On May 17, 1972, a confidential source advised the Plattsburgh, New York Chapter of the Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW) was first noticed during the International Winter Sports Games held at Plattsburgh in late February, 1972:

VVAW is an anti-war organization organized in 1967, with headquarters in New York City. Its first published objective is "to demand an immediate cessation of fighting and the withdrawal of all American troops from Indo-China.

The VVAW used State University of New York (SUNY), Plattsburgh, New York facilities for meetings to show movies. About 25 persons attended. VVAW is not an authorized student organization at SUNY, Plattsburgh. The source said [REDACTED] name appeared on a flyer with CHARLES HARRISON, MICHAEL CARLIN, and RICHARD W. AZOTEA, as sponsors of a march on Plattsburgh Air Force Base (PAFB) on April 29, 1972. The march was planned and sponsored by the VVAW Plattsburgh Chapter as the last event in the Spring Peace Action programs of April 27-29, 1972. [REDACTED] participated in these programs and the march to PAFB. Source advised [REDACTED] is believed to be a veteran and student at North Country Community College (NCCC), Saranac Lake, New York.

Source recalled several marchers had threatened to jump the fence at PAFB, but none of these marchers were believed to be VVAW members. REGIONAL CONFERENCE IN AUBURN

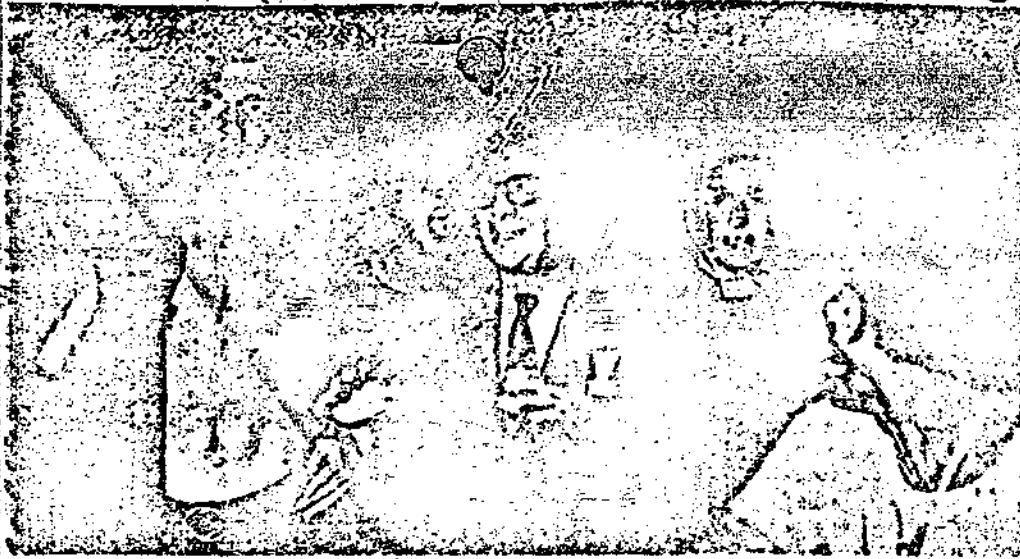

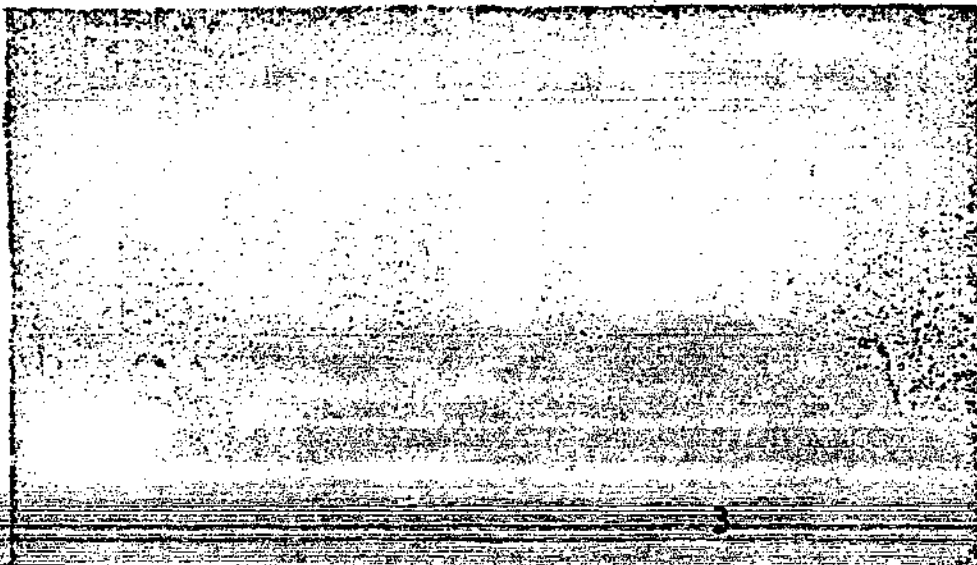

ALABAMA-MISSISSIPPI

We ACCUSE the Government of the United States of the following crimes:

