



The VVAW was founded in the spring of 1967 by six young Vietnam veterans in New York City. At the beginning of 1968, with 600 members, VVAW opened a national office, founded the first GI newspaper, "Vietnam GI", and sent close to 500 veterans into the McCarthy campaign to beat down the red baiters. After getting gassed at the Democratic convention at Chicago and caught in the general "down" of the peace movement, VVAW was nearly inactive until the moratoriums in the fall of 1969. Members of VVAW led student strikes on major campuses across the country and battled Veterans Administration Hospital authorities over threats to throw amputee Vietnam veterans out for signing anti-war petitions. present, membership of the VVAW, nationally, consists of 8,500 members.

The Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW) is a national organization composed primarily of veterans of the war in Vietnam. Its national office is located at 25 West 26th Street, New York City, New York. The VVAW has organized and participated in demonstrations against the war in Vietnam during 1970-1972.

Staiger offers military counseling at these locations and is the only definite member, according to source. He is also the only officer in the Dayton Chapter of the VVAW. Staiger claims to have approximately 175 persons on the mailing list of the VVAW in Ohio and Indiana

The source has further pointed out that numerous attempts to contact or to get a response from Staiger and/or the office of the VVAW, had been expended before a response was received. The source expressed the opinion that the VVAW at Dayton, Ohio, was not a functioning organization and exists only in the person of Gary Staiger. The VVAW in Dayton is synonymous with Staiger and the only activities which take place are those in which Staiger desires to participate and/or organize.

The source noted that for much of the summer of 1972 there was no activity in the Dayton, Ohio area.


The source has furnished information that the VVAW had been a sponsor of anti-war demonstrations at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base on Saturdays since the first part of January, 1972. Staiger has also been identified on several occasions in newspapers in Dayton, Ohio, as a leader and participant in anti-war demonstrations in the Dayton area during 1972. The source has noted that Staiger has emphasized that the demonstrations should be maintained on a peaceful basis.

The July 5, 1972, issue of the "Journal Herald," a Dayton, Ohio daily morning newspaper of general circulation, contained an article, captioned, "Hanoi Determined Anti-Vet Says." This article identified Staiger as the Ohio-Indiana Regional Coordinator of the VVAW, who was part of a VVAW delegation which recently travelled to Paris, France from the United States to talk with North Vietnamese and the National Liberation Front near Paris regarding peace possibilities. He was quoted as being impressed with their determination. He was also quoted as saying, "We're going to intensify very much. I'm convinced now more than ever before of the wrongness of our Government's policy. We will intensify as a result of the knowledge that we have to stop it, and Nixon isn't listening."

The August 18, 1972, issue of the Dayton Daily News, a Dayton, Ohio daily afternoon newspaper of general

circulation, contained an article captioned, "Viet Vets 'Last Patrol' Bound For Convention." This article identified Staiger as the Regional Coordinator for the VVAW and quoted him regarding the "last patrol," a group sponsored by the VVAW going to Miami Beach, Florida, to demonstrate at the National Convention of the Republican Party. This article indicated they were leaving on the night of August 17, 1972, and Staiger indicated he hoped there would be a least 100 car loads from the Midwest to go in this "patrol."



VIETNAM VETERAIS: AGAINST THE MAKE

On September 10, 1967, the Daily Worker, then the name of the official newspaper of the Communist Party, U.S.A. (Crush), provided the first published information on a new antivar organization, the Victnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW), whose location was given as 17 East 17th Street, New York City.

VVAN was formed earlier in 1967: at an April 15 peace parade in New York City, a small group marching with Veterans for Peace (VFP) carried a banner on which was painted "Vietnam Veterans Against the War."

Six weeks later tellowing a Memorial Day Peace Action in Washington, D.C., sponsored by VFP [7127 South Chicago Avenue, Chicago] and an Ad Hoc Veteranc Committee [5 Beekman Street, Room 1033, New York City], a meeting was held at Uashington's Willard Hotel at which the concept of a VVAW organization began to take shape.

Publicity for the Memorial Day action and the meeting was obtained by means of a full-page advertisement in the New York Times of 5/22/67 which was credited to the Ad Noc Voterans Committee for Memorial Day Peace Action, with an Arthur Knight named as secretary.

On 8/30/65, Arthur Knight was identified as a member of CPUSA and as press director of the Mahhattan County Censuittee of the Communist Party in the '50's in sworn testimony by Ethel Howton, a former member of CPUSA who rejoined the Party to act as a source for the FET. In 1966, Knight, who was an employee of the Communist bookstore, the Jafferson Bookstore, on East 16th Street, N.Y.C., was observed at the CPUSA National Convention.

NOTE: Joseph Forer of the Washington, D.C. law firm of Forer and Rein, is a member of the National Lawyers Guild (NLG) and is a frequent defender of CPUSA members and causes. His law partner, David Rein, was identified as a member of CPUSA in December, 1955, by Herbert Fuchs in sworn Congressional testimony. In 1966-67, David Rein was "president pro tem" of the VFP Washington, D.C. organization.

At the Koten hearing before the Senate Sub-Committee, it was established that he had lived and traveled extensively in the Soviet Union from 1932 to 1938; and that he had attended, as both a student and teacher, the Moscow State Pedagogical Linguistic Institute.

It was also established at this hearing that on his return to the U.S., Koten had become the sole employee of the American-Russian Institute and subsequently of its successor, the Library of Intercultural Studies. In these posts he described himself as a "researcher" and as the "research director."

Koten refused to answer questions regarding membership in CPUSA, Party membership in Russia, or Party membership during the three years that he served with the U.S. Army in World War II.

