On May 17, 1972, a confidential source advised the Plattsburgh, New York Chapter of the Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW) was first noticed during the International Winter Sports Games held at Plattsburgh in late February, 1972:

VVAW is an anti-war organization organized in 1967, with headquarters in New York City. Its first published objective is "to demand an immediate cessation of fighting and the withdrawal of all American troops from Indo-China.

The VVAW used State University of New York (SUNY), Plattsburgh, New York facilities for meetings to show movies. About 25 persons attended. VVAW is mt an authorized student organization at SUNY, Plattsburgh. The source said name appeared on a flyer with CHARLES HARRISON, MICHAEL CARLIN, and RICHARD W. AZOTEA, as sponsors of a march on Plattsburgh Air Force Base (PAFB) on April 29, 1971. The march was planned and sponsored by the VVAW Plattsburgh Chapter as the last event in the Spring Peace Action programs of April 27-29, 1972.

Darticipated in these programs and the march to PAFB:
Source advised is believed to be a veteral and student forth count. Community College (NCCC) sarahac Lake, New York.

Source recalled several marchers had threatened to jump the fence at PAFB, but none of these marchers were believed to be VVAW members. - 1. Bombardment and artillery strikes against non-military targets, particularly undefended villages (Violation Hague Convention IV Art. 25)
- 2. Designation of Free-Fire Zones (artillery fire and bombardment within large land areas directed at anything that moves) (Violation Geneva Art. 3.1)

The convoy arrived in San Diego on the afternoon of August 15, 1972, and while joining with members of the San Diego contingent and gassing their automobiles, local citizens filed complaints with the San Diego Police Department that private driveways were blocked and as a result San Diego Police officers who arrived at the scene proceeded to copy the license numbers of each vehicle in the caravan. The caravan departed San Diego and proceeded through Yuma, Arizona, where it was given a police escort through the town. On the evening of August 15, 1972, the caravan stopped for the night at a rest area near Chiricagoa National Monument, Arizona.

On the morning of August 16, 1972, the convoy departed Arizona, proceeded into New Mexico and on to El Paso, Texas, through Ft. Stockton, Texas, and camped for the night in Junction, Texas. On the morning of August 17, 1972, the convoy departed Junction, Texas, went through Johnson Cit Texas, where the convoy received the attention of the Secret Service for several miles through this area. Mear Austin, Texas, the convoy was badly fragmented due to a lack of direction on the part of convoy leaders and misjudging the distance between gas stops. Outside of Austin, while the convoy was reorganizing, a young boy who was in the convoy being transported by his mother, who had traveled with the convoy from Los Angeles, was struck by a passing truck. The local police were called and when it was established that the child was not seriously injured, the convoy was allowed to continue on its As the convoy was regrouping, the police arrested a member of the convoy for possession of an offensive weapon, a knife. This individual, unknown to the source, was subsequently released by the police and the convoy departed for Baton Rouge, Louisiana, where it spent the evening in a bayou campground.

On the morning of August 18, 1972, the convoy departed Louisiana, went through Mississippi into Alabama. A massive rush-hour traffic jam in Mobile, Alabama, separated the convoy which did not regroup until arriving at the Florida Border. In Mariana, Florida, local police attempted to arrest persons from one of the vehicles in the convoy, accusing them of being fugitives from San Diego. The National Socialist White People's Party (NSWPP), also known as The American Nazi Party, American Nazis, and the George Lincoln Rockwell Party, was organized on February 26, 1956, at Arlington, Virginia, based upon the concept of an international

"National Socialist" movement as espoused by the German Nazi Party headed by Adolf Hitler. The organization supports and follows the line of hatred against Negroes, Jews, and communists through various poropaganda media seeking a legitimate diominant political party in the United States and foreign countries.

Park was Stagnated under the influence of heat, too many vehicles, few communicated decisions, and the easy accessibility to drugs and alcoholic beverages. Two thirds of the park was occupied by zipples, san offshoot of the Youth International Party, and members of the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS); worker Student Alliance (VSA) faction

SDS was founded during June 1952 at Port
Huron, Michigan, and in the 1960's functioned
as the leading New Left campus-based student
organization in the United States. From
an initial posture of "participatory democracy,"
SDS moved to a radical-revolutionary position,
with debate centering on how best to create
a revolutionary youth movement. Internal
factionalism produced split during the SDS
National Convention in June 1969, which resulted
in the following three factions: Weatherman,
WSA, and Revolutionary Youth Movement (RYM).
The Weatherman and RYM are no longer affiliated.

Weatherman, formerly a faction of SDS; controlled the SDS National Office from June 1969 until its closing in February 1970. Weatherman then entered an underground status and adopted a tactic of "strategic sabotage," with police and military installations designated as primary targets.

