SOURCE ADVISED THAT THE THENES OF THE DEMONSTRATORS

SOURCE ADVISED THEY DESIRE A DEMONSTRATION MADE UP OF PICKETS, THEATRICAL SKITS AND MARCHERS TO BRING ATTENTION TO THEIR DEMANDS OF UNCONDITIONAL ANNESTY FOR ALL DRAFT EVADERS AND DESERTERS AND TO COMPARE THE LAVISH FOOD AND EATING HABITS OF THE PRESIDENTIAL PARTY TO THE ALLEGED STARVING PEOPLE IN VERNONT.

SOURCE ADVISED THAT ADDITIONAL GROUPS ARE TO BE CONTACTED BY THE PLANNERS OF THE DEMONSTRATION IN AN EFFORT TO ENLIST THEM TO PARTICIPATE IN THE PLANNED DEMONSTRATION.

SOURCE ADVISED THAT SOME OF THE GROUPS MENTIONED WERE THE

BURLINGTON, VERNONT. SOURCE ADVISED THAT HAS RECENTLY
BEEN TRYING TO GAIN SUPPORT FOR THE VIETNAM VETERANS AGAINST
THE WAR/WINTER SOLDIER ORGANIZATION (VVAW/WSO) ON THE CAMPUS
OF THE UNIVERSITY OF VERNONT BUT HAS GAINED LITTLE SUPPORT.

THE VVAW WAS FORMED IN 1967 AS AN ORGANIZATION OF VIETNAM VETERANS TO FROTEST AMERICAN INVOLVEMENT IN THE WAR IN SOUTHEAST ASIA. SINCE THAT TIME VVAW LEADERS HAVE TOLD NEMBERS THE VVAW IS A REVOLUTIONARY GROUP, NOT "JUST ANOTHER GROUP OF WAR VETERANS." ALSO, THE MEMBERSHIP HAS BEEN TOLD THE VVAW HAS BEEN ASKED TO COOPERATE ON AN INTERNATIONAL

AVPC WAS SELF-DESCRIBED IN 1971 AS AN ORGANIZATION THAT SUPPORTS THE NATIONAL LIBERATION FRONT OF SOUTH VIETNAM AGAINST THE UNITED STATES AND SOUTH VIETNAMESE GOVERNMENT. AVPC CONSISTED OF SIXTY ACTIVE NEMBERS AND SOME SUPPORTERS, MOSTLY IN MONTREAL, CANADA, ALL BEING STUDENTS OR

EX-STUDENTS FROM SOUTH VIETNAM.

MEETINGS OF THE DEMONSTRATION PLANNERS AND HAS SPOKEN OF THE MECESSITY OF DEMONSTRATING AT THE BURLINGTON INTERNATIONAL AIR PORT AND THE RANADA INN BECAUSE THERE WOULD BE TELEVISION COVERAGE. SOURCE ADVISED THAT MENTIONED A RADICAL THEATRICAL GROUP IN NEW YORK CITY WHICH HE WOULD ATTEMPT TO HAVE COME TO VERMONT FOR THE DEMONSTRATION. THIS IN TURN MIGHT LEAD TO ARRESTS AND SOURCE STATED THAT THE HOPES TO HAVE SOME AMERICAN CIVIL LIBERTIES UNION ATTORNIES IN THE CROWD SO THAT THEY MAY BRING LATER CHARGES OF POLICE ERUTALITY, SHOULD ARRESTS TAKE PLACE.



On August 13, 1974, first source furnished an "August Calendar of Events" issued by the New York City (NYC) Chapter, Vietnam Veterans Against the War/Winter Soldier Organization (VVAW/WSO) (see appendix), which disclosed that the VVAW/WSO would participate in an "Honor Vietnam Vets Day" at Shea Stadium, on August 19, 1974, at 6:00 PM. The calendar stated as follows with respect to this activity:

"On March 29th, Nixon decided to 'honor' Vietnam vets by naming a day for them. We told him we weren't going to be fooled by that kind of publicity stunt. Now there is going to be a day for 'honoring' vets at Shea Stadium, when vets and their guests get in for a dollar. Lets go and take the banners that talk about how people could really honor vets like a single-type discharge, Amnesty, decent benefits, etc."

On August 18, 1974, first source advised that about 10-15 persons would participate in the VVAW/WSO activity at Shea Stadium, Queens, New York (NY), on August 19, 1974, and that the activity would consist in the main with the distribution of leaflets on amnesty.



VVAW/WSO gathering and demonstration at Shea Stadium, Queens, NY, on August 19, 1974, at which members passed out leaflets calling for unconditional amnesty for veterans and increased benefits during the Veterans commemorative ball game. The members also unfurled a banner and attempted to shout slogans. Six persons were arrested, four from NY and and and from New Jersey.

On September 18, 1974, a third source advised that six persons were arrested at Shea Stadium, Queens, NY, on the evening of August 19, 1974, at "Honor Vietnam Veterans Night". Those arrested were apparantly associated with the VVAW/WSO inasmuch as they carried VVAW/WSO banners. Because they were noisy during the ceremonies, the Stadium Security Police attempted to remove them from the premises. An altercation ensued resulting in the arrests. One member of the Security Police sustained an injury. Those arrested were charged with Assault, Second Degree, Disorderly Conduct, and Harassment. The following persons were arrested:

VIETNAM VETERANS AGAINST THE WAR/ WINTER SOLDIER ORGANIZATION

The Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW) was formed in 1967 as an organization of Vietnam Veterans to protest American involvement in the war in Southeast Asia. Since that time, VVAW leaders have told members that VVAW is a revolutionary group, not "just another group of war veterans." Also the membership has been told the VVAW has been asked to cooperate on an international level with many organizations, including communist and Maoist groups. Additionally it was indicated that "anti-imperialist groups" consider the VVAW a potent organization of similar stature in the United States. In April, 1973, the group changed their name to Vietnam Veterans Against the War/Winter Soldier Organization (VVAW/WSO) so that non-veterans could become members. Current VVAW/WSO national officers are Marxist-Leninist oriented and strive to educate their membership in Marxist-Leninist doctrine.