During the Senate hearing, a classified FBI report was entered into the record. It read:

"Bernard Koten, research director of American-Russian Institute, is friend and contact of William Hermann Eckart Johnson and his wife, Annette E. Johnson, who are employed at present on the secret Russian desk of the War Department, Washington, D.C. and who are suspected of giving out info. to the NKVD:"

Also during the hearing, the Cormittee Counsel said that the American-Russian Institute was a recruiting agency for Soviet intelligence. Koten was the Institute's sole employee.

NOTE: That a classified FBI report on Koten was I lished was in itself ironical. The report was one stolen by Judith Coolon, a Justice Department clerk, which was seized at the time of her arrest while she was passing it with other papers to a Soviet intelligence agent, Valentin Cubitchev, who was tried with her.

The report was an exhibit in the 1950 trial of Judith Coplon, who was convicted of passing classified U.S. documents to the Russians. On appeal the conviction was overturned on a technicality.

[Hiss Copion's defense team included Leonard Boudin and Albert H. Socolov, whom she married. Socolov has a law office at 299 Broadway, N.Y.C., and lives in Brooklyn with his wife].

In 1963, Koten was back in the Soviet Union as a visitor, leading a group of tourists organized by the Afton Agency. In Kiev he suddenly dropped out of sight to the consternation of the now leaderless tourists. However he reappeared with Intourist, the Russian tourist organization, offering the explanation that he had been arrested for a homosexual offense involving a Soviet citizen.

In 1967, when he becare involved with the VPP organization, Kotan was living at 1370 St. Nicholas Avenue, #22R, New York, N.Y., and was working in the Russian Collection of the New York University General Library.

The Wolins mentioned in the Lagort letter is yet another member of CPUSA. LeRoi Wolins of Chicago. Illinois, was identified by the late J. Edgar Hoover as a CPUSA member in testimony on the FBI appropriation for 1968. In 1970, HISC was told that Wolins was the organizer, financial angel and mastermind of a national organization, Vetezans for Peace in Vietnam (VFP), based in Chicago.

NOTE: Wolins' record of involvement with CPUSA dates back to the '40's. He had been secretary of the Chicago chapter of the National Council of American-Soviet Priendship, an organization dating back to 1943 which was found to be a "Communist front" within the meaning of the Internal Security Act of 1950.

On July 5, 1967, Ron Holin, New York organizer for VFF, sent a letter reporting on his activities to LeRoi Wollins in which he wrote:

"Probably most significant is the fact that our action the New York Times advertisement and its subsequent Pemorial Day demonstration) provided the first national platform for Vistnem veterans and gave impetus to the organization of at least two Vietnam vet's groups, Vietnam Veterans Against the War in New York-and United Vets for Peace and Freedom in Phila

NOTE: Ron Wolin is a self-proclaimed believer in the communist theories of Leon Trotsky and is an identified member of the Socialist Workers Party (SWP) (HISC Annual Report, 1971). He has associated himself with many of the SWP's GI organizing projects. Radical sources indicate that in 1967 Wolin kept his political views quiet to enable a working relationship to develop with members of CPUSA.

On June 30, 1967, a check for \$488.52 was sent to Corliss Lamont by the VFP organization with a covering letter which said:

"The contributions on the ad came to something under 50% of its cost. Pursuant to our commitment, we're accordingly returning to you herewith our check for \$488.52. Thanks again for your help in making the ad possible. Its effectiveness in turn helped ensure the success of the Memorial Day action in Washington."

In its formative menths, VVAN was closely associated, if not practically identical, with Veterans for Peace in Vietnam (VFP) which had been formed a year earlier [January 1966] in Chicago by LeRoi Wolins. VFP operated, and still does, from #31 South Dearborn Street, Chicago, and from P.O. Box 4508, Chicago, Illinois 60680 (312/922-0065).

According to the National Guardian of 3/26/66, one purpose of the VFP was "to neutralize veterans organizations such as the Marine Corps League; Veterans of Foreign Wars, and other veterans and right-wing groups."

During 1967, VFP participated in the major entiwar action at the Pentagon and set up some thirty chapters in various parts of the country, often with the assistance of identified members of CPUSA, [For example, David Rein in Washington, D.C.; Louis Cortz and Leo Jackson in Pittsburgh, Ac. Pennsylvania; and Arthur Knicht, New York City].

VFP's members took an active role with the most militant antiwar groups such as the Chicago Peace Council, the New York Fifth Avenue Peace Parade Committee, and later, the New Mobilization Committee to End the War in Vietnam.

NOTE: While VFP was expanding and the involvement of CPUSA members a matter of public record, Senator George McGovern wrote the organization an "open letter" which he concluded in the following words: "I wish you well in your efforts to bring about an honorable and early end to the war."

Senator AcGovern's support for antiwar veterans groups continued over the years. In May 1971, he entered into the Congressional Record [E4465 - 5/17/71] the content of an "ad hoc" hearing that he conducted on April 23 which provided a number of VVAW members with the opportunity to make charges which the Senator characterized as "tragedies" and "atrocities," "exactly what the Nazi forces did in occupied territory in Europe during World War II."

Introducing the material, Senator McGovern said, "The testimony ... demonstrates that the Victnam Veterans Against the War probably represent the majority view of those who have served in combat."

And it is interesting to note that at the hearing conducted by Senator McGovern, the first "witness" was Scott Cemil who related how his unit tortured and killed prisonars, raped women, and mutilated corpses.

Camil is now under indictment as a leader of a conspiracy to disrupt the Republican Convention in Miami Beach by organizing "fire teams" to attack with automatic weapons, fire and incendiary devices police stations, police cars, and ctores in Miami Beach on various dates between August 21 and 24, 1972.