1. Bombardment and artillery strikes against non-military targets, particularly undefended villages (Violation Hague Convention IV Art. 25)
2. Designation of Free-Fire Zones (artillery fire and bombardment within large land areas directed at anything that moves) (Violation Geneva Art. 3.1)
3. Battlefield policies which systematically deprive civilians of their dwellings and ancestral relics (burning them to the ground) (Violation Hague IV, 23 G, IV 46, Geneva 53)
4. Collective reprisals against whole villages for support or suspected support of guerrilla activities for isolated sniper-fire, mortar or rocket fire, emanating from the village (Violation Geneva 33)
5. The forcible transfer of refugees from their homes into camps (pacification, strategic hamlets) against their will (Violation Geneva Art. 49)
6. Reliance upon weapons that cause great suffering such as napalm, phosphorus, fragmentation, and 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ -ton daisy cutter bombs, 50 caliber and M-16 bullets, and nausea gas against human beings (Violation Hague Convention IV-22-E Hague 22)
7. Turning prisoners over to the Saigon Regime which engages regularly in acts of mistreatment, torture, and execution (Violation Geneva Art. 12)
8. Search and Destroy Operations which result in the killing of unarmed civilians; men, women, and children (Violation Geneva Art. 3.1) (The Army prosecuted William Calley for this kind of operation.)
9. The use of highly toxic defoliants causing death to young children, old people, and animals, producing birth defects, permanent damage to soil, destroying crops, producing famine and plague - ecodide (Violation U.N. General Assembly voted to ban 80-3)
10. Training and indoctrination at military camps in preparation to engage in unlawful later actions (Violation Geneva 3.1)

In lieu of these acts we must recognize who are the criminals and who are the victims. The draft evaders, the deserters, the soldiers who fought and died, the prisoners who remain, the people of Indochina and of America are the victims. The men who caused and pursued the war for their own political gains or profits are the criminals and their acts should never be forgiven or forgotten.

On May 17, 1972, a confidential source advised the Plattsburgh Chapter of the Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW) was first noticed during the International Winter Sports Games (FISU) held at Plattsburgh, New York, in late February, 1972.

VIETNAM VETERANS AGAINST THE WAR (VVAW) is an anti-war organization organized in 1967 with headquarters in New York City. Its first published objective is, "to demand an immediate cessation of fighting and the withdrawal of all American troops from Indo-China."

The VVAW used New York State University College, (SUNY), at Plattsburgh facilities for meetings to show movies. About 25 persons attended. VVAW is not an authorized student organization at SUNY, Plattsburgh.

The source advised four names appeared on a flyer as sponsors of a march on Plattsburgh Air Force Base (PAFB) on April 29, 1972. These sponsors were CHARLES HARRISON, SAM MILLER, MICHAEL CARLIN and RICHARD W. AZOTEA. The march was planned and sponsored by the VVAW Plattsburgh Chapter as the last event in the Spring Peace Action Programs of April 27-29, 1972. Source recalled several had threatened to jump the fence at PAFB, but none of these marchers were believed to be VVAW members. In fact, source said, ~~VVAW leaders had helped~~ the police in getting the marchers headed back downtown to disperse. Source stated he believes all the leaders of the local VVAW to be non-violent. 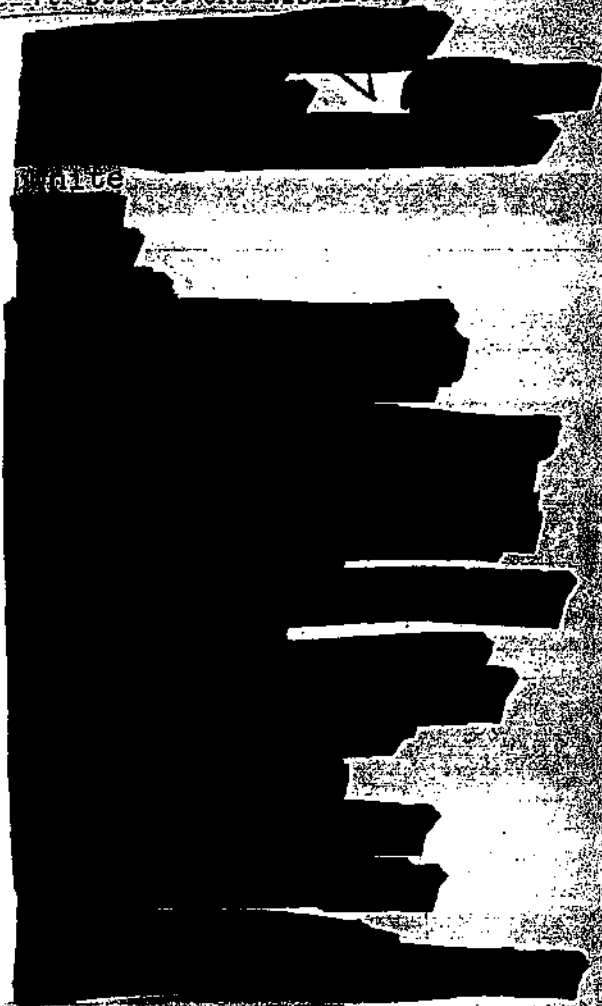

VVAW is an anti-war organization organized in 1967 and headquartered in New York City. Its published objective is "to demand an immediate cessation of fighting and the withdrawal of all American troops from Indochina."

SATURDAY SEPTEMBER 30, 1972

One hundred and twenty-five people attended the National Steering Committee Meeting held at Palo Alto, California. The following contingents of the VVAW were in attendance: contingent from the National Office at Chicago; contingents from Milwaukee, Wisconsin; contingent from Colorado; contingent from New York State; contingents from Northern Illinois and Iowa; and a combined contingent of VVAW chapters from Ohio, Indiana, and Kentucky; combined contingents from Alabama and Mississippi; and contingent from California.