Vietnam Veterans Against The War/ Winter Soldier Organization

The Venceremos Brigade (VB) was formed in June, 1969, in cooperation with the Cuban Government to show support for a successful communist revolutionary government and to encourage American youth to travel to Cuba in defiance of a ban on travel to Cuba by the U.S. Department of State. The VB seeks participation of subversive people in the United States, based on their support for the communist regime and desire to aid in harvesting agricultural products and construction of housing in Cuba. The VB has stated it will seek to educate people about imperialism and foster a revolution against it. Individual members of the VB have made statements to the effect that the most significant effect of the Brigade would be to build a revolutionary movement in the U.S. around those who go to Cuba. utilizes a questionnaire to screen applicants and recruitment for membership in recent Brigades has favored individuals with subversive backgrounds. It is known that officials of the Cuban Government have played a dominant and decisive role in the formulation of VB policy and in selection of VB leaders and members for recent VB contingents. VB members are known to have been contacted by various hostile intelligence services while in Cuba and it is known that the VB is being used by these intelligence services for spotting purposes as well as recruiting intelligence agents and support personnel. The VB is currently headquartered in New York City.

V. CHAPTER REPORTS

Oakland/East Bay Chapter

gave the Oakland/East Bay Chapter report, stating that the chapter has increased to the point where they have 15 people consistently at meetings. The Discharge Upgrading Project (DUP) is continuing and they are making an effort to recruit law students to write the briefs. She further stated that the chapter is intending to start a bookstore in the store front and take over supplying the overseas chapter with books. She added that the chapter held a demonstration in front of the San Francisco Veterans Administration to publicize amnesty and bad benefits.

Long Beach Organizing Committee Report

gave this report, stating that the committee had a discussion around the had organizing techniques used in the past and how to improve and learn from past mistakes. The Long Beach Committee is planning to work with Movement for a Democratic Military (MDM) in a certain capacity. He also reported there are 28 DUP cases.

MDM was organized in December, 1969, in Southern California, and is a group of active duty and ex-servicemen dedicated to forcing the military to be responsive to the will and needs of servicemen and the American people.

Southbay Report

The person giving this report stated that the chapter organized people around a demonstration against Nixon. The chapter has been in a slump membership-wise, but the chapter hopes to make some contacts during school registration.

Verice Chapter

This report was given by She stated that there are 20 sets of records acquired through the DUP, but not all were completed as hoped for; that no new people are being accepted for DUP since there will be new channels for people to go through. On August 9, 1974, some members of the Venice Chapter addressed people at the long march in Los Angeles, which led to a good discussion around VVAN/WSO. A workshop around DUP was held at the University of California at Irvine.

Palo Alto Organizing Committee

stated that five people had been on the committee as of mid-Tune, but since then, one of the five rejoined the Army, two decided to join a family commune, and the other two got disgusted and went back East, leaving only Young on the committee. Tannounced that he works at Radio Station KJFC covering amnesty and DUP.


San Francisco Organizing Committee

made the report for the organizing committee, stating that the committee has moved out of its headquarters on 24th Street in San Francisco and is now using her residence at Street. The reported that an anti-imperialist study group has been held by the San Francisco Organizing Committee.

San Jose Chapter

The person making the San Jose Chapter report stated that the Regional Office has become a project of the San Jose Chapter and has taken away from the work on the WAW/USO projects. However, the chapter is starting to get on top of things in what the Regional Office should be. It was announced that at a recent tune-up benefit, the chapter netted \$100. It was also

stated that an anti-imperialist study group had been formed within the chapter and six people attended this study group. He added that the chapter had gone through a summer slump, but it was viewed that things would start rolling again shortly. He added that the chapter has about 35-40 DUP cases.

Santa Cruz Chapter

VYAHARSO REGION.

made the report on the Santa Cruz Chapter and stated the chapter is doing work on "Days of Concern" and is forming a coalition around "Days of Concern". The chapter, during the registration at Cabrillo College, set up tables for people to sign amnesty petitions. The chapter had a workshop on "cxism" and will be having workshops on internal direction. The chapter participated in a march on the Fourth of July in Aptos, California, and handed out 2,500 leaflets. He added that it is hoped a study group will be formed in the near future to study "Prairie Fire".

Inland Empire Chapter

Barry Romo made this report. Pomo stated that the chapter's main work has been around the Lawton-Gardner trial in Riverside, California, and the distribution of the "winter Soldier", the official publication of the VVAN/MSO. demonstrations were held in Riverside by the chapter in the past five months, one being held on July 2, 1974, at the time the VVAM/MSO was having a demonstration in Mashington, D.C. second demonstration was held August 6, 1974, in solidarity with the demonstration the Japanese were having around the bombing of Hiroshima. The chapter has had study groups and covered the questions of "the national question in the U. S." and "the building of a united front against imperialism in the U. S."