In addition to these federal charges brought in Tallahassee, Florida, Camil faces state narcotics charges as well as kidnapping charges.

<u> PMBER OF SUBJECT ORGANIZATION</u>

Among the links between the Communists of the VFP organization and the VVAW of 1967 and the present time is VVAW chairman, Jack number in September 1967, Crumb was listed as "Viet Vets editor" of Veterans Stars and Stripes for Peace, the VFP publication. In the 8/21/67 issue of The Militant, the official newspaper of the SMP, he was identified as VVAW chairman. Three years later (11/24/70), the CPDSN schally World reported Crumb as VVAW president, a role that he epparently continues to play. :

An SP 4 in the U.S. Army, Crueb claims to have been in Vietnam with the 18th Aviation Company from December 1961 to October 1963. In July 1964, he was appointed to the U.S. Hilitary Academy at West Point, and resigned in November of that same year.

Crumb, whose family comes from Interlaken, New York, was a participant in the VVAW Winter Soldier project; using the name Jan Barry, he was an editor and contributor to Winning Hearts and Winds, a paperback book of "war poems by Vietnam Leterans" which is published by 1st Casualty Press, 208 Dean Street, Brooklyn, N.Y. 11217 [Crumb's residence]. [In listing himself as a contributor to Winning Hearts and Minds, Crumb marked himself as "Jan Barry" of Interlaken, N.Y.

MOTE: Others involved with Jan Crumb in the earliest days of VVAW were Francis R. XRocks, secretary/treusurer; Mark VOonnelly and Daviden roun-

During the years 1967 through 1970, little was heard of VVAM. But over the Labor Day weekend of 1970, the group sconsored "Operation RAW Rapid American Withdrawal" with the purpose of protesting the war in Southeast Asia, demanding an inclease in Veterans Administration funds, and calling for a war crimes investigation.

Operation_RAW [I.D., 9/11/70, refers] involved an 80-mile trek from Morristown, H.J. to Valley Forge, Penna. by about 84 veterans. During the warch, VVNW performed a number of guerrilla theater actions. On September 7, 1970; at Valley Forge's Grand Parade Ground, a rally of about 1,000 received speeches from Representative Allard K. Lowenstein Jane Conda, Hark Name Donald Sutherland, Rev. James Deval and WAW executive secretary Alvinthard.

TARES OF CURINGE ORGANIZATION According to the New York Times [9/5/70], Hubbard was "a 32-year old former Air Force pilot who wore three rows of military decorations on his sweat-darkened fatigues.

NOTE: William Overend; a CBS newsman, published the Hubbard saga in the conservative National Review [the story was printed in the Congressional Record [87929 - 6/2/71].

It concluded with a statement by Overend:

"As a liberal, it had occurred to me that raising questions about Al Hubbard might hurt the antiwar movement, but as a journalist it didn't seem that should be a factor. I was wrong. No one would touch the story. Not David Sanford of the New Republic; not any other editor of any liberal publication I contacted."

But despite this story, Hubbard has continued to be accepted by yvan and the antiwar movement as a leader.

In January, 1971, VVAW was ready to move fully into a leadership role in the antiwar movement, choosing as its vehicle the implementation of the demand made during Operation RAW for a war crimes investigation.

The Winter Soldier Investigation, organized from 967 Emerson Street, Detroit, was convened in a Howard Johnson motel in midtown Detroit, January 31 - February 2. Some 100 Vietnam veterans claimed to have seen and/or taken part in war crimes and atrocities.

The verbatim transcript ran to almost 1,000 pages; a video-taping was made of the "investigation;" and in 1972 Beacon Press, under the auspices of the Unitarian Universalist Association, published an edited transcript as a paperback book. [A list of participants in Winter Soldier is available].

On April 6 and 7, 1971, Senator Mark Hatfield had the entire Winter Soldier transcript read into the Congressional Record.

NOTE: The term Winter Soldier was used by VVAW to indicate its belief that they are "true patriots," and they quote Tom Paine, "The summer soldier and the sunshine patriot will in this crisis shrink from the service of his country; but he that stands it now; deserves the love and thanks of man and woman."

NOTE: From May 1939 until the present, the USSF has been deeply involved in supporting radical antiwar causes and especially the GI coffeehouse movement and GI underground newspapers. During the period May 1969 to November 1970, the USSF spent over \$125,667 on these projects, and had an income of \$166,714.

Major contributors to the USSF tincluded the Fund for Tomorrow, Inc. Peter and Corangeiss J, the Stern Family Fund, Max Relevsky, Elizabeth and Pau Williams.

A detailed account of the USSF will be found in October 1971 HISC hearings, Investigation of Attempts to Subveit the U.S. Arned Services.

During the weeks following Winter Soldier, VVNW staged similar histrionics in New Jersey, Philadelphia, Connecticut, St. Louis, Atlanta, Minnesota, Boston and Florida; and through coverage by the National Educational Television (NET) on 4/19/71 received nation-wide publicity.

Using the publicity generated by Winter Soldier, VVAW organized Dewey Canyon III, "a limited incursion of Washington, D.C.," April 19-24. 1971. The purpose of Dewey Canyon III was to "call upon the Congress and Supreme Court to exercise their defined Constitutional responsibilities to override Nixon's blood lust, and act to stop all 'business as usual, until the government recognizes and responds positively to cur demands."