_____ advised prior to opening of the meeting the Midland Bay chapter of VVAW, from San Francisco, representing themselves as the "Venceremos Brigade," attempted to pass out a red booklet containing Venceremos Brigade publications. Source indicated they provided an address of 1969 University Avenue, East Palo Alto, California, telephone number 328-4941. As a result of the attempt by the Midland Bay Chapter, the National Committee expelled this chapter, indicating that although some of the members were veterans, they also included non-veterans and therefore, were not permitted to participate in the committee meeting. _____ this group remained in the area for the next two days drinking beer, but presented no further interruptions.

The VA was formed in June 1969 by a coalition of New Left organizations to encourage American youth to travel to Cuba in defiance of a ban on travel to that country by the U. S. Department of State. The ostensible purpose of the travel was to assist the Castro Regime in the harvesting of sugar cane and other agricultural products and to give young Americans the experience of living in a revolutionary communist country.

Source advised the National Office, now headquartered in Chicago, address unknown, opened the meeting Saturday, September 29, 1972, with an analysis of the VVAW's operation "Last Patrol" to the Democratic Miami convention, August 1972, of which the general consensus of the members of the Committee felt was a disaster due to lack of leadership and coordination between various participating groups. The National Committee made a resolution that prior to any national participation by the VVAW in any future event, at least six months of prior planning, both on a regional and national scale, would be necessary.

The next item on the Saturday agenda was the matter of bussing, put forth by the Ohio and Indiana VVAW contingent, in which they stated they favored bussing and this matter was adopted by the entire body in attendance at the Steering Committee Meeting. In the future, the VVAW now endorses bussing.

The next item on the agenda was the matter concerning the Gainesville Conspiracy, two members of which were in attendance, a Scott Camille and a John Griffin, both of whom indicated they the national effort of the VVAW should be focused on the Gainesville Conspiracy and they should receive all the attention of the VVAW until they were exonerated. A heated debate arose between Camille and the National Office as it was generally felt that Camille and the others involved in the Gainesville Conspiracy were now not concerned with the VVAW, but were merely looking out for themselves.

Source advised the meeting was then broken into workshops. Number one involved the post Vietnam syndrome. This workshop was concerned with the cultural shock resulting in the return of Vietnam veterans from Vietnam and the military, and to the American society, as they were experiencing difficulty

in obtaining good jobs, and a general unfriendliness towards veterans because of the dissatisfaction of the American people with the Vietnam conflict.

The second workshop involved communication as the National Office experienced considerable difficulty with information they were disseminating to the regional offices eventually reaching the local chapters. The National Office is now preparing a mailing list of all VVAW local chapters in the country. This list is to be completed within thirty days and mailed to all local offices so that they, in turn, can correspond with any local chapter and directly with the National Office of the VVAW.

The third workshop involved the Alabama project.

The Alabama project involves the Selma Freedom City in Selma, Alabama. The VVAW plans to organize a team of medics, obtain food, supplies, and building materials, and travel to Selma, Alabama during Christmas this year and provide them with medical attention, assistance in construction, and supply food, clothing, and whatever necessities they are able to gather on behalf of the Freedom City. [REDACTED] the obtaining of necessary drugs and medicine for this project.

[REDACTED] the fourth workshop involved the VVAW's role in the national election, and it was proposed by the National Office, that the VVAW support Senator Mc Govern's efforts in the national election, and that every VVAW chapter is to assist the Mc Govern campaign office in their locale.

[REDACTED] the subject of political repression and political prisoners was brought to the attention of the Committee by [REDACTED] from [REDACTED] California. The results of the demonstrations for Billy Dean Smith and Gary Lawton were discussed.

The next topic to be discussed was the veterans affairs. This involved a proposal to bring pressure to bear on local politicians to improve the job opportunities for veterans and veterans' benefits; also, to improve veteran hospital conditions.

The next matter discussed involved VVAW internal problem as it was indicated the National Office treasury, as of last year, deposited in excess of \$90,000 and spent in excess of \$80,000, most of which was spent by the six national coordinators, now headquartered in Chicago. It was proposed that three of the six national coordinators would remain at National Headquarters at all times and the other three would make visits to local VVAW chapters across the country. It was indicated that most of the \$80,000 spent as of last year, funded the trips and travel of the six members of the National Office, and it was felt by members of the Committee that many of these trips were unnecessary and merely for the pleasure of the National Officers.

Source advised workshops were completed and new business undertaken. First item on the agenda was the female participation in the activities of the VVAW. It was pointed out that many of the VVAW members were former WACS and WAVES, whom had become upset at not being allowed to participate in all functions and activities of the VVAW on an equal status. It was pointed out that those female members who participated in the operation "Last Patrol," were not allowed to pull guard duty and other duties reserved for their male counter-parts on the trip. It was then decided that in the future, all the VVAW members, whether they are

The next item on the agenda was a proposal by the New York contingent headed by ~~an Ed Damato~~ address 25 West 26th Street, New York City, New York, telephone 725-5680. ~~Damato~~ proposed in defiance of the national Office's decision to support Mc Govern, that the VVAW work independently towards the defeat of Nixon by focusing the people's attention on the Vietnam war, the present war-time economy, veterans' benefits, and veterans' services. This matter was not resolved and the meeting moved onto the next topic which was introduced by the Bay Area of VVAW located in San Francisco, Post Office Box 151, telephone 861-7700. The Bay Area chapter proposed a Veterans' Community Program. This Program was to serve a community of veterans larger than any one chapter's membership. The leaders of the Program would contact and appeal to local businessmen to hire veterans, and a proposal for this Community Program to serve both civilian and veterans alike, such as breakfasts for children in their respective communities. This Program was to be undertaken by the Bay Area VVAW chapter on a trial basis and questionnaires were passed out among the members of the Steering Committee and they were requested to complete the questionnaire and return it to the Bay Area chapter, and based upon the answers to the questionnaire the Program would be structured.