GENERAL REPORTS

gave a regional financial report (set out previously under "Regional Office Report"). gave a report on the distribution of the "Winter Soldier" in prisons, which included the prisons in California that were allowing the "Winter Soldier" to be distributed to its inmates, and those which were not. She reported that most of the problems

in distribution were in the federal prisons. She added there is no state-wide ban on "Winter Soldier", but prisons within the state can take the option of banning it or not. It was also stated that there is clearly a harassment technique be certain people.

California. She stated no new legal work is being initiated at the present time and that one of the problems that the DUP staff is faced with is the fact that the staff is stuck with the briefs. She stated that one way to alleviate this problem is to make the manuals available to legal organizations so that the DUP staff can do political organizing. In this way, she hoped that the staff would make themselves available as instructors. She added that the VVAM/NSO will not be soliciting new cases to be reviewed.

gave a security committee report. She stated that the committee has begun investigations within the chapters. Only chapter members in leadership roles, such as chapter coordinators, and those members who have access to important documents are to be investigated. She added, however, that the investigation process has been slowed down somewhat because the committee has been unable to obtain \$300 to get a credit check number in order to do credit checks.

VII. FORKSHOPS

Indochina Amnesty Workshop

The general tone of discussion was that they should make their work around amnesty and Indochina constant and visible to the masses. It was suggested that to maintain a constant level of work, there should be:

- Calling up radio talk shows;
- Literature tables set up on the street, in shopping centers, work places, campuses, and high schools;
- 3. Letters to the editors of local newspapers representing our organization and ourselves as individuals:



4. Pickets and demonstrations in front of jails in solidarity with those inside.

Vietnam Problem Workshop

The committee established at the Regional Conference at Riverside, California, in May, 1974, met twice, and while nothing tangible has come out of the committee as yet, research on veterans' problems is continuing and the circulation of information collected will begin at the end of October.

Racism Workshop

It was recommended that three levels of work within the chapters around racism be initiated where each chapter can attempt to answer concerning racism:

- 1. Have study groups to learn about "where we have come from" and to get a perspective on an individual's level;
- 2. How does the VVAM/MSO work around Third Morld struggles?
- 3. As each chapter plans actions, who is the VVAN/WSO speaking to in the community? Does this relate to the needs of the Third World people and how?

There was a general discussion of the National Office Position Paper. An attempt was made to discuss the various issues so that chapter representatives could take the various issues back to the chapters for more discussion.

VIII. FUTURE EVENTS

The next Regional Conference of the VVN / MSO will be held in Long Beach on January 10, 11 and 12, 1975.

COMMUNIST PARTY, USA (CPUSA)

Title 50, USC, Section 781 (Internal Security Act of 1950) stated that, as a result of evidence adduced before various committees of the Senate and House of Representatives, Congress found the existence of a world communist revolutionary movement, whose purpose is to establish a communist totalitarian dictatorship in the world's countries through the medium of a world-wide communist organization. Communist action organizations in various countries endeavor to carry out the objectives of the world communist movement by bringing about the overthrow of existing governments by any means. The communist organization in the United States -- the CPUSA -- pursuing its stated objectives, presents "a clear and present danger to the security of the United States." The Subversive Activities Control Board, established by Section 791 of the above Act, found the CPUSA to be a communist action organization. This finding was upheld by the United States Supreme Court in June, 1961. The CPUSA has continued to be an arm of the international communist movement dominated by the Soviet Union. The CPUSA, in its dependence on the Soviet Union, has never knowingly adopted a position contrary to Soviet policy. leaders frequently confer with Soviet leaders to receive guidance and direction on the policies the CPUSA is to follow. There has been no evidence that the primary aims of the CPUSA, as they conform to Soviet objectives, have changed over the years.

REVOLUTIONARY UNION

The Revolutionary Union (RU), founded in early 1968 in the San Francisco Bay area, is a militant semicovert Marxist-Leninist revolutionary organization ideologically oriented towards the People's Republic of China and the teachings of Chairman MAO Tse-tung. Its objectives as set forth in its theoretical publication, "The Red Papers," and in its monthly newspaper, "Revolution," are the development of a united front against imperialism, the fostering of revolutionary working class unity and leadership in struggle, and the formation of a communist party based on Marxism-Leninism-MAO Tse-tung thought, leading to the overthrow of the United States Government by force and violence. Members of the RU have been identified as collecting weapons while engaging in firearms and guerrilla warefare training. As of July, 1974, RU national headquarters was located in Maywood, Illinois.





VENCEREMOS ORGANIZATION Also Known As Venceremos

In December, 1970, and January, 1971, two sources advised that the Venceremos Organization (VO), also known as Venceremos, had its genesis in an ideological schism within the Revolutionary Union (RU), which, in mid-December, 1970, culminated in the RU Peninsula Collectives, from South San Francisco, California, to San Jose, California, withdrawing from the RU and forming a separate organization.

The VO faction holds that the "revisionist" RU, in overemphasizing the role of the industrial proletariat in the revolution, has downgraded and betrayed the black and third world revolutionary struggle within the imperialist United States. VO holds that armed struggle is an actuality in the United States today and advocates the furtherance of this struggle by sabotage and urban guerrilla warfare.