Devey Canyon III was an unconventional prelude to the inevitable annual spring antiwar protest which gained massive media coverage. An estimated one thousand VVAW members and supporters gathered in Washington, set up an illegal encampment on the Mall, marched, demonstrated, performed guerrilla theater, met with Senators and Congressmen, threw away their medals in "a final act of contempt for the way the executive branch is forcing us to wage war," and won an accolade from Senator George McGovern who described the anti-American propaganda circus as "the most effective protest to date."

NOTE: The Mall encampment was the subject of an injunction granted by the U.S. Supreme Court, sought by the Justice Department and contested on behalf of VVAW by former U.S. Attorney General Ransey Clark.

Despite the fact that the injunction was granted by the Chief Justice and confirmed by the full court, your ignored it. No attempt to enforce it was made by the Justice Deaprtment, and the injunction was dissolved at the Government's own request.

Dawcy Canyon III was an expensive project for WVAM; tents were rented, rations supplied, and transportation provided. Logistical support was granted by the Nedical Committee for Human Rights (NCHR), People's Coalition for Peace and Justice (PCPJ), and the Rennie Davis Mayday apparat.

Larry canada a wealthy friend of Davis from Indiana, provided much of the food. Financial supporters of Dewey Canyon III (at \$5,000 each) included Edger Branfmen president of Seagram's Distillers: Philip J. evin , president of Hadison Square Garden; and a New York City banker, Abach an Vicinberg

In addition to seeing the Supreme Court defied on its very steps, Dewey Canyon III saw the emergence of a VVAW national coordinator, John F. Kerry, as a spokesman. Kerry became VVAW's star speaker, but by the end of summer he had acquired sufficient media coverage and prominence to return to conventional politics. He is now campaigning in Boston for House of Fepresentatives.

Since 1971, VVAW has taken a leadership role in the Communist dominated segments of the U.S. antiwar movement. According to an article in the Guardian, 5/24/72, by Abe Welsburd,

" VVAV ... is a dedicated anti-imperialist, anti-racist organization.... It is a permanent veterans organization which has as one of its stated objectives to charge 'the domestic's social, pulitical and economic institutions that have caused and permitted the continuance of the war. Among its other stated objectives are: to struggle against racism; to and U.S. illegal operations in Latin America, Africa, China, Europe, Thailand, as well as Indochina, to affirm the principles of Nuremberg relative to American war crimes in Indochina; to achieve complete freedom for all deserters, antiwar dissenters, and political prisoners; and for jobs, proper education and health care for veterans."

The article concludes:

"VVAN with its positive program for jobs and against racism, and its oblicty to relate to the veteran, is one of the most important anti-imperialist organizations on the V.S. scene. It has natural allies in the working class and the oppressed natione alitics in the W.s. Effecting greater unit) among these forces, is a blow against U.S. imperialism.

NOTE: Abe Weishird the writer of the culogy, is a long-time supporter of CPUSA causes and has served on the administrative committee of New York's Fifth Avenus Peace Parade Compliance of Trade Unionists for Peace descellusion by the that Communist Party.!

During the past fifteen wonths, VVNV has sought publicity by demonstrations in a number of U.S. citics. In the last week of December, 1971, WAW "occupied" the Statue of Liberty in New York, the Betsy Ross House in Philadelphia, the Lincoln Memorial in Washington, a military hospital in California, and the South Vietnamese consulate in San Francisco in actions coordinated from New York ty Al Hubbard which were designed to "put the issue of the war back on the front page."

In the spring of 1972, antiwar actions by VVAW took a leadership role in attempting to block access to federal buildings and military installations; and VVAW was well represented in the abortive attempt to blockade the Pentagon on May 22.

Both at home and in foreign countries, VVAW members work to bring discredit on the U.S. In July 1972, VVAM members and leaders including Jean-Pierre Wendell, Leland Mubinsky, Fred Warner, Alan Morris and Albert dorgen visited Cuba. While in Havana, according to a Radio Havana Spanish language proadcast on July 5, they donated blood to the North Vietnamese. MEMBER OF SUBJECT ORGANIZATION

After a visit to Hanoi, VVAN staffer Joe Wree told a reporter for CPUSA's Daily World that his North Vietnamese Nosts were distributing leaflets to GI's telling them that "if they Jo not attack the villages U and refuse to go on combat operations, their base camps will not be harmed. In February 1972, the Daily World reported a speech by Al Hubbard before a rally at the World Assembly for Peace in Paris which set a new trenl in antiwar activity in the U.S. Hubbard related how the U.S. government "is escalating the aggression in Indochina instead of winding it down" to the thousand-odd assembly delegates: and then proceeded to give details of classified U.S. ship and aircraft movements.

Hubbard's example of giving classified military information to the Democratic Republic of Vietnam [North Vietnam] was quickly followed by VVAN generally. VVAN took credit [in the Daily World, of course] for releasing "a 24-page document with information revealing air force, navy, and troop menouvers. The material had been gathered from active-duty GI's throughout the country and in Vietnam." [It was released via the ad Hoc Military Build-up Committee, a U.S. group in direct contact with the DRV. The same Taily World article the Sustained this information also contained a complaint from Datroit VVAW leader Bil Migrshall that as far as the FBI is concerned, "we're spies, infiltrators and saboteurs." BER OF SUBJECT ORGANIZATION

VVAW's national headquarters is at 25 West 26th Street, New York, N.Y. 10010 (212/725-5680). It publishes its own newspaper at irregular intervals which is called "The lst Casualty."

VVAW claims a national membership of 25,000 including 2,500 activeduty GI's in Vietnam and an active membership of 8,000. However investigative sources credit VVAW with less than 1,000 active members. It is noted that in August 1972, VVAW could not muster more than 300 members nationally for its project Operation Lost Patrol which has been hearalded by VVAW publicists as "a massive caravan of 25,000 cars and 100,000 persons traveling to Miami to protest the Republican Convention."