Following this proposal, a proposal was made by the Northern Illinois and Ohio VVAW contingent, which called for a VVAW investigation of the Veteran's Administration (VA). Its purpose was to inform the American public of how the VA does not care for the needs of returning veterans. They proposed to do this by investigating the VA on six points:

- 1) Veterans' hospitals.
- 2) Veteran hospital drug care.
- 3) Psychiatric care.
- 4) Disability compensations by the VA.

- 6) Veterans' unemployment.

They also proposed to rely on a questionnaire form not yet available, but they indicated it would be mailed to the chapters when it was completed. It was then the responsibility of each chapter to complete the questionnaire and return it to this contingent which would formulate plans for regional and national investigations, file suits, and petition Congressmen on behalf of the veterans as a result of their investigations. An individual by the name of [REDACTED] city and state unknown, telephone [REDACTED] was to organize this effort. [REDACTED] was from either Chicago, Illinois, or Des Moines, Iowa.

The final proposal was entered by the Alabama and Mississippi contingent, mailing address 1317 14th Avenue, Tuscaloosa, Alabama. This contingent proposed national action on behalf of the Gainesville Six be taken and all the efforts of the VVAW to gain public support of the conspirators be undertaken.

They also proposed endorsing Mc Govern and reminded all the Committee members that a regional conference for the southeast region was to be held at a future date, not indicated, at Auburn, Alabama where they indicated they have 150 acres for the use of the regional conference.

Source indicated that upon completion of Sunday's meeting, the majority of the contingents concluded their business and departed the area.

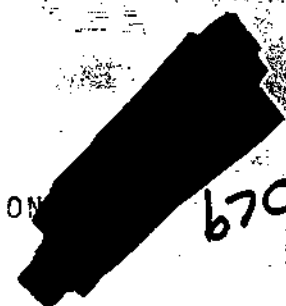

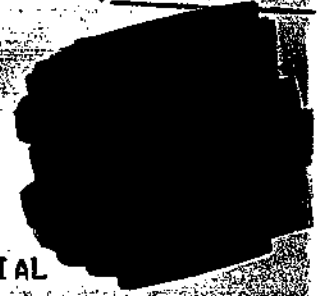

VVAW is an antiwar organization organized in 1967 and headquartered in New York City. Its published objective is "to demand an immediate cessation of fighting and the withdrawal of all American troops from Indochina."

On the morning of August 15, 1972, the convoy departed Los Angeles enroute to San Diego to join with a contingent of the VVAW in San Diego. Upon departing Los Angeles there were 21 automobiles and one Honda 350 motorcycle in the caravan. Accompanying the convoy during its trip to Miami was a film crew utilizing still and motion picture cameras and sound recording equipment. A white female, apparently of French extraction, [REDACTED] appeared to be in charge of the film crew. She stated that she had been captured by the North Vietnamese during the 1968 Tet Offensive and her photographs of this action had been used in "Life" magazine. [REDACTED] is described as 5' tall, approximately 35 to 40 years of age, 90 pounds. The film crew included approximately seven

other individuals and it was stated that a movie of the convoy from Los Angeles to Miami would be made. The convoy arrived in San Diego on the afternoon of August 15, 1972, and while joining with members of the San Diego contingent and gassing their automobiles, local citizens filed complaints with the San Diego Police Department that private driveways were blocked and as a result San Diego Police officers who arrived at the scene proceeded to copy the license numbers of each vehicle in the caravan. The caravan departed San Diego and proceeded through Yuma, Arizona, where it was given a police escort through the town. On the evening of August 15, 1972, the caravan stopped for the night at a rest area near Chiricahua National Monument, Arizona.

On the morning of August 16, 1972, the convoy departed Arizona, proceeded into New Mexico and on to El Paso, Texas, through Ft. Stockton, Texas, and camped for the night in Junction, Texas. On the morning of August 17, 1972, the convoy departed Junction, Texas, went through Johnson City, Texas, where the convoy received the attention of the Secret Service for several miles through this area. Near Austin, Texas, the convoy was badly fragmented due to a lack of direction on the part of convoy leaders and misjudging the distance between gas stops. Outside of Austin, while the convoy was reorganizing, a young boy who was in the convoy being transported by his mother, who had traveled with the convoy from Los Angeles, was struck by a passing truck. The local police were called and when it was established that the child was not seriously injured, the convoy was allowed to continue on its route. As the convoy was regrouping, the police arrested a member of the convoy for possession of an offensive weapon, a knife. This individual, unknown to the source, was subsequently released by the police and the convoy departed for Baton Rouge, Louisiana, where it spent the evening in a bayou campground.