The following appeared on page 13 of "Pamoja Venceremos", issue number 1, dated May 18, 1971, and self-identified as the newspaepr of the VO:

"Venceremos is an inter-communal organization of brown, Asian, and white revolutionaries based in the Peninsula area -- from South San Francisco to San Jose. We work on the basis of Marxism-Leninism-MAO Tse-tung thought as it applies to the conditions of imperialist American society today. We are guided by the principle of revolutionary inter-communalism, the unity of all those oppressed by U. S. imperialism and its lackeys. In theory and in practice, we follow the leadership of third world people, the true vanguard of revolutionary struggle in the world today...We struggle on all levels -- from standing armed against the open public invasion of our communities, to serving the day-to-day needs of the people. We have as many fronts and levels of combat as there are of the imperialist monster. Our goal is to wipe the imperialist monster off the fact of the earth so that we, the people, will be free to control our own lives. Our aim--rule by those who are now ruled ... "

In May, 1973, a third source advised that all members must subscribe to the Five Principles of Unity:

- 5. Armed Struggle, which principle states, in part, "...every Venceremos member must learn to operate and service weapons correctly, must have arms available, and must actively teach the oppressed people the importance and methods of armed and organized self-defense..."

San Francisco Bay Area media on September 28, 1973, quoted Venceremos leaders that the organization had disbanded and was no longer in existence.





VIETNAM VETERINS AGAINST THE WAR/ WINTER SOLDIER ORGANIZATION

A source advised in January, 1974, that the Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW) was organized in New York City in 1967 as an organization of Vietnam Veterans to protest American involvement in the war in Southeast Asia. In 1967-1971, the VVAW engaged in various protest demonstrations of a non-violent nature, but during late 1971 evidenced increasing militancy, culminating in December, 1971, with the takeover of various American landmarks and public buildings. In 1972 certain VVAW leaders were quoted as telling members the VVAW was a revolutionary organization and not "just another group of war veterans."

VVAW leaders have traveled to North Vietnam in 1972-1973 and have reportedly established liaison with revolutionary or terrorist groups internationally. During the January, 1973 National Steering Committee (NSC) meeting, VVAW leaders discussed programs aimed at obtaining support from or influencing active duty military personnel to act contrary to orders. Also discussed was obtaining access to classified Government information to be used against U. S. interests, and one leader subsequently reportedly engaged in such activity.

During 1972, VVAW leaders and activists reportedly made several trips to Europe and Asia during which they participated in conferences with representatives and/or officials of the Soviet Bloc, North Vietnam, and the National Liberation Front of South Vietnam. The membership was also told the VVAW had been asked to cooperate on an international level with many organizations, including communist or Maoist groups, describing them as "our friends". Commitments of support for the VVAW were reportedly received from throughout the world, and it was stated the VVAW had strong ties with nearly all revolutionary organizations. Further, international "anti-imperialist groups" considered the VVAW a potent organization of similar stature in the United States.

At one NSC meeting in 1972, the speakers presented their views in a manner demonstrating the VVAW utilized a Marxist-oriented analysis of world problems.

APPENDIX CONFIGENTIAL:



In April, 1973, an organizational name change to Vietnam Veterans Against the War/Winter Soldier Organization (VVAW/WSO) was made to indicate inclusion as member individuals other than veterans of military service.


During the April, 1973 NSC meeting, the attendees were told the group has communication with over 200 foreign organizations and was considered a credible organization by these groups. In October, 1973, representatives of the VVAW/WSO attended and participated in the World Peace Congress in Moscow, USSR.

In mid-1973 an ideological split within the organizational leadership became evident, with those espousing the Marxist-Leninist doctrine having to contend with the growing influence of the Maoists. Current VVAN/WSO national officers are Marxist-Leninist oriented, and have expressed determination to educate the VVAN/WSO membership in Marxist-Leninist doctrine. The VVAN/WSO publication, "Winter Soldier", is considered a very useful tool in this regard.

The VVAW/WSO is composed of approximately 130 chapters nationwide. Current estimated membership is 2,000. National Headquarters is located at 827 West Newport, Chicago, Illinois.

It was learned that on the weekend of September 21-22, 1974, five members of the Vietnam Veterans Against the War/Winter Soldier Organization (VVAW/WSO), a characterization of which is contained in the Appendix attached hereto, attended a conference in Toronto, Ontario, Canada. This conference was attended by various members of exile groups which are comprised of deserters from the U. S. military and individuals who refused to be inducted into the U. S. military by the Selective Service System.

In addition to attendance at the conference by members of various exile groups, there were also attendees at the conference from the National Council for Universal and Unconditional Amnesty (NCUUA), the VVAW/WSO, AMEX (an exile group), the National Council of Churches, and the CCCO, which is a pro-amnesty group that is not further identified.

It was learned that several of the exiles are concerned that individuals who refused to be drafted or deserted from the military for other than reasons of conscience. will avail themselves of the amnesty program. The concern is that when these individuals accept the program, the exiles who are remaining in exile for reasons of conscience, will lose their notoriety. Several individuals not identified indicated that they will return to the United States during the amnesty program, however, they will refuse to take a new oath of allegiance to the United States and will refuse to submit to the terms of the amnesty program, thereby subjecting themselves to arrest when the program ends. individuals will accept arrest and jailing in order to display to the American people that there are still individuals who have objections for reasons of conscience to the Vietnam War, which they claim is still continuing at the present time. Regarding their refusal to swear allegiance to the United States, these individuals feel that they have not indicated any lack of patriotism towards the United States by becoming exiles, rather, they consider themselves to be the true patriots who followed their conscience and objected to the Vietnamese war. Several of these individuals also desire to obtain "landed immigrant" status in Canada or Europe and to become citizens of these countries at a future date, and therefore, they do not wish to swear allegiance to the United States which might hamper their decision to remain abroad.