Internal VVAN documents show that the organization works closely with such organizations as La Raza Unida, the Black Panther Party, National Welfare Rights Organization, United Farmworkers Organizing Committee, Angela Davis Defense Committee, Billy Dean Smith Defense Committee, National Lawyers Guild, Miami Convention Coalition and the People's Coalition for Peace and Justice - all organizations in which the Communist Farty, U.S.A. takes a sympathetic interest and in several instances dominates.

In April 1972, VVAW's National Steering Committee met for its quarterly convention in Houston, Texas. Stated an internal document, it decided "to secure and build our community base through continuing agitation," and also to decentralize, placing control of the organization with six national coordinators; Jack Bronaugh, E.B. Del Rosario, Peter haboney, Jack McClostkey, Nichael McClain and Berry Mono.

According to a VVAW report, Al Hubbard and Joe Urgo did not stand for re-election, saying that they wanted a rest from their responsibilities.

The six national coordinators are assisted by 26 regional coordinators who in turn have a number of state and local coordinators to help them.
[Internal VVAW documents listing these coordinators are available].

"Symplifying your life; trying new ways of living which are counter to the present system. It is an attempt on experiment to live under \$1700 a year. It means setting up alternatives, sharing food, jobs, owning little or no property ... yoing without ... Learning to share, to love and to create and to be fiee in attempt to alter a society based on fear, hate, and violence."

Whatever their motivation, VVAW members have demonstrated over the past five years their ability to follow the dictates of international communism, and to march in lock step with our enemies in Victness and the communist world.

After their attempts to dislocate the Republican Convencion and a spell of rest and relaxation, VVAW activists will gather in San Jose. California, at the ranch home of David Warris, a convicted draft-evader and ex-husband of folk-singing antiwar activist Josh Rez. from October 4 through 7 for their national convention.

SAN JOSE, CAL There will be strict security. Delegates must register at least two weeks in advance, and they will be subjected to a number of security checks.

The conference will determine the course that VVAW will take for the next twelve months. Plans will be discussed for pre-election projects to oppose President Hixon's campaign, and for an "action" at the Presidential Inaugural in January. Various legal defense committees [the Tallahassee Six and the Camp McCord Three] will be instituted or reinvigorated. There will be some publicity, and the usual sympathetic coverage by the mass media.

One aspect of the VVAW 1972 national convention will not receive any publicity: that aspect is the extent to which the Communist Party. U.S.A. dominates the organization.

Since 1ts inception, VVAW has cashed in on the avarage of them s natural concern and sympathy for servicemen raturned from water becomes general knowledge that VVAV is a part of the communist conspicacy. it will lose its value to the communists here and in Hanoi. With its malcontents and advocates of violence, supported by wealthy credulous liberals, directed by this country's red enemies, VVAW poses a threat which can be ignored only to our peril.

After getting gassed at the Democratic Convention in Chicago and caught in the general "down" of the peace movement, VVAW was nearly inactive until the moratoriums in the Fall of 1969. Members of VVAW led student strikes on major campuses across the country and battled Veterans Administration Hospital authorities over threats to throw amputee Vietnam veterans out for signing anti-war petitions. A present membership of the VVAW, nationally, consists of 8,500 members



According to the "Boulder Daily Camera," a daily Boulder, Colorado newspaper, in a article in its November 21, 1971 issue, the pilot and passenger in the aircraft were subsequently cited under an ordinance prohibiting the throwing of advertisements on the streets and public ways. The pilot was also charged with flying too low.

Source nine on December 8, 1971 advised that







Special Agents of the FBI on December 17, 1971 observed Gary Mundt, VVAW, and approximately six others who were dressed as though connected with the VVAW were observed to march in a domonstration sponsored by a Black youth group called Au Par Youth Center on December 17, 1971. Approximately 90 individuals were involved. At the rally following the march a comment was made that the bullhorn used by speakers had been provided by the VVAW.

According to the December 22, 1971 issue of the "Rocky Mountain News," supra, trials for the 83 individuals connected with VVAW who were arrested for participating illegally in the Veterans Day parade October 23, 1972 were still pending, and in addition to charges of Blocking a Roadway and Failing to Obey a Lawful Police Order all were charged on December 21, 1971 with Parading without a Permit. The farticle indicated that the battery of 12 defense attorneys were mostly volunteers from the National Lawyers Guild.

National Lawyers Guild is a communisty front organization of lawyers and law students dedicated to Communist Party, USA, and New Left ideals for radical change of the social, economic and judicial systems in the United States.

The February 19, 1972 issue of the "Rocky Mountain" News" reported in an article that the judge of the Denver County Court had offered the arrestees deferred prosecution. A VVAW spokesman predicted that most would refuse the offer. The March 21, 1972 issue of the "Denver Post," supra, reported that Richard Christmas, age 26, from Greeley, Colorado, was convicted of some of the charges growing out of the October 23, 1971 arrests, and was fined \$100 with the fine suspended for six months on the condition no similar violation would occur within that time. A VVAW spokesman announced that all the defendants, except tenger had decided to accept the judge's offer for deferred prose-cution. On March 31, 1972 the "Denver Post" reported that only four of the total of 83 cases remained on file and 30 of them involved defendants who were not VVAW members, but were sympathetic and participated in their protest. The April 29, 1972 issue of the "Denver Post" reported that the three remaining defendants all middle-aged were convicted April 28, 1972 and each was fined \$55.