On the morning of August 18, 1972, the convoy departed Louisiana, went through Mississippi into Alabama. A massive rush-hour traffic jam in Mobile, Alabama, separated the convoy which did not regroup until arriving at the Florida Border. In Marianna, Florida, local police attempted to arrest persons from one of the vehicles in the convoy, accusing them of being fugitives from San Diego. Approximately 100 persons surrounded four police officers and after a discussion it was decided no one would be arrested. The convoy stopped at a residence on

On August 19, 1972, the convoy departed [REDACTED] and traveled to New Smyrna Beach, Florida, where they were to join with a caravan from the East Coast and a caravan from the Midwest, but do to a change in plans by the National VVAW Office the two convoys had gone on to Ft. Pierce, Florida, so the Los Angeles convoy held another party at New Smyrna Beach.

The National Socialist White People's Party (NSWPP), also known as The American Nazi Party, American Nazis, and the George Lincoln Rockwell Party, was organized on February 26, 1956, at Arlington, Virginia, based upon the concept of an international

"National Socialist" movement as espoused by the German Nazi Party headed by Adolf Hitler. The organization supports and follows the line of hatred against Negroes, Jews, and communists through various propeganda media seeking a legitimate dominant political party in the United States and foreign countries.

7 According to the source the camp area at Flamingo Park was stagnated under the influence of heat, too many vehicles, few communicated decisions, and the easy accessibility to drugs and alcoholic beverages. Two thirds of the park was occupied by zippies, an offshoot of the Youth International Party, and members of the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), Worker Student Alliance (WSA) faction.

SDS was founded during June 1962 at Port Huron, Michigan, and in the 1960's functioned as the leading New Left campus-based student organization in the United States. From an initial posture of "participatory democracy," SDS moved to a radical-revolutionary position, with debate centering on how best to create a revolutionary youth movement. Internal factionalism produced split during the SDS National Convention in June 1969, which resulted in the following three factions: Weatherman, WSA, and Revolutionary Youth Movement (RYM). The Weatherman and RYM are no longer affiliated.

Weatherman, formerly a faction of SDS, controlled the SDS National Office from June 1969 until its closing in February 1970. Weatherman then entered an underground status and adopted a tactic of "strategic sabotage," with police and military installations designated as primary targets.

WSA, a faction of SDS, was expelled from SDS in June 1969, by the then dominant Weatherman faction but continued to use the name SDS and opened an office in Boston, Massachusetts. WSA aligned ideologically with the PLP and in February 1971 moved to Chicago, Illinois, where it opened the SDS National Office at 1225 South Wabash. Its official publication, "New Left Notes," is published in Chicago.

The Progressive Labor Party was founded in 1962 by individuals expelled from the Communist Party, USA, for following the Chinese communist line. Its objective is the establishment of a militant working-class movement based on Marxism-Leninism and MAO Tse-tung thought.

RYM, a pro-communist revolutionary youth organization, was organized in 1969, first as a faction within the SDS, then as a separate group with headquarters in Atlanta, Georgia. RYM was unsuccessful in attracting support and by mid-1970 it was practically defunct.

This was a cause of constant concern and friction for the VVAW, for the zippies continually set off fireworks and stole equipment and food that was not under guard and spent the majority of their time getting high on narcotics and/or alcoholic beverages.

On the afternoon of August 21, 1972, approximately 500 to 600 persons marched to a local high school where the Florida National Guard troops were located. Some of those in the march tore down apartment house signs along the way and antagonized supporters of President Richard M. Nixon. At the high school Ron Kovic (Supra) made an emotional speech and called for the National Guard troops to join the marchers. Members of the Guard closed the blinds on the school windows but later a note was dropped from the windows stating that the

It was known by the VVAW that civil disobedience was planned by members of the zippies and SDS, WSA Faction, but nothing specific in the way of participation was announced at the VVAW camp. Many of the VVAW members became disenchanted with the poor showings at previous marches and demonstrations and decided to leave Miami Beach; majority of these VVAW members proceeded to Gainesville, Florida, to support veterans who had been previously arrested.

On August 23, 1972, [REDACTED] and two other wheelchair veterans received passes for the convention floor from California Senator Paul McClosky and entered the convention hall. They were surrounded by guards and media representatives but managed to make a quick speech before being led off. One woman at the convention allegedly expectorated on [REDACTED] as he left the convention floor. Several VVAW members momentarily disrupted President Richard M. Nixon's Inaugural Speech by chanting from the gallery "Stop the Bombing". On August 24, 1972, the VVAW members who arrived in Gainesville, Florida, marched through the rain with their hands placed on top of their heads in a silent protest in a demonstration in support of four previously arrested VVAW members. Following this demonstration the vast majority of VVAW members departed Florida and headed out in their own direction.

The meeting will mark the first time veterans from opposing armies have met in peaceful discussion while the conflict is in progress. This will be a profound human encounter between former "enemies" to seek a mutual understanding about what can be done to end the war and how each can work toward peace."

They are incarcerated in an 8 by 10 foot cell with no ventilation, they have received no exercise since they were imprisoned on August 10. They have painted a very large VVAJ symbol on the wall of their cell with the legend Vietnam Veterans Against the War Leon County Jail Chapter (temporary), the Liberation flag of Vietnam is also displayed prominently to the consternation of the jailers. Given the situation, our brothers remain strong and send their love and wisher that VVAJ continue the struggle for peace and equality. They would like to thank those who participated in the March in Gainesville in support of the Gainesville 6 and also those who marched in Tallahassee two days later. They say they do not feel isolated, since they are receiving so much support from the outside. Drop them a line and let them know how you feel. It looks like they will remain POW's until 31 December, 1972.