D. Membership

As of May 29, 1974, the chapters within the New York-Northern New Jersey Region are as follows: New York City, Oneonta, Old Westbury, Rochester, Ithaca, Westchester-Putnam, Suffolk County, Orange County, Mid-Hudson and Fredonia. The viable chapters within the region are Buffalo, New York City and Oneonta. By viable is meant that these chapters have a significant membership and the ability to carry out significant activity on behalf of VVAW/WSO. The Westchester-Putnam Chapter approaches the viable status. The Rochester Chapter, Orange County Chapter and Mid-Hudson Chapter are struggling and will probably make some progress. The Ithaca Chapter is going nowhere since there are only two people in the chapter. The Old Westbury and Suffolk County Chapters are basically campusoriented groups and there is no significant activity during the summer months although during the school year they can

generate support for VVAW/WSO activities. The Fredonia Chapter consists of two or three individuals who are trying to form a chapter, but there is really no chapter there as such.

Regarding the number of individuals in these chapters, the Buffalo Chapter has approximately 30 members and the New York City and Oneonta Chapters have approximately 20 members. AMERICAN SERVICEMEN'S UNION

The American Servicemen's Union was founded in 1968 by the Workers World Party. Its objectives are to cause discontent among military enlisted personnel and call for the establishment of a servicemen's union. Its main propaganda weapon is the publication "The Bond - The Servicemen's Newspaper."

WORKERS WORLD PARTY

The Workers World Party (WWP) was founded in 1959 by former members of another Trotskyist-communist organization who disagreed with the policies of that organization. The WWP advocated unconditional support of the Soviet Union and the building of a revolutionary party to overthrow capi-The W.P also called for peaceful solutions to Sino-Soviet disputes; however, the WWP now generally supports the Peoples Republic of China in its ideological differences with The WAP national headquarters is located the Soviet Union. While the WWP does not openly advocate the in New York City. violent overthrow of the U. S. Government at this time or violations of other Federal or state laws, the WWP does believe that eventual violent revolution to overthrow the present capitalist system of government in the U. S. is inevitable. The objective of the WWP is to organize a membership to take action to precipitate such a revolution when conditions are ripe and to direct and seize control of the revolution when it occurs.

COMMUNIST PARTY, USA (CPUSA)

Title 50, USC, Section 781 (Internal Security Act of 1950) stated that, as a result of evidence adduced before various committees of the Senate and House of Representatives, Congress found the existence of a world communist revolutionary movement, whose purpose is to establish a communist totalitarian dictatorship in the world's countries through the medium of a world-wide communist organization. Communist action organizations in various countries endeavor to carry out the objectives of the world communist movement by bringing about the overthrow of existing governments by any means. The communist organization in the United States -- the CPUSA -- pursuing its stated objectives, presents "a clear and present danger to the security of the United States." The Subversive Activities Control Board, established by Section 791 of the above Act. found the CPUSA to be a communist action organization. This finding was upheld by the United States Supreme Court in June, 1961. The CPUSA has continued to be an arm of the international communist movement dominated by the Soviet Union. The CPUSA, in its dependence on the Soviet Union, has never knowingly adopted a position contrary to Soviet policy. leaders frequently confer with Soviet leaders to receive guidance and direction on the policies the CPUSA is to follow. There has been no evidence that the primary aims of the CPUSA, as they conform to Soviet objectives, have changed over the years.

NATIONAL CAUCUS OF LABOR COMMITTEES

The National Caucus of Labor Committees (NCLC) is a violence-oriented, self-described "organization of revolutionary socialists" which was formed in 1969 with its stated aim to identify with American workers and orient them toward a socialist America. In its attempt to become the dominant Left group in the U. S., NCLC members have attacked attendees at meetings, demonstrations, conferences and conventions of various communist, Trotskyist and socialist organizations because it contended that it is necessary to use violence to achieve socialism. According to statements made by LYN MARCUS, National Chairman, NCLC will have gained state power in the U. S. by 1979 and by the year 2000 in the world. NCLC, which is headquartered in New York City, currently has chapters in more than 40 cities in this country and has affiliated chapters in five foreign countries.

NCLC utilizes its front group, the North American Unemployed and Welfare Rights Organization (NU/RO), to attract poor people to its philosophy; its youth group, the Revolutionary Youth Movement (RYM), to organize ghetto youths; and its political arm, the U.S. Labor Party (USLP), to conduct political campaigns aimed at acquainting the general public with the activities of NCLC.

REVOLUTIONARY STUDENT BRIGADE

The Revolutionary Student Brigade (RSB), formerly known as the Attica Brigade, is a student-based organization founded in New York City in the Fall of 1971. The RSB considers itself to be an anti-imperialist organization which views United States imperialism as the main enemy of the people of the world. The RSB favors violent actions to further its cause and is moving closer in ideology to the Revolutionary Union (RU), which has significantly infiltrated the RSB and plays a major role in the RSB policies, decisions and activities. As of July, 1974, the RSB is headquartered in New York City. The RU is a basic Marxist-Leninist-Maoist revolutionary organization.