On January 5, 1972, source ten advised that approximately 23 VVAW members from Arkansas, Missouri, Kansas, Colorado, and Texas, participated in a "peace action" in Killeen, Texas, between December 24 and 31, 1971. On December 24, 1971, a goup of them went to the front gate at Ft. Hood, Texas, and attempted to give a Black Christmas tree to some military officers. They were turned away and went a short distance from the front gate where they placed the tree in a stand and placed toy rifles under it. On December 26, 1971, there was a caravan that went from Killeen, Texas to the Veterans. Administration despites in Temple.

At the Veterans

Administration Hospital they talked with a couple of veterans and then returned to Killeen, Texas.

At approximately 10:30 a.m., December 27, 1971, the group moved onto the property occupied by Ft. Hood. All who went onto the post were taken to the Provost Marshal's Office where they were fingerprinted, photographed and issued letters barring them from the post. Six of them were from Colorado.

Late on the night of December 27, 1971, eleven persons went to Austin, Texas, including three from Colorado They planned to occupy the LBJ Library.

They all gathered outside the Library and occupied is grounds; which are policed by the University of Texas Security Department. They decided to hold a fast and vigil outside the library for four days until December 31, 1971. The domonstration at the library ended at approximately midnight on December 31, 1971 with no incidents.





On December 28, 1971, Special Agents of the FBI observed that during the afternoon of December 28, 1971, a group of 15 VVAW members led by Gary Mundt appeared at the office of U. S. Congressman James D. McKevitt (Republican), Federal Building, Denver, Colorado. The group expressed their grievances which included the military's drug rehabilitation program, narcotics in general and the Vietnam War. The meeting with McKevitt lasted about an hour and was peaceful.

First source on January 3, 1972 advised that approximately 25 members of VVAW held a march from their headquarters to the State Capitol Building where a moratorium service was held during the afternoon of December 31, 1971. The service was to mourn all who had died and would die in the Southeast Asian War. Gary Mundt read a short statement. The moratorium service lasted approximately 30 minutes and was without incident.

Second source on January 31, 1972 advised that the VVAW were planning to attend the speech of General Maxwell Taylor scheduled for February 1, 1972 at DU. Special Agent of the FBI on February 1, 1972 observed that General Maxwell Taylor spoke at DU, Denver, Colorado, the evening of February 1, 1972. Several individuals were observed passing out leaflets at the entrance to the Field House where the speech was given. During the course of General Taylor's comments, about nine individuals, seven males and two females, rose to their feet one at a time at about five minute intervals raising signs. They remained standing throughout the entire speech and the question and answere period afterwards. All signs pertained to U. S. policy in Southeast Asia. No incidents occurred.

Source ten on February 4, 1972 advised that VVAW chapters in Colorado and other areas are planning to participate in a caravan from Kansas City, Missouri, to Cairo, Illinois, February 10 through 14, 1972, in order to take food and supplies to the Black community.

Source eleven advised February 11 - 17, 1972 that on February 11, 1972, VVAW representatives from Denver, Colorado, arrived in Kansas City, Missouri, to participate in the Cairo caravan. The caravan departed Kansas City, Missouri area, February 12, 1972, loaded with food, clothing and medical supplies. After arrival in Cairo, Illinois, in the afternoon of February 12, 1972, a rally was held at which approximately 80 people were present. The supplies were unloaded and no guns or ammunition were seen. Thereafter, the members of the caravan returned to their representative cities.

During the period February 22 - 26, 1972, sources three, seven and ten, among others reported that a National Steering Committee of VVAW was held in Denver and Boulder, Colorado, February 185, 20, 1972, Approximately 15 probosals were acted upon which relate to restructuring the organization Action proposals were tabled and were to be further considered at the Abril 7 - 117 1972 National Steering Committee meeting being held in Houston, Texas

On February 17, 1972, first source advised that a poster posted at Metropolitan State College (MSC), Denver, Colorado, February 16, 1972, indicated that a member of the VVAW along with Al Rosenthal of the Colorado Peace Action Coalition (CPAC), were to speak at the Young Socialist Alliance (YSA)/Socialist Workers Party (SWP) militant forum February 18, 1972 at 8:00 p.m. on the subject "The Air War and the New Escalation in Southeast Asia."

First and second sources, both of whom have furnished reliable information in the past, have advised that CPAC, formerly known as the Colorado Peace Coalition, is an ad hoc umbrella committee formed from several anti-war, anti-draft groups in the Denver, Colorado area, which committee includes representation from the Socialist Workers Party (SWP), Young Socialist Alliance (YSA),





Student Mobilization commuttee (SMC), and the Institute/Mountain West (self-proclaimed as a small group dedicated to non-violent revolution). CPAC is largely dominated by Mary Walter and Joe Johnson, both SWP members, and recent plans of the committee have implemented those established by the National Peace Action Coalition (NPAC).

As the youth organization of the SWP, the YSA serves as the main source of recruitment into that organization. The YSA is described in the masthead of its official publication, "The Young Socialist Organizer," as "a multinational revolutionary socialist youth organization."

The SWP has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

The Student Mobilization Committee to End the War in Vietnam (SMC) is controlled by the SWP and its youth affiliate, YSA. SMC initiates and supports public demonstrations against the war in Southeast Asia.

NPAC was founded in 1970 by members of the SWP. Its basic objective is to unite masses of people, including labor unions, GIS, and the Black community in the struggle to end United States intervention in Southeast Asia through orderly and peaceful tactics.

