. The WSA continues to use the name SDS and maintains. its national headquarters in Chicago, Illinois.

Weatherman, formerly a faction of Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), controlled the SDS National Office from June, 1969, until its closing in February, 1970. Weatherman then entered an underground status and adopted a tactic of "strategic sabotage," with police and military installations designated as primary targets.

Worker Student Alliance (WSA), a faction of Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), was expelled from SDS in June, 1969, by the then dominant Weatherman faction, but continued to use the name SDS and opened an office in Cambridge, Massachusetts. WSA allgned ideologically with the Progressive Labor Party (PLP) and in February, 1971 moved to Chicago, Illinois, where it opened the SDS National Office at 1225 South Wabash Street.

A characterization of the Revolutionary Youth Movement (RYM) is contained in the appendix section attached hereto.

The Progressive Labor Party (PLP) was founded in 1962 by individuals expelled from the Communist Party, USA, for following the Chinese communist line. Its objective is the establishment of a militant working-class movement based on Marxism-Leninism and Mao Tse-Tung thought.

# REVOLUTIONARY YOUTH MOVEMENT

A source advised that the Revolutionary Youth Movement II (RYMII) faction of Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) held a national conference at Atlanta, Georgia, from November 26 to 30, 1969. At this conference it was decided to form a new organization to be known as Revolutionary Youth Movement (RYM), characterized as a mass anti-imperialist youth organization, said organization being proposed as separate and distinct in form and content from SDS. The "Principles of Unity" adopted by the conference included a struggle against white supremacy and male supremacy; fights against imperialiam, anti-communism, fascism and oppression of youth; and support of the right of of all "oppressed nations", also support of the right of all "oppressed and exploited" peoples "to armed self-defense. It was agreed that RYM would not be a Marxist-Leninist organization; however, source said this was decided in order to indicate an organization broad enough in form to be acceptable to everyone. A temporary National Steering Committee (NSC) made up of eight females and two males was elected to govern RYM until national officers could be elected during the Spring of 1970.

RYM publications have listed the RYM National Office (NO) at Post Office Box 5421 and Post Office Box 77012 C. both Atlanta, Georgia, and a second source has advised that the NO has no office space but would probably be considered as located at Apartment 27, 1067 Alta Avenue, Northeast, Atlanta.

Second source advised that women dominated the founding conference and have continued to dominate NSC meetings to the point that "women's liberation" has apparently become the RYM's principal issue - also that RYM's poor financial condition has resulted in its failure to publish a paper. During early 1970, RYM has decided to cater to the working class rather than youth, since the potential for social revolution lies in workers.

A third source has stated that it was decided at the March, 1970, NSC meeting that RYM women had decided the organization will be molded into a "working class, Marxist-Leninist, revolutionary, anti-imperialist, pro-black nationalist, people's women's liberation organization."



Those chapters were located at Texas Christian University (TCU), Fort Worth, Texas; University of Texas at Arlington (UTA), Arlington, Texas; and Eastfield Junior College (EJC), Dallas, Texas. These chapters activities included a 32 mile march-type demonstration from Fort Worth to Dallas, Texas, September 4-6, 1971; a guerrilla theatre (pantomine) of a search and destroy attack on suspected Viet Cong at TCU in October, 1971; and a visit to the Veterans Administration Hospital, Dallas, by VVAW members from EJC in the fall of 1971.

VVAW is an anti-war organization organized in 1967, with headquarters in New York City. Its first published objective is "to demand an immediate secession of fighting and the withdrawal of all American troops from Indo-China."

#### AT EASTFIELD JUNIOR COLLEGE



The VVAW is independent of any other organization and is not influenced by any one individual or group. The organization feels that the war in Vietnam is wrong and are attempting to influence people in non-violent ways which primarily consist of guerrilla theatre stints and some movies.

On April 15, 1972, advised that a non-violent demonstration was held at the John F. Kennedy Memorial Plaza, Dallas, Texas. The demonstration was sponsored by the Dallas - Fort Worth Peace Action Coalition; however, a few members from the Arlington UTA VVAW chapter participated. Approximately twenty people were involved and the demonstration quietly ended at 3:55 PM, April 15, 1972.