APPENDIX

REVOLUTIONARY UNION

The Revolutionary Union (RU), founded in early 1968 in the San Francisco Bay area, is a militant semicovert Marxist-Leninist revolutionary organization ideologically oriented towards the People's Republic of China and the teachings of Chairman MAO Tse-tung. Its objectives as set forth in its theoretical publication, "The Red Papers," and in its monthly newspaper, "Revolution," are the development of a united front against imperialism, the fostering of revolutionary working class unity and leadership in struggle, and the formation of a communist party based on Marxism-Leninism-MAO Tse-tung thought, leading to the overthrow of the United States Government by force and violence. Members of the RU have been identified as collecting weapons while engaging in firearms and guerrilla warfare training. As of July, 1974, RU national headquarters was located in Maywood, Illinois.

APPENDIX

VIETNAM VETERANS AGAINST THE WAR/ WINTER SOLDIER ORGANIZATION

The Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW) was formed in 1967 as an organization of Vietnam veterans to protest American involvement in the war in Southeast Asia. Since that time VVAW leaders have told members the VVAW is a revolutionary group, not "just another group of war veterans." Also, the membership has been told the VVAW has been asked to cooperate on an international level with many organizations, including communist and Maoist groups. Additionally, it was indicated that "anti-imperialist groups" consider the VVAW a potent organization of similar stature in the United States. In April, 1973, the group changed their name to Vietnam Veterans Against the War/Winter Soldier Organization (VVAW/WSO) so that non-veterans could become members. Current VVAW/WSO national officers are Marxist-Leninist oriented and strive to educate their membership in Marxist-Leninist doctrine.

YOUNG WORKERS LIBERATION LEAGUE

The Young Workers Liberation League (YWLL), the youth group of the Communist Party, USA (CPUSA), was formed in February, 1970. It has established chapters throughout the United States for the purposes of educating youth in Marxist-Leninist doctrine and recruiting them into the CPUSA. National headquarters are in New York, New York.

YOUTH AGAINST WAR AND FASCISM

The Youth Against War and Fascism (YAWF) is the youth group of the Workers World Party (WWP). It was formed in the Summer of 1962 and is currently headquartered in New York City. It propagandizes the beliefs of the WWP among the youth and is the main source of recruitment into the WWP. The WWP is a Trotskyist-communist organization whose objective is the overthrow of the present capitalist system of government in the U.S. and the institution of a dictatorship of the working class.



VISIT OF PRESIDENT GERALD R. FORD TO BURLINGTON, VERMONT OCTOBER 7, 1974

Representatives of the Federal Bureau of Investigation observed approximately 350 persons demonstrating upon the arrival of President GERALD R. FORD at the Ramada Inn, South Burlington, Vermont, on the evening of October 7, 1974. The demonstrators carried signs which bore slogans against nuclear testing, International Telephone and Telegraph Corporation, the pardoning of former President RICHARD M. NIXON and the present government of South Vietnam. The demonstrators walked peacefully in a circle outside Ramada Inn and chanted slogans.

The demonstrators then moved to the Patrick Gymnasium on the campus of the University of Vermont, Burlington, Vermont, where they peacefully demonstrated again and shouted and booed at the President upon his arrival there for dinner and also upon his departure.

While at the Patrick Gymnasium, the demonstrators were spoken to by one DAVID EVANS ROSS, self proclaimed representative of the Vietnam Veterans Against the War. (A characterization of which is contained in the Appendix hereto). ROSS spoke to the demonstrators about the extravagance of the cost of the dinner as compared to the needy people throughout the world. The demonstrators

drifted away from him with the exception of ten or fifteen which remained to hear him. It was not apparent what ROSS wanted from the demonstrators other than the possibility that he was attempting to gain control of the demonstration. ROSS was unable to gain control of the demonstrators.

There were no incidents of violence at the scenes of the demonstration of the President's route of travel during his visit to Burlington, Vermont and there were no arrests made.

The Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAN) is a national organization composed primarily of veterans of the war in Vietnam that has organized and participated in numerous demonstrations against the war in Vietnam during 1970-1972, including the seizure of the Statue of Liberty, New York City, and the occupation of the Betsy Ross House, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, in December, 1971. Six members of the VVAW were indicted by a Federal Grand Jury, Tallahassee, Florida, July, 1972, on charges of conspiracy to violate the Federal Antiriot Law.



The Vietnam Veterans Against the War (VVAW) was formed in 1967 as an organization of Vietnam veterans to protest American involvement in the war in Southeast Asia. Since that time VVAW leaders have told members the VVAW is a revolutionary group, not "just another group of war veterans." Also, the membership has been told the VVAW has been asked to cooperate on an international level with many organizations, including communist and Maoist groups. Additionally, it was indicated that "anti-imperialist groups" consider the VVAW a potent organization of similar stature in the United States. In April, 1973, the group changed their name to Vietnam Veterans Against the War/Winter Soldier Organization (VVAW/WSO) so that non-veterans could become members. Current VVAW/WSO national officers are Marxist-Leninist oriented and strive to educate their membership in Marxist-Leninist doctrine.







For information of the Bureau, on October 2, 1974, who was an integral part of the Vietnam Veterans against the War (VVAW) chapter at Kent State University (KSU) last year, reported that there is no longer a VVAW chapter there. Its leadership, particularly has left the Kent, Ohio area. The room at KSU allotted to the group has been vacant, and there seems to be little or no interest in reviving the group at the present time.

For these reasons, the KSU chapter of VVAW is being closed.

It is noted, however, that as of approximately June 1, 1974; ADEX subject and former president of VVAW at KSU has set up a chapter at Akron, Ohio. This was reported in minutes of VVAW/WSO regional meeting of July 27-28, 1974, at Athens, Ohio. Current chapter address is P. O. Box 903, Akron, Ohio 44309, phone 762-1033. A confidential source furnished the following information concerning the Vietnam Veterans Against the War/Winter Soldier Organization (VVAW/WSO) (See appendix).