Third source advised on February 22, 1972
that at the National Steering Committee meeting held to Denver and Soulder Cold do Ebruary 185 20 197
was decided that the national bosy of WAW would not avoid at in any way with the National Peace Action Coalition (NPAC).
SWP, SMC, YSA, People's coalition for Peace and Justice or any other front groups.





The People's Coalition for Peace and Justice (PCPJ) has described itself as being headquartered at 1029 Vermont Avenue, N.W., Washington, D. C., and as consisting of over 100 organizations which are using massive civil disobedience to combat racism, poverty, repression and war.

The "Colorado Daily," an independent student newspaper at CU, Boulder, Colorado, in its February 23, 1972 issue stated that a speaker from the Denver VVAW group was scheduled to participate in a SMC "truth-in" protesting the step-up in the war being held at CU, February 23, 1972.

Third source on March 12, 1972 advised that

The Venceremos Brigade (VB) was formed in June, 1969, by a coalition of New Left organizations to encourage American youth to travel to Cuba in defiance of a ban on travel to that country by the United States Department of State. The ostensible purpose of the travel was to assist the Castro regime in the harvesting of sugar cane and other agricultural products and to give young Americans the experience of living in a revolutionary communist country.

Source three also advised

On March 20, 1972, second source advised that two member of the VVAW in Denver, Colorado, were present at the CPAC sponsored regional anti-war conference held March 4, 1972 at CU Denver Center.

On April 3, 1972, first source advised that at a potluck supper held March 30, 1972, by Institute/
Mountain West (IMW), 2096 Emerson Street, Denver, Colorado, it was learned that the VVAW will leaflet at Lowry Air Force
Base (LAFB) main gates on Friday, March 31, 1972. IMW
members are expected to join in the activity.

On April 4, 1972, first source advised that the leafleting planned for March 31, 1972 was postponed until April 3, 1972 at 4:00 p.m. due to poor weather conditions. Source twelve on the same date advised that six male individuals appeared at the gates of LAFB, two at each gate, at approximately 4:05 p.m. on April 13, 1972, and the last ones departed at about 5:45 p.m. They handed out copies of "Hoa Binh," the VVAW, Denver, newspaper.

Special Agents of the FBI on April 15, 1972
observed that approximately 350 participated in the April 15,
1972, march in Denver, Colorado, and approximately 700 were
present for the rally which followed. A contingent of about
50 members of VVAW was included in the march. Representation
from the Communist Party, SWP, YSA, SMC and IMW was abserved.
Speakers included SWP Presidential candidate Linday enness;
SWP candidates from Colorado; Herrick Roth, President, Colorado
Labor Council; a member of VVAW; and a member of the Colorado
House of Representatives. Kathy Shields, Chairman, CPAC, acted
as Master of Ceremonies. No incidents occurred.

Kathy Shields announced that a demonstration would be held at the Brown Palace Hotel, Denver, Colorado, April 18, 1972, at 11:00 a.m. during the time that General William C. Westmoreland was to speak.

Special Agents of the FBI on April 18, 1972
observed that the picketing of General William C. Westmoreland's speech at the Brown Palace Hotel, Denver, Colorado, occurred as announced at the April 15, 1972, CPAC rally. The picketing was led by VVAW members, with representatives from SWP and CPAC being present. The demonstration lasted from 11:00 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. and the number of demonstrators varied from 20 to 30. They carried placards and distributed leaflets protesting United States involvement in Southeast Asia.

On April 29, 1972, Special Agents of the FBI observed approximately 1,200 individuals participating in the April 29, 1972 CPAC sponsored march and from 1,500 to 2,000 in attendance at the rally which followed. Leaders of the march were Jim Lauderdale and Jon Hillson, both of SWP. Various contingents participated, including the Chicano contingent; VVAW from Ft. Collins, Greeley, and Denver, Colorado; CU-VVAW from Ft. Collins, Greeley, and Denver,

While the rally was neaceful, one individual

The Crusade for Justice (CFJ) is a militant Mexican-American organization founded in 1968 with headquarters in Denver, Colorado. Its political arm is known as "La Raza Unida," The United (Mexican-American) People. Its objective is development of the Mexican-American community in political education and social action.





Third source on April 25, 1972 stated that in a flier prepared by VVAW on its letterhead, it was announced that on May 4, 1972, VVAW would be helping in a coalition of Denver movement groups to link local actions with the national moratorium. It indicated that there would be a noontime rally at the Air Force Induction Center in downtown Denver and VVAW would be coordinating with GT for actions in the evening. The possibility of smaller groups appearing at Air Force recruiting stations was also mentioned.

Special Agents of the FBI observed that
Denver VVAW, assisted by followers of IMW, handed out leaflets
at the gates of LAFB from 7:00 a.m. to 8:15 a.m., May 4,
1972. 19 participants were present at the peak of the
leafleting. No incidents occurred.

Adherents of the above two groups, plus individuals from CLC, held a silent vigil around the New Custom House, 19th and Stout, Denver, 12:00 noon to 1:10 p.m., on the same date. Approximately 225 people were present. Leaflets were handed out and no incidents occurred.

According to the May 5, 1972 issue of the "Sun."
a Colorado Springs, Colorado daily newspaper, and
Colorado Springs, Colorado Police Department
the Colorado Peace Coalition, VVAW and the Jubilee Brotherhood
were some of the organizations participating in a "silent
vigil" march in front of the Internal Revenue Service in
Colorado Springs, Colorado on May 4, 1972. About 30 students,
college instructors and citizens participated. The domonstration
was part of an all day teach-in at El Paso Community College
to commemorate the anniversary of the Kent State shooting two
years ago. David Rosen of the Denver VVAW was among those
participating.