WSA, affaction of SDS, was expelled from SDS in June 1969, by the then dominant Weatherman faction but continued to use the name SDS and opened an office in Boston, Massachusetts. WSA aligned ideologically with the PLP and in February 1971 moved to Chicago, Illinois, where it opened the SDS National Office at 1225 South Wabash. Its official publication, "New Left Notes," is published in Chicago.

The Processive Labor Party was founded in 1962 by individuals expelled from the Communist Party, USA, for following the Chinese communist line: Its objective is the establishment of a militant working-class movement based on Marxism-Leninism and MAO Tse-tung thought.

RYM, a pro-communist revolutionary youth organization, was organized in 1969, first as a faction within the SDS, then as a separate group with headquarters in Atlanta, Georgia. RYM was unsuccessful in attracting support and by mid-1970 it was practically defunct.

This was a cause of constant concern and friction for the VVAW, for the Zincies continually set of fireworks and stole equipment and food that was not under guard and spent the majority of their time getting high on narcotics and/or alcoholic beverages.

On the afternoon of August 21, 1972, approximately 500 to 600 persons marched to a local high school where the Florida National Guard troops were located. Some of those in the march tore down apartment house signs along the way and antagonized supporters of President Richard M. Nixon. At the high school Ron Kovic (Supra) made an emotional speech and called for the National Guard troops to join the marchers. Members of the Guard closed the blinds on the school windows but later a note was dropped from the windows stating that the

National Guard was sympathetic with the veterans. At this location seven demonstrators were arrested for climbing on the school roof. That evening rallies were held by various organizations but were sparsely attended.

On August 22 1972, members of the WVAW got off to another late start but a march was held to the hotel of the delegates attending the convention, the Fountainebleau. During this demonstration, two veterans were slightly injured when a delegates car struck them and then left the area. At the Fountained Tear Hotel, eight members of the VVAW were given tickets by an elderly man and woman to attend a Young Republicans for Nixon dinner. The eight individuals went to the Marine Auditorium and were refused entrance. The police and Secret Service questioned the eight and then ordered them to leave the area. When the eight had reached a bridge approximately two miles from the Marine Auditorium they were stopped by the local police and the driver of their vehicle was arrested for having a broken tail lense and the vehicle was impounded. The other seven remained at the area with the police for approximately 30 minutes and then they were all arrested for disorderly conduct and obstruction of a police officer. All eight were booked and bail was set at the Dade County Sheriff's Office approximatel nine hours following the arrest and all were released. During

was planned by memoers of the zipples and SDS; wsh-Paction, but nothing specific in the way of participation was announced at the VVAW camp. Hany of the VVAW memoers became disenchanted with the poor showings at previous marches and demonstrations and decided to leave Miami Berchi majority of these VVAW memoers proceeded to Calnesville, Florida, to support veterans who had been previously arrested.

On August 23, 1972, and two other wheelchair veterans received passes for the convention floor from California Senator Paul McClosky and entered the convention hall. They were surrounded by guards and media representatives but managed to make a quick speech before being led off. One woman at the convention allegedly expectorated on as he left the convention floor. Several VVAW members momentarily disrupted President Richard M. Nixon's Inaugural Speech by chanting from the gallery "Stop the Bombing". On August 24, 1972, the VVAW members who arrived in Gainesville, Florida; marched through the rain with their hands placed on top of their heads in a silent protest in a demonstration in support of four previously arrested VVAW members. Following this demonstration the vast majority of VVAW members departed Florida and headed out in their own direction.