On October 5 and 6, 1974, the Regional Meeting of the Ohio, Indiana, Kentucky, Michigan, Western Pennsylvania and West Virginia VVAW/WSO was held at 475 West Market, Akron, Ohio, the Friends Humanity House. The Saturday, October 5, 1974, session took place from about 1:00 PM to 7:00 PM and the Sunday, October 6, 1974, session from about 11:30 AM to 5:30 PM. There were only about 17 people there from the VVAW/WSO, six from Akron, Ohio; four from Columbus; one from Cleveland; four from Dayton and two from Cincinnati.

Akron

Not much work going on other than obtaining signatures regarding the Attica Brothers support.

Cincinnati

Five to six active members; demonstration at Veterans Administration (VA) in Cincinnati; work with James Hardy Defense Committee including participation in a demonstration and doing leafletting, Columbus; participation in a television show regarding amnesty; GI counseling on the upswing; "Winter Soldier", the VVAW/WSO publication, sales very poor; leafletting of VA office in Chillicothe, Ohio: Concerning fundraising, the chapter profited \$500 from the showing of the film "Billy Jack".

Cleveland

That chapter reported close contact with the Revolutionary Union (RU) (See appendix) and the Revolutionary Student Brigade (RSB) (See appendix). The chapter reported being involved in a fight regarding seven Vietnamese people being deported. Krause said he had been speaking some regarding VVAW/WSO but not many people were

expressing an interest in the VVAW. Dayton; not much to report except that military counseling continues to be active.

reported that the region was in bad financial shape and requested the chapters to consider their sending \$2.00 to the region instead of the \$1.00 they are supposed to send so that \$1.00 could be kept by the region and \$1.00 sent to the National Office.

It was announced that there would be a demonstration at Cleveland, Ohio on October 26, 1974, sponsored by the VVAW/WSO with several other organizations being invited, including the RU and the Socialist Workers Party (SWP) (See appendix). It was to be held at the VA but later it was changed to the West Side Market in Cleveland beginning at 10:00 AM, then to go to the Public Square at Cleveland State University at 12:00 noon, with a workshop being held in the afternoon.

After a lengthy discussion, it was resolved that the VA hospitals should treat people, other than veterans, particularly those in the vicinity of the hospital. Each chapter was urged to have an action in their own area around this issue.

During the Sunday, October 6, 1974, session, and from Dayton gave a report on the National GI Project (NGIP) of the VVAW/WSO, which in essence urged other chapters to place an emphasis on GI organizing.

Also, regarding the issue of amnesty, each chapter was urged to have an action related to this in their local area before October 26, 1974.

The issue of police repression was discussed and it was eventually proposed that since the National Lawyers Guild (NLG) (See appendix) reportedly has a list of lawyers for use in case of arrest, that a copy of the list be obtained and also that the NLG be requested to participate in local actions.

In a discussion regarding fund mising, it was decided that the "Winter Soldier" had very limited appeal

and, therefore, very little interest was shown which was reflected in the poor sales record.

Two individuals from the RU, one Mark (last name unknown) from Cincinnati and one Mickey (last name unknown) from New York, spoke to the group on Communist Cadre in a Mass Organization. Mickey did most of the talking. They discussed the RU as a Marxist-Leninist-Maoist organization formed in 1968 to overthrow the United States Government. They used the term "correct line" numerous times, pointing to the need to change the system in the United States. There was a need to organize through the working class and politically win over people and be ready thereafter before taking steps toward the revolution.

In pointing to the past and the future communist activities in the United States, the need to form a new Communist Party was emphasized by the RU speakers. They noted that if there had been a real party in the past, there would have been a real advancement of communism - but there was not. The formation of a new Communist Party was not yet worked out and the RU was conducting a nationwide speaking tour in an attempt to get the feeling of the people about this matter. This move would be to form a real Communist Party, made up of true communists, which would not recruit people just to have a large number of people.

Until at least a new Communist Party is formed, the RU is a secret cadre in that they are located in small cells with one not necessarily knowing the members of other cells, even in their own area. There are also secret members. No one knows the entire membership. This is correct because the RU is the single largest threat to the system in the United States and with this secret or concealed membership, they cannot be wiped out.

Also they must be ready to go underground if they become harassed or threatened, in order to preserve the organization and to do illegal activities if necessary.

The RU must lead the way in the United Front. They believe the VVAW/WSO has the same goals and they want to help the VVAW as an anti-imperialist organization in the United Front with a focus on vets.

VIETNAM VETERANS AGAINST THE WAR/ WINTER SOLDIER ORGANIZATION (VVAW/WSO)

The VVAW was formed in 1967 as an organization of Vietnam veterans to protest American involvement in the war in Southeast Asia. Since that time VVAW leaders have told members the VVAW is a revolutionary group, not "just another group of war veterans." Also, the membership has been told the VVAW has been asked to cooperate on an international level with many organizations, including communist and Maoist groups. Additionally, it was indicated that "anti-imperialist groups" consider the VVAW a potent organization of similar stature in the United States. In April, 1973, the group changed their name to VVAW/WSO so that non-veterans could become members. Current VVAW/WSO national officers are Marxist-Leninist oriented and strive to educate their membership in Marxist-Leninist doctrine.