Special Agents of the FBI on May 9, 1972 and the "Denver Post," supra, on May 10, 1972 reported that an estimated 300 anti-war demonstrators from VVAW, IMW, Clergy and Laity Concerned and other unidentified groups gathered May 9, 1972 near the intersection of Lincoln Street and East 6th Avenue, Denver, Colorado, about 3:00 p.m. to show their disagreement with President Nixon's announcement of a North





VVAW, the Vietnamese blockade. According to CLC and other local anti-war groups. Attempts to block the intersection failed and nine individuals were arrested on various charges, including disturbance, using filthy language and pedestrian walking along roadway. The "Denver Post," supra, in its May 11, 1972 issue and source one on May 15, 1972 reported that on May 10, 1972, approximately 200 persons assembled near MSC at Colfax and Fox Streets at noon. Most of the crowd consisted of MSC students; however, VVAW and IMW people were observed The peace rally was supposed to be controlled by MSC students, but the YSA attempted to take over. stepped in and directed the crowd toward the State Capitol building, where members of VVAW and YSA spoke. The group split in two; those who wanted to engage in civil disobedience. and those who wanted to simply rally against the war activity in Vietnam. The group wishing to engage in civil disobedience marched in the streets in downtown Denver for about a block, at which time the police forced them onto the sidewalk. Approximately five individuals were arrested thereafter for the walking in the street.

On May 15, 1972, first source stated that during the general student unrest which followed President Nixon's decision to blockade harbors of North Vietnam, approximately 200 persons assembled near MSC at Colfax and Fox on May 10, 1972. The protest was supposed to be controlled by students, but the YSA wanted to take over. YSA failed in the take over and VVAW then stepped in and directed the crowd toward the Capitol building. In subsequent speeches, a VVAW representative claimed that YSA always wanted to control things and that they were idiots.

On May 13, 1972, first source learned that the VVAW was planning to leaflet at Lowry Air Force Base (LAFB) on that date. A Special Agent of the FBI on May 13, 1972 observed that at approximately 1:30 p.m. on May 13, 1972, Gary Mundt, VVAW, with approximately ten other members, were at Gates 2 and 4 at LAFB. Mundt indicated there were 15 members of VVAW at Lowry at that time.



On May 15, 1972, source twelve advised that approximately 16 people were present at LAFB on Saturday, May 13, 1972, passing out copies of the VVAW newspaper "Hoa Binh" and another VVAW leaflet. They arrived around 11:20 a.m. and the last ones departed about 3:20 p.m. Two members of VVAW and one individual giving IMW as his residence were picked up on base and were given letters of exclusion. A

In connection with Armed Forces Day, May 20, 1972, at Ft. Carson, Colorado, an Open Post was held where several displays were exhibited. Special Agents of the FBI observed that during the early afternoon hours several individuals known to be connected with VVAW and IMW were observed passing out literature, which was in violation of Post regulations. Eight individuals were identified and 12 were escorted off Post by Military Police.

During the afternoon while Colonel William J. Lidsey, Jr. was talking with another Colonel, an individual later identified as John T. O'Connor of Denver, Colorado (VVAW member), approached Colonel Lidsey and from a paper cup threw a blood-like substance on Colonel Lidsey's uniform. O'Connor then stated, "You people are responsible for murder." He was taken into custody, given a letter of exclusion and transported off Post. The "Rocky Mountain News," supra, in its May 27, 1972 issue reported that members from 12 different organizations, including VVAW, CLC, IMW, Rocky Mountain Military Project, and other peace groups, have banded together to form an ad hoc committee called "The Coalition." A spokesman said the group plans to walk behind the Denver Memorial Day parade on May 27, 1972, but will remain on the sidewalks. Participants will be dressed in black and after the march, will attend a memorial service held by CLC. On June 2, 1972, first source stated that the VVAW were permitted to march in the Memorial Day parade on May 27, 1972. They was did so without incident. There was a group of persons dressed in black clothes who walked on the sidewalks behind the parade carrying a casket draped with a flag and being led by a single drummer. In this group members of IMW were observed. After the parade they met with the VVAW for a memorial service. Approximately 100 persons participated in the service. Members of VVAW, CLC and IMW were present. VVAW held a barbeque at 1776 Williams Street after the ceremony.

On July 7, 1972, sixth source advised that the VVAW, Getting Together, Military Draft Counseling and Rocky Mountain Military Project had combined to form a committee called the "Ad Hoc Committee for Sanctuary" and had made a press release on June 20, 1972 protesting injustices within the 3320th Retraining Group at LAFB, Denver.

On June 21, 1972, twelve persons from this committee were arrested at the Yosemite entrance to LAFB while Denver police were taking three AWOL servicemen into custody. The three servicemen were demanding an interview with a ten man task force which was at Lowry investigating military justice.

On July 17, 1972, first source advised there was to be a raily by unknown groups at the Federal Building mall in Denver about noon on that date. A Special Agent of the FBI observed that approximately 25 individuals held a rally on the Federal Building mall, 19th and Stout Streets, Denver, Colorado, from noon to 12:45 p.m., July 17, 1972. Members of VVAW, CLC and IMW were observed present. The rally protested the recent Florida Grand Jury indictments against six members of the VVAW for conspiracy to disrupt the Republican National Convention being held in Miami, Florida, in August, 1972. No incidents occurred.

On July 20. 1972, source two reported that

The informant stated that subject is not personally known to him to actually have been an active VVAW member, and has not promulgated or carried out any acts of violence.

Other sources familiar with New Left or subversive activities in the Twin Cities area were contacted during the course of this investigation, but did not know the subject.