OBJECTIVES OF VVAW

1. To demand an immediate cessation of fighting and the withdrawal of all American troops, planes, and military and economic aid from Indochina. We cannot allow one more human being to be killed in Southeast Asia.
2. To demand the immediate termination of all other operations by the United States government, its agencies, and American business interests that are designed to suppress the rightful struggles for liberation and self-determination of the Peoples of Africa, Asia, and Latin America. This includes the maintenance of dictatorial governments, economic domination, and the theft of the natural resources of other countries.
3. To demand that all active-duty servicemen and women be afforded the same rights that are guaranteed by the United States Constitution and Bill of Rights that are presently denied by the Uniform Code of Military Justice. We are appalled that active-duty GI's are treated as less than first class citizens. We endorse the efforts of our active-duty brothers and sisters in their struggle to democratize the military.
4. To support all military personnel refusing to serve against their consciences in wars at home and abroad. We demand that Congress enact legislation for the immediate repatriation of those brothers and sisters who are in prison or in self-exile by reason of their refusal to serve in the military. This legislation must also include an end to all repression and a freeing of all political prisoners.
5. To demand that there be no distinctions as to types of discharge and that a single type of discharge be issued, and that this be retroactive. We also demand that all veterans receive all rights and benefits under the VA; and that compensation for disabilities be based solely upon the degree of disability for veterans and their families, without regard to sex, race, rank, or length of service.
6. To make clear that the United States has never undertaken an extensive, open investigation of American war crimes in Indochina. We demand that the United States government, in its war in Indochina, affirm the principles of Nuremberg. As active-duty and former GI's, we recognize the responsibility and guilt of the individual soldier to refrain from committing war crimes. We also recognize that the responsibility and guilt for war crimes committed in the name of America lies with our policy makers at all levels.
7. To show Americans that our society is permeated by racism, which manipulates whites into viewing non-whites as inferior or less than human. This racism pushes Third World People through inferior schools to inferior jobs and into the combat arms. Thus Third World People are sent off to die in disproportionately high numbers as we kill Asians indiscriminately. We also demand that the U.S. military recognize its complicity in America's domestic and international racism.
8. To show that sexism plays a major part in promoting war. We must show Americans our society is permeated by sexism, which forces an inferior status upon women; reducing them to subservient sexual objects; and which robs both men and women of their natural growth. This institutionalized sexism channels women into unfulfilling, lower paying jobs which are servile in nature and purpose; it exploits their bodies for sex and profit; and it degrades and dehumanizes them by a double standard of morality wholly dependent on the myth of male supremacy. This sexism is exploited by the military, officially defining servicewomen as subordinate and thoroughly subjugating them to servile work and the role of a sexual object. We resolve to fight sexism within our society, within our own organization, and within ourselves.
9. To dedicate ourselves to these principles and objectives which directly relate to the imperialist suppression of the People of the World by the United States government. We understand this war in imperialist origin and affirm that the membership of VVAW is not only concerned with ending this war, but with changing the domestic social, political, and economic conditions that have caused and perpetuated its continuance.

On one recent day, in Quang Tri Province alone -- an area not much larger than Rhode Island -- we dropped twenty-five hundred tons of bombs, with three or four times the blast-damage force of the atomic bomb on Hiroshima. That is what the war has come down to. In this year's Presidential elections, the country will be brought face to face with the question of the war, [in Ala-Miss this will happen only if we (you and I) make it happen] but it is a changed war now, and a changed country. The country has been brought to the point of exhaustion by the war. It is an exhaustion of sensibility, however -- not physical exhaustion. Most of us find it more tiring to think about the war than to wage the war. Thinking about the war takes special effort, after all these years. On the other hand, waging the war is easy. All you have to do is to go on with business as usual. This is enough because the war has become part of America's business as usual. The war has inertia on its side. In a strange reversal of the usual order of things, it requires inaction to fight the war and action to stop fighting it. And because it takes so little for most of us to go on with the war, we sometimes get the feeling that someone else is waging it, or that no one is waging it -- as though the computers and the B-52's could wage it by themselves. Yet in fact it is no one but ourselves who are killing the Vietnamese. If we are not killing them, who is? Some people go as far as to maintain that the war is over. But what has happened is only that its shape has been changed to fit the public mood in the U.S. For the Vietnamese, the war is in its most punishing phase.

But if the war is the only reality for the Vietnamese, who are living with it, it is almost wholly unreal to Americans, who are supplying most of the explosives. This is partly because what we are doing in Vietnam isn't like war as we have known it in the past. War is fought against an enemy, but who is the U.S.'s enemy in Vietnam? The North Vietnamese cannot harm us now and never will be able to harm us. They can just barely harm the force we are using to destroy them. The enemy can hardly be the Chinese, who we are told, will soon be flying about in American 707's. And surely it isn't the Russians, whose Party Chairman now drives a Cadillac given him by President Nixon. Wars involve risks, but in what is happening in Vietnam the risks to most Americans are nil, and the combat casualties of those in the theater of war are regularly lower than the casualties resulting from accidents. For Americans, Vietnam is less a battlefield than an open pen that we fire into at will as the people flee in masses from one side to another. War is a contest. The people we are killing are unable to pit their arms against our arms. Instead, they have pitted their willingness to suffer and die against our willingness to torment and kill. Our strategy is to punish them until they can no longer endure the punishment and must give up. This is the logic of the torture chamber, not of the battlefield. Wars call for sacrifices, but few people on the home front are being asked to make any. Those who lose their sons don't find that the burden of their loss is being shared.