The VVAW is a national organization composed primarily of veterans of the war in Vietnam, that has organized and participated in numerous demonstrations against the war in Vietnam during 1970-72, including the seizure of the Statue of Liberty, New York City, and the occupation of the Betsy Ross House, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, in December, 1971. To demand that all active-duty servicemen and women be afforded the same rights that are guaranteed by the United States Constitution and Bill of Rights that are presently denied by the Uniform Code of Military Justice. We are appalled that active-duty GI's are treated as less than first class citizens. We endorse the efforts of our active-duty brothers and sisters in their struggle to democratize the military.
- b. To support all military personnel refusing to serve against their consciences in wars at home and abroad. !!e demand that Congress enact legislation for the immediate repatriation of those brothers and sisters who are in prison or in self-eale by reason of their refusal to serve in the military. This legislation must also include an end to all repression and a freeing of all political prisoners.
- To demand that there be no distinctions as to types of discharge and that a single true of discharge be issued, and that this be retroactive. We also demend that all veterans reserve all rights and benefits under the VA; and that compensation for disabilities be based solely upon the degree of disability for veterans and their families, without regard to sex, race, rank, or length of service.
- 6. To make clear that the United States has never undertaken an extensive, open investigation of American war crimes in Indochina. We demand that the United States government, in its war in Indochina, affirm the principles of Muremberg. As active-duty and former GI's, we recognize the responsibility and guilt of the individual soldier to refrain from committing war crimes. We also recognize that the responsibility and guilt for war crimes committed in the name of America lies with our policy makers at all levels.
- To show Americans that our society is permeated by racism, which man-ful ipulates unites into vicuing non-unites as inferior or less than human. This racism pushes Third Horld People through inferior schools to inferior jobs and into the combat arms. Thus Third World People are sent off to die in disproportionately high numbers as we kill Asians indiscrimately. We also demend that the U.S. military recognize its complicity in America's domestic and international racism.
- C. To show that serism plays a major part in promoting war: He must show Americans our society is permeated by serism, which forces an inferior status upon momen; reducing them to subscribent sexual objects; and which robs both mon and women of their natural growth. This institutionalized secisa charmels women into unfulfilling, lover paring jobs which are service in nature and purpose; it exploits their bodies for sex and profit; and it degrades and deliminations them by a double standard of morality idiolly dependent on the myth of male supremacy. This semism is exploited by the military, officially defining serviceromen as subordinate and thoroughly subjugating them to servile work and the role of a sexual object. He resolve to fight sexism within our society, within our own organization, and within ourselves.
- To dedicate ourselves to these principles and objectives which directly relate to the imperialist suppression of the People of the World by the United States government. We understand this war in imperialist in origin and affirm that the members up of VVAV is not only concerned with ending this war, but with changing the domestic social, political, and



On one recent day, in Quang Tri Province alone -- an area not much larger than Rhode Island - we dropped twenty-five hundred tons of bombs, with three or four times the blast-damage force of the atomic bomb on Hiroshima. That is what the war has come down to. In this year's Presidential elections, the country will be war has come down to. In this year's Presidential elections, the country will be brought face to face with the question of the war, /in Ala-Miss this will happen only if we (you and I) make it happen but it is a changed war now, and a changed country. The country has been brought to the point of exhaustion by the war. It is an exhaustion of sensibility, however -- not physical exhaustion. Blost of us find it more tiring to think about the war than to wage the war. Thinking about the war takes special effort, after all these years. On the other hand, waging the war is easy. All you have to do is to go on with business as usual. This is enough because the war has become part of America's business as usual. The war has inertia on its side. In a strange reversal of the usual order of things, it requires inaction to fight the war and action to stop fighting it. And because it takes so little for most of us to go on with the war, we sometimes get the feeling that someone else is waging it, or that no one is waging it -- as though the computers and the B-52's could wage it by themselves. Yet in fact it is no one but ourselves who are killing the Vietnamese. If we are not killing them, who is? Some people go as far as to maintain that the war is over. But what has happened is only that its shape has been changed to fit the public mood in the U.S. For the Vietnamese, the war is in its most punishing phase.

But if the war is the only reality for the Vietnamesc, who are living with it, it is almost wholly unreal to Americans, who are supplying most of the explosives. This is partly because what we are doing in Vietnam isn't like war as we have known it in the past. War is fought against an enemy, but who is the U.S.'s enemy in Vietnam? The North Vietnamese cannot harm us now and never will be able to harm us. They can just barely harm the force we are using to destroy them. The enemy can hardly be the Chinese, who we are told, will soon be flying about in American 707's. And surely it isn't the Russians, whose Party Chairman now drives a Cadillac given him by President Nixon. Wars involve risks, but in what is happining in Vietnum the risks to most Americans are nil, and the combat casualties of those in the theater of wer are regularly lower than the casualties resulting from accidents. For Americans, Vietnam is less a battlefield than an open pen that we fire into at will as the people flee in masses from one side to another. War is a contest. The people we are killing are unable to pit their arms against our arms. Instead, they have pitted their willingness to suffer and die against our willingness to torment and kill. Our strategy is to punish them until they can no longer endure the punishment and must give up. This is the logic of the torture chamber, not of the battlefield. Mars call for sacrifices, but few people on the home front are being asked to make any. Those who lose their sons don't find that the burden of their loss is being shared.

All in all, the American endeavor in Vietnam is more like a factour than like a war. It's a war in which the assembly line ends in the villages of Vietnam. Hone of The Americans participating are ever reminded that they are involved in anything out of the ordinary -- not the scientist who designs the weapons, not the worker and the executive who manufacture them, not the taxpayer who pays for it all. And, at the end of the line, the pilots who deliver the bombs to the Vietnamese villages are as undisturbed as millmen delivering bottles to the doorsteps of American homes. There are all kinds of factories, and the American machine in Vietnam is a death factory. We are its workers and its consumers, our ships and planes are its moving parts, and the Vietnamese are its raw materials. In this new guise, the war has become so much a part of our lives that we scarcely notice it any longer. In a way, those who claim that the U.S. is no longer active in Vietnam are right. The war cannot now be seen as something we are doing; it is what we are.