REVOLUTIONARY UNION

The Revolutionary Union (RU), founded in early 1968 in the San Francisco Bay area, is a militant semicovert Marxist-Leninist revolutionary organization ideologically oriented towards the People's Republic of China and the teachings of Chairman Mao Tse-tung. Its objectives as set forth in its theoretical publication, "The Red Papers," and in its monthly newspaper, "Revolution", are the development of a united front against imperialism, the fostering of revolutionary working class unity and leadership in struggle, and the formation of a communist party based on Marxism-Leninism-Mao Tse-tung thought, leading to the overthrow of the United States Government by force and violence. Members of the RU have been identified as collecting weapons while engaging in firearms and guerrilla warfare training. As of July, 1974, RU national headquarters was located in Maywood, Illinois.

REVOLUTIONARY STUDENT BRIGADE

The Revolutionary Student Brigade (RSB), formerly known as the Attica Brigade, is a student-based organization founded in New York City in the Fall of 1971. The RSB considers itself to be an anti-imperialist organization which views United States imperialism as the main enemy of the people of the world. The RSB favors violent actions to further its cause and is moving closer in ideology to the Revolutionary Union (RU), which has significantly infiltrated the RSB and plays a major role in the RSB policies, decisions and activities. As of July, 1974, the RSB is headquartered in New York City. The RU is a basic Marxist-Leninist-Maoist revolutionary organization.

SOCIALIST WORKERS PARTY

The Socialist Workers Party (SWP) is a revolutionary, Trotskyist-communist organization, which is headquartered in New York City. Its purpose, as stated in its Declaration of Principles, is the overthrow of the United States Government and the institution of a dictatorship of the working class and the eventual achievement of a communist society. It was founded in 1938 and maintains close association with international Trotskyist organizations as a "sympathizing" group, but it denies formal membership in any foreign group to escape application of the Voorhis Act, which regulates certain types of organizations subject to foreign control. While the SWP does not openly advocate the use of violence at the present time to overthrow the United States Government, it believes that eventual violent revolution in the United States is inevitable. Its objection to the current use of violence is based on the ground that it believes violence is premature at this time. The SWP seeks to precipitate a revolution when conditions are ripe and to seize control of the revolution and to direct it when it occurs.

Certain VVAN/WSO leaders were quoted as telling members VVAM/WSO is a revolutionary organization and not "just another group of war veterans." VVAW/WSO leaders have traveled to North Vietnam and have reportedly established liaison with revolutionary or terrorist groups internationally. at a National Steering Committee meeting, VVAW/ WSO leaders discussed programs aimed at obtaining support from or influencing active duty military personnel. They also discussed obtaining access to classified Government information to be used against U.S. interests and one leader subsequently actively engaged in such activity. There were also indications at this meeting that VVAW/MSO activists possessed the technical knowledge and training to carry out any revolutionary program proposed. 8/73 at a National Steering Committee meeting, some members of the national leadership promoted education of the entire VVAW/WSO membership in Marxist-Leninist doctrine directing the organization into political growth along Marxist-Leninist lines. A preliminary inquiry was initiated concerning the subject for the purpose of determining if the subject was a leader or activist of the VVAW/WSO, activities of which could involve violations of Title 18, U.S. Code 2383 (Rebellion or Insurrection), 2384 (Seditious Conspiracy), 2385 (Advocating Overthrow of the Government), 2387 (Sedition), and 793 (Espionage)

On 5/29/74, Metropolitan Police Department, WDC, furnished a copy of the WDC Chapter VVAW/WSO membership list to a representative of WFO. The membership list was furnished to Officer


The name of subject, telephone # was included in the membership list.

VVAW/WSO was organized in New York City in 1967 as an organization of Vietnam veterans to protest the American involvement in the war in Southeast Asia. VVAW/WSO engaged in various protest activities but during late 1971 demonstrated increasing militancy, culminating in 12/71 with VVAW/WSO takeover of various American landmarks and public buildings. Information was also developed indicating that some VVAW/WSO chapters

were cooperating with or infiltrated by communist-dominated groups including the Communist Party, USA, and the Socialist Workers Party. Certain VVAW/WSO leaders were quoted as telling members VVAM/WSO is a revolutionary organization and not "just another group of war veterans." VVAN/WSO leaders have traveled to North Vietnam and have reportedly established liaison with revolutionary or terrorist groups internationally. In 1/73 at a National Steering Committee meeting, VVAM/ WSO leaders discussed programs aimed at obtaining support from or influencing active duty military personnel. They also discussed obtaining access to classified Government information to be used against U.S. interests and one leader subsequently actively engaged in such activity. There were also indications at this meeting that VVAN/WSO activists possessed the technical knowledge and training to carry out any revolutionary program proposed. 8/73 at a National Steering Committee meeting, some members of the national leadership promoted education of the entire VVAV/WSO membership in Marxist-Leninist doctrine directing the organization into political growth along Marxist-Leninist lines. The VVAM/WSO currently has a factional dispute between Maoist and Stalinist groups. The Stalinist group is supported by the National Office of WAN/ Additionally, the National Office contributed financial support to a program of recruitment of military personnel designed to promote political indoctrination with the objective of creating disruption and disorientation within the military at such time as there is a revolution within the United States. VVAW/WSO is currently headquartered in Chicago, Illinois.

WFO agency and informant sources were contacted concerning captioned subject with negative results.

In view of the fact that investigation has failed to disclose any activity of a subversive nature on the part of subject, this case is being placed in closed status.