All in all, the American endeavor in Vietnam is more like a factory than like a war. It's a war in which the assembly line ends in the villages of Vietnam. None of the Americans participating are ever reminded that they are involved in anything out of the ordinary -- not the scientist who designs the weapons, not the worker and the executive who manufacture them, not the taxpayer who pays for it all. And, at the end of the line, the pilots who deliver the bombs to the Vietnamese villages are as undisturbed as milkmen delivering bottles to the doorsteps of American homes. There are all kinds of factories, and the American machine in Vietnam is a death factory. We are its workers and its consumers, our ships and planes are its moving parts, and the Vietnamese are its raw materials. In this new guise, the war has become so much a part of our lives that we scarcely notice it any longer. In a way, those who claim that the U.S. is no longer active in Vietnam are right. The war cannot now be seen as something we are doing; it is what we are.

REGISTER TO VOTE

If you haven't registered to vote as yet, we urge you to do so. Politics is generally bullshit, but unemployment, high prices, and the continuing war in Vietnam are realities. It's just possible McGovern might do something about these problems, so many of us are supporting him on an individual basis. It only takes a minute and doesn't hurt a bit. If you're a student, it might interest you to know that McGovern authored the Bill that is floating around Congress right now to increase your GI Bill allowance and to pay all tuition and fees up to \$3000. It will add about \$75 to \$100 to your monthly pay, depending on your category. The Republicans are doing their best to thwart its passage, and we all know who pulls their strings. We'll be getting more info to you on the NDPA candidates in the upcoming election. The Regional Office sent a couple of people of people to their state convention, where we wrote their platform planks on the War and on Veterans Benefit and Services. If you had been there, you could have been just as active in determining the party's actions and directions. We're supporting them in this area, and urge you to do the same.

Miami

Ala-Hiss was represented by four carloads of folks at the Republican Convention, about 16 people in all. VVAV led two demonstrations during the Convention, one on Monday and one on Tuesday. On Monday, about 1000 Vets & supporters marched to a Miami High School where the National Guard was staying and we leafletted the troops with instructions on discharge procedures and methods to avoid hassling demonstrators. We also performed some guerilla theater for the troops, but the brass went from room to room pulling the shades to prevent any truth from filtering in. On Tuesday, 1600 vets and supporters marched four abreast in a silent march through the streets of Miami, ending up at the Fountainbleau, where we were met by Paul McCloskey and a large number of State Police. We spoke on the war, unemployment among veterans, vets drug problems, and the Veterans Administration. A couple of vets, confined to wheelchairs were allowed to deliver a letter inside, where it was probably shitcanned. We provided the security for both demonstrations, which were orderly and peaceful. At one point we did evict some American Nazis who had come into Flamingo Park, torn up an exhibit and thrown some people off a stage. We did so with a minimum of force and only after it became evident that the crowd was ready to rip them off. The VVAV also helped with camp security, preventing theft, violence, and the sale of comers and heroin. Most vets left early Wed., and headed for Gainesville to rally in support of the Gainesville 6, whose arraignment took place the following day. A good bit of bullshit did transpire at the Convention but VVAV was together and effective. The older Jewish community and

Greetings:

My signature at the bottom of this letter indicates that I am in full agreement with its contents. I'm sending this to you, hoping that what it has to say will lead you to take some sort of action as regards the present situation here at the University.

The University Workers are on strike for reasons which I believe to be legitimate. They appear to have exhausted all other methods of trying to communicate with the University administration and Dr. Matthews, President of the University. I support their strike and agree that their demands are legitimate. Here is a partial list of what they are asking for:

1. non-discriminatory wage increases be instituted.
(the last wage increase only allowed for a maximum raise of 10¢/hr for black workers)
2. full recognition of Local 1279, AFL-CIO, the local to which the workers belong.
3. guarantee of a 40 hr. work week for all union members.
(they now work on a 38 and 3/4 hr./week contract which allows the University to refrain from granting certain rights which automatically hinge on a 40 hr./week contract)

The fact that Dr. Matthews and his administration have refused to even seriously consider these demands seems to point to their lack of concern about the ideas and welfare of not only their employees, but also the students and faculty.

Freshmen have been forced to live in overcrowded, uncomfortable dormitories because of the administration's inept handling of University financing and housing difficulties. Students are now being forced to pay an exorbitant fee to replace lost or stolen student ID cards.

The faculty has been unable to gain a meaningful say in what University policies, both academic and financial, will be. Dr. Matthews received a \$5000/year raise recently, yet academic programs which would benefit the students are screaming for funds which he claims do not exist.

In short, we are faced with an administration, led by Dr. Matthews, which believes that silence will hide incompetence and that others should pay for that incompetence.

I'm asking you to call or write the University and Dr. Matthews and ask them what is going on. Ask them to answer these charges to you. You pay the tuition and the taxes, and money talks. I'm asking for your help.

Investigation regarding captioned individual was instituted upon receipt of source information that subject was a member of the Carbondale Chapter of the Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW). Subject was registered as a full-time student at Southern Illinois University (SIU) Carbondale, Illinois, at that time. Background investigation, including continual source coverage, reveals [REDACTED] to be a legitimate type individual showing his protest of the war in Vietnam with no other affiliation with extremist or New Left groups. Arrest checks conducted regarding subject with negative results.

It should be noted that the VVAW is considered to be a defunct organization at SIU, not having held a meeting since around December, 1971. The VVAW was formed as a local chapter at SIU and did not become affiliated with the national or regional organizations of VVAW. At the height of its existence the Carbondale Chapter of VVAW had a following of between six to eight persons. Source coverage had revealed that none of these individuals had participated in the demonstrations in Miami in connection with the Republican Presidential Convention in August, 1972.