The Dallas - Fort Worth Peace Coalition is an association of peace groups in the Dallas - Fort Worth, Texas area. It is composed largely of members from the Dallas Peace Coalition (DPC) and led by Johnny St. Angelle.

The DPC was originally organized during 1966 at Dallas, Texas. The DPC, during 1967 and part of 1968, held weekly silent peace vigils at Dealey Plaza, Dallas, Texas, in protest to the Vietnam War.



The CALC is described as a group of clergy and laymen who have in the past concerned themselves with the Vietnam War. The CALC now concerns itself with matters other than the Vietnam War, including economics, prison reform, social and religious reforms.

On April 21, 1972, advised that approximately twenty-five members and supporters of the Arlington VVAW held a rally at the Student Union Building, UTA, in protest of the continued bombing of North Vietnam. President Nixon was hanged in effigy and a short non-violent speech was given. There were no threats or damage to university property.

On May 4, 1972, advised the UTA VVAW staged a protest march and demonstration against the continuation of the Vietnam War. The group, numbering about fifty, marched peacefully from Ferris Plaza to Dallas City Hall, Dallas, Texas. After a short prayer, the group then marched against traffic down Commerce Street to the front of the Federal Building. A short speech in protest of the Vietnam War was given by who stated, "I am a veteran who was proud to go over there and fight. I know what it is like now and I don't like it. I, for one, will not subject myself to fighting in the war anymore." The demonstration ended without any incidents, property damage, or violence.

On May 9, 1972, advised that the VVAW from UTA held a rally in protest to the escalation of the Vietnam War on the campus of Southern Methodist University (SMU), Dallas, Texas. Approximately forty individuals participated in the rally-demonstration which was held peacefully with no violence or arrests. Approximately fifty additional SMU students were attracted to the rally. After demonstrating at the Student Union Building, the group went to Perkins Hall Administration Building. At that time, twenty-two SMU students entered and met with SMU officials, demanding that SMU give a resolution condemning the Vietnam War. They stated that if school officials did not adhere to their demand, they would remain quietly in the building indefinitely until it was met.

advised that at approximately 3:30 AM, May 10, 1972, the security force of SMU physically cleared the twenty students from the hallway of Perkins Hall. The students had to be dragged out bodily; however, they offered no resistance.

On May 26, 1972, advised that the VVAW chapter at UTA was falling apart and was no longer a functional organization. Source blamed this on poor leadership and general apathy. Source further advised the same was happening on the state level of the VVAW organization.

On June 21, 1972, advised there had been no VVAW activity in Arlington or UTA during the summer.

On July 3, 1972,

Police Department, Arlington, Texas, advised that a VVAW steering committee meeting was held July 1 and 2, 1972, at the UTA Student Union Building and the apartment of stated he believed five people were in attendance at the meeting at the Student Union Building and that most of them were from Austin, Texas. Later, this group adjourned to apartment where eventually a total of twelve people participated in the meeting.

On July 5, 1972, a pretext telephone call made by a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation to residence determined the above meeting consisted of a VVAW steering committee for the Southwest Region composed of individuals from Austin, Houston, San Antonio, Dallas and Arlington, Texas. It was further revealed that there was a definite lack of interest in the VVAW as there had been only one meeting held this summer and no one showed up. The prime reason for this meeting was an attempt to determine why there was a lack of interest and ways of stimulating old members to attend meetings.

On July 26, 1972, was interviewed by Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation at which time he stated that he is of the VVAW in Arlington, Texas, and that there were

related the VVAW had not held any meetings in three months and did not plan to do so in the near future.

went on to state that a steering committee meeting was held during the first part of July in which it was primarily attended by members off the VVAW group from Austin which was headed by John Kniffin.

Kniffin and the VVAW group from Austin to be too radical and, therefore, he, as well as other formalbers of the Arlington VVAW, do not agree with Kniffin and his group.

Stated that he personally is too busy at the present time earning as IVIng to be active in the VVAW any longer; however, he still opposes war in any form, especially the Vietnam War.