If you're a student, it might interest you to know that legovern authored the Bill that is fleating around Congress right now to increase your GI Bill allowance and to pay all tuition and fees up to \$3000. It will and about \$75 to \$100 to your monthly pay, depending on your category. The depublicans are doing their best to thwart its passage, and we all know who pulls their strings. We'll be getting more info to you on the BDPA candidates in the upcoming election. The begional Office sent a couple of people of people to their state convention, where we wrote their platform planks on the War and on Veterans Fanefit and Services. If you had been there, you could have been just as active in determining the party's actions and directions. We're supporting them in this area, and urge you to do the same.

Miami

Ala-Miss was represented by four carloads of folks at the Republican Convention. about 16 people in all. WW! led two demonstrations during the Convention, one on lionday and one on Tuesday. On londay, about 1000 Vets & supporters marched to a Hiami High School where the Mational Guard was staying and we leafletted the troops with instructions on discharge procedures and methods to avoid hassling demonstrators. We also performed some guerilla theater for the troops, but the brass want from room to room pulling the shades to prevent any truth from filtering in. On Tuesday, 1600 vets and supporters marched four abreast in a silent march through the streets of liami, ending up at the Fountainbleau, where we were met by Paul licCloskey and a large number of State Police. He spoke on the war, unemplyment among veterans, vets drug problems, and the Veterans Administration. ... couple of Vets, confined to wheelchairs were allowed to deliver a letter inside, where it was probably shitcanned. He provided the security dor both demonstrations, which were orderly and peaceful. At one point we did evict some American Mazis who had come into Flamingo Park, torn up an exhibit and thrown some people off a stage. We did so with a minimum of force and only after it became evident that the crowd was ready to rip them off. The VVAV also helped with camp security, preventing theft, violence, and the sale of comers and heroin. Rost vets left early Med. and headed for Gainsville to rally in support of the Gainsville 6, whose arraignment took place the following day. A good bit of bullshit did transpire at the Convention but WWW was together and effective. The older Jevish community and

- My signature at the bottom of this letter indicates that I am in full agreement with its contents. I'm sending this to you, hoping that what it has to say will lead you to take some sort of action as regards the present situation here at the University.

The University Workers are on strike for reasons which I believe to be legitimate. They appear to have exhausted all other methods of trying to communicate with the University administration and Dr. Latthews, President of the University. I support their strike and agree that their demands are legitimate. Here is a partial list of what they are asking for:

1. non-discriminatory wage increases be instituted. (the last wage increase only allowed for a maximum raise of 10%/hr for black workers)

full recognition of Local 1279, AFL-CIO, the local to which

the workers belong.
guarantee of a 10 hr. work week for all union members. (they now work on a 30 and 3/4 hr./week contract which allows the University to refrain from granting certain rights which automatically hinge on a 40 hr./week contract)

The fact that Dr. Hatthews and his administration have refused to even seriously consider these demands seems to point to their lack of concern about the ideas and welfare of not only their employees, but also the students and faculty.

Freshmen have been forced to live in overcrowded, uncomfortable dormitories because of the administration's inept handling of University financing and housing difficulties. Students are now being forced to pay an exorbitant fee to replace lost or stolen student ID cards.


The faculty has been unable to gain a meaningful say in what University policies, both academic and financial, will be. Dr. atthems received a \$5000/year raise recently, yet academic programs which would benefit the students are screaming for funds which he claims do not exist.

In short, we are faced with an administration, led be Dr. Hatthews, which believes that silence will hide incompetence and that others should pay for that incompetence.

Investigation regarding captioned individual was instituted upon receipt of source information that subject was a member of the Carbondale Chapter of the Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW). Subject was registered as a full-times student as Southern Illinois university (SIU), carbondale, Illinois at that time. Background investigation, including continual source coverage, reveals to be a legitimate type individual showing his protest of the war in Vietnam with no other affiliation with extremist or New Left groups. Arrest checks conducted regarding subject with negative results

It should be noted that the VVAW is considered to be a defunct organization at SIU, not having held a meeting since around December, 1971. The VVAW was formed as a local chapter at SIU and did not become affiliated with the hational or regional organizations of VVAW. At the height of its existence the Carbondale Chapter of VVAW had a following of between six to eight persons. Source coverage had revealed that none of these individuals had participated in the demonstrations in Miami in connection with the Republican Presidential Convention in August, 1972.

As the title reflects, this is the investigation which covers the incident referred to in this magazine article. Discussion with agents familiar with this matter developed that they had no recollection of receiving information that the VVAW was planning to leaflet Philadelphia by plane and had not been able to find a plane. In view of these negative recollections, a serial by serial reviewwas made of the file covering Valley Forge II. It is noted that excellent informant coverage was afforded this by a number of surrounding offices as well as Philadelphia.