As the title reflects, this is the investigation which

a serial by serial review was made of the file covering Valley
Forge II.

It is noted that excellent informant coverage was
afforded this by a number of surrounding offices as well as

It seems correct to conclude then that [redacted] allegation must be incorrect as we could not have furnished him, even inadvertently, information we did not possess.

The Bureau may wish to review Bureau file on this matter for further confirmation.

SA [redacted] who is currently assigned at Minneapolis, did handle the encampment phase at Valley Forge State Park. As part of his duties, he kept the Penna. State Police, who had principal security, fully aware of significant developments. They, of course, knew he was the Agent responsible for this matter.

About a week after this encampment, it is known that VVAW group when picketing the Philadelphia Office in Philadelphia, shouted the name of [redacted] and at the time we were unable to resolve how they might have come into possession of this name. The best reasoning indicated that some law enforcement officer who had contact with the VVAW might have had a slip of the tongue and let out his name. It was not until "Harrisburg 7" trial in January and February, 1972, that a better explanation for this incident came about.

At that time the VVAW received special permission from Governor MILTON SHAPP to camp on the "island" at Harrisburg, forbidden to all other persons. This permission was secured for them by a former attorney in the Community Advocate Unit of the Penna. State Department of Justice. His name is [redacted]

Through informants we learned that [redacted] told VVAW leaders that SA [redacted] was responsible for investigation of them in Harrisburg and that he [redacted] was there to protect the VVAW from illegal harassment and abuse by the FBI, particularly [redacted]

Some inquiry at the time and discussion with SA [redacted] then developed that Attorney [redacted] had been the representative on the scene at Valley Forge State Park. There he secured for the VVAW unique permission to camp overnight and it is reasonable to project backwards that he is the man who did for SA [redacted] what he did for SA [redacted] i.e.,

The Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW) is an anti-war organization organized in 1967 and headquartered in New York City. Its published objective is "To demand an immediate cessation of fighting and withdrawal of all American troops from Indo-China. VVAW has participated in several demonstrations, including a massive demonstration in Washington, D. C., April 19 - 23, 1971.

On October 16, 1972, a confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that the VVAW plans to participate in a Veterans Day Parade, Birmingham, Alabama, on October 23, 1972. The source advised that the VVAW will attempt to have members throughout the Southeast participate in this parade.

On October 20, 1972, [redacted] advised a Special Agent of the FBI that he expects no more than 25 VVAW members to participate in the Veterans Day Parade in Birmingham. [redacted] advised the VVAW participation would be nonviolent and if VVAW members are not given permission to march, they will hold some type of silent protest.

On October 23, 1972, [redacted] Birmingham Police Department, Birmingham, Alabama, advised that 12 to 15 members of the VVAW met in

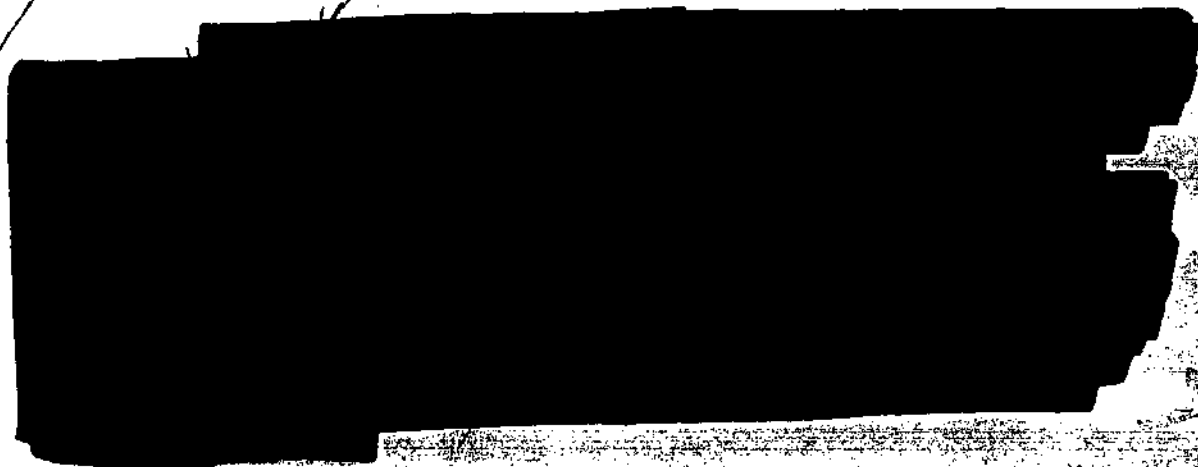

On October 25, 1972, a confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that at approximately 11:00 AM, October 23, 1972, members and supporters of the Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW) began meeting at Woodrow Wilson Park, Birmingham, Alabama, to prepare for participation in the Veterans Day parade to be held in Birmingham on that date. Signs were made by the group to display during the parade. By 1:00 PM, approximately 70 persons had gathered at the park, including VVAW members and supporters from high schools, colleges, and Birmingham residents.

VVAW is a national veterans organization with a national office located at 25 West 26th Street, New York City. Its first published objective is "to demand an immediate cessation of fighting and the withdrawal of troops from Indochina."



The group handed out VVAW literature and attempted to recruit for the VVAW. They carried signs previously
